

GLIMPSES OF THE PAST

Life Bible-Presbyterian Church was founded on October 20, 1950 as the English Service of Say Mia Tng, the Teochew-speaking Life Church, Prinsep Street. To its pulpit was called the Rev. Timothy Tow who had just then returned from theological training in the United States.

The congregation consisted of thirty English-speaking members transferred from the Mother Church together with their children. They were the Chans, Chias, Chuas, Hengs, Lims, Queks and Tows. They met in worship every Lord's Day 5.30 p.m. at Prinsep Street for full twelve years.

Two elders who served with the young church from its inception, now in glory, deserve special remembrance. Elder Tan Boo Chiang, octogenerian Chinese herb doctor, to whom English was "like thunder to a duckling", never missed a service. For several years, his personal attendance, with liberal weekly financial support, upheld the young pastor's hands. Elder Lim Hong Hock, ever zealous for the building of God's House at Gilstead Road, departed suddenly in September 1960. He saw the Promised Land and the first phase of earth-filling.

As to Life Church Sunday School, it was established in November 1950, one month after the Church's founding, with 27 members. These were divided into three classes with the pastor as superintendent.

From the outset the young Life Church did not content herself with worship and work within her four walls at Prinsep Street. Early 1951 saw Lifers, under Elder Quek Kiok Chiang, branching out to the old people of the State Welfare Home, Johore

Bahru. Through this ministry a Hope Church was founded. Deacons were ordained from among the first batches of sixty baptised. Today, the Hopefuls are dispersed to Serdang and Kota Bahru, and are under care of our sister church, Faith.

In March 1952 the Malaysia Christian Pioneer Mission was organised. Through this missionary society which now serves all our Bible-Presbyterian Churches, the Kelapa Sawit Mission Church in January 1954 came under our mandate, jointly with the Singapore Evangelistic League. Missionaries today to Kelapa Sawit (43 miles north of Singapore) are Brother and Mrs. James Chan Lay Seng, both Lifers and alumni of the Far Eastern Bible College.

The issue between our Reformed and Fundamental heritage and the inroads of Modernism and Ecumenism into the Chinese Presbyterian Synod, with which we were linked, came to a head in 1955. In order to bear a separated testimony for the Faith, we declared ourselves the Life Bible-Presbyterian Church. Though the name is new, our faith is old. We trace our lineage to the faith brought to South China, Swatow and Amoy, by the early English Presbyterian missionaries (1847).

In our struggle for the Faith, Deacon (now Rev.) Silas Hsu Chiang Tai who stood with us from the beginning and has remained loyal to this day deserves honourable mention. (Rev. and Mrs. Hsu are now settled in U.S.A.).

In August 1956, Life Church played host to the Third Assembly of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches. Dr. Carl

McIntire, president of the ICCA and Mrs. McIntire graced this Assembly with their personal attendance. From this Assembly was born the Singapore-Malaysia Council of Christian Churches.

It was soon after this Assembly that the Lord began to open doors of service that no man can shut. January 1957 saw the first branching out of Life Church to Sembawang Hills Estate to establish a Sunday School in a member's house. This was done with the cheerful reception by Deacon and Mrs. Seow Chong Pin. This work has now grown to maturity, short of organising itself into a church. The Sembawang Sunbeams, as they are affectionately called, today own a \$20,000 corner-house property.

No sooner had Sembawang been opened than Serangoon Gardens came into our purview. In April 1957 Lifers under Deacon Chia Kim Chwee started a Sunday School on the premises of Zion Kindergarten, then the property of the Christian Stewardship Foundation. Its president, Rev. Jason Linn of Indonesia, now of Hong Kong, is auspiciously with us today. This property was taken over by Life Church with the cooperation of Central Church, in June of the same year. A new Church called Zion, after the Kindergarten's name, was established. Rev. Quek Kiok Chiang was installed honorary pastor.

God blessed this undertaking and Zion, after one year, started a Chinese service. This Chinese service later amalgamated with Central Church to form the present Faith Bible - Presbyterian Church. As the daughter congregation grew to vigorous womanhood, Life Church relinquished her rights to the Zion property to encourage a faster, fuller development. The magnificent new Church built jointly by Zion and Faith in December 1967 is proof

of the genius of our Presbyterian form of church government.

