To enlighten our minds further on giving to Woodlands, let me share an excellent article I've brought back from U.S. by Rev Frank Mood, assist. pastor to Dr. McIntire. He writes on:

Building the Church

The Bible gives many directions about building the work of the Lord. I Chron. 29 deals with our attitude toward the work before us. Vs. 1 gives the picture. "The work is great: for the palace is not for man, but for the Lord God." This puts the work of building in proper relation to everything else. David says it is "great". We are doing a work which is not some run-of-the-mill work, not an everyday job, not a common thing, not a routine event, but "it is a great work." This makes it something very special and outstanding, something that demands our very best.

Building the church requires that we give our best. The best of our time, the best of our years, the best of our life, the best of our efforts, the best of our talents, the best of everything. I cannot be sloppy and careless in building the church, it demands my best. I must be precise and exact, it must be the best I can give and do.

The greatness that demands so much in building churches is found in the fact that "it is not for man, but for the Lord God." This shapes my whole concept concerning the building of the church. The work that I am called upon to perform is not something for man and his standard. It reaches far above the level of man to the very peak of perfection. It is "for the Lord God." And the Lord God is holy and His house is holy (vs.3). When we realize this aspect, then our attitude falls into its proper place. Then church building supercedes e rything else, it becomes a great work, the greatest work in all the world. It must come that and it calls forth my best in meeting God's holy standard.

David knew the greatness of the work and gave his best, his all. He says, "I have prepared with all my might for the house of my God" (vs. 2). It was a personal work for his God that required the preparation for building with all his "might", his wisdom, his abilities, his time, his wealth, his all. It was always the preeminent thing in his life.

Again, David says, "I have set my affection to the house of my God (vs. 3). David was reciprocating to the love which God had shown to him. David's heart belonged to God and that is where his treasure was. "I have of my own proper good ... given to the house of my God over and above that which I have prepared for the holy house" (vs. 3). In the vernacular of today, we could say that David was all wrapped up in the work of building the church. It is this attention I give to this important work that soon reveals if my attitude is right or wrong.

May we realize that building churches is a great work that we are not labouring for men and their praise, but we are working for the Lord God and He is holy. If this is our attitude, then we can proceed with the work of building true churches. (end of quote).

Building the Church in the Believer's Heart
Of greater importance is building the Church, the temple of God, in the believer's heart.
Eph. 2:19, so says we are of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone. The apostles represent the N.T. and the prophets the O.T. Our foundation is the Bible, God's Word, Jesus' Word.

"Blessed are they that sow beside all waters

That send forth thither the feet of the ox and the ass! (Isa. 32:20) This exhortation from Isaiah to go out humbly for the Lord was acted upon July 1978. I was on my way to West Kalimantan when I first met the "boat people" at Tanjung Pinang. We held several gospel meetings with these "vanguards", as a result of which 9 were baptised. This Christmas I received a card from one of the nine. This Vietnamese brother, Ly Chan Thang, now settled in Aust. writes: "I was (one of the nine) baptised by you. You led me into the door of everlasting life. Time flies. That was more than a year ago, and I've not written you since. How are you? Have thought much of you. May the Lord preserve you always. A Happy Christmas to you and the brethren". May this evidence to God's saving grace, like the Samaritan leper returning to thank Jesus, spur you on.

If a chance contact with the Vietnam "boat people" had won a soul like Ly Chan Thang, how much more will the reinforcement of a permanent Slum Children's work. We have gone out in earnest to build at Siantan, Pontianak a Church-Kindergarten, 7.5 m x 14 m on about 2 acres land bought 3 years ago at only \$2,400. This new Church should be ready in 6 months. Despite the Woodlands project, we gave Rev. Djunaidi \$10,000 in Oct. to get started. Another \$10,000 is pledged by a lover of build-

Woodlands, Ahoy

When we dropped our sealed tender envelope for Woodlands into the box that fateful late morning of Sept. 17, we were well assured the deal was won. From that day concerned and anxious hearts have inquired after the result.

Some weeks later, a first "wireless" message reported we were the highest. This was confirmed from another quarter. Yet some had qualms.

Dec. 6, 1980 the eve of our trip to U.S., a second "wireless" message came. This said we were chosen by HDB, and the files were sent up to the Minister. This relieved the long lull that intervened. Another surge of excitement! Yet some would rather have it official in black and white.

Thurs. Jan. 8, 4 p.m. the phone rang. Elder Dr Teck Chye said, "Woodlands is ours. This is official. It is announced by the Minister!" "Woodlands at last, Woodlands, Ahoy!" I was overjoyed. I could jump up the ceiling! But the next minute was solemnised by that sombre thought:

"Payment in 2 weeks - \$900,000!"

The latest figure of our offerings and loans totals \$778,332.87 (This included several \$10,000 earned interest through the extended delay.) What we immediately need is \$122,000 plus legal fees and duty. An elder who had put sums of money into his children's P.O. Savings Account is the first to rally to the Lord's Cause. Perhaps. \$10,000:

My heart is full of praise and thanks to the Father Almighty for leading us all the way. Hitherto had the Lord helped us! Ebenezer: When we launched out into this Woodlands Project in earnest Assist 1979, we started with someone giving his whole month's \$1,25D/-. We rallied to \$150,000 by Christmas. When we went to tender in Sept. that sum had struggled to \$300,000. In $3\frac{1}{2}$ months since that day the die was cast, our fund had climbed to wo \$580,727.62 Plus \$196,000 loans, we are now heading for the \$800,000 merk! This is the Lord's doing. It marvellous in our eyes. There is no more that sinking feeling in a financial ocean separating us from the promised land. We are now as near as standing on the shore of Johore Bahru. We san swim this distance with confidence. Woodlands, Ahoy!

Beloved, as your pastor returning from America to earry out the unanimous decision of the Session, I have exerted every ounce of strength, under His Mighty Hand, to lead you into the Promised Land. We are now, like Joshua encamped at Gilgal before Jericho, poised for the attack. But Gilgal, which means Roll-away, must see to the circumcision of the whole Israelite Army. This means cleansing, cutting off the old, fleshly, sinful life and have it rolled away before victory can be won. How true! As we launch out in the next 2 weeks to take ever Woodlands, how we need to cleanse ourselves again of every known sin that will hinder God's work. The spiritual conditioning is more important than the silver and gold offering.

- 3. The "Promised Land" itself sat atop a hillock rising to some 30 feet above road level with a clump of shade giving trees rising majestically to 60-70 feet into the sky.
 - 4. The surrounds were free from any disturbing neighbours.
 - 5. Ours is the only site for a Christian witness and house of worship.
 - 6. The site strategically overlooks the Johore Straits and the Mainland.
 - 7. The price of your tender is now a real bargain!

No doubt all these benefits are known to you. But for me, I am reminded of the Queen of ba who told King Solomon after seeing the kingdom for herself: "...I came, and mine eyes had seen it: and behold, the half was not told me."

Exciting things lie ahead for you, dear Lifers. I am thrilled by your liberality. I hear a brother has promised to donate all the furniture. How wonderful! To all others who are rallying to build God's House: the blessing is yours! Let every Lifer rise to the occasion and not lose your opportunity. Can I also have a share?

Affectionately yours in the Lord, Dr Tow S. Hwa. "NOT BY MIGHT NOR BY MY POWER BUT BY MY SPIRIT SAITH THE LORD OF HOSTS"

This famous saying from Zechariah 4:6 is actually spoken by the angel to Zechariah the prophet to be conveyed to Zerubbabel. Who is Zechariah and who is Zerubbabel? Zechariah was a contemporary of Haggai the senior prophet who both returned from Babylon with Zerubbabel the Governor of the Jewish returnees. Together with Haggai Zechariah preached to the Jews to encourage them to rebuild the Temple of Solomon, which was destroyed by Nebuchanezzar 70 years ago.

"Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit" is said not only to Zerubbabel, but also to us today, who are now entered into the second phase of the Woodlands project. God promises to be with Zerubbabel by His Spirit to help him accomplish the great work of raising up the Second Temple. God promises also to be with Lifers to build a New Life Church for Him. God says through the angel, "The hands of Zerubbabel have laid the foundation of this is: his hands shall also finish it" (Zech. 4:9). God assures us by the same faithfulness in St Paul's words, "He which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Phil. 1:6).

The will of our Session and Congregation to build a second house of God at Woodlands was manifested in the rousing response of pledging \$101,000 in gifts and loans at one stroke last Sunday, so that the \$900,000 required of us to pay for Woodlands was exceeded. Hallelujah, praise, praise the Lord! Our faith thus exercised will now take us to greater heights.

At the entrance to Woodlands Town there stands a blue mosque with a 100 ft tower well-visible to Malaysians driving in from Johor Bahru. Can the Church of Jesus Christ be lesser in appearance? Let God's House that stands for the true Way of Salvation be built by a greater faith and love with the help of His mighty Spirit. Let it bring honour and majesty to Him who is forevermore exalted to the right hand of God the Father. Further, hear the Word of the Lord by Haggai the other prophet, "And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the Lord of hosts, The silver is mine and the gold is mine, saith the Lord of hosts. The glory of this latter house shall be greater than of the former, saith the Lord of hosts: and in this place will I give peace, saith the Lord of hosts" (Haggai 2:7-9).

Willing-hearted Offerers

Now that the first phase of our Woodlands Project is accomplished, I said to myself, "Let us re-visit the site to determine the layout and shape of the Building." No sooner had these words escaped my heart than the phone rang. (Ex. 35:21,22).





MOVEMENT OR MONUMENT?

Our Church is known as the Bible-Presbyterian Church of Singapore and Malaysia. We claim Malaysia for Christ by virtue of the three churches we've established in our neighbouring country. They are Kelapa Sawit (1954), Rawang (1972) and Kulai Besar (1973). These three churches are under our care. We are grateful, however, for Calvary helping out at Kelapa Sawit and Kulai Besar. As Rawang is Teochew-speaking, it remains my duty to visit, not too regularly to administer the sacraments. So, I'm off this Lord's Day. (I'm grateful for Dr. Patrick Tan chairing the pulpit and for Rev. Jim Turner speaking in my place.)

Since a Church in the true sense is a missionary movement, and Life Church has been enabled through the years to branch out, it is my joy to report on Rawang's extending to <u>Bukit Gambir</u>, 12 miles to the north. Here the young people have been maintaining a Gospel witness for a couple **of years** by holding a midweek meeting.

Kelapa Sawit has a new Church-Kindergarten completed as recent as July 1978. Deacon John Ling, of late, has been talking with me about some outreach. Perhaps we should branch out to Simpang Renggam, an important junction-town 20 miles north. This could be a joint project for both Kelapa Sawit and Kulai Besar. This will provide spiritual exercise for the upcountry Christians, as Kulai Besar has been a means of blessing to our young people from Singapore. The Church that stops evangelising begins fossilising. Or as it is said elsewhere, a movement that stands still becomes a monument.

In 52 days ... In 52 weeks,

When Nehemiah led the Jewish returnees from Babylon to rebuild the broken Wall of Jerulem, and finished the work in 52 days, he became a marvel to all the inhabitants. Even his enemies had to concede defeat, "for they perceived that this work was wrought of our God" (Nehemiah 6:15).

When God is behind our work, there is nothing that can stop it. Do you know that this Gilstead Road Church and the FEBC L-Annex took only 15 months to build? And the 3-storey Kindergarten-College extension exactly one year (Apr. 1968 – Apr. 1969)? As it is now perceived by the whole Church that Woodlands is of the Lord's pleasure to build, let us hasten to an early completion of the project, inspite of labour and material shortage.

That "this work was wrought of God" is, however, matched by "the people had a mind to work" (Neh. 4:6). In our present situation God's pleasure to build a House at Woodlands is answered by "the people has a mind to give".

Notwithstanding a 6-figure pledge the week before, new gifts for Woodlands flowed in unabated the following week - angpows, angpows, angpows, adding up to over \$6,000. At this rate we can predict there will be an avalanche of angpows this Chinese New Year to head towards the Million mark. In this connection the Sunday School is taking a lead. This is a very wise decision. Sister Catherine Ong, writing in Lively Stones, bids us not to "squander our money in an afternoon shopping spree and other forms of entertainment". Yes, why waste your substance on frivolous buying under the spell of the dollar spinners when turning them in to the Lord yields eternal value? As we all have this mind to use our angpows more aningfully, we shall soon see the new Life Church rising above the hillock, over the "town-square".

I won't say 52 days. If we can commence building in 52 weeks, this work will be seen to be wrought of our God.

Like the Mini Skirt

It has been observed that as the young men's hair gets longer, the young women's skirt gets shorter. In algebraic language, their lengths tend to vary inversely with each other. But I have also observed that the mini-skirt has grown back to old-fashioned lengths (good for you girls!). What's the moral behind this observation?

For a decade at least the guitar with its modern versions of hymn-singing has taken over. (Now, I'm not against the guitar nor against modern compositions if it is played right and if they are composed right). But I have also observed this: few of this new fangled stuff will last into the next decade. Newer ones will have to be concocted as these become out-fashioned, like the mini-skirt. What's the reason? The music, like the mini-skirt, does not measure up to the standard. The words, like the mini-skirt, do not measure up to the standard either. Fancy one "Gospel" hit being sung, around about Abraham having multiple sons. What's the glory? The "chef" of this modern hotch-potch either doesn't know his theology or the newest Singapore family fashion, "Two is enough". Insofar as theology is concerned, the sons of Abraham by his concubines Hagar and Keturah (does this shock you?) are the fruit of the flesh. These are mentioned in shame than anything else, a warning to us men! What's there to sing about the multiple sons of his concubines? If there is anything to write about Abraham in regard to his children, it is Isaac the seed of promise, that leads to our salvation in Jesus Christ. If there is any song to compose about Abraham's children, it is Isaac's obedience in giving of himself for a burnt-offering, a wonderful picture of our Lord's pacrifice on the cross for our sins in obedience to His Father.

