

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

(Pastor's Fifth Anniversary Message.)



NUNC AUT NUN QUAM - NOW OR NEVER! That is the lesson of the failure of God's people to enter the Promised Land.

One year and one month after the going out of Egypt, God was prepared to grant Canaan, the Land of Milk and Honey, to His people. But there was one condition: providing they had the faith

and courage to take it. To test them out, God told Moses to send out 12 spies, leaders from the 12 tribes, to prospect the land and give their report. Sad to say, the majority of them came back drenched with discouragement. They said, "No doubt Canaan is a land' flowing with milk and honey. But, the inhabitants thereof are giants. They live in great walled cities and we become grasshoppers in their sight!" However, two dissenting voices, from Joshua and Caleb, urged immediate possession. But, they were of no avail.

"The congregation lifted up their voice and cried, and the people wept that night." A sudden paralysis of despair seized a once mighty army.

The result of not having faith and courage was disastrous. The congregation were immediately turned about into the dreary desert to wander for forty years. All males from 20 years upwards, that is the whole 600,000-strong army, perished.

What the congregation should have done was to heed the voice of faith and move with courage, trusting God to provide where they lacked. Had not God showed Himself mighty to save over ten times?

On the eve of our happy Fifth Anniversary, Life Church is also brought to the border of Canaan! Hitherto God has worked mightily in our midst. Today He has shown Himself greater by lifting us from Prinsep Street to a delightful 2-acre piece of land at Dunearn and Gilstead Roads, 200 yards from Newton Circus. He has swept three competing applicants for this land aside. He has moved Government to lease us the land at only \$1.20 per sq. foot.

I am glad to announce on behalf of Session which convened at an emergency meeting after Church on Oct.16, that we have unanimously voted to take it. Now or never, it is up to Congregation, every man and every woman, every boy and every girl, to do our part. The success of this great undertaking or failure, which might put us off till 1995, if Jesus tarries, depends on YOU!





We will do it by expounding the Word of God, and also by the testimony of those who have found Christ through the ministry of faithful preaching. Finally, Point 3: To arouse members to a keener sense of their duty to trade with talents God has entrusted them, so that they may not be ashamed to face their Saviour when He comes. Every saved one owes God a gospel debt. Romans 1:14 says, "I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the barbarians; both to the wise and to the unwise." It is not the pastor's debt to preach the gospel to the lost. It is every Christian's. Therefore let everyone in Life Church neglect not this duty. Let us give to the uttermost of our time, energy and money, in order that God's work might go on unchecked.

O, let us be banded together as a team to earn talentsfor Him, so that when He appears, each one of us may hear Him say, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant!" Jesus IS coming SOON! # How to be saved!

No one can be saved unless he is born again by the power of God's Spirit. Christ says, in John 3:7, "Ye must be born again." The necessity is absolute - ye must be born again. Nothing will take the place of the new birth. Baptism will not take the place of the new birth. Confirmation will not take the place of the new birth. No performance of religious rites will take the place of the new birth. A great many people are depending upon the fact that they say their prayers, read their Bibles, go to church, partake of the sacrament, and perform other duties; but all that cannot take the place of the new birth.

Culture and refinement and outward correctness of life will not take the place of the new birth. The trouble is not merely with our outward life: the trouble is in the heart, in the very deepest of our inward life, and merely to perform your outward life will not save you.


Suppose I had a rotten apple. I could take that apple to an artist, have him put a coating of wax on it, and then paint it till it was the most beautiful looking apple you ever saw; but it would be just as rotten at heart as ever, and one bite into it would be a bite into decay. The trouble is that out of Christ you are wrong in heart, and mere culture, refinement, respectability, morality, is simply a coating of wax on the outside painted up. You must be changed, down to the deepest depth of your being. "Vorily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."

The Lord Jesus Christ preached, "Repent, ye, and believe thegospel." Repentance is turning from sin to God. The gospel message has power in it to transform your life.

In John 1:12 we read, "As many as received Him, to them gave Ho power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name. "We are born again by God's Holy Spirit, through His Word the moment we receive Christ. When you take Christ into your heart He transforms you through and through in a moment. I care not how worldly you are, how sinful and how hard - anyone today who will throw his heart open and let Jesus come in to rule and reign, God will make that one a new creature in a moment. 
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THE HABIT OF GOING TO CHURCH EVERY SUNDAY MORNING AS AN ACT OF WORSHIP TO GOD.


The Churches are the most important institutions in any community. The Sunday Morning Service is the Church's principal way of doing its work; it is THE EVENT of the community life.






- I. The Lord's Day ought to be remembered before hand in order that all our temporal and ordinary callings may be so arranged and seasonably laid aside, as not to be impediments to the proper sanctifying of the day when it comes.
- II. The whole day is to be celebrated as holy to the Lord both in public and in private, as a day of divine worship and holy resting. To which end, it is requisite, that there be a cessation all that day from all unnessary labours; and an abstaining from those sports and recreations which may be lawful on other days; and also from all worldly thoughts and conversations.
- III. Provision for the support of the family on the Lord's Day should be so ordered that servants or anyone else in the household be not unnecessarily detained from public worship or hindered from properly sanctifying the day.
- IV. There should be private preparations of every person and family, by prayer for themselves, and for God's assistance of the minister, and for a blessing upon his ministry; and by such other exercise, as may further dispose them to a more comfortable communion with God in His public ordinances.
- V. The Lord's people should be careful to assemble promptly at appointed hour, that the whole congregation may be present at the beginning and with one heart solemnly join together in all parts of the public worship; none should unnecessarily depart until after the benediction.
- VI. After the public meetings of the congregation have been concluded the time should be spent in reading the Word, meditation upon the sermon, catechising, spiritual conversation, prayer for blessing upon the public ordinances, singing of hymns and spiritual songs, visiting the sick, relieving the needy, and such like duties of piety, charity and mercy,

This question often presents a real difficulty to young Christians in school. Things they learn in science are in apparent conflict with certain recorded facts in the Bible. Which are they to believe, Science or the Bible?


Let us, therefore, set forth as simply as possible for the benefit of every young one, the facts of the case.

The Bible is God's Word, written through His inspiration. In it is vested Divine Authority and absolute accuracy that no other book has. It is God's message to man, and it reflects the mind of One whose wisdom is unlimited. Science has grown out of man's discovery of the marvels of God's creation. It embodies many laws and theories, which are but the product of man's limited thinking and knowledge. It is liable to mistake, and in fact often does.

The Bible was written by various writers, some hundreds of years apart. Yet they all agree in what they write, because there is actually one Author God Himself. Scientific literature also has many writers, but each one is the author of what he has to write. Each scientist only writes what he knows or thinks that he knows. Often they do not know enough. The result is mistake and disagreement among themselves.