After a reorganisation of the Sunday School in 1953 under the leadership of Dr. Tow Siang Hwa, the attendance reached 234 on Life Church's 7th Anniversary. As the Sunday School could not be contained in the little Prinsep Street Church, the drive for the Building Fund, spontaneously launched as early as October 1955, intensified. On Life Church's 7th Anniversary, the Fund had reached \$30,000.

It is true that when we seek God's Kingdom and spiritual things first, He will add to us the blessings of earth. When Life Church put missionary outreach first, God gave her a home base, the Gilstead Road property, which has become the cynosure of all eyes!

A land-claiming service was held on the then swampy land on July 20, 1957, though the title-deeds date the 99-year lease as from August 1, 1957!

From July 1958 to July 1959, the pastor took one year's leave to further study at Faith Seminary, USA. Rev. Quek Kiok Chiang, whilst pastoring at Zion, acted during his absence. In September 1958 Bro. Philip Heng also left for USA to study for the ministry.

The year 1960 saw yet another outburst of energy of the young church. In that year was seen the taking over of Tekong Gospel Centre by the MPM with the help of the Evangelistic League; the founding of Galilee Bible-Presbyterian Church, with the Pasir Panjang Young Christians Fellowship as a nucleus (June 1960), the opening of Jurong Sunday School by Miss Ivy Tan at the Chandra home (October 1960), and of Mt. Carmel Sunday School at the Redhill home of Deacon and Mrs. Robert Ong. (December 1960). The decision to found a Far East-

ern Bible College was taken by Presbytery action at Zion Kindergarten, after academic help, promised by the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions, was assured. (September 1960).

The greatest joy came upon the whole church when the Church-and-College plan for Gilstead Road became a reality, first in September 1962 when the Bible College was opened on the premises of the Annex, and second in February 1963 when the new Church auditorium was dedicated. Mr. Ang Kheng Leng our Hon. Architect is to be remembered for his ever kindly help and generosity. The whole property on the day of completion cost the Lord's people \$300,000. Of this sum, there still remains \$25,000 unpaid.

Through Bro. Moses Tan, a Hume Heights Gospel Centre at the house of the Lows, 8½ miles Bukit Timah Road, was founded in 1962. In 1964 was begun an open-air children's work with young Lifers at Kampong Chia Heng. In October 1965, the Life Church afternoon Mandarin Service was started, with the Tsaos taking a leading part. The Tsaos were united with our Church through the fatal Cameron Highlands accident. It was 3.30 p.m. Easter Monday, April 19, 1965 when Mrs. Tow Keng Chuan, my beloved aunt, Nancy and Annie, my beloved wife and daughter, were taken up in a flash at Bidor. "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord . . . and their works do follow them." (Rev. 14:13.)

The greatest burden our Church has borne in the extension of God's Kingdom is undoubtedly the programme of the Far Eastern Bible College. By a slow-grinding, day-to-day process, are moulded within this institution, presently, fourteen fulltime students in a four-year theological curriculum. In this connection, the past help of Rev. Peter Ng of Jesus Saves

Mission, and of Rev. and Mrs. John E. Grauley of the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions, deserves particular mention.

Mention must also be made of Rev. Philip Heng, a first-fruit offering to the Lord's service from amongst our own church. Rev. Heng who returned from USA in September 1963 is now pastor of Galilee Church, assistant pastor at Life and a member of the FEBC faculty. It is hoped that similarly Bro. Quek Swee Hwa's return will not only add to Zion's testimony but also contribute to the Bible College's training programme.

In 1965 the Session of Life Church saw the vision of what further development of its park could result. The Kingdom of God is likened to a wise investment, so invest we did. With the spontaneous offering of a sizeable tithe by a sister, it was felt that the Lord would want us to prosecute this extension project without delay.

Building plans were finally approved in February 1968. Ground was broken by Easter. Today, after exactly one year, there rises before us such a handsome three-storey building for the multi-uses of both Church and College, with a whole downstairs devoted to a Far Eastern Kindergarten. The total costs of \$130,000 are still short of \$25,000, but God is able.

As we humbly review the events in Life Church and the Bible-Presbyterian Church Movement as a whole during the last nineteen years, we cannot help but say with the Apostle Paul that it is God who has given the increase. Of ourselves we can do nothing. We have also sensed the relentless fleeting of the times. Hence the urgency, to press on with what is placed into our hands, that we should be busily occupied till He comes. Amen.