In vain do I look for the unadulterated Gospel in these modern song-hits. "Pass It On", with its sissy tune that I hear even on Life Church grounds, tells of the wonder of experiencing God's love and the imperative of spreading it around. But it does not tell me what kind of love it is. There is not the slightest glimpse of the cross, nor of the Son imparting the Father's love to me. Like the mini-skirt, like "Ramona", that favourite of cinemagoers in the late twenties (where is it now?), "Pass it on" will pass on — into oblivion.

Now on the word "love" in these song-hits. "Love" like the word "girl" is so abused in modern usage that unless you sanctify it with holy definition, it is, like a sarong, used as a hasty covering for lust. "Love" is the talk of hippies, of Lennon and his ilk and of "the Children of God" but what love? "The greatest thing in all my life is loving You" can conjure a host of unlovely things in the "love"-programmed young mind today. "Loving" can be as lustful as the mini-skirt. Like the mini-skirt.

And nowadays, it is not enough to worship God vertically. The fashion, like the miniskirt, being introduced, is "horizontally". Like the mini-skirt. - T.T.



Deep-sea Fishing for Christ

When Peter launched out into the deep at the Master's Word, he drew in two shiploads of fish. Since 1952 when we launched out into Malaysia we have been favoured with three - viz., Kelapa Sawit, Rawang, Kulai Besar.

Last Sunday's expedition was an extraordinary one. Rev Andrew Bo, Stephen Masila and I set out in the Volvo. At Bt. Timah we picked up Freddy Yong, wife and son. As all these had never seen

the hill of Woodlands we digressed for a special visit before crossing the Causeway. were delighted with the goodly heritage.

At the Kastam the tax officer asked if we were from some Consulate. (In India I was once asked if I was "Diplomat".) Most probably, I remarked to Rev Bo, he was the Ambassador, I his driver and Stephen cook. He agreed according to II Cor. 5:20. In this ambassadorial elation we were suddenly flagged to stop by a traffic cop. Looking up into the perplexed faces of the "ambassadors", the cop considered for an eternity of 30 seconds when he decided to let His Higher Majesty's officers off. "Praise the Lord", I muttered. Something inside me had warned not to go above 55 kph (we're in City limits). "\$50 saved for Woodlands", I exclaimed!

Our first halt in Malaysia was for an inspection of Kulai Besar. The \$6,400 renovations - hew well had they put into the job? Praise the Lord, the result was more than I had expect- an increase of 50% floor space, beautifully and sensibly finished. (When shall I take the WF to Kulai Besar?).

By-passing Kelapa Sawit (which I'm visiting Chinese New Year's Day) we headed for Simpang Renggam. We drove through the village past where the CIM in the 50s had stationed a lady missionary. Today there is wanting a gospel witness. Will the Lord send us here to revive His work?

We took lunch at Air Hitam. As there was time to spare we took the West Coast Road to Batu Pahat. Our purpose was to comfort Elder **Phua T**ian Kang in his sick-chair. How he wept with joy to see us, and blessed us with a heartfelt prayer!

But what was so extraordinary about this visit was our meeting with Mr Phua Seng Kok, our Woodlands architect. As Session had delegated me and Dr Patrick Tan to negotiate with HDB for better terms and our architect is a professional in such dealings, he kindly offered to come along. "The steps of a good man are ordered of the Lord" (Ps. 37:23). Architect Phua has also agreed to visit the Woodlands site with me as soon as possible, so as to get out the layout plans. The earlier we build, the more we save:

At Rawang we preached to about 50. Chinese New Year fever, perhaps, had kept some away. Another reason was the shifting of young adults to the cities to seek a livelihood. Nevertheless, Rawang still has a sizeable young people's group, which produces a weekly song-

Stephen Masila gave a short testimony. I preached on Jesus the Bread of Life. I pointed out that the Lord's Supper, while being a means of Grace does not itself save. Only Jesus does when He is received with relish, as food is by the hungry soul. One cannot rely merely on the Lord's Supper for salvation, since this could not save Judas in the least. Though he ate the Lord's Supper, he was exposed as Christ's Traitor. He was called, after the Feeding of the 5,000, a devil.

Before we went on our American vacation, I had written Rawang about our needs at Woodlands. A collection from 16 people and groups yielded \$2,035.46. 16 angpows, I'd call them, since these are gathered on the eve of Chinese New Year. This said sum is about the same amount given earlier by Kelapa Sawit. How the upcountry brethren and sisters love Life Church! Since the Malaysian \$ is 7 cents smaller than the S'pore \$, we'll use this sum in Malaysia so as not to lose on the exchange. Do you need Malaysian \$\$?

After service one elder and several deacons together with the Pastor's wife took us to Muar for some seafood. We ate to our hearts' content. For our lodging Elder Kua Keng Woo has insisted we stay at the late Madam Lim Siew Guat's. This house with all its A1 facilities has always been opened for our lodging, since 1965.

Nay, 1955! If you read up our 21st Anniversary magazine, you'll find the story of the "Three Musketeers" staying at Lim Siew Guat's during that fateful Synod at which we repudiated the liberalism and ecumenism of the missionaries. Since they had roped our Chinese Church into the World Council of Churches, and we could not bring about a withdrawal, we seceded from our parent body to form the B-P C Movement.

But why did I return to Trinity, Muar to minister in 1965? Because Muar voted with and for us, and has stood with us to this day. Interestingly, the Chinese Synod is both in and out of the Ecumenical Movement, for the allegiance of member churches is split. We serve those who take a stand with us. And I have extended a special invitation to Elder Kua and his session to attend the coming Conference of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches, to be held at Gilstead Rd and Pandan, June 8–12, 1981.

Alas! The Muar River had bogged down Rev Cook, pioneer English Presbyterian missionary who founded Living Water Church here, 1892. He had intended to go all the way to Penang. Alas! Though we've crossed the Muar River to take Rawang, we've failed to go farther north. Nevertheless, Mr Chew of Petaling Jaya is under our tutelage at FEBC for a year. After this he could start a B-P service there. Unless we keep on advancing, our movement will become a monument. Deep-sea fishing for Christ with boat and net, not with line and hook, sitting up some creek. Yours faithfully, T.T. MR. LEE KUAN YEW'S CHINESE NEW YEAR MESSAGE

Reprinted from The Straits Times, Thursday Feb. 5, 1981, distributed by Life Bible Presbyterian Church, S'pore

On New Year's Eve, Chinese Singaporeans honour an ancient custom. They meet at the home of the patriarch of the extended family for dinner. The eldest of the family, whether grandfather or father, has his sons, their wives and their children gather around him.

It is not taught in the schools. No books of etiquette spell this out. Nevertheless, this practice will not die. It has been part of Chinese tradition for several thousand years. It is honoured by universal practice and enforced by social convention. Hence the tremendous rush of Chinese from Malaysia to bus stations, railway stations and airports for their family reunions.

Precepts

Then, on New Year's Day, the young wisit their elders in the family: Grand-parents, parents, uncles, aunts, then their peers, siblings, cousins, other relatives, and then their friends. The protocol order stems from Confucianist precepts: The five basic relationships, first that between prince and minister; second, father and son; third, man and wife; fourth, brothers and sisters; fifth, between friends. When these five sets of rights and obligations are properly observed, order and stability will prevail over society.

Varying degrees of blood relationships were noted in exact nomenclature for each relative: Paternal, as distinct from maternal, uncles and aunts, then whether they are older or younger than one's parents. Elder or younger brothers and sisters, maternal or paternal cousins, are differently called. Each title used to carry with it concomitant rights and obligations. It is a patriarchal society, in which ties of blood through the male line are primary. Changing habits have made everybody an uncle or an aunt. We should encourage a return to these correct titles, in Mandarin. They will underline the obligations to one's parents or one's grandparents, obligations which cannot be discharged by putting them into old folks' homes.

I visited Ang Mo Kio on Sunday, Jan. 25. I was dismayed to discover that our youngest new town has two old folks' home. It is not something to be proud of. It must not be encouraged. An old folks' club for the elderly to meet each other, play chess, amuse themselves, go on outings — by all means; but not a place for old parents and grandparents to be abandoned.

Unique

Sons must shoulder their duties. And in an age of two-child families, and equality of the sexes, daughters, too, must shoulder their responsibilities for their parents. This problem has often been discussed in Cabinet. Some Ministers have proposed legislation to give parents the right to maintenance from children they have brought up. Only if they are invalids or need special nursing, can children be allowed to send them into government institutions.

Fortunately, our young know it is a shame to leave parents in institutions. At a private charitable hospital, children who visit the parents they have left there, often pretend that they are friends or distant relatives, not sons or daughters.

With the knowledge of consequences, we should have encouraged much earlier on, in the late 1960's, joint balloting for parents and children, for either adjoining flats or flats on the same floor. The solidarity of the family, the basic unit, has seen Chinese societies through the last 4,000 years. It is a civilisation that is unique in its continuity. It has survived in recognisable form despite the ravages of flood and famine, fire and pestilence, wars and earthquakes. After each catastrophe, people picked themselves up, dusted themselves, and cleared the debris. They recognised their obligations to each other and to their families, acknowledged the rights and obligations of relatives and friends, observed their duties, and enjoyed the privileges as citizens of the ruler. Gradually civilised life was restored.

The HDB is studying several ways to make it easier for families to stay close together. Most parents do not want to move to a new town. They prefer their children to be given homes in the old estate. Unfortunately the old estates are fully built up; and as only few old blocks are rebuilt, there are not enough rebuilt units to accommodate requests for priority from those wishing to transfer from the old blocks. Most new homes are in the new towns. HDB can help in the sale or exchange of old flats, to make it financially attractive to exchange an old for a new flat. Grandparents help bring up children better than daycare foster parents or creches, or servants. In the cycle of life, parents, in turn, will become grandparents. 114,000 or 4.7 per cent of our population are over 65 years at present. They will riss to 164,000 or 5.4 per cent by the year 2000.

Encourage

We must make determined steps now to encourage the extended family to stay together in adjacent flats. I know that the present practice in Western societies is different. They consign their old to government or commercial institutions, even when there are no medical reasons to justify it. Of the advanced industrial societies, only the Japanese have an unbroken history of over 2,000 years. And the Japanese do not put their old in homes for the aged. These Asian traditions and values have enabled our forefathers to survive under hostile circumstances, as during the colonial period, when the government was not interested in its subject people. It is unsound for a government to take over family responsibilities, for we shall damage the basic unit of society, the family, the building bricks of our society. I wish all a happy and prosperous Chinese New Year.

"PEACE TO YOU FROM THE LORD!"

The topic of my message this first Sunday evening of the Chinese New Year is "Peace to from the Lord". This message is prompted by the Editor of the Bilingual Page of the you from the Lord". He offered \$50 some time before the end of the old year to anyone who would submit the Most Meaningful Chinese New Year Greeting. I suppose you can count the title of this sermonette a meaningful greeting. But, alas, I haven't got a chance to that \$50 angpow, since the closing date of contest was Jan. 29, and today is Feb. 8. I am 10 days behind that \$50 ang pow.

But why must the sending in to the Editor of the Bilingual Page of a "Most Meaningful New Year Greeting" be rewarded with money? Isn't the selection of the best, and the honour of being selected, as good an incentive? Ah! Didn't I also hear "Gong Xi Fa Cai" already, as this subject was broached. And "Gong Xi Fa Cai" is the age-old Chinese New Year Greeting that wishes you lots of money to make? But is making lots of money the chief purpose of life? Why not? Hail to the mighty dollar! "If you have money", as another Chinese saying goes, "You can make even the devil to slog for you!"

Money can do a lot of good, no doubt, but what I'd like to point out here is money is not everything! There are more important things in life which money cannot buy. Can you name some of them? Well, let me start off by naming health as the No. 1 important ingredient of life, and if it is not all—supreme in this earthly life, it is at least equal to hey, since it rhymes with wealth. Another ingredient is Happiness, such as you most oesire in a happy marriage, a happy home, happy children who honour you and make the grade in school.

Now, coming back to health. Youngsters who are in the pink of health cannot understand what I say until age begins to take hold of you. But, at least, those of you who are over

forty will begin to agree! (Some lower my estimation to 35.)
At any rate, money is not all. The trouble, however, is not with money, but with that desire within you to get rich quick. Is it a good desire or a bad desire? That inordinate, that insatiable, that unquenchable desire! To make a fast buck by job-hopping or by pulling a quick deal, or by trying your luck in a dip here and another dip there. To get rich by hook or by crook is not the best policy! King Solomon, the wisest man that ever lived, says in Proverbs 23:4,5 "Labour not to be rich: cease from thine own wisdom. Wilt thou set thine eyes upon that which is not? for riches certainly make themselves wings; they fly away as an eagle toward heaven". Another version of Solomon's Wisdom reads, "Don't weary yourself trying to get rich. Why waste your time? For riches can disappear as though they had the wings of a bird!"

Her name is power. Political power is what Solomon is thinking Money has a twin sister. about in these verses of the same chapter. Proverbs 23:1-3 says, "When thou sittest to eat with a ruler, consider diligently what is before thee: And put a knife to thy throat, if ou be a man given to appetite. Be not desirous of his dainties: for they are deceitful meat". Dana Lam, talking about Chinese New Year traditions in the Straits Times, says, "And if your boss were to pick for you a choice piece of chicken at the Company dinner on New Year's Eve, it would indicate that your services would be terminated in the New Year!" As a man is often over-ambitious in money-making to his own sorrow, so is he destroyed by the power he over-ambitiously craves from kings and governors. Jesus says, "For what shall it profit a man if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?"