The Bible was completed many centuries before modern science came into existence. Yet it has stood every test of time, and its absolute reliability and accuracy have not been shaken. Science is comparatively young, and is continually changing. What is accepted as truth today, may be rejected tomorrow.


In the past, whenever there was disagreement between the Bible and Science, evidence has repeatedly been found to show that the Bible was in fact correct. This has served to strengthen the faith of men in the Bible. In the future, should further doubts arise in any instance, more evidence will be found to prove that the Bible is true in every detail.



CONCLUSION: The Bible is God's Word and contains no mistake, whether historical or scientific. Science is the product of man's shallow knowledge and understanding of God's marvellous creation. God the Creator causes things to happen merely by a word of command: storms abate, seas dry up, demons flee, water turns to wine, sick are healed and dead raised - all at His bidd ing. His creation obeys Him. Who are we, His creation, to question His doings?

When so-called scientific men doubt His works as recorded in His Holy Word, they merely expose a gap, and a very serious one indeed, in their knowledge - the knowledge and fear of the Almighty, who rules over all His creation.

Young Christians, have you any doubts in your mind? Is there any thing you have learnt in school which seems to contradict the Bible? If so, go "search the Scriptures", and let God Himself speak to you through His Word. Then look for the discrepancy, and you'll find it - in some scientific loophole.

"Peace be within thy walls, and prosperity within thy palaces." Psalm 122:7

The house of the Lord is the place of adoration and worship of God, for prayer and fellowship with His children, and for personal testimony and service to Christ.

As an exile and sinner in the devil's domain, the least likely place one would desire to go to is the church. On the other hand, the happiest place which a born-again Christian seeks to go to outside his home is the place which Jesus himself called "the house of prayer." Today this place is commonly called the church.

Upon entering the threshhold of the church, one should recall the love and suffering of our Lord in order that we might be reconciled to our Maker and Creator, the Giver of Life. As it pleased God in olden days to divide Canaan to the twelve tribes of Israel, so does He appoint to every true church of God a place to witness for Him. Lutheran, Presbyterian, Anglican and Methodist are great names in the Church of Christ, as Judah, Ephraim, Manasseh and Benjamin were noble in the Kingdom of Israel.

We are a Bible Presbyterian Church, according to our confession of faith and form of Church government. Other churches may be called Methodist Bethesda or Baptist according to their confession of faith and form of Church government. Now, such denominations exist because of a different emphasis on minor points of doctrine, but as to fundamentals of the Faith, they do mutually agree, bearing common testimony to the Lord Jesus Christ. Thus it is our duty, while zealously upholding what we believe to be nearest to the revealed truth of God, to excercise brotherly forbearance towards other churches, and it is expected that our brethren in other "tribes of Israel" will so deal with us.

Why we have become known as Bible Presbyterian, let me briefly relate. We are descendants of a "colony" of Chinese Christians who migrated from Swatow to Singapore during the last two generations. Our grandparents, and parents were converts of the English Presbyterian Mission, the overseas work of the Presbyterian Church of England. Now as descendants of a great heritage, making Malaya our home and independently building up the church of God, we might properly be called Malayan Chinese or Malayan, Presbyterians.

But something has happened during the last two decades that has made it necessary for us, we are sorry to say, to disassociate with the English Presbyterians. It is modernism. The present-day missionaries are not like those who preached to our ancestors the old-time faith. Missionaries of the English Presbyterian Mission have denied the precious blood of Christ as being shed for the forgiveness of our sins; One has denied the virgin birth and another the bodily resurrection. (These facts have been earlier published in the Weekly.) Lest we be mistaken for sharing theiranti-Christian views, and in order to protest against such unbelief, it behoves us to proclaim ourselves to be "Bible Presbyterian". We believe and uphold every word of the Bible, but modernists, who deny these essentials of the Faith, do not.

Now, modernism has not usurped our Presbyterian churches only. Like an epidemic, it has swept through every denomination of the Church of God - Methodists, Anglicans, Baptists, Brethren, Lutherans, all over the world, are suffering from the same plague. Nevertheless, God still reigns over His church. When modernism had risen to its peak, the Lord began to raise up a standard against it. This standard is a church reformation movement beginning as early as 1927 in China. Dr.A.B.Dodd and Dr. Chia Yu-ming, principal of a Nanking Seminary of which Dr. John Sung was president of the directors, challenged the modernists. In America about the same time, God raised up a young minister to do likewise. Today He is Dr.Carl! McIntire, president of the International Council of Christian Churches, which is a fellowship of this church reformation movement. Today this movement has grown to a membership of 54 denominations from 40 countries.

The issue in the 16th century Reformation between Lutherand the Roman Catholic Church was whether salvation was by works or faith. The issue today between us and modernism is whether the Bible is the infallible, inerrant word of God. This is a much greater issue, because if the Bible is not to be believed at every point, then it might not be believed at all points. Indeed that is the logical conclusion. Today so-called Bishops and ministers of Christ's Church, have shamlessly culogised other religions at the expense of Christ. Others go so far as to say that the way to heaven is paved by all religions. We hear missionaries teach ourchildren that the Bible contains myths and fairy tales and that Jesus' miracles are not to be believed. The doctrines essential to our salvation are torn to bits because they have first destroyed the authority of the Bible.


In order to uphold the Word of God and defend and confirm the essential doctrines of the Christian Faith, a doctrinal Statement is issued by the International Council of Christian Churches. To this statement we gladly and unreservedly subscribe, and we reproduce it for your profitable study. This statement reads:

"Among other equally Biblical truths, we believe and maintain the following:

- a. The plenary Divine inspiration of the Scriptures in the original languages, their consequent inerrancy and infallibility, and, as the Word of God, the supreme and final authority in faith and life;
- b. The Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit;
- c. The essential, absolute, eternal Deity, and the real and proper, but sinless, humanity of our Lord Jesus Christ;
- d. His birth of the virgin Mary;
- e. His substitutionary, expiatory death, in that He gave His life "a ransom for many";
- f. His resurrection from among the dead in the same body in which He was crucified and the second coming of this same Jesus in power and great glory;

- g. Salvation, the effect of regeneration by the Spirit and the Word, not by works but by grace through faith;
- h. The everlasting bliss of the saved, and the everlasting suffering of the lost;
- i. The real spiritual unity in Christ of all redeemed by His precious blood;
- j. The necessity of maintaining, according to the Word of God, the purity of the Church in doctrine and life; and, still believing the Apostles' Creed to be a statement of Scriptural truth, we therefore incorporate it in these articles of faith.

Yes, the reason why we call our Church Bible Presbyterian is that we not only desire to preach the gospel but also to defend and confirm it. - May Presbyterians who want to uphold the truth become "Bible Presbyterians" and may "Bible" churches be formed other denominations of Christ's Church which are being usurped by modernist leaders today.