"Gong Xi Fa Cai" is not the most meaningful Chinese New Year Greeting, I'm sure. Or else, why should we be asked to look for another? And since, as the Apostle Paul has also declared; "The love of money is the root of all evil..." and "they that will be rich fall into temptations and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts which drown men in destruction and perditions" - does this not remind you of that notorious gold bar murder case which took place quite some years ago in our City? Yes, money is not all, and how true the saying, "the love of money is the root of evil". Money is neither good nor bad in itself. It is the lust for money in man that makes it bad. Jesus says, "Man does not live by bread alone but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God". And Jesus who knows all our desires is He who has diagnosed our souls' sickness. He comes to put us in the right frame of mind. Yes, more than that, He comes to lead us out of death into life by dying on the cross in our stead, to pay for the penalty of our sins. He gives us life, even life everlasting, life more abundant.

Jesus is also the Prince of Peace. He who is the Prince of Peace gives us peace, not as the world giveth. "Peace I leave with you". He says to His disciples, "my peace I give unto you, not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid."

Why must we pray for this peace and wish one another this peace? The peace that comes from the Lord Jesus? Because we are not merely made of flesh and blood. Our needs are not in the physical realm only. There is that inner man, the soul within us that must be taken into account. As the body needs food, the soul, the hear? and the mind, needs what Jesus

calls peace. St Augustine, in his search for peace, prayed, "O Lord, thou hast made us for Thyself, and our souls are restless till they find rest in Thee." Thank God, he found that rest, that peace, he was seeking for. From a playboy he became a saint. He is the greatest Christian philosopher whose writings have deeply influenced the Christian Church after him to this day.

Dear listener, the quest for money will never end. The more you make, the more you will desire. A friend of mine told me while he was making quick money in the black market under the Japanese occupation that he would retire after the first million in "Tiger" notes was reached. Do you believe him? You have the answer! Christian listener, in regard to your getting more and more involved in the world, and less and less with the Church, St Paul has this to say, "(the money) which while some conveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves with many sorrows". The apostle John says, "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him." (I John 2:15). A Christian should rather be a master of money. and not a slave to money! A Christian should use his money power, way beyond the tithe, to further God's Kingdom. "Give of thy wealth ... And all thy spendest Jesus will repay".

Whether you are Christian or not, the more meaningful Chinese New Year greeting I've given you, "Peace to you from the Lord", is not mine, but as it is clearly stated, from the Lord. This greeting is taken from Jesus' own words which He spoke to greet the troubled disciples on the day of His resurrection. The peace He offered them and us today is real peace, not of this world, but from above. It satisfies every sincere seeking heart. Jesus says in another place, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of Me for I am meek and lowly in heart; and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matt. 11:28— 30). So let us hear God's Son say to us again, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (Jn. 14:27). With His promise, I can greet you more meaningfully with "Peace to you from the Lord" this Chinese New Year. Or if you would have it in Mandarin, is not"Gong Xi Fa Cai" but "Ju Ci Ping An". "PEACE FROM THE LORD TO YOU".



BLESSING. OF BLESSINGS

Epilogue to last week's Radio Message, "Peace to you from the Lord"

At Chinese New Year it is required of us to speak kind words, so as to bring blessing or good luck. New Year couplets with good wishes written with the brush on red paper are pasted on either side of the door. On the lintel above the door, also in red, reads such a familiar wish "Wu Fu Lin Men" that is "Five Blessings to this Door". Overhanging the front of the house is a crimson streamer.


Now, what are the five blessings that the Chinese pray for at the beginning of year. They are long life, wealth, health, love of virtue and a natural death. The root of these earthly blessings may be seen in the composition of the character Fu, Blessing. This composite character is made up of four radicals put together, which signify: one, mouth, field and altar. A field to yield to the support of life, with its attendant blessings, however, cannot be complete without sacrifice made to God. Hence the altar radical.

This ancient Chinese idea of sacrifice as the root of blessing is wonderfully corresponded by the etymology of the word <u>blessing</u> in the English language. The English word <u>bless</u>, according to Webster, comes from an older English word, <u>blod</u> which in modern English is spelt <u>blood</u>. What blood? Webster says, "From the consecration by sprinkling the altar with blood". The book of Hebrews in the New Testament, says, "Without the shedding of blood is no remission", i.e., without the rhedding of blood, there is no forgiveness of sin.

The Chinese and English idea of sacrifice and blood as the root meaning of blessing can be traced to the Jews. Originally called Hebrews the Jews were slaves under the Pharach of Egypt until God raised up Moses. Moses had to contest with Pharach ten times, sending plague after plague before the Hebrews could go free. The last plague God sent upon the Egyptians by Moses was the slaying of all of Egypt's firstborn. Now, for the protection of the Hebrews, for the keeping out of the angel of death from their homes, God told His people to kill a lamb. With the blood shed from the lamb that was killed they were to dab the door posts and lintel of their house. Those who kept within this blood-stained door during the night the angel of death visited were safe. The angel of death who saw the lamb's blood "passed over". Hence this new-yearly sacrifice of the Jews was called the Passover Feast. Does this strike you as something wonderful? Isn't it a marvellous correspondence with the Chinese idea of a red streamer over the front of their house?

There can be no New Year's wish of five blessings in the full sense of the word blessing, without the lamb's blood being shed. What does the lamb stand for? John the Baptist calls Jesus the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world. St Paul declares, "For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us!"

As I have said earlier this evening Jesus is our Peace, and I wish you Peace from the Lord this Chinese New Year instead of saying, "Gong Xi Fa Cai", let me also point out that Jesus is our blessing. He is the true blessing, the blessing of blessings, because He was made to be sin for us who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God in him" (II Cor. 5:21). All our earthly blessings come to nought until we have obtained the heavenly blessings. Until our sin-sick souls are washed and cleansed by the blood of the Lamb. Until we have the inward peace, that comes from God to those who find the forgiveness of sin through the blood of Jesus Christ. Without this true blessing, the five blessings of earth are not only shortlived but meaningless.



Christ our Redeemer died on the cross, Died for the sinner, paid all his due; All who receive Him need never fear, Yes, He will pass, will pass over you.

DOHAR LETTER TO LIFE CHURCH PASTOR, Feb 3, '81

I am very glad to know that you are being delegated to see the work in Sumatra. I sense your interest for the work in Medan, and it has been my prayer that my brethren in Singapore would stretch out their hands to help me. But before you made a move I would like to inform you about the situation now in Medan.

Since my returning from Singapore to Medan, in January 1980 I have been invited to preach at various churches. And then in February I was called to teach Calvin's Institutes to a Women's Group. And then to conduct Bible Study to a Women's Fellowship. And slowly the husbands also joined the wives, and now we have Bible Study for husbands and wives. And through this contact, they ask me to start a Sunday School for children and juniors, and then for Y.F.

All these activities have been going on far six to seven months. But when I told them last month (January) to start a new Church, they were afraid. They said to me, "We do not build a new Church, but we will be a light witness in our own Churches". Now I am in a difficult ground. I do not argue with them. I pray that God will make them realise the importance of establishing a Biblical Church.

Now I am still teaching them but they have not been ready to come out of their own churches. Because Bible-Presbyterian is new to Indonesia they are very careful about it. As I think over the situation, my plan is to convince them of "the need of a True Church".

Now we have twenty children gathered at my house. This is the only meeting which is held in our own building. So it is called B-P Sunday School. Now I am reaching to junior and youth. This month I am inviting them to come to my house. I feel safer to hold the meeting at my house, but the house is too small. It can take only 20 people:

The seed of the Gospel has been sown in the heart of the people. It is now growing among the fairest and hardest ground.

Finally, I would like to praise God for all of you (Life Church) and others who zealously give to the Woodlands Project.

I would like to thank A.F. for their prayers and support for Medan. And I have received Francis's letter, and I am very glad he is coming to Medan. A very warm welcome to Francis and his company.

I will fetch you on your arrival in Medan. As for the facility, of course a simple room which is built by the help of the brethren here is waiting for you. May God bless you with a good journey. Yours in Christ, Dohar S. Siregar

When Rev Bo showed an interest in my Medan trip, I felt my prayer for a companion was answered. Truly, his coming was used of the Lord to augment my witness (the testimony of two men is true. Jn. 8:17).

Our trip to Medan after 9 long years cannot be without significance. It was in 1972 that Rev Quek and I first went over Sumatra in response to a request from Dr J.C. Marris our ICCC Gen-Sec in Holland. From this contact made, a stream of young people has been drawn to FEBC. Dohar is one who stands out, who treasures the Calvinistic teachings he has received, who now is teaching the

same to widening circlesof seekers for Truth.

Among those he has ministered to since returning to Medan over a year ago are two women's fellowships. These WF numbering 14 are a lay people's movement, because the established Protestant churches to which they belong are practically dead. Their pastors are no more of the old type. These modern ones smoke and drink and patronise the cinema. They have no message to give to their congregations. The WFs come together to pray and sing, but above all to hear the Word. Dohar has been called to preach to two of their groups and has found acceptance among them.

These two WF's combined to hear us. Over 25 of them, mostly wives of the more wellto-do, good singers and good prayers, received us. Rev Be gave a word of testimony, a . I preached. In the evening a Young People's Group numbering about 30 also heard the Word.

Our coming has sent a current of excitement into these groups. The leader of the WFs asked me what our mission to Medan was. I plainly told her and the group the purpose of our coming.

Dohar has felt that the time to launch the B-P Church of Sumatra had come. My purpose of coming therefore was to discuss the launching of the project. Most important of all was a visit on the spot so as to determine how the work could be advanced.

A two-day survey of the land has given we a clear picture. We have everything ready for the launching of the BPC Sumatra! We have a new terrace house somewhat like our Kulai Besar set-up, belonging to Dohar's father. It is one in a Govt. National Housing, where hundreds of people (without a Church within several kilometres) are settled. This house is now gladly given over to Dohar by his father, a devout Christian speaking perfect English. He told me he had become a BPer in his heart when he first came to know our Church through Dohar. This new terrace house has added to it a sizeable back-room from funds previously sent to Dohar. It is therefore quite spacious to hold S.S. and worship.

On the day appointed, Feb. 19, 13 adults gathered to inaugurate BPC Sumatra. a-sermon by Rev Bo to mostly women gathered, I spoke from Jn 4 where Jesus says God 1. seeking the truthful and sincere to worship Him. Mr Wesley (Dohar's father) offered to add his testimony. With tears he gave his witness. That today Dohar is able to preach and serve the Lord is in answer to his lifelong prayers. Dohar's father is glad also for Haposan and Agus studying at FEBC. Henceforth, we can be sure a strong work will be established in this Housing Estate.

At present this new house where Dohar is starting anew is short of equipment. We can help by offering a small organ, a tape recorder, one or two fans and a fridge. As the work progresses we should think of buying some property for the building of God's House and perhaps a kindergarten, etc. The needs before us are great. Count-less souls are held in the clutches of sin and superstition by the Devil and many false prophets and witchdoctors. Pray for the work ahead. Our Mission is accomplished - BPC Sumatra is launched! But the battle ahead is just beginning. Pray for Dohar! (Total cost of this Mission, \$380: Rev Bo is self-paying.) Francis and Lit Miah are visiting Dohar, Mar. 4 & 5.-----

Do you know that apart from Dohar up in Medan we have work at Tg. Pinang, Riau Islands, at Siantan, Pontianak and Kumpai, West Kalimantan (Rev. Djunaidi). Some of the funds given the last 2 years have also gone to help Rev. Ormeo's Bible Institute in the Philippines? Such outreaches for the extension of God's Kingdom are what St. Paul describes as

"from a peculiar people, zealous of good works" (Titus 2:14). At Siantan, Pontianak, West Kalimantan, Rev Djunaidi has bought all the materials in readiness to build a Church-Kindergarten, scheduled to be completed June this year. We've received \$10,000 from one zealous for Asean missions, so that the funds needed by West Kalimantan are being met. Expresgram to Rev Djunaidi: If you have time why not come for a short visit?

Not only must we trade with every talent God has given us, we should make it pay the highest dividends.

The way we put our multi-million property at Gilstead Road to use must follow the line taken by the 10-pound servant. To make 5 pounds is good, but not good enough. Seeing there is a greater need of our Book Centre (now to be run by a Book Trust of which Life Church is a member), the L-corner room hitherto used by the S.S. Pr. Dept must make way for this higher priority. Fortunately there are 4 big Kindergarten rooms with much bigger space for the S.S. to choose for their transfer. The pastor will arrange a smooth promotion to the FEK classroom. The L-corner room will be linked to the main book room by an archopening in the wall where the counter is.

Another renovation to be made is to open a door into the front bedroom of the downstairs "Guest House". This will turn it into an office by day, and sleeping place by night, if needed. For this room is the least used by guests. This alteration will make it a multipurpose room 24 hours of the day and night. Unless every inch of our valuable property be put to the utmost use we are losing much by default. A businessman tells me that per sq. ft. of floor space at Orchard Road leased for trading purposes costs \$20 per month! And we're not too far from town, are we? Thus when the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches meets at Life Church June 8-12, we should use every available space for the promotion of the Conference. Save some guests hotel expenses, we are willing to open our parsonage during Conference week. He must increase, we must decrease.

Polishing up and Painting up

The decision to repaint our Church was made in mid-1979 prior to our return from America. When it was resolved to re-tender for Woodlands, that decision to paint up was shelved. We needed to conserve every dollar (and we've just made it).

GOD

Now that a little respite has come after a great struggle, and Gilstead Road will be centre of a Far Eastern Church Assembly, June 8-12, Session has decided to implement its 1979 decision This will be a great expense to be sure! But, remember, this sprucing up is long overdue, overdue by a decade for the exterior facing Family Planning and the new HUDC flats. Let us not do it by order of the Ministry of Environment!

THE STORY OF JOASH, THE TEMPLE-REPAIRING KING, (II Chron. 24:4-14) ***

To finance the repainting, and repairing of our Church, Kindergarten and FEBC annex, we will follow the good example of King Joash by placing an offering box at the main entrance. This is to facilitate the bringing in of freewill offerings by the Lord's people. When the Woodlands tender was in the process, we concentrated every ounce of strength towards our successful bidding. In celebration of this victory, and with a little respite after the great total effort, we can now devote part of our resources to renovating these Church edifices. This is killing two birds with one stone, since the 10th Gen. Assembly of the FECCC is coming to us in June. Will it not be a joy to see God's House decked like a bride for the Heavenly Bridegroom?

In the busine\$\$ world, everyday count\$! Even to a fraction! In putting your money into the Bank, if you go after 11 a.m. (am I right?) you've lost a day's interest! What's that to me? When it is a big sum, 9 \$630,000 at 12%, you lose \$210 (approxima)y) per day. That is the position we are in!

HDB replied Mar. 2. The letter arrived on Mar. 4. It accedes to our downpayment of 30% without interest. The rest of the sum, 70% = \$630,000 is chargeable at 12% p.a., dating from Feb. 7 (we profit by 2 days of Chinese New Year, otherwise it would be from Feb. 5).

Now we've paid \$45,000 deposit in the first instance. To make up 30% we're paying HDB, Mon. Mar. 9 \$225,000. But the rest of the sum still payable, which is \$630,000, is owing interest at \$210 (approx.) a day. reason why we cannot pay the \$630,000 at once is: this sum in various instalments is accruing interest, and maturing on various dates in the fortnight following.

Like fighting a fire, we've quickly taken \$18,000 and \$5,000 from our branch organisations to pay in, so as to save part of that \$210 chargeable every day. If you can spare any sum for just two weeks to save interest, please see Deacon William Teo today!

My dear Readers,

"The Lord Hath Done Great Things for us;

Whereof we are glad" (Ps. 126:4)
Although many of us were feeling quite sore last week over HDB's imposition of 12% interest on 70% of our tender price for Woodlands, which works out to \$7,200 odd, our Treasurer discloses we have counter balanced with as much earned interest and the more, by the delay. This puts us in a better position than had we paid in cash the whole amount on Feb. 7. In this respect, we should publicly thank the Lord! Yes, "the Lord hath done great things for us whereof we are glad" (Ps. 126:4). "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God ..." (Rom. 8:28). The latest about Woodlands is that we have paid HDB \$45,000 + \$277,000 (Mar. 9) + \$531,000*. By next week, when the last sums in Bank mature, we shall have paid in full, including stamp duty, etc. We have just enough to settle all accounts in this first phase of Woodlands. Praise the Lord again, I say. This is possible because apart from the \$18,000 + \$5,000 lately taken from sister organisations, we've a \$20,000 loan converted into gift, and another quick loan of \$10,000. *(Mar. 14).

121/2 % As you know, we have of late been earning 121/2 % interest. How much does \$900,000 earn in one month? Ans: \$9,375. Alas! With our cruze of oil and barrel of flour emptied to rockbottom, our earning power is now reduced to a shadow. Last year we earned about \$25,000 intext, and from this year \$5,000 and \$6,000 per month, and heading steadily upwards still. As God has so ordered in the affairs of men, we've paid up. We've to start from kosong all over again.

To help replenish quickly our deposits with the bank in order to earn 121/2 %, may I once again appeal to you who love the Lord to give your tithes in advance. Calculate how you could help swell the Lord's Treasury by such economic arrangement of your resources: If you put yours into the Lord's bank instead of the POSB, how much difference in interest in \$1,000 can you accrue? Don't say, "A few tens of dollars!" If 100 of you will do the same, the increase of the Lord's Treasury by wise trading will gladden every heart. "Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in my house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it" (Mal. 3:10).

Appeal In regard to our appeal for waiving the 12%, our architect has submitted for a reason the occupation of our land by a precast concrete manufacturer, a hindrance to our surveying operations. "We feel it is unfair to charge our client interest if we cannot occupy the site after the balance is paid up". May the Lord's will be done.

Calling the Middle-aged! My reason for enlisting the 40-50s is they have just matured to an understanding of life education and experience. They will more readily assume leadership in the Church. Praise the Lord, one in his early fifties and the other in his early forties have heeded the call. They're plunging into fulltime study at FEBC!

Let me share with you the reasons given by these two time-tested man.

A is bilingual, and a music teacher by profession. He is elder of an upcountry church, English secretary of the Chinese Presbytery. He says, "Partly encouraged by your exhortations all these years, I have decided to train at FEBC. Should I live up to 70, I've but 18 years left to serve God. The times are also very uncertain, and the need of the Church is great. So I must give myself to serve the Lord".

B is principal of a Music School, has a Teacher's Diploma, numerous certificates in music qualifications. B testifies: "In 1979, I reconsecrated myself to the Lord. My mother passed away on 19 June, 1980 and I was filled with a sense of utter spiritual inadequacy and despair during the funeral service. I believe my mother is with the LORD. I had no doubt about it. The realisation that one day I too will also meet the LORD convicted me of my sinful ways. I prayed to the LORD that I wanted to know more of Him. I want to love Him and worship Him with all my heart, strength, soul and spirit. I want to obey Him even if He called me to serve Him. I prayed that I will never want to stray away from Him ever again. The Lord answered my prayer. I began to develop an insatiable and delightful desire to study His Word. Through another Christian brother the LORD taught me to trust in Him and believe His Words and to claim His promises for living a victorious Christian life. In August I was suddenly struck by a feeling that what I had accumulated and gained during the past eight years, materially, was nothing at all in His sight. I could not bring these to Him. It was only temporal and of no consequence to Him. I was convicted and realised that the only meaningful thing to do is to devote my life and time ministering unto the LORD and to the studying and teaching of the Word of God, the Bible

On October 30, 1980, I was quite restless in the afternoon after lunch. I then took the book "HE SPOKE, AND I WAS STRENGTHENED" and just opened it with no particular page in mind.

This was what I read: Go in this thy might ... have not I sent thee? (Judges 6:14)
Go, in this your might: I have put a power within you.

I have given you a determination.

I have given you an energy

I have given you an overflow.

Thus, from your innermost being shall flow rivers of living water. You shall find a momentum-a-current-a-tide of power flowing out of you. Your life shall be one that is energetic and overflowing. You shall be as one who has something to give for I have given you assurance, confidence, and humble boldness. I will give you a mouth and wisdom that can neither be gain-said nor resisted. Even as Stephen of old was full of faith and power, and did great wonders among the people and even as he spoke with such wisdom and power that the people were not able to resist him - so shall it be with you.

But you shall not go out with haste, nor by flight. I will go before you.

Stop. Think. Understand that it is I who am working within you, both to will and to do of My good pleasure....

These words spoke so real to me and of my character and personality too. What more, my Christian name was even mentioned. No other name was mentioned in the whole book except this particular page. I could feel my blood rush to my face as I read through the pages. I believe the Lord called me. I returned home and told my wife the whole incident.

I was to wait on Him. So I waited and three months passed by. 

Pang, Dr Tow Siang Hwa. The Woodlands Church resembles the Gilstead Road Church but is wider slightly, with a fellowship hall below. Behind is a two-storey parsonage and kindergarten annexe with Sunday School rooms and library, quarters for staff, etc. etc. Estimated cost: \$2 million.

I'm pleased to report our fixed deposit A/C is not entirely kosong. As you have once again rallied to His Cause, we're starting to earn interest again. But let the gifts come in quick. They start to earn Monday morning!

Djunaidi Letter, Mar. 11, '81

Thank you for the remittance of 3 million rupiahs (S\$10,000) through Mr Liau for Church-Kindergarten construction.

Mr Huang of Sanggau came to Pontianak last week to discuss the prior need of fencing the church grounds. For security and protection of our building materials Sister Johanna's (our co-labourer in the Slum Children's Work) husband agrees with us this is a highest priority. We have

therefore decided to use part of the construction money to buy 300 "salt wood" poles for the fencing. Cost: 2,250 rupiahs (300 rupiahs = S\$1). Also several dozen rolls of barbed-wire netting costing over 200,000 rupiahs, (not counting labour). Once the building materials arrive from upcountry (cheaper to buy there) we will start work. Target date of completion: mid-June. ...

Expresgram to Djunaidi: Please come in time to attend 10th Gen. Assembly of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches June 8-12. We shall dedicate the new church after mid-June. Repainting our Church Buildings

Since the completion of our Church auditorium Feb. 1963, FEBC L-Block Sept. 1962 and the Kindergarten-Extension April 1969, the Church had only one repainting, Feb. 1973, by Mr T.C. Eng, FEBC repainted in parts once or twice and the Kindergarten, insofar as the classrooms are concerned.

There was a plan to renovate the Church in July 1979. In view of our decision to enter Woodlands, this plan was frozen. With the 10th Gen. Assembly of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches convening at Gilstead Road coming June, we have no reason for further delay. Moreover, the back of FEBC is so fungus-dirty that we can expect a notice from the authorities anyday!

Since Session decided a month ago to give the whole complex a thorough face-lift, we've made contacts with Mr Ng, one who has done a fine job for several Lifers. With lightning speed, the scaffoldings were erected last week, while the Kindergarten classrooms were the first to come under the brush.

The cost of renovating the Church auditorium is \$6,000, and of the Kindergarten and FEBC blocks \$7,000. For a start, FEBC has offered to contribute \$3,000. Other users who should gladly offer to the Lord's House are: FEK, CLBC, Sharon, Korean, Life (Chinese) and Pepsi. Are you not pleased with this honourable citation?

As for Lifers we are naming the 3 offering boxes at the front and side entrances "King Joash" Boxes. These are to receive your offerings to go directly to the repainting of the

Church. King Joash used this method to gather free-will offerings from the Lord's people to repair the Temple. It was in bad shape in his time! And the Lord bless ed this method, and His people, abundantly. A weekly report will hence be given, as you see the repainting job mount with the days. Can we labourers together with God match the speed of the painters?

Incidentally, we are re-activating the central Road Lamp, and we've installed an overhead one above "Jerusalem Court", and erected a Globe Lamp for the Roadside Garden - all for \$400! Who'll offer these to the Lord? Added also 8 crescent stone

Those who touch the wall are blind

The prophet Isaiah has a very interesting observation: "We grope for the wall like the blind" (Isa. 59:10). It is the blind who touch the wall to get around. But if you have eyes and touch the wall (surely not to find your way around) you are doubly blind! You are blind culturally and aesthetically.

One reason why we've despaired of repainting the Church buildings is this: no sooner is the wall, the lower wall, spruced up so new and fresh like a daisy than it is smudged by some blind hand. It is excusable to touch the wall if you are blind. But if it is due to mere bad habit, then there is no excuse whatsoever. And I have observed this also: Touching the wall is not only the mass bad habit of the young, but of the old as well.

Now our Government has held many a campaign to instruct citizens not to litter. It is high time all heads of departments of our Church, from Sunday School Primary right up to the Session, educate our people not to smear up this new job of a repainted church. And if there is no improvement from before, it shows we are a people blinder than the blind.

Parents should instruct their children, including civics. Cleanliness, next to holiness, is an essential Christian virtue. Nor are the Church grounds the daily responsibility of FEBC students (there're several who above their assigned duties, keep our grounds spick and span for the Lord). Everything on the Lord's property is your responsibility and mine. And those who talk but lift not a finger are dumb.

Man Proposes, God Disposes

The repainting of our Church auditorium was scheduled Mon. Apr. 6-Sat. 11 when there we dn't be any wedding or other function. This matter was confirmed with Mr Ng our contractor.

Man proposes, God disposes. When Mrs Tow and I went to survey Woodlands last Tues. morning, the sub-contractor for scaffoldings had the Church hall all rigged up during our absence. Anger was our first reaction. On second thoughts, this might be God's better plan to allow the painter more time to do a proper job.

So, that's the reason why we are worshipping in the green porch and under the Kindergarten awnings. In order not to clash with the Chinese congregation, we shall have a combined service, Dr Patrick Tan speaking, me interpreting. And if you miss that comfortable seat of yours inside the most comfortable Church Hall, then put that which you ought into the King Joash Boxes! To save trouble, however, we'll collect altogether in today's worship offering.

Now, the King Joash Boxes yielded \$220 last week + \$80 (Pepsi) + \$100 (Reformed Tape Lib.) + \$3,000 (FEBC).

Easter will be here in 3 weeks! Every year it is our custom to join with other B-P churches at a Sunrise Service at McRitchie Reservoir (once or twice we diverted to Petrce).

This year Presbytery has decided, at the instance of Dr Tow Siang Hwa, to hold Easter Sunrise Service at Woodlands! This will serve also as our land-claiming. Easter Sunrise Service on the 31st year of our BPC movement, is symbolic of taking a great forward step for God's Kingdom, inasmuch as Woodlands is bridgehead on Johor Straits with all Malaysia before us.