Dr. John Sung, moved by our spirit and determination, told us to kneel down and be not ashamed before Christ, because out Lord knew all about us. He told us to pray to God for repentance together with him, and he put his hand on my head. As soon as he called out to God, I felt a spiritual sensation descending upon me. I felt a chill and fear, and began to cry out. At that moment I felt the heaviness in my heart vanish away. I knew and realised our Lord had answered my prayer and had taken away my sins.

Quite a few of our older members have children who do not fully understand the service in Chinese. And so, it was necessary, and indeed a blessing, that this English Service was started.

Our children are now learning to seek the Lord and His way. Many are beginning to love the Bible. Still others improve their English. Thus far our Sunday School attendance has reached 252 and we are looking forward to our Lord's further blessing.

-an appreaciation of the book by Mr. Leslie T. Lyall

DURING the years 1935-1939, a mighty wave of revival swept the Chinese churches throughout South East Asia. Siam, Burma, Malaya, Sumatra, Borneo, Java, Philippines, and last but not least, our island home ofsaw a spiritual awakening the like of which has not been witnessed before or since. For God was pleased to use John Sung, the 'Flame of God in the Far East! for the turning of many from their sins to righteousness. lighting of a thousand flames of service in Christian lives every the re-warming of hearts, long cooled off in years of dead and ministries. What is more important, God always used him to the glory of His own Holy Name. Today, wherever the word is faithfully proclaimed, there are living test monies of active workers who had received a lasting from the ministry of Dr. John Sung.

Dr. Sung was the fourth son of Pastor Sung of Hingwha in China. his early boyhood days he had been in a God-fearing environment. He was endowed with exceptional intelligence and natural talents, and also a fierce temper which accounts for his eccentricities off the pulpit. One other lity which partly accounted for his success was his utter devotion to the task in hand, and his complete disregard for his own bodily health.

From the time he was ten, John Sung used to help his father in preaching tours, and soon he was hailed as the 'Young Pastor'. But he was ambitious, and God opened a way for him to America. There he startled the American public by topping practically every examination, with highest honours. Nothing was too difficult for his marvellous brain. Soon he gained the degrees of B.Sc., and M.Sc., confounding his critics and astonishing the university professors. His fame spread far and wide. Many awards, scholarships and high appointments were offered him. He went on to take the Ph.D., which time he was qualified to be a professor of Science. As far as worldly achievement was concerned, no one could have wished for anything more. John Sung had 'gained the world' but deep in his soul was an emptiness he could not fill, a hunger the world and all its glitter could not satisfy. In desperation he thought he would study in a seminary, and perhaps find peace in his soul.



This verse led to Dr. Sund's conversion:

"For what shall it profit a man if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?" (Mk, 8:36.)




## But what things were gain to me, those I consted loss for Christ

Accordingly, he joined the Union Theological Seminary, New York. Here he revolted against the Christ-denying, Crossless and Blood-less doctrines of the professors. As a result, he was cast into a mental asylum for 193 days. Imagine his plight as he was confined in virtual imprisonment, away from friends and loved ones, in the company of the mentally unsound. But God knew best. Here the Holy Spirit started Dr. Sung on a theological course, which took him through the Bible 40 times. How we proise Him for His wondrous works. When finally released, Dr. Sung said that he "graduated from Seminary."

The call of God had come to him. So Dr. Sung sailed for China again. Gold medals, honours and distinctions, fame and fortunes were to him things of the past: these were but dung. As he neared the homeland, he threw every award into the sea. For him, it was the way of the cross.

From themoment he set foot on China again, every minute of his life was spent in the service of the Master, Who had said to him as he wopt for his sins one day in America, "Little son, your sins are forgiven you. I took them upon myself on the cross at Calvary. You need sorrow no more." O the joy of sins forgiven, the peace of burdens rolled away! From henceforth it was not John Sung who lived, but Jesus Christ in John Sung, as he brought the glorious gospel to the uttermost parts of China and S.E. Asia. Was it any wonder then, that John Sung spared not himself, as he burnt up his earthly frame, blazing a fiery trail of revival wherever he went.

As one who received the new birth at Telok Ayer in 1935, sitting through three meetings daily for days at the feet of John Sung, I have enjoyed every page of Mr. Ieslie T. Lyall's book. It brings back old memories and at times one seems to feel the old spirit of revival again. Of one thing I am convinced: anyone who loves the Lord will profit by reading this thrilling biography, the life-story of "the greatest evangelist China has ever known!"





ONE sacred duty solemnly committed to a pastor's charge, according to Titus 1:9-11, is to preserve sound doctrine in the Church and warn against deceivers, "whose mouths must be stopped."

Commenting on the above passage of Scripture, John Calvin, a leader of the Protestant Reformation, says, "A good pastor ought therefore to be on the watch so as not to give silent permission to wicked and dangerous doctrines to make gradual progress, or to allow wicked men an opportunity of spreading them. If we mark such person and point them out with the finger, everybody will avoid them, and thus they will be prevented from doing harm. This is what Paul had in eye."

Praise be to God, He has not left Himself without such good pastors in every age. Whilst many evangelical leaders refrain from carrying out this sacred duty of pointing out deceivers, He has raised up in our day a Bible Presbyterian pastor, Dr. Carl McIntire, (President of the International Council of Christian Churches) and the late Dr.T.T.Shields, a Canadian Baptist pastor. They have been used of God in a mighty way to awaken churches to the wiles of the Deceiver. We thank God specially for sending them to Singapore in 1949, so that many churches in Malaya, including ours, were awakened to the soul-destroying unbelief of modernism in our midst. This deceitful unbelief of modernism is operating here through the work of the Malayan Christian Council and Trinity College!

Being aware of this danger, our church has voted not to join the M. C.C., but rather to stand with the International Council of Christian Churches. And during these years your pastor has diligently kept watch, so that evil doctrines might not croep in.

We are glad to report that two cases of infiltration by "Jenovah's Witnesses" or "Watch Tower" into both our English and Chinese Congregations have been successfully eradicated by "The Malaysia Christian" with the cooperation of our young people and the pastors. And we are glad to report a recent victory by our Mother Church against the Malayan Christian Council and Trinity College: Last week, both these organisations requested from our Chinese-speaking congregation one week's offering to promote their work. A member of the session discussing these two requests suggested that a token "offering" be sent to appease them. Believing that such appeasement would amount to giving both material and moral support to the work of deceivers, members from our English Service opposed such a "move". Prase be to God, a couple hundred dollars were saved from falling into the hands of the M.C.C. and its partner.

Honestly speaking, such successful rearguard actions are being won today as a result of the vanguard work of the International Council of Christian Churches. Had Drs. McIntire and Shields and many other stalwarts like Dr. A.B. Dodd refrained from crusading to this part of the world, our English Service could surely have become a cog in the M.C.C. machinery.

In case you might not know the difference between the faith we preach and that of the M.C.C. and Trinity College, here are two samples for your perusal: Bishop Baines. Chairman of the M.C.C., speaking last year on "The Churches' Task in Malaya" at a public meeting in K.L. said. "It task at the religious level to do everything in our power to increase understanding among the adherents of different religiors both by the respect we pay to their systems and the regard we have for their practice and by the careful and reverent study we make of their doctrines. It has never been part of the Christian way to ignore or belittle the shines in other faiths... (p.4, M.C.C. Bulletin, June-July, 1954.) No wonder a leader of the M.C.C. can take part in the joint - religious service yearly held at the Cenotaph, whereJesus, the name that is above every other name, is equated with Buddha and some other "god." If what the chairman of the M.C.C. says is true, then it is vain for our young people to try win souls, steeped in the darkness of human religions, to the Jesus Christ. Secondly, in a book on "Theological Education on S.E. Asia." Dr. Stanley C. Smith, principal of Trinity College, defames the good name of Chinese evangelists like our Dr. John Sung, ridiculing them as "footloose, free-lance,......who have come to regard this part of Asia as their happy-hunting-ground, and whose influence has been in many instances, pernicious..." (p.10.) Of course the reason why Dr. John Sung is classed as of the pernicious is that he preached vigorously against the hypocrisy of modernism.

O that we may have more of such good pastors as John Sung and McIntire!

Dr. John Sung vs. Modernism.



Jesus said, "Beware of false prophets which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves."

Satan's preaching sounds like the truth. But it is powerless. It cannot move a man, nor change his heart.

There are many today who preach a social gospel. They preach themselves hoarse on "good character", "service" and "sacrifice." Have they got a man to repent of and confess his sins and change over? By no means. If a man does not believe in the precious blood Christ, he shall never find forgiveness of sins, nor can his old self be crucified. It is a pity they are blind, and yet they want to show others the way. Shall not both fall into the pit?

These men do not believe the Bible. They do not believe the precious blood. They do not believe that Jesus was born of a virgin, the Word become flesh. They don't believe anything. And why should they preach the gospel? They have a bow and no arrows. They are cheats. They use the name of Christ as a cover for forming councils and spon soring movements. Whatever be their "movement", the result is nil.



The International Council of Christian Churches is often accused of being negative, a movement which only raises protests against the World Council of Churches and its errors.

It isof course true that our movement opposes the WCC and its attitude to the fundamentals of the Christian faith. It would also be easy to point out that such an opposition is most emphatically commanded by the Word of God. Everyone who knows his Bible also knows that a great part of it consists of polemical statements directed against errors of all kinds. But in connect ion with such polemical utterances the truth is stated also. Thus it is evident that the polemical parts of the Bible serve to instruction in the truth. This is the line followed by the ICCC It would be sufficient to refer to the resolutions adopted by our Plenary Congresses.

But it should be also stated that the greater part of our work is altogether positive. Let me point out the following:

1. A worldwide fellowship of Bible-believing Christians has been formed. This has meant immensely much for the individuals and churches which still stand for the Bible and for the pure gospel.

2. The fundamental doctrines of the Bible are strongly stressed by our doctrinal statement and by a great number of addresses given in our conferences in different parts of the world.

3. What the ICCC has done in order to keep mission doors open has helped to maintain the giving to the heathen the pure gospel.

4. The testimony of the ICCC has awakened Christians all over the world to recognise their duty to stand for the faith & to proclaim the Gospel of the Bible. — The Reformation Reporter.





When we view the moral nature of man, this process of curruption is just as apparent. What a sad picture this truth presents!

But though this sad state of affairs exists, the situation, thank God. is by no means gloomy. Although Christians are passed from death to life (John 5:24) and now live with a new song upon their lips, it is the will of God to subject them to groanings of this sin-cursed world (Rom. 8:22,23). And though God's special mercies doth henceforth attend their ways, they are not exempt from trials and temptations. The fact that a Christian, too, is required by law to insure his car against accident shows his vulnerability to the exigencies of life.

But we thank God that while He uses pain and sorrow to chastise us, sometimes allowing us to go through fiery trials, He will not suffer us to be tempted above that we are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape that we may be able to bear it (I Cor. 10:13). Therefore, when you are beset with troubles, read the Bible! The best book to read from is the <u>Psalms</u>. So you should easily get one at a turn, and if you don't, on the next page or two.

Read it reverently, expectantly. Then commit your troubles to the Lord in prayer. James 5:13 says, "Is any of you afflicated? Let him pray!" But also be sure that your sins are confessed, for verse 16 of the same chapter says, "The effective fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

A recipe of God's sure cure for your troubles is Philip. 4:6,7 "Be careful for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God which passeth all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."



#### BELIEVING IS SEEING

We are all familiar with the saying "Secing is believing". During our first Bible Camp, Rev.Wilson Wong told us a story to show that this saying is not always applicable. Once there were three professors who wanted to prove that there was no God, no scul, and no Heaven and Hell. First, the Professor of Astronomy said, "I look into the sky with the most powerful telescopes and I see the sun, moon and stars. But I do not see God. Therefore, there cannot be a God." The Professor of Surgery said, "Some say that man has a soul. In my operations I have opened many bodies. I see all the organs inside, but I have not seen the soul. Therefore, there cannot be a soul." The Professor of Philosophy said, "I have read many books, but there does not seem to be any that tell of Heaven and Hell, or of anyone who has seen these places. Therefore, there cannot be Heaven and Hell." To these three learned men, seeing is believing: if they did not see, they did not believe.

The audience was much impressed by their speeches, and there was loud applause. When the noise had died down, an old farmer stood up—and—said that he would like to ask a few questions. First to the Professor of Astronomy he said, "When you look into your telescope, do you see the wind?" The Professor said, "No". "Do you believe in it?" "Yes." "But you do not see. How can you believe?" "Well, I see the effects of wind, and its manifestation. Right now I feel it blowing on my face—and—I can hear it rustling in the treetops." Said the farmer, "That's the same with God. We cannot see Him but we can see the effects of His workings. We can feel His presence sometimes around us. We can see His manifestation everywhere."

Next he asked the Professor of Surgery, "Sir, do you have a wife?" "Yes." "Do you love her?" "Yes:" In all your operations have you found out where love is located in the body? Do you see it in some organ like the stemach or intestines?" "Of course not! How can one see love?" "If not, then why do you say that you have love?" '"Well, I feel it. I know that I love my wife and that she loves me. If not we would not be husband and wife." Said the farmer, "That's very much the same with the soul. We cannot see it, but we can feel it: it is in us. Without the soul you would be dead as a doornail."