1981 is a significant year. It was 100 years ago the Chinese Presbyterian Church was founded, from which we've sprung. 1981 is the year our BPC is rising to Synod status. 1981 is the year when the greatest Far Eastern Church Assembly will convene in Singapore, at Gilstead Road and Pandan Gardens. And after mid-June a new Church-Kindergarten will have arisen over the slum-children's shacks at Siantan, Pontianak. Truly, this Easter is redolent with the fragrances of your loving service for Christ and His Kingdom.

Young man, young woman, what is your ambition?

It is important that young people have ambition. Ambition sets a goal. Ambition resolves to win. Without ambition life is a dribble.

Nevertheless, a Christian young man must not let his ambition override him. His aim in life must be subjected to Christ. An FEBCer who was a schoolteacher before, upon graduation, chose to go to a remote country so as to impart Christ to her young pupils. There's a higher purpose in teaching, the saving of young souls. This is surely accepted of God.

Let not your ambition take you outside God's will for your life. A devout young man, Baruch by name, served Jeremiah the prophet as his secretary. Then he felt he had greater things he could do. Perhaps he was tempted to leave the service of God to go into some "higher" position in the world. Jeremiah cautioned, "Seek them not: for, behold, I will bring evil upon all flesh, saith the Lord; but thy life will I give thee for a prey in all places whither thou goest." War was coming, but Baruch's ambition blinded him.

Some devout young people feel called of God. Until that selfish ambition lurking within is completely crushed, it is impossible to serve Him. Young man, young woman, what is your ambition?

Every Lifer I've met has commented joyfully on the removation now going on the buildings. But you will agree that if we are to renovate, we have to renovate all the way. There can be no half measures. For while the walls and ceilings are shining bright, this sparkling beauty reflects the more adversely on the dull old pews! And what a conglomeration of chairsred; brown; green, yellow and "black": (The recent addition of new yellow fibre-glass chairs, to be further fortified with another hundred by a deacon, is one noteworthy saving feature). Then there are the old Boyanese benches that need a coat at last, and to be added should be 2 or 3 rows of high-legged ones for the back balcony). All these grouses from your pastor mean we should be prepared to spend at least \$20,000 to complete a good job. Yet, this is just a paltry sum for a Church of our size. The same sum can be lavished on a 5-room HDB flat.

The Jews who returned from Babylon so lavished on their new houses, "with floral ceilings" (Chinese transl.), but contributed not a shekel to the rebuilding. Admonished the Lord, "Consider your ways: Ye have sown much and bring in little ... and he that earneth wages: earneth wages to put in a bag with holes" (Haggai 1:6). But the Lord also commended: "Build the house and I will take pleasure in it, and I will be glorified" (Haggai 1:8).

In this connection, let me exhart you not to grow weary in offering your tithes to Woodis: On our part we have strained every nerve to raise the fixed deposit by diligent management. Your early contributions help to swell our fixed deposits which are still earning good interest. So let us go forward together. "Be a new cloth and not an old garment!"

One happiest highlight of Easter celebrations in our Church since her founding 31 years ago are baptisms. The newest additions to the Church are our firstfruit-offerings to the Lord. There are over 40 of them this Easter, not counting believers' children and transfers.

Other Elders are Edmund Tay, Khoo Peng Kiat, Lau King Hong, Lim Teck Chye, E. Mahadevan and Peter Wang. "He that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet Shall receive a prophet's reward" (Matt. 10:41).

Rev Timothy Pietsch of Japan Reports on Pope and Billy Graham



that each of the Four Evangelists has given a sizeable portion to record the events of the Holy Week? That is from Jesus! riding a donkey into Jerusalem to His crucifixion, Good Friday and resurrection Easter Sunday? Their ratios may be seen in this tabulation: Matthew 8:28; Mark 6:16; Luke 6:24; John 9:21. Which Evangelist's is the highest?

The importance placed upon the events of the Holy Week has moved the Church to yearly commemoration, though we are constantly reminded of His Death once a month by the Lord's Supper and of His resurrection every Lord's Day. To emphasise the importance of the saving acts of our Lord during Holy Week, we have written you earlier than previous years. We have exhorted you to come worship Him today, Palm Sunday. Palm Sunday commemorates our Lord's Kingship. Let us go on from here to meditate on His betrayal, crucifixion and resurrection. Finally to His ascension and the sending forth of the Disciples into all the world with the Good News.

In regard to the great Commission, the order to march forward with the Gospel, let us redouble our efforts as we see the dark night closing in. If we cannot do very much in speaking, let us support others who can! Like Dohar in Medan and Djunaidi in West Kalimantan. Easter is not to be celebrated as a custom, but with purpose and devotion to make its message known throughout the world.

Our mandate to form the Chinese Presbytery comes from Paul's injunction to Titus, "For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee" (Titus 1:5). Yes, we have to get the Chinese Churches more organised, and raise up more preachers!

But are you concerned for your Chinese-speaking parents and spouses? Our Life Chinese Service is advanced to the morning purposely to facilitate their coming. Do your bring them in?

In this matter, Nazareth Gospel Mission has set a good example. It has held 4 Parents' meetings, in Hokkien/Cantonese. Tanglin Bible Class is similarly burdened. Pray for me as I shall be speaking to their parents May 1 & 2 at FEBC Hall.

One Secret of B-P Church Growth

Church Growth is a hot subject these days for theological seminars. We see church growth not in talk but in action, with devotion to the Saviour.


We believe in this principle of Church Growth! To increase Him we must decrease ourselves. Not centralisation but decentralisation.

In decentralisation we have given much from the Mother Church to the daughter churches. Grace Church, Kului Besar, are examples. Result: God has blessed with 21 branches in 31 years. The more we lose ourselves, the more we gain, like Galilee's ever—outflowing waters.

Decentralisation is all the more needed in an overcrowding Church. Take the young people of our Church for example. Must all come under one central organisation called Life Church Youth Fellowship? From the doctrine of decentralisation we've practised successfully hitherto, we have Tanglin Bible Class, and various smaller groups that are just as much a part of Life Church. There was the Pistis Group, and there are the Ecclesia, Singing Disciples, and now Laos Makarios. The Beulah group has branched from the Y.F. We encourage all such branchings—out than discourage them. Decentralisation has also saved our Church from "overheating".

"HE MUST INCREASE, BUT I MUST DECREASE" (John 3:30).

Let all branches work in complement and with compliments to one another. - The latest branching out, incidentally, is from my Adult S.S. Class. It has been filling one side of the Church. I thank God for Elder Mahadevan for siphoning off 11 disciples. By such decentralisation the S.S. will further increase - one secret of BP Church Growth.



An Extraordinary Trip!

The trip I made with Rev & Mrs Quek to Malaysia last week was extraordinary in 3 aspects.

1. It was "to set in order the things that are wanting, and order elders in every city"
(Tit. 1:5). We are of the mind that Deacon John Ling and Deacon Tsou Yah be elected elders, who have been faithful over the Lord's household for two or more decades. Kelapa Sawit, partly the work of the Evangelistic League, will apply to join our Chinese Presbytery. So will Rawang, which has also two elders.

2. While Rev Quek showed slides of the Kampuchean Relief at Living Water Church, I had the pleasure of driving with Elder and Mrs Kua Keng Woo to Pagoh, 16 miles north of Muar where a Gospel Station has been established for the last three years. About 50 Chinese students came to hear the Word which was preached in Mandarin.

Inasmuch as Pagoh is the outreach of Trinity, <u>Bukit Gambir</u> is being evangelised weekly by the young Rawangites. Several of the young converts from Bukit Gambir came to the Rawang Service for the first time. How heartening! And inasmuch as Rawang is joining the Chinese Presbytery, Bukit Gambir becomes the farthest outpost of BPs in Johore.

3. Never before in all my travels to Muar have I encountered such a big flood. At the wheel of Rev Quek's Toyota 2000 I suddenly found our car at the back of a waiting lorry, while the headlights of a greeping on-coming car revealed a sea of water! Like the children of GIsrael crossing the Red Sea in the night with the pillar of cloud and fire guiding them, the Lord had prepared a lorry to take us across!

Not seeing the half-dozen long stretches of water ahead, we clung

innocently to the lorry that ferried us over what turned out to be a half-hour of agonising battle with the churning water. Rev Quek was my co-driver. He kept uttering, "Trust God. Trust God. Step on the gas!" Step on the gas! did with all the driving experience I had. Then when the last stretch of foaming waters, like a disturbed lake surrounding us, was crossed, the lorry drew to the side to let us pass. That was the only lorry going through, and we were the only car following. Coincidence? Then came the Word of Isaiah to my memory, "When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee" (Isa. 43:2). God rather was my co-driver! And Isaiah says again, "When thou walkest through the fire, thou shalt not be burned; neither shall the flame kindle upon thee". What a consolation as we face a future looming with an atomic holocaust. Our shelter is God. May this ordeal of ours be shared to the strengthening of your faith. Then come also the words of our Risen Lord, "Fear not; I am the first and the last: I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore. Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death" (Rev 1:18).

Testimony of Wendy Wong Wai Ling

I come from a non-Christian family and was an ancestor worshipper before. But I thank God that now He has brought me into His kingdom.

I heard of the Lord Jesus Christ since my primary school days. When I was in secondary 3, a few Roman Catholic friends often told me parables of the New Testament. Since then 1 began to take interest in Christianity.

Then God opened my eyes to see that I was a wretched sinner and Jesus Christ is the only Way to salvation and reconciliation with God. I invited the Lord Jesus Christ into my heart five years ago,

My conversion was not something dramatic. I thank God for His conviction and guidance to know the Truth and not follow the Catholic faith (which is a great possibility when I come to think back of it, if not for His mercy and grace).


My early Christian life was not good, in the sense that I was not growing, until I began to have Bible Study with my sisters, and joined the Christian fellowship in school.

to have Bible Study with my sisters, and joined the Christian fellowship in school. In December 1978, I was invited to Life B-P Church to attend the Christmas celebration. From them, I gradually began to know what the Church is like. I attended the Youth Fellowship meetings but not the Sunday Worship Service because of the fear of my parents' objection. But with the encouragements from God's people and His Word, God helped me to make a stand for Him. I began to attend Worship Service from September 1979.

At about the same time, I left the YMCA. Two years ago, I was very involved in the social work there. But the Lord spoke to me through very many people. I realised that that was not a place for a Bible-believing Christian, I came out of it. From then on I concentrated on serving in the Church. There is nothing more joyful than doing God's work together with God's people.

I have been a Christian for five years, but I did not know the importance of Baptism till last June. I heard a message on Evangelism. The speaker said both Baptism and Evangelism are commandments of God. Most of us, he said, would get baptised, but would not evangelise. What struck me in that message was that Baptism is commanded of God. So that is the reason why I've decided to be baptised.

Baptism was my resolution for 1981. I am very happy that this resolution will soon materialise this Easter Sunday. Praise the Lord:

For this is Cheng Beng (Annual "Tomb—) sweeping") which coincides with Easter. How they deceive themselves by burning Hell Bank Notes for their deceased parents' use in the underworld. How does this Hell Bank Note speak to you?

Beloved, the abuse of God's land by heathen worshippers should spur us to build His (Light) House there to shine in the gross darkness. This burning of "Hell Bank Notes" should prick our conscience to re-double our efforts to bring Chinese idolaters to the True Way of worship.

In this connection we should all support the Tanglin Bible Class Gospel Campaign for Chinese—speaking parents and loved ones, May 1—3. Please pray for me as I am requested to preach to them in Hokkien and Cantonese. The least you can do for His sake is to pray for me, and bring your unsaved Chinese-speaking loved ones, May 1-3, to Church. Souls saved in this campaign are channelled to our Chinese Service.

Easter culminates in the Great Commission - Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel (Good News) to every creature. Let this Easter be celebrated not with mutual congratulations among ourselves, but with a concern for our unsaved relatives and friends.

Easter is Evangelism

Easter has come and gone for most of us who are "slow of heart to believe" (Luke 24:25) and to preach. Easter did not last for a day to the Disciples as it did with us last Sunday: Sunrise Service at Woodlands (something special this year), Communal Breakfast on the Church Grounds, a record number of baptisms. But that's all. Easter went as quickly as it came. It was a ritual.

If we believe Christ rose from the dead Easter Sunday, we should be bubbling over with joy, like the Disciples, to tell others of the Good News. Our hearts should "burn within us" as we hear the message preached from the pulpit. We must do something to advance the Cause of Christ. We must save those outside Christ before sudden destruction is rained down from heaven when He returns.

Praise the Lord, one vibrant member of the Commonwealth of Life Church, the Tanglin Bible Class, is re-living and reenacting the Easter story. Do you know that Easter was a forty-day experience of the Disciples with the Risen Saviour through 10 appearances? Do you know that the Great Commission which was given "officially" at the Ascension was in fact delivered to the Disciples the first evening of the Resurrection? Jesus said to them, "As my Father hath sent me, even so send I you". It is no happy coincidence that our Tanglin Bible Class is holding a series of 3 Gospel meetings to the Chinese-speaking on the heels of Easter, May 1-3, 1981. It is the divine imperative, the fire that burns in their hearts after meeting with the Risen Saviour that quickens them to action. Their action has stirred my heart to action too. But, how about yours? What will you do with Jesus?

The least you can do is to pray for these Chinese Gospel meetings. Pray for me the d's mouthpiece. Bring your Chinese-speaking parents, relatives and friends!