Lastly to the Professor of Philosophy he said, "Sir, you say that you have read many books, but none tell of Heaven and Hell. Have you read God's Book?" "No What is it?" "It is the Holy Bible. In it God says that there is Heaven and Hell. We have not seen them, but He has and He is telling us!"

This story may sound childish, but it drives home a truth, that seeing is NOT always relieving. Many times we cannot believe what we see with our eyes and many times we cannot see what we believe in our hearts. The traveller in the desert sees an easis in the horizon, apparently a few miles

away. As he travels towards it, he doesn't seem to be making any headway: the oasis remains in the horizon, because he is only seeing a mirage. If he persists in believing what he sees and hurries on, he would be overtaken by the night and be lost, because he believes what he sees at face value. Some years ago a magician by the name of Sorcar while performing in Singapore, was said to have put a woman into a coffin and cut through it with a saw. To the eye, the woman was cut in two. It was most spectacular and convincing, but seeing again is not believing.

Very often we believe without seeing. Just take the history we learn. We all believe in Napoleon although none of us has seen him. Why? Because we believe in the historians, and we see records and evidences.

of his existence. So is it with all the other historical characters and events. Take something we all know, electricity. No one has seen electricity, yet we all believe in it. Why? Because we see evidences of its existence. It lights the electric bulb, drives engines, and you feel it if you hold a charged wire. We know how electricity manifests itself, and the laws that govern it. Therefore we believe in electricity as a fact, although we do not see it.

Similarly with God. I cannot see Him, neither can I comprehend His origin. But the evidences of His existence surround me and I am persuaded, indeed compelled to accept His existence. I see His marvellous works and know that there must be a Master Mind, a Higher Intelligence behind them. I feel His nearness when I seek Him. In the Book of Psalms it says, "The Heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament sheweth forth His handwork." The finished work speaks for its Maker. When we see the orderliness and design of the universe, we can only conclude that there is some great Power and Designer who has set the heavenly bodies in their respective places. When we see the life in animals and plants around us, which we with all our scientific advancement cannot produce, we cannot dony the existence of a Being above all, the Creator who has put life on this planet. We do not know how, because we cannot comprehend His infinite wisdom with our finite thinking. But, we can believe it.

I cannot see the soul, but who am I to deny its existence, when God says that man has body and soul? For God made man and He should know. For Gol so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. In these lines from John's Gospel, we see that the important thing is not to see, but to believe. He who will not believe in the Gospel of Jesus Christ will not see life, but, one who believes in Jesus, will see everlasting life. Therefore, where oursalvation is concerned, it is a case of "Believing is seeing" and not "Seeing is believing."

This is God's wonderful and free offer to you and me. He promises our souls a place in Heaven, if only we would accept the offer on His terms. One very important condition is this: there is a time limit to it. We must

That was not the only reason for their short-sightedness. When they read the verse they thought that God should make all Christians rich - have big houses and cars. Of course, God can do that if he wants, but, first of all, man must give God the glory for what he possesses. There are rich Christians who give even up to 9/10 of their income to Christ. They realise they are stewards of God, not only in money but also in time and service.

God may also give you just enough to live on for He said, "He shall supply all your need." That does not promise great wealth in money. So if God gives you just enough to live on, He is not breaking His promise.

When we read 'the word "riches" we always think only of money. What about your need of knowledge and wisdom? God will supply you with knowledge and wisdom if you only ask.

I know of a family of limited means, but God has blessed the children with intelligence. People cannot help noticing it. Non-Christians and Christians all recognise the fact that God is supplying their needs.

However, there are times when we in our weakness thinkthat God has forsaken us. He has not made us rich in money or wisdom. I have felt that way at times, but when I meditate on God's word I realise that He has a reason for doing that. Maybe I have not worked hard enough, nor have given glory to Him. The fault is mine, not His. One thing I am sure: He is working things his way He will surely supply my need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

# The Sovereignty of God in Providence.

The Sovereignty of God in Providence is a doctrine very full of comfort. By this is meant that nothing happens but what the Lord foreknew and foreordained. He controls as an absolute sovereign, in the very fullest the earth and all that goes on upon it -- the weather, the warring of nations and everything down to the very smallest detail that affects our lives. TOPLADY, the hymn-writer and theologian, quotes with warm approval the following words of Bishop HOPKINS: "A sparrow, whose price is but mean, two of them valued at a farthing, and whose life therefore is contemptible, and whose flight seems giddy and at random; yet it falls not to the ground, neither lights anywhere, without your Father. His all-wise Providence hath appointed what bough it shall pitch on, what grains it shall pick up, it shall lodge, and where it shall build on what it shall live, and where it shall die. Our Saviour adds, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. God keeps an account even of that stringy excrescence. Do you see a thousand little motes and atoms wandering up and down in a sunbeam? It is Ged that so peoples it, and He guides their innumerable and irregularstrayings. dust flies in a beaten road but God raiseth it, conducts its uncertain tion, and, by His particular care, conveys it to the certain place " He had before appointed for it; nor shall the most fierce and tempestuous wind hurry it any farther. Nothing comes to pass but God hath His ends in it. will certainly make His own ends out of it. Though the world seems to run at random, andaffairs to be huddled together in blind confusion and rude disorder, yet God sees and knows the concatenation of all causes and effects and so governs them that He makes a perfect harmony out of all those seeming jarrings and discords. It is most necessary that we should have our hearts we-11 established in the firm and unwavering belief of this truth, that whatsoever comes to pass, be it good or evil, we may look up to the hand and disposer of all, to God. In respect of God, there is nothing casual nor contingent in the world. If a master should send a servant to a certain place and command him to stay there till such a time, and presently after should send. another servant to the same place, the meeting of these two is wholly casual in respect of themselves, but ordained and foreseen by the master who sent them. So it is in all fortuitous events here below. They fall out unexpectedly as to us, but not so as to God. He foresees and He appoints all the vicissitudes of things."

Now this absolute and wonderful sovereignty of our gracious God can no more be exercised apart from the perfections of His attributes and being than it is possible for Him to lie. Many have become the victims of perplexity, misunderstanding, even bad living and infidelity, by overlooking this obvious fact. Rightly considered therefore the sovereignty of God can never be a cruel tyranny or wicked despotism such as is associated with a Nero or a Hitler. It is the unbounded rule of One who is "too wise to err and too good to be unkind"; of Him who "so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son" to be the propitiation for sin, and the Saviour and Friend of the redeemed.

This is a wholly benevolent and beneficent autocracy, and so it is not dreadful but delightful.

Much in this great doctrine is too deep altogether for the human mind to fathom, and we must be content not to know what He has not told us. Happy is that man who still trusts the Lord even when he cannot see clearly the divine wisdom and love in the things which befall him, but is convinced that the Father in heaven rules and over-rules all things, good and bad alike making them to work together for his good; that God cannot be hurried or hindered, but works according to His time-table; and that nothing can cause Him to speed up or slow down His plan.

This great truth brought home to the soul by the power of the Roly Spirit promotes a peace and satisfaction in life which all the trials that come with the years can never destroy.

"THE WORLD'S TINIEST BABY LIVES A NORMAL LIFE." This news was published by the Singapore Standard in August.


I want to thank the Lord for giving me the privilege of nursing this 1 lb.  $15\frac{3}{4}$  oz. baby girl. I saw a great deal of God's wonderful work while looking after this baby. It was a great responsibility to nurse such a tiny baby. It was also a hard job. The only thing I could do was to commit the babyinto God's hand and pray for her every day.

Baby was quite satisfactory a few days after birth. But she started turning slight blue on the 6th day. On the night of the 7th day at 8 p.m. she was very blue, almost navy blue. She was nearly gone. The sister in charge of the ward informed Baby's doctor, a specialist, and the parents, that she was on the D.I. (dangerously ill) list. I could do nothing but pray earnestly in my heart that God would show forth His glory through this baby that He is a God of the impossible. The parents came to see their precious bab, looking very worried and sad. At this moment God's promise came to me, "And call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me" Ps.50: 15. There was great calm in me. I told the parents that unless God spared the baby's life, the specialist's care could do nothing. After the parents left, I claimed God's promise, and prayed Him to deliver baby from death. Every day I prayed that God would show forth His glory by keeping Baby alive.

Nursing a baby under 2 lbs. is a hard job. The baby was fed on mother's milk from a medicine dropper - one drop at a time! If an extra drop was given or if the milk flowed slightly faster, she would turn blue.

Baby's condition began to improve after that night's experience. Every time the doctor saw her, she was pleased with the wonderful improvement. The baby's feed was increased nearly every day. She showed signs of great progress at the end of look months. She could suck from a small bottle, and gradually learned to such from a normal baby's bottle and mother's breasts. She is now 3 months and 12 days, and weighs about 6 lbs!

Thank God for keepingBaby alive and healthy. A member of the hoppital staff told me when I started nursing the baby that she would not survive for more than a few days. Praise the Lord, He does the impossible. My heart's earnest prayer is that Baby may live to glorify God and witness for Him.

I am sure all those who have given cheerfully have received showers of blessing from our Heavenly Father. One thing I have learnt is that the more we give the more we receive.

One day the Lord moved me to help a servant of God.Well,it was near the end of the month, and all I possessed was a ten dollar note. Here Satan came in tempting me to keep it back for my own use. I was weak in the flesh and nearly gave way to Satan. At that moment I heard the Lord's voice speaking to me through this hymn "Yield not to temptation, for yielding is sin." Immediately I surrendered to Him and did what He wanted me to do. Then joy filled my life. Two days later a note was pinned up on the Nurse's Notice Board asking me to collect a rebate of \$20. Lately we bought a Royal typewriter for \$295 at special discount, to be paid in the next three months. An anonymous brother has been moved to offer \$50, and now we need \$245 more. May the Lord continue to work in each heart and help us to store our treasure in heaven. St. Luke 12:34 says "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have showed toward His Mame. Heb. 6:10



"Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." (Ma -rk 16:15.) This is the great commission or marching orders to the Church.

Notice the phrase, "all the world." In Matthew 28:8 where the great commission is also recorded, "all nations" is used. In Acts 1:8 it is repeated as "the uttermost part of the earth". The significance of this triple emphasis is that speeding the gospel to unevangelised regions should claim priority in our Church programme. Or as Dr. Oswald Smith vividly puts it, "Why should anyone hear the gospel twice when others have not heard it once?"

In obcdience to this command, a missionary meeting of our Session was called in March, 1952. Being moved of the Spirit that there was need to extend the witness of Life Church beyond our Island, we decided to form a missionary society which we named the Malaysia Pioneer Mission. To show our determination to support this much-neglected ministry of Christ's Church, an offering totalling \$241 was taken at close of the meeting amidst much rejocing. Soon after this our pastor and Deacon Hsu Chiang Tai were sent on a series of preaching trips to the new villages. This enabled them to contact some 60 villages with the preaching of the Word and the distribution of Bible portions and tracts.

One of the villages contacted from the beginning was Kelapa Sawit. This is a farming centre of 3000 Hakkas, 43 miles north of Singapore on the Kulai Road. Here was a mission newly planted by Dr. Andrew Gih of the Evangelise China Fellowship. December 1953, however, saw the decision of this missionary fellowship to leave the village in order to strengthen their other stations in Tampoi and Pekan Nanas. Thus Kelapa Sewit would need volunteers to take over in January 1954.


Miss Leona Wu of Chin Lich Bible School, which supplied two workers for Kelapa Sawit, approached me if the Malaysis Pioneer Mission might not consider coming in. Being assured that the Lord wanted us to start a work of more permanent nature, we decided to do so. But we were not alone in assuming responsibility for Kelapa Sawit, for that would be too heavy. The Singapore Christian Evangelistic League, of which Miss Wu is president, promised to bear the other half of the burden. We had to supply \$130 per month for our share of work, being \$100 for the support of one missionary and \$30 for rent of the mission church.

One year ago God moved the landlord to sell us the two-storeyed shop house occupied by our mission church. In view of his low price of \$1050 and of much money to be saved from paying rent, we agreed to buy it. Our share of \$525 was speedily over-subscribed which indicated that the Lord's hand was with us. The young congregation at Kelapa Sawit rejoiced to see the work permanently established.

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During the last 20 months, the pastor has visited Kelapa Sawit about a 10 times. On almost every occasion the Lord's Supper was served to as many communicants. Eight persons have been united with the Church in baptism, one old lady of 81 was given a Christian burial, and a young woman has been sent to train at Chin Lien Bible School. Behind these cold statistics, however, many warm tears were wept in sowing. Apart from regular work, special meetings with the help of Misses Laing and Duff of the CIM were held, and messages from Rev. Andrew Lu and Mr. Harry Liu of the Pocket Testament League were given. Then there are the faithful contributors, whom the Lord does not forget, who chip in regularly to keep that gospel door open. Nor does this out-station work remain confined within the barbed wires of Kelapa Sawit. It is our privilege to minister also to sister missions - baptising and serving the Lord's Supper in Tampoi, Pekan Nanas and last but not least, Miss Char's work in faraway Jemaluang.

We have not been equal to the task. Only as we willingly "died" in the Lord were we endowed with strength to extend the witness beyond. Praise be to God for His great wisdom in thrice emphasising "to the uttermost part" in the great commission to His Church. Without this emphasis, perhaps our Life Church would never have been born!



This Bible Memory Course was started in order to help the children in the Sunday School to know the Bible better.