Every follower of Christ must be an active witness! But if we cannot do as much as others, we can support with our funds. Hearing of the TBC's needs, an elder spontaneously offered \$400 after last Tuesday Night's prayer meeting. Similarly, a sister, upon seeing the strategic location of Woodlands at the Sunrise Service, handed a third sum of \$10,000 to the Treasurer. - 2. My path leads from the Empty Tomb Where He rose from the dead! It brings me to the Upper Room Where all my friends are met. With Thomas I shall worship Him, And I'll call Him my Lord. O won't you give your heart to Him? Jesus the Son of God?
- 3. And from the lone Emmaus Road Christ leads His followers on: He meets with us in Galilee, And gives our hearts a song. Returning to Mount Olivet, We hear His last command: Go ye, go into all the world, Go ye, go into all the world, Go ye, go into all the world, And preach the Word of God! I want to walk where Jesus walks And serve Him all the way ...

(To the tune of "I walked today where Jesus walked", from Songs and Verses from the Holy Land.)

" I LOVE THY KINGDOM, This classic hymn of Christendom says in its 3rd stanza,

"For her my tears shall fall, For her my prayers ascend; To her my cares and toils be given, Till toils and cares shall end".

So, Paul became a bond slave to Jesus Christ. So are we who love the Lord and His House. We will not spare an ounce of strength to labour for the extension of His Kingdom.

If you love God's Kingdom:

- 1) You will bring someone to the Tanglin Bible Class Gospel Meetings for the Chinese-
- 2) You will contribute something to renovate God's House now in progress.
- 3) You will keep it clean by not touching its walls.
- 4) You will support missions to earth's end with your prayers and resources. Remember Djunaidi, Dohar, Freddy.
- 5) You will continue to support Woodlands. Are you not happy to see the earning of interest again this week (over \$500)? You will give your tithe (1/10) lovingly and promptly that there may be meat in God's House (Mal. 3:10).
- 6) You will pray for the 10th Assembly of the FECCC and play host with a cheerful heart 7) You will think of ways and means to increase God's Territory to the glory of our Lord

and Saviour Jesus Christ.

My name is <u>Nwee Kok Thai</u>. I'm aged 18. At present I am schooling at <u>Saint Andrew's</u> Junior College doing my second year in engineering.

I accepted Christ on the 15th of June 1979 in a Bible-believing Church. Now that I am absolutely sure of my salvation I wish to be baptised. How I came to accept Christ as my personal Lord and Saviour is a long story which began when I was still a child.

I was brought up in a non-religious family. In my early childhood days, my family was in a very bad situation; my family is extremely poor and conflicts and quarrels often arose between my parents. In those early days, I experienced much sufferings and loss of parental love and care. Such early childhood upbringing provided me a strong stimulation in my later life; I became very pessimistic about life; I began to question myself — What is the real significance of all such sufferings and joys, gains and losses in life? Persuaded by my neighbour, a strong Christian, I began to resort to the Bible when I was 15. After more than a year's intensive search through the Bible I finally arrived at my greatest realisation - God revealed to me that I am a lost sinner, and as such my best intellectual interpretations will be subjected to faults and errors. God told me that the path of the divine can only be walked with faith, not mere human wisdom. All the way through I had been searching for the most divine of all things the Bible enlightened me that the greatest is love. For God loves me so much that He sacrifices His only begotten Son to die for me so that through Him my sins are forgiven and I can be reunited with God again. God promises me eternal life in Heaven through His Son Jesus in John Chapter 3 verse 16. For now that I came to realise the greatest of all truths, the answer to all my doubts and questions, I sincerely confessed of my sins and accepted Christ as my personal Lord and Saviour publicly.

My life began to change since then. The Holy Spirit really works marvels in my life - from an undisciplined, emotionally disrupted person to one who can find real peace and joy in Christ my Lord. I found my new purpose in life: to live solely and purely for Christ; to witness for Him. The Scripture now serves as my Guide, Christ as my eternal backing. Life for me is almost always met with tough challenges, which serve only to strengthen my faith in Christ. Many a time when I was confronted with adversities, God helped me out. My most earnest prayers were answered. Sometimes I sinned against God, but I know that He is always merciful to forgive. This marvellous love manifests in my life to bring about the most wonderful blessings. I am able to progress steadily in my spiritual life by His love and guidance.

Now that I have found my eternal Lord, my desire is to serve wholeheartedly for the rest of my life. I know that He has a mission for me. Right now my task will be to bring my whole family to salvation in Christ. Thank God that my sister and elder brother are both saved and baptised; I pray that my whole family will be saved too.

GOD'S ETERNAL LOVE TO A WAYWARD CHILD

I come from a non-Christian home. In March 1956 I was invited to attend Life Church then located at Prinsep Street by a classmate, Vincent Tay. I attended YF, SS and Church worship very regularly. In August 1956 during one of Rev Ormeo's Gospel meetings held at Life Church I accepted Christ as my personal Saviour and was baptised in Oct the same year (Anniversary). Since then I was actively involved in the activities of the YF and SS. In mid-1968 I gradually wandered into the wilderness from the Promised Land.

However God has not forgotten me though I had neglected to keep my quiet time and read my Bible regularly. During the periods whilst I was working at Changi Prison and TTSH, brother on Wong and a few others were sent by God to persuade me to resume attending Church. However, there was an unknown force preventing me from doing so.

On the afternoon of 31 Jan 81 I felt sick, but after resting a while I felt well again. The next day, 1 Feb 81 I felt a pain in my left loin. I did not pay much attention to it as I thought it would go off after a while. However the pain persisted. I was seen by the doctors at TTSH and advised to be admitted on 8 Feb 81 for further investigation. After a week of investigations including several X-Rays it was found there was a tumour in my intestines and an operation was required. This was made known to me on Sunday 15.2.81

When I heard this, fear came over me as I was scared of blood and operations. However I did not faint. I realised that I should turn to God for help. Thus I prayed to God. God answered my prayer, for on the next day (16.2) 2 days before my operation, I was waiting for my ECG Test when Dr Patrick Tan, who was on his way for his ward rounds, saw me and was told of the above. Incidentally Bro. Tan was attached to TTSH from Dec. 80 to Mar. 81. He met me once at the Main Office in Jan. 81 but did not know about my admission and impending operation. This shows God works in response to His children's requests according to His will.

Since then Dr Tan had visited me very regularly. He brought a book "Words of Wisdom" for me to read. I read through the whole book in one day. This gave me further encouragement and comfort as this book is a translation of the Book of Psalms and Proverbs.

On 18.2.81 my operation was postponed to 20.2.81 as an urgent operation had to be performed.

On 20.2.81,my day of operation, I was less fearful as on 18.2.81. After Dr Tan's advice and encouragement I realised that God was leading me through this operation. All I had to do was simply to TRUST in HIM.


The operation was a success. During the five weeks of convalescence in the hospital, my spiritual life was revived as I drew closer to God. I resumed reading the Bible regularly and kept my quiet time.

The visits by Rev Tow, Dr P. Tan and other brethren of the Church further assisted in my recovery both physically and spiritually.

God's providence is further shown by the fact that when I mentioned attending Life Church on my discharge from hospital to my wife and son, they immediately agreed. Another providence God has shown me was my willingness to spend a little money in getting the special X-ray done by a private radiologist. Had I waited for the earliest appointment available at TTSH X-Ray section on 14 Apr. 81 my tumour might have moved downwards and a more complicated operation would be required (Rom. 8:28).

I was discharged on 28 Mar 81 afternoon and the next day 29 Feb 81 being the Lord's Day I resumed attending Church with my family in a thankful spirit, since God had seen me through the past seven weeks.

In closing may I leave two Bible verses with you. Romans 8:38-39.

ON FOOD OFFERED TO IDOLS (Ans. to DC) If you read carefully I Cor. 8 & 10, the resultant teaching of the Apostle is that Christians are forbidden to eat idol-food. 
The argument on "knowledge" of an idol that it is nothing in the world, and there is none other God but one," comments Calvin, comes from the conceited Corinthians! This is what they (the Corinthians) are actually saying, Calvin points out: "An idol is a mere figment of the human brain, and, for that reason, must be regarded as nothing. It follows : the consecration, which is made in the name of an idol, is silly, fanciful and meaningless. Therefore, a Christian who has no respect for the idol, and eats of the food offered to it, is not made unclean." This is how they are justifying themselves, and Paul does not dismiss what they say as false, for there is valuable teaching in it, but he rejects it because they were making wrong use of it, in allowing no love to operate." For though eating idol-food might seem quite harmless to the Corinthians, it may cause other Christians to stumble. Love of the brethren is part of our faith. The "meat" in I Tim. is not idolfood but such meat as pork which Jews refrained from but is now allowed to Christians. 

On returning to Shanghai, John was met with invitations from many churches to conduct meetings, but he decided to accept the renewed invitation from the Worldwide Bethel Evangelistic Band to return with them to Shantung. At the part town of Tsingtao, new problems confronted him. The so-called "Spiritual Gifts" movement was strong there and many were seeking the fullness of the Spirit with outward manifestations: speaking with tongues, spiritual songs, visions, dreams, and similar phenomena. It was re garded as a mark of spirituality to seek these things. John was mystified. He wanted to help them, but he did not know how. Character Assasination is powerless against Factual Presentation

Jesus cast out the devil who possessed a blind and dumb man so he was able to see and to speak. The Pharisees beheld a hard cold fact before their very eyes, but they refused to acknowledge this act was by the power of God. Instead they accused Jesus of using demonic-art, yea, of casting out devils by the prince of devils. They even called Jesus a devil on two other occasions. Jesus replied with brilliant logic, "A house divided against itself shall not stand". The Devil will not cast out his little devils. In the light of this factual presentation, the Pharisees' charac-

ter assasination of our Lord is powerless.

In recent years God has used Jack Chick's Publications in a mighty way to shine the Gospel Light. One publication that has exposed the darkness of the Roman Catholic system is the story of Alberto Rivera, an ex-Jesuit priest. The "comic book" titled "Alberto" has been so popular that Chick has published a sequel, called "Double Cross". Of course this twin exposure of the dark Roman system has aroused the ire of the RCs. But why is Christian—y Today so concerned as to go after Chick and Alberto Rivera? Does this not reveal a nomanward—trend in Neo-evangelical leadership other than Billy Graham?

Insofar as Singapore is concerned, I have known of a certain Christian Bookroom that has been selling Chick's booklets until a change of ownership consigned all of Chick's products to the fire. "But the Word of God is not bound".

In order to discredit Alberto, Christianity Today tries to report that he had two illegitimate children, and had issued bad cheques. But the magazine is not able to substantiate the charge that the Alberto story is a fraud. Character assasination is powerless against factual presentation. Christianity Today admits that a year ago Alberto Rivera had issued a sworn statement defending his allegations. The author declared: "Alberto is a true and actual account, and I will face a court of law to prove the events actually took place." Until Alberto Rivera's story is disproved in a court of law, to insinuate this or that about the author is like pelting a rock with eggs — powerless.

As it is said that "the blood of martyrs is the seed of the Church," this character assasination of Alberto rather promotes the book and Chick's other publications.

"Surely the wrath of man shall praise thee. The remainder of wrath shalt thou restrain" (Ps. 76:10).



Banner of Truth

"Thou hast given a banner to them that fear thee, that it may be displayed because of the truth" (Ps. 60:4).

The 10th Gen. Assembly of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches, a regional of the International Council of Christian Churches, is a banner of truth raised of God among Bible-believing Churches. A banner is a flag carried at the head of an army to rally the fighting men. Our coming assembly which is bringing together 260-270 delegates from East and West and over 1,000 from local Churches is also rallying God's people to battle - to battle for the Truth.

Isaiah adds, "When the enemy shall come in like a flood the Spirit

of the Lord shall raise up a standard against him". The 10th Gen. Assembly of the FECCC has arisen against Satan and his forces for such a time as this. Can God allow the hordes of Modernism, Ecumenism, Roman Catholicism, Marxism, Neo-Evangelism, Charismatic fanaticism to gather against His Holy City, His True Church, without a fight? Without the people seeing that Truth must prevail in the end? As Elijah in his contest with Baal? On which side are you? Will you not play a part in the coming Battle for Truth?

There is a Spirit of Revival and Action as we prepare for the 10th Assembly. This confirms our decision at the 9th Assembly, Baguio, Philippines, Nov. 1978, that Singapore be the next venue. This Assembly which is totally run by Asian Christians and financially supported by Singapore demonstrates the sovereignty and spontaneity of the Spirit's working. The Battle is the Lord's, and it is our privilege and honour, O Singapore, to host this international ci erence!

Insofar as Life Church is concerned, the Lord has moved us to renovate thoroughly these ageing buildings. How youthful and daisy-fresh now they look. See the transformation of our backyard with the 100 ft long extension for Conference dining and cooking! Look at the neat lines and stately round pillars! Sit under the attap patios, so cool and serene with the Galilee Sea fountain playing in the sunlight. Even the attap pondok in the children's playing field, topped with a wooden cross, is refuge for both children and adults from the concrete jungle that Singapore is becoming. The sleeping capsules added are a ready standby for overflow guests, not only for the coming Assembly, but also for Church and Youth camps. Every inch of our 15 million-dollar grounds must be utilised for God's glory and for the benefit of His children. (I want to thank that lady personally for contributing \$1,400 for the twin capsules over our staircase). These capsules also relieve a little the growing congestion of Life Chinese Sunday School held at the Parsonage.

The furniture, fans, mattresses, toiletries, food, etc. brought in are another form of timely help. We are grateful for a Deacon offering a bag of rice: Whatever goods, surplus utensils and household paraphanalia that can be used for the Lord's Cause, are welcome! How all these bring to mind the royal reception given King David when he fled from Absalom across Jordan to Mahanaim. There the people of God "brought beds, and basons, and earthen vessels, wheat, and barley and flour, and parched corn, and beans and lentiles, and parched pulse, and honey, and butter, and sheep, and kine, for David and for his people to eat ..." (II Sam. 17:28-29).