The course was Launched on 3rd October 1954. On that day, the children who were eager to learn the Bible were each given a card on which were the verses for Section I. After a lapse of one week, they all returned, eager to recite their verses. For their hard work, they were each given a trophy for completing that Section, stars to paste on each little section on the card and golden text cards, the verses of which they could learn at their leisure. The whole course is divided into 12 sections, and for every section completed, a boy or girl receives a trophy. The half-way prize, that is, the trophy for Section Six. is a Parker Ball Point Pen. The final prize is a gold-edged Bible costing about 13 dollars.

A boy can take three years to complete the whole course. Though this is permissible, the people in charge of this work always urge the childrento finish the twelve sections as soon as possible. Special reference is made to Phua Chor Kok and Dora Goh for completing their whole course of 270 vertes in a short space of three months, and that was because they could only be tested once a week. Had they been given a chance to be tested everyday they could have finished everything in just one week. Both of them have received their most treasured prize - the gold-edged Bible.

# Feriday Night Family Worship.

Our Friday Night Family Worship was started from the begin ning. It originally began as a Prayer Meeting on on Wednesday night. Owing to the poor response of our members, the prayer meeting had to be suspended. By the grace of God this Friday Night Family Worship has proved a great success. It has grown from a few families to a total of 18 strong.

Fundamentally the programme of the Family Worship follows that of the Lord's Day Service. The only difference is the inclusion of some refreshments at the end of the service. The service is made up of hymns, choruses, prayer, thanksgiving and Bible Study. We have finished studying the Books of Matthewand Genesis, and at present we are nearing the end of Revelation. Occasionally, lessons were drawn from other books to suit a particular situation.

Sometimes we were privileged to have a brother or sister, usually from a foreign land, come to address us. Miss Adeline Char of Honolulu, Dr. A.B. Dodd of Formosa, Dr. John G. Bremen of Indonesia, Mr. Harry Liu of the Pocket Testament League, U.S.A. and Rev. Boon Mark Gittisarn are some of our distinguished speakers. Several times we had to suspend Friday Night Worship in order that we might take part in some more important meetings of the Church, such as Bible Camp, and revival meetings with Evangelist Newman Shih and Mr. Wu Yung.

Our attendance numbers from 30 to 60. It fluctuates according to the locality of our meeting. Many of our families are in the Newton-Tanglin District, and there are three families in Geylang-Katong District. But we are happy to hold service at your home even if we have to go up to Changi Point or Johore Bahru. In such a case, those who have cars usually arrange to give a lift to members who have not.

We would surely be happy to hold services in more homes of our big Church Family. Why not claim this extra blessing from the Lord?







It was after our 1st Bible Camp; God had worked wonders in our midst, and we all felt the greater need for God's things. Prayers were made for God's direction and God's spirit moved our hearts to band ourselves together to study His Word (II Tim. 2:15) and to seek Him in prayer.

On Dec. 31st at the Young People's New Year's meeting, the suggestion for the formation of this Group was made known. About 20 young people decided to join. 
# How to Find Happiness (3) By Willie Seah

## Tow Siew Yang.








Bible Camp should be held with the following objectives:

## MY IMPRESSION



# WANG MING TAO ON MODERNIST LEADERS OF THE CHURCH

(Translation of extract from veteran defender of the Christian faith, Mr. Wang Ming Tao's article "We Are For The Faith!", which led to his imprisonment in Peking in 1955).

"I wish all my readers will understand this: we all have freedom of belief. We must respect the belief of others, as others must also respect our belief. But, this refers to different beliefs. We should not attack those who believe in other religions, nor should we attack those who believe in no religion, just as those who believe in other religions should not attack us Christians, nor should those who believe in no religion attack those who do believe in religion.

"Not so with 'unbelievers' in the Church. These people have no belief. They do not believe in Jesus. They are not Christians but pretend to be Christians, mingling within the Church and preaching some plausible, false doctrines to deceive the believers and corrupt their faith. Such people are thieves in the Church and wolves in sheep's clothing mixing with the flock. It is the duty of every Christian to expose and oppose them so as to prevent them from doing harm to the flock of God. For such people there can be no respect, let alone uniting with them. According to the Word of God, we cannot even receive them into our house nor bid them God speed, for he that biddeth them God speed is partaker of their evil deeds. (II John, 9-11).

## Dr. E. Stanley Jones.

"Spiritual Mobilisation Throughout Singapore" - this is the slogan of a handbill distributed by the Malayan Christian Council to rally support for Dr. E. Stanley Jones in the coming "evangelistic" compaign at the Cathedral grounds, April 28 to May 1. "The extension of Christ's Kingdom at this crucial time in Singapore is urgent and vital", is another of its appeals.

An atmosphere of doing something great for Christ is now being worked up. Christians are being impressed with an approaching season of soul-winning in the coming of this "great Christian leader," and are requested to pray and work for its success.

Yes, Christians should take an active part in any work for God. But, we are also warned to examine it whether the same is truly of the Lord. In Luke 21:8, our Saviour says, "Take heed that ye be not deceived: for many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and the time draweth near: go ye not after them." An evangelistic compaign may be launched in the name of Christ by the highest Church Council, but if the preacher is found to be disloyal to his Master, we must take heed not to support it. We are sorry to say that Dr. Stanley Jones is such a man, and duty demands that we warn fellow Christians from falling to his teachings.

Dr. Jones's statement on the most vital part of a Christian's faith is plainly contradictory to our Lord's. Discussing it in his book, "The Christ of the American Road", p. 150, Dr. Jones says, "I announce some subject such as 'What May a Modern Person Believe?' and then at the close say something like the following: 'What do you do about it?' Well, if you are a member of the Jewish faith, I would suggest that you go home and talk to your rabbi and say to him, "I'm committed. I see what I must do; I'm going to give myself to God and the temple." If you have a Roman Catholic heritage, go home and say to your priest, "I'm committed. I'm going to give myself to God and the church." And if you have an evangelical or Protestant heritage, go home and say to your pastor, "I'm committed. I'm going to give myself to God and to the Church.""

Surely, this sort of evangelism will not save a single soul! The Jews reject Christ as being the Son of God. and spurn His blood as being shed for the remission of sins. Yet, Dr. Jones advises it is all right for a Jew to continue in his unbelief and serve God. Roman Catholicism makes Mary higher than Christ with all the attending errors. Yet, Dr. Jones asks a Roman Catholic to go back to his church without showing him the true light of salvation. Why doesn't he stress that there is no salvation apart from the name of Jesus Christ, and that such faith as a person has must be personally experienced through the work of the Holy Spirit? Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." Jesus further says, "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 14:6; 3:3.)

Indeed, were he speaking to a group of Indian students in the same book, he might advocate that a Buddhist go back to his monk and a Hindu to the Bhagavad-Gita. In another book, "The Christ of the Indian Road," p. 170, Dr. Jones says, "As Christ said of the Old Testament Law, 'I came not to destroy but to fulfil,' so Christ may turn to India and say the same of her religions." Are the religions of India complementary to the one and only appointed Saviour of God, Jesus Christ? The Bible says, "Neither is there salvation in any other, for there is none other name under heaven given among men whereby we must be saved." (Acts 4:12.) "I am the door of the sheep. All that ever came before me are thieves and robbers: but the sheep did not hear them." (John 10:7,8.)

"Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world." (I John 4:1.)

#### MOUNTAIN-TOP EXPERIENCE And at Teluk Paku Bible Camp?

What a day it was for the three disciples of the inner circle! They were away from the feverish haste and din of city life, enjoying the sweet hush and the cool air of that solitary hill.

They were free from the usual routine of daily duties; they were not crowded by sick people, waiting to be healed -- no hungry multitude to feed - no poor to take care of - no critics asking questions - no distraction of any kind. They were perfectly free from the demands of their calling. It was a real change for body and soul.

And yet it was not a picnic - but something infinitely better than that, because they were in the company of the Lord of glory. Wherever the Lord Jesus is found there is bound to be joy and peace. What a thrill it should have been theirs to be in the presence of such a mighty Person who did so many wonderful miracles and taught eternal truths! On the hill-top He was not surrounded by a large crowd, as He usually was. Peter, James and John were the only ones with Him. Now they could have a quiet and intimate fellowship with Him Who was their beloved Lord. Theirs, surely, was an enviable privilege.

Little did they realize that a unique experience was in store for them yet. As they enjoyed such sweet communion with their divine Master, they were over-awed and enthralled to see a marvellous change come over him. The Lord Jesus was transfigured and they caught a glimpseof His transcendent glory and beauty. The brilliance with which His face shone was so great that the writers of the gospels were at a loss to describe it adequately.

They saw also Moses and Elijah on either side of the Lord, conversing with Him as regards His death in Jerusalem. Were they on earth or in heaven - or were they dreaming? They were lost in wonder. Peter blurted out, rather dreamily, "Lord, it is good for us to be here --let us make a tent, one for Thee, another for Moses and yet another for Elijah! "Truly, that was a foretaste of heaven.

This, in a sense, was the experience of some of us in the Bible Camp. Like the disciples of old, we were away from the usual activities and attractions of our city life, and spent a week of fellowship with the Lord - in the study of His precious Word. It was there that some of us first surveyed the "wondrous cross on which the Prince of glory died" and gave our hearts to Him, while others saw a fresh vision of Him, and willingly surrendered our lives to His service.

There it was that the Lord communed with us in a special way and taught us great truths - truths which were unknown to us before. Nevertheless we must not be taken up by the truths, but like the three disciples see "JESUS ONLY". It was really wonderful. It was good to have been there.

How we wished we were there all the time! This, much as we like to, cannot be done. His disciples, after having had this wonderful experience, had to go down to the valley - there to resume their ordinary duties of life. The experience they had was not that they should shirkthe responsibilities of their calling - but that they may do their work with a fresh zest and with renewed love for the souls of men. Now that we have come back to face life in all its sins and changes, problems and buffetings, how are we going to react?

We should translate the divine truths that we learnt into daily practice. The Lord expects us to live according to the vision we had on the mount, so to speak. He is waiting to see if we are going to keep the promise we made to Him that we shall serve Him whole-heartedly. Are you going to be faithful? Are you going to keep your word?



When we set out for our 2nd Bible Camp at Telok Paku, it was with the assurance that God would supply all our needs as He has done in the past. We praise Him, for once again we proved Him faithful to those who put their trust in Him. The great majority of campers were in the non-earning category, and it was obvious that a charge of \$12 per pamper for 7 whole days was far from adequate. Think of it - three full meals a day drinks and refreshments daily, prizes for sports, games and Bible quizes, transport four times between Church and camp, boat rides at Changi, and other comforts and enjoyments - all for less than \$2 a day!

How did we manage it? From the beginning, generous friends of the Life Church Family gave towards the good cause. Dollars began to roll in. Altogether, cash donations totalled \$208.28. Thanks be to God and His people who have seen our need and rallied to our support.

The accommodation of over 90 souls as compared with 46 the previous time, threatened to create grave overcrowding. But our good helper Mr. Lim Lam San, the Principal, very kindly opened to us 2 extra classrooms, which were turned into dormitories. This gave us six dormitories in all, and there was no fear of congestion.

A number of friends contributed gifts of food, which proved to be "life savers" at meal time. Many times our appe-

tites ran wild, and mountains of food disappeared in record time. It was then that these extra items came to the rescue. On the whole, every camper had 3 square meals a day. There were times when service was inadequate to cope with over 100 mouths at a sitting, and if any camper was starved at all, we promise to do better next time!

We are thankful to the Counsellors who were willing to rough it out, living among us in true camping fashinn. We certainly enjoyed the spiritual delicacies which they lavished on us many times daily. That week of feasting has only served to whet our spiritual appetites, and most of us are longing for more.



We are convinced beyond any shadow of doubt that an even richer harvest will be reaped days that lie ahead, through the bountiful mercies and of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, to whom be glory, honour and power for ever and ever, Amen.

## (FAITH) DORIVITORY



## SWIMMING REPORT.


Life Savers: Tan Swee Teck and Robert Seah


The weather was not as kind as we would have liked it to be. On two evenings, outdoor games had to be cancelled because of the adverse weather. However, on the whole, it was not too bad.

C. Thank you very much for your good advice. But, (looking at his watch) Oh! I will be late for my dinner. My wife will be looking for me, and

will be angry. She, she is fierce, you know. See you again.

M. Good-bye, but just a moment please. Would you mind keeping this small booklet, please. (Hands over to him the gospel of John) Good-bye!
C. (Carelessly puts it in his pocket, and hurries off with his basket.)

SCENE II

Place: In the Chinese man's home, in his bedroom. Time: Late in the night.

### CHINESE MAN:

He enters the room wearily, throws away the coat on the chair, and drops on the bed. Remains still for a minute or two.

His heart seems greatly troubled, and although he tries his very best is not able to sleep. Rolls on the bed.

Suddenly but softly, he murmurs to himself: "No, Christians are bad people, I don't like them." (pause.)



"But, but the missionary does'nt seem so bad. Good man, Good Christian." (sitting up.)

"No, I don't believe in such person. Believe that Jesus, the European God? Our Chinese Buddha is certainly better. Thousand times better." (pause.)

"No! No!" he shouts, "I don't want to be influenced by such people." I don't want Him..... I want to go to sleep ..... (pause.)

A real blessing, the summer camp spansored by the L i f e Church in August has proved to be to the children of my family.


Two of the children sought the Lord in tears and in trembling and received definite assurance of salvation.