While God's soldiers battle with the enemy, His people on the home front can join the fray by giving hospitality to them in the fight. Our sole desire is to raise a Banner of Truth in the Name of the Lord and proclaim the Gospel to the ends of the earth. — T.T.

Beware of Fals- Teachers! by Wang Ming-dao

"But there were false prophets also among the people, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction.

And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of.

And through covetousness shall they with feigned words make merchandise of you: whose judgment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not." (II Pet. 2:1-3) Before I understood clearly the doctrine of God's saving grace, whenever I read about "false prophets" and "false teachers", I would regard these to be very queer and peculiar people. The false doctrine they preached would be something never heard of before. I also thought these people to be a rare species. Should one or two be seen by chance, we would

recognise them very easily. We would take care not to follow them, lest we be deceived.

After I had truly repented and understood the meaning of the Gospel, I realised my previous misconceptions. I realised then that these "false prophets" and "false teachers" are number-less in the Church today! Most churches are infested with these "false teachers". In some churches 60-70 per cent, yea, 80-90 percent of their leaders and preachers are "false teachers". Are you surprised, my Reader? Let us stony this Scripture text.

"But there were false prophets also among the prople, even as there shall be false teachers among you, who privily shall bring in damnable herisies, even denying the Lord that bought them, and bring upon themselves swift destruction" (v.1). Note: This prophecy tells us,

false teachers shall bring in damnable heresies, even denying the Lord that bought them. Lord Jesus bought us with a heavy price even by His own blood that we might be delivered from the curse of sin and have everlasting life. This is most precious Biblical doctrine, also the Gospel we believe and preach. "Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Matt. 20:28).

"For thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people and nation" (Rev. 5:9). "Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed" (I Pet. 2:24). "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all" (Isa. 53:5,6).

Had Christ not accomplished His work of salvation on Calvary, there would be no salvation, no forgiveness of sin, no hope, no promise of life - but only fearful judgment and wrath before a sinful mankind. Thanks be to God, for our sakes, He had sent His Son into the world to become sin for us, to bear our punishment that we by faith might be justified and have life everlasting. As it is stated in Scripture, "For He hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God in Him" (II Cor. 5:21). "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life" John 3:14,15). Me have just returned from conducting a two week training program in North Sumatra, (Medan) Indonesia. The Lord was so good to provide two of our former students, who are from there, to serve as translators for us in our classes and other services. One of these (Dohar) is now a pastor there getting a Bible believing church (B-P Sumatra) established. The four of us worked together as a team, spending many hours in preparation and prayer together before and after classes.

Each morning we held two hour classes for more than 100 parents. Most of them were believers from dead churches where little is given them from the Word of God. Because of their hunger for spiritual food, they have formed a fellowship group and meet together regularly for prayer and Bible study. Their cry to us was to help them know how to raise their children to know the Lord and live for Him.

This group also arranged a series of nine (two hour) evening classes for us to give training for Sunday School teachers. We can never forget the hunger and eagerness stamped on their faces as they listened to the simple Gospel and how they could share it with children. The Lord used His Word in a very definite way. Eighty men and women, out of around 300 who attended the classes, served as counselors for a special children's meeting arranged by this group of 1,000 children and young people for Salvation. We believe this is just the beginning of what the Lord is going to do through them.

BEWARE OF FALSE TEACHERS (II)

There are many important truths in the Bible but the truth of Christ dying on the cross and shedding His precious blood to redeem us is the central truth. A truly repentent and believing disciple must take special notice of this important doctrine. A person truly called to preach the Gospel must declare this important doctrine. But there is in the Church today something that cannot be Hid. There are many preachers who deny the doctrine of Christ's redeeming blood. These preachers blatantly declare they do not believe the doctrine of Christ's substitutionary atonement. They really don't believe. So they have no Gospel to preach. They try to palm off with many secular teachings such as raising moral character, social service, family improvement, universal education. They turn Gospel preaching stations into social service stations. They open factories, schools, service centres, tuition classes, and even club houses, billiard rooms, hotels, restaurants, baths, barber shops, sports centres, cinemas. If they can lead men to Christ through these services, of course, that would be fine. But no such thing! It is because they have rejected the Gospel of salvation that they get into these secular projects. How therefore can you expect them to win men to Christ? If you don't believe me, you can go and see these things for yourself. See if they ever preach the Gospel? And

Report on West Kalimantan by Rev. Djunaidi

Oct. 1978. Our Gospel Boat the "Kapuas Kourier" left her moorings at Pemangkat to sail on her maiden voyage southwards into the Kapuas. 21 years have passed!

- During this period the Boat has visited the villages along the bank of the 1,000 km. river up to Putusibau at the head waters. It also sailed a tributary to Nanga Pinuh, and out to the coast at Teluk Air, Batu Ampar and Ketapang.

From 1981 we entered a new phase of work. We have completed the building of a Church-Kindergarten in the name of the Kapuas Gospel Mission at Selat Sumba, Siantan. We have scheduled June 24, 1981 for its Dedication. Rev. Tow and party of 8 are coming!

As to our applying for an unused Government School at Kumpai to open a Christian School, this matter is still in abeyance. Perhaps the Lord has a higher purpose to divert

to a big superannuated rubber estate. This estate belongs to an elderly Chinese philant...opist who is willing to sell on easy terms. Rev. Tow will inspect this place.

In answer to an appeal from Dyaks in May this year we sailed another tributary, the Landak Here we came across a good number of Dyak villages, never evangelised before. Wherever we went we were enthusiastically received. We were invited to return.

We were piloted by a Dyak who knew the way. Because the river was shallow we could reach

up only to Ngabang, to Naya, which is adjacent to Bambang village.

The last was visited in April by motorbike. We were entertained by the Temanggung and Kepala Kampung. Many came out of curiosity to see our Gospel Boat, and had to queue up! At the evening Gospel rally 150 were counted. We believe this to be a fruitful field. But we need to push on!

When I reported these conditions recently to Rev. C.T. Hsu in USA, he immediately responded to support 3 Dyak preachers (@ U.S.\$50 per month). Moreover Rev. Hsu emphasises this work is urgent, to be effected without delay. (May I express our thanks to Life B-P Church and other lovers of God our appreciation for their support).

P.S. Under Rev. K.C. Quek is operated the West Kalimantan Pioneer Mission. This Mission now has 7 churches, a Bible School and orphanage and Primary School. Recently at Bekut is completed another Church. This needs Rev. Quek to inaugurate. Further there are two co-workers to be ordained. There will be a big meeting all night! Please pray for us! Mission Note: Life Church Mission to West Kalimantan to inaugurate the new Church-Kindergarten at Siantan, Pontianak and participate in the ordination of two pastors with Rev. K.C. Quel consists of the following: Rev. Tow, Elder Kua (of Muar and FEBC), Lee Meng Fong, Tan Lay Hoo Lim Ai Lian, Lim Chor Hoon, Lee Lai Heng, Kimiko Goto (FEBC). Others are Rev. K.C. Quek,

Yohanes, Ganan (ordinands); Rev. Djunaidi, Sis. Johanna Heng. Itinerary: Fly June 18 via JB to Kuching. One day in Kuching, Fly 19 to Pontianak. (Our hotel (on water) the "Kapuas Kourier". Preaching at Dyak churches, ordination, visits along the Kapuas River. Fly Djakarta June 25. One night. Return June 26. All members of party to



THE GIRLS TELL THEIR STORY Lee Lai Heng

In last week's weekly, our pastor Rev. Tow has already given us the outline and programme of the trip to Pontianak. Hence, now I will just bring out more memories that are likely to stay for a long time.

In Kuching, Ai Lian, Lay Hoon and myself shared a room in Borneo Hotel. It was an unanimous agreement between us that staying in the hotel room for the rest of the day was a pure waste of time. Since God has brought us there, we decided to use this God given opportunity to sight see that part of the world. We were very careful with our money so that we would have enough Malaysian currency for dinner that night & breakfast the next day. However God knew our needs even before we prayed. We met my classmate from S'pore while gallivanting and his uncle gave us a dinner treat. My classmate also gave an offering of M\$30 for the work in W. Kalimantan.

In W. Kalimantan, we were very touched by the warm hospitality extended to us by Rev. Djunaidi & his family. To those of us who knew Esther Djunaidi while she was studying at FEBC, it was a time of happy reunion; to those of us who did not know her, her friendliness & frankness made us feel as though we were good old friends. We also took an immediate liking to the rest of the Djunaidis but we only got to know David & his wife Rebecca better. David spoke English and he spent lots of time with us, driving us around in his church van as well as in the Gospel boat. His wife spoke Mandarin & Teochew. She took the trouble to visit us girls almost everynight in another Perumnas unit. Well, as you might have guessed, when a group of ladies were gathered together, we chatted away on matters that will only interest ladies, for e.g. ... etc. It is pitiful that our problem in language communication prevented us from getting to know many more people.

A memorable day was 21/6/81 when we visited the Dyaks at Menjalin. The pastor was not at home when we arrived at lunch time. Our hunger problem was solved by some instant noodles and pork bought from the shops in the village. Cooking in that primitive kitchen was fun for us Singapore girls! God has more fun in store for us later when 4 shy Singapore girls and a Japanese San, all clad in sarongs, descended into Sungei Mempawak for their baths. An evening service was held in the Dyak church that night. A Dyak man really touched our hearts then, — he walked 80 km in the dark with a torchlight, just to see us!

Well, that reminded me of a contrasting feature between W. Kalimantan and S'pore - the pace of life. They seemed to be in slow motion all the time.

We also seemed to have lost our freedom in that land. We had to report to the district police everytime we enter or leave a certain district. Thank God for our freedom in Singapore. Corruption was widely practiced too. I was shocked to be stopped by a traffic police during one of our journeys by a mini-bus. The driver paid him some money and we could resume our journey. A greater shock came when we were again stopped on the road in this fashion another day. That day we were travelling in David's church-van. The policeman recognised the vehicle and he let us pass, free of charge, because he said he was a Christian too. Then he contidued collecting the "passing road fare" from other vehicles. "What a testimony!" I thought. These people were so underpaid that they simply can't survive if they don't resort to such means" was the explanation given to me. Well, what else can I do but to thank God that in Singapore we are not under the yoke of such corruption. It is definitely not easy to be a Christian in that land!

More frustrations followed when we realized that we were stranded in Pontianak. There was no way that we could fly for all flights have been fully booked. The only other alternative was to sail. On Tuesday June 22, after the ordination of the 2 pastors, we went to the sailing office in Permangkat to make some enquiries. To our horror, the last ship leaving that week would be taking off that very night, and we had to be back in Singapore before Mon. 29/6. If the ship was to leave according to the scheduled time, there was no way we could catch it because we needed 4 hrs. to drive to Pontianak for our luggage and another 4 hrs. back from Pontianak to Permangkat. However with God's help, we managed to make some "undertable" arrangements to delay the schedule and booked a 4 cabin. The ship sailed on Wednesday 23/6 at 4.30 p.m. S'pore time.

How thankful we were to be back!

MISSION TO WEST KALIMANTAN

When Rev Tow asked me whether I would join him on a mission to West Kalimantan, I immediately responded. I felt the Lord was calling me. Oftentimes, I was like Jonah, trying to disobey His command.

God had a purpose and directed our way via Kuching to Pontianak. Through Rev Djunaidi's contact, Rev Lim Teck Hock of CNEC met us at the airport. He took us to Borneo Hotel which gave a discount of 20%. During fellowship with him in the evening, we realised Rev Lim needed the help of a Hakka speaking preacher. As Rev Djunaidi speaks Hakka, he consented to hold a week's meetings there in due course.

Leaving Kuching the next day, we reached Pontianak. While Rev Quek went north to Tebas and Bekut to attend to His mission, our team comprising of Rev Tow, Mr Lee Meng Fong, Kimiko, Chor Hoon, Lay Hoon, Ai Lian, Lai Heng and me were in the south. We wore at the Chinese Church, Siantan, Sunday morning with Rev Tow preaching. As he was having a back-ache, the Lord retained him to preach in the same church their night.

During this mission, members of our team were able to serve Him in a small Dyak village called Menjalin about 100 km north of Pontianak. We stayed in Rev Ronga's Dyak house for the night. We also witnessed the dedication of a new church at Bekut by Rev Quek, the ordination of the two new pastors - Yohanes and Ganan.

Five of our team, Mr Lee Meng Fong, Lay Hoon, Chor Hoon, Ai Lian and Lai Heng had to leave Pontianak, 24th June by boat for Singapore as no tickets were available for the flight from Pontianak to Jakarta. We were sorry that they missed the dedication of the Siantan new Church and Kindergarten on that day.

The dedication at Siantan on the 24th June was a great event. I was amazed to see such a beautiful building amid the neighbouring slums. Really (as I told Rev Tow) it was "a lotus out of the mud" and "a Light unto the world".

After the dedication, we boarded the "Kapuas Kourier" with Rev Djunaidi to sail up Sunger Landak to a village called Biong. Due to engine-overheating, we arrived at about 9.45 p.m. Rev Djunaidi's accordion accompanying the singing of "Yesus Engkau-lah Bunga Mawar" immediately attracted many Dyaks to the meeting at 10.00 p.m. Rev Tow preached, Kimiko and I said a few words. Praise the Lord 19 of them expressed a desire to accept the Lord. We finished the meeting at 11.30 p.m. The Gospel Boat was a "floating hotel" with natural air-conditioning in which we slept soundly on the bank of Sungei Landak. The "Kapuas Kourier" is a great asset as many Dyak villages extending hundreds of miles could only be reached by boat. When berthed in Pontianak, it was a lodge to the missioners and Dyak preachers.

My heart was filled with joy throughout this mission as I could see His gracious and loving hand leading us through various obstacles. At the age of 52, I felt that I was running out of time. I heard His command saying "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations ...". I was extremely happy that I had responded to His call. Truly, the harvest is plenteous, but the labourers

are few. Are you willing to answer Pis call - for Kalimantan?

CHRISTIAN CONTRIBUTIONS IN THE ARMED FORCES

Concld. part of Message delivered by Lt Col Dr Patrick Tan to the 10th Gen. Assembly, FECCC, June 11, 1981.

Christians in any vocation or place of employment have much to contribute. The military is no exception. I would even declare that the military is a unique place where Christians can make definite and effective contributions. On the other hand when Christian soldiers fail to contribute positively a great opportunity is missed and the military is that much poorer.

The first contribution the Christian soldier can give is the Spirit of Excellence. There were many outstanding soldiers who were also Christians. Their lives were guided by the Word of God. The Bible is

full of instructions that Christians should strive toward excellence. One of them is from Paul to Timothy. He said, "Study (work hard) to show thyself approved unto God". and with reference to spiritual warfare Paul said, "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ" 2 Timothy 2:15; 3. The Christian's great desire is to please God, and this he does by faithfulness and diligence in his work and thus producing excellent results. This spirit of excellence will no doubt be applied in the military. The crying need in many Armed Forces is to find soldiers with a high level of motivation for without it work can only be mediocre. When military service is compulsory the motivation expected to be low. In many professional armies, motivation is maintained by financial incentives, personal rewards and in many soldiers by a sense of pomp and glory. The Christian soldier will for Christ's sake, to please Him, be diligent and faithful.

The second contribution the Christian soldier can give to the Armed Forces is a standard of Morality. Morality is right behaviour. Soldiers can sometimes be unruly, drink too much and behave indecorously towards the opposite sex. It is surprising that one so disciplined to obey authority and to fight cannot control his own passions. This is because right behaviour must be founded on religion, a reverential awe towards God and a deep respect for human worth. The Christian believes in God, adores and worships Him and regards all men as God's noble creation and would love them as he would love himself. The sermon on the mount is the best known of the teachings of our Lord. In it Jesus taught about Christian behaviour. How different is from the world's standard. He exhorts His followers, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" Matthew 5:16.

The third contribtion is a Spiritual Ministry. War is a fearful thing. All veteran soldiers testify to the blood, the sweat and the fear that paint every battlefield. There is no pomp and glory in the sound of canons and the cries of wounded men. Here chaplains dispense the Lord's support to troops facing the next battle, say prayers of comfort to wounded soldiers, and commit the dead to the resurrected Saviour. Soldiers look to the xly and kindly chaplain for spiritual strength and comfort. He stands between death and eternity. He is God's servant and he can intercede for them before God. Then soldiers

and eternity. He is God's servant and he can intercede for them before God. Then soldiers can have courage to fight because his eternal security is assured. Chaplaincy is the churches' great contribution to the Armed Forces.

There is another spiritual ministry of importance. That is a Military Christian Fellowship. This is provided by Christian soldiers themselves who determine to gather together for Bible Study, prayer and evangelism. All over the world there are Military Christian Fellowships which serve the spiritual needs of the soldiers in armies without chaplaincy and complement the ministry of the chaplains. Spiritual growth of the Christian soldiers can develop spontaneously by examples and encouragement from fellow Christian soldiers. Then there are soldiers whose lives are empty and meaningless and Christ can fill that void, and give meaning and purpose to their lives. This is the global task of the great commission and the Armed Forces is a vital mission field where Christian soldiers witness to soldiers and confront them with the claims of Jesus Christ.

Finally there is the ministry of prayer. Our military commanders need prayers for their decisions may mean life or death to those under their command. Our national leaders stand in need of prayer. They decide how peace and stability may be maintained in the nation. So the Christian soldier has a vital prayer ministry, to pray "for kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty" 1 Timothy 2:2.

My final word is that the Christian soldier prays for peace but prepares for war.

Fellowship in the Singapore Armed Forces, since 1970.

DJUNAIDI ON LATEST KALIMANTAN ADVANCE

There were eight of us, including two preachers and 1 teacher when we sailed to the Village of Biong up the Landak River, July 2. We came to officiate the engagement of a young couple, and took this opportunity for another Gospel meeting. The engagement ceremony was the first of its kind in this village. It made a deep impression on the people.

According to Ev. Kalam, (Dyak co-worker) he has preached at Pampang again. The Christians there are requesting help to conduct Sunday services. Leaders were appointed from among the local congregation. We would visit on circuit.

Ev. Atun (Dyak co-worker) also came to see me yesterday. He was deeply touched to receive his monthly pay of 30,000 rupiah. He would move with his family to Pontianak to work when we've got him quarters. He is a good assistant. Presently he takes care of the work at Habang.

Yesterday I received Rev C T Hsu's mail. He would support each worker US \$50 p.m. This he would send through you.

As to extending a parsonage behind the new Church-Kindergarten, this matter will be discussed with Bro. Wong when he comes to town. As to the school at Kumpai, I've got in touch with the Military again. Pray for early release of the property.

Tomorrow we will advance beyond Ngabang to Bebehan village when we will hold a Gospel meeting at night. This village will henceforth be included in our orbit.

We have just arrived back from the bush today, and I suspect Choon Poh is pleased to be back here with some modern conveniences, and toilets without flies and mosquitoes! Well, it has been a precious experience up there with people who have so little of this world's goods, and yet who have all things in Christ. I have never seen people live in such a simple way. It made me recall the words of our Lord Jesus when He said 'having food and raiment, therewith let'us be content.' Paul also added that godliness with contentment is great gain. These people have been living for years without the things that Singaporeans would consider essential. It is true that there are needs - real needs both in the spiritual and in the social areas, but it was an education to see how these folk have adapted to the situation, and made the best of it. Of course one of the most disturbing things is the fact that they have no citizenship, and therefore that they do not belong anywhere. Had there been further opportunity, I would have liked to preach a sermon on our citizenship being in heaven...

I enjoyed driving a Toyota pickup into one of the villages over some road that made me feel homesick for Australia. It was slow going with a loaded vehicle, but we arrived without mishap... Most of the time we have been out we have had meetings every night, with visitation during the day. It appears that it is only the Christians that come to the meetings, as the unsaved stay well clear. That means that it is better to lean towards teaching messages than straight evangelistic. I enjoyed giving a few children's talks through interpreter, as at times there were more children than adults ...

The trouble is, like ungrateful children who forget their parents, we do not. We love our wife and children more, our own desires, our house, our car, our T.V. and Hi Fi Music, our profession, our hobby, more than God. We have left our first love. To set us a minimal standard for the expression of our love, God has ordained the tithe.

Abraham gave tithes, so did Jacob when he found how God had helped him in his troubles. Tithing therefore is not a Mosaic law that was imposed on Israel. It preceded Moses. It is confirmed by our Lord Jesus Christ. In Luke 11:42, while Jesus rebukes the Pharisees for neglecting the higher virtues of justice and love, He nevertheless upholds the worship of tithing. Paul certainly does when he exhorts the Corinthian Christians to give "bountifully", which is certainly more and not less than the tithe.

Jesus further encourages us to give, "It is more blessed to give than to receive". Conversely, if we have received, and received from God's hand, and have never reciprocated with heartfelt returns, we would not be blessed. We might even be accursed: In Mal. 3:11 God reminds the Jews how their fruit trees, being worm-eaten, were due to their withholding the tithe. Malachi called this "robbing God" (Mal. 3:8). How can one be blessed when he robs God?

Let me tell you of an interesting encounter recently with one of our contractors. This one is a mason. He is the one who made the roof-top extension to the Parsonage. I witnessed to him, as to all other contractors. But he ridiculed the God of Heaven. He said we Christians are superstitious. I kept quiet. But his cement work became a washout that day with a drizzling rain.

A fortnight later he came back to remake the cement floor. Drip-drop, drip-drop! He felt a little apprehensive. I said, "Pray to the God of Heaven. He'll help you!" He replied, in Chinese, equivalent to the American, "Baloney". I kept quiet. The drops thickened. It drip zzled on ...

Finally, my friend gave in. "Ah," he sighed, "this work is a washout again. O.K. I'll make for you a mosaic floor next time - half price! Only \$180/=. The rest is for God!"

"For God!" I mumbled within myself. Had my mason friend bowed to the Almighty?

"Don't be iron-teethed!" he sheepishly acknowledged his stylesprenses as he arranged to

Reader, do you have to learn the hard way like my mason friend? Tithing is a matter between you and your God.



TESTIMONY OF CAPT. LIM JUI SECK

On 7 Jun 81 afternoon while returning home after church, I was paralysed in the bus! The complete left side of my body was totally numb and senseless! I could not even breathe through my left nostril! I used my right hand to massage the left limbs, tried to exercise to regain the senses. But for more than ten minutes, all my efforts were in vain. My heart sank, my mind went blank and my tears were running.

Thank God, the Holy Spirit prompted me to pray. There was a still small voice that

urged me, "Why don't you pray?"

"Lord Jesus, Lord Jesus, please save me. I don't want to be paralysed just like that. Please give me good health that I may serve you throughout my life. Lord Jesus please save me now."

Immediately after my prayer, I felt warmth flowing through my limbs; then I could clench my left hand; I could shift my left leg; I could breathe with my left nostril. I was saved and I was normal again. I was so thankful to our Lord Jesus that my tears continue to run for a while. I returned home safely.

On 8 Jun 81 morning I reported to my camp doctor and told him what I had experienced the day before. He was taken aback, and told me that that was something very serious. He referred me to the Neurosurgery Department at Tan Tock Seng Hospital instantly. He even contacted the Head of that department Mr Tham Cheok Fai and arranged for my admission. I was admitted at the hospital without knowing that I was in a very serious and dangerous condition.

During my interview with Mr Tham, he told me that it was unusual for me to have recovered from the paralysis attack which is medically termed Transcient Ischaemic Attack (TIA). He said that I was lucky. Really God is gracious to me.

In the next few days I was put through a series of special tests to determine what actually went wrong. On 12 Jun 81 after the doctors had confirmed their findings, Mr Tham discussed with me what they had discovered and their intention.

The right Internal Carotid Artery at my brain was 95% constricted by cholestero! The constriction could have been formed long time ago. The doctors were puzzled that I could still exercise my left limbs. Again Mr Tham said that I was lucky. This is truly God's special grace upon me.

As the constriction was just before a junction or branch, the best they could do was to link a synthetic artery to by pass the constriction. But Mr Tham told me there was no guarantee of success. I told them, "God has been so gracious to me, He will see me through the operation. I trust the Lord will lead you. So just do your best and I shall be saved."

Until my operation on 15 Jun 81, I did not experience anymore TIA. Praise and thank God for preserving me safely. Psalms 121:8, "The Lord shall preserve thy going out and thy coming in from this time forth, and even for evermore."


I was operated on on 15 Jun 81 morning. It was a very major operation. The surgeons had to remove a portion of my scalp and skull in order to reach the artery on my brain; and on appletion, replace them and stitch up the incision. I was in the operating theatre for about six hours. All went through smoothly and successfully.

My recovery was good and speedy. On 22 Jun 81 the stitches were removed and on 24 Jun 81 I was discharged from the hospital. These amazed the doctors and nurses too. There were many patients admitted before me but still recovering in the hospital. During my seventeen days in TTSH I saw eight patients from my ward pass away; few of them were actually recovering fine, but suddenly passed away.

My wife and I have been praying for the GCE'A' examination which I will be taking at the end of this year. I hope to obtain good results so that I can apply for SAF Scholarship to go to the university. This incident happened at the right time.

After the operation I feel more energetic and do not feel tired and sleepy which I always felt before. Now I have a better brain to study. I have applied for three and a half months of leave commencing middle August 81 to prepare for the examination, but now I am given medical leave and I can study full time already. Romans 8:28, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose".

With the privileges and grace that He has given me, all that remains is for me to ask God to strengthen me that I may be able to carry out my promise to Him. The promise which I made when I was paralysed in the bus was that I may serve Him throughout my life. Amen.



This is a Chinese couplet often quoted in respect of the perseverence needed in the nurture of students in a school of learning. No less is the same required of two schools — attached to our Church, both Far Eastern by name - first, the Bible College; second, the Kindergarten. As supervisor of the latter and principal of the former, I can truthfully say, it takes "a hundred years to make a man."

It takes years and years to establish any school that will make a mark on society.

It has taken the Far Eastern College almost two decades to enter into this period of fruitful-bearing. To date, there have been graduated from our College 66 students from a dozen countries, though the majority consists of Singaporeans, Malaysians and Indonesians and sons and daughters of the B-P Church. This is FEBC's 19th year completed with a 13th graduation service just held on Friday, July 24, 1981. At this service, three degrees were conferred on Dohar and Glorya, both of Medan, Sumatra, and on Tan Boon Kwang of GLTS (Gospel Letters and Tract Soc., a Reformed Church group) and a Diploma in Theology awarded to Cheong Yoke Fun, a Lifer now with Mt. Carmel B-P Church. All four are in the Lord's service or will

While these four are of the class of the 19th academic year, there promises a much bigger graduation as we look forward to the 14th graduation and the completion of the 20th year. For the student body this year has risen higher - to a total of 49, of whom 43 are fulltime and 6 parttime. Should all this number live-in, our FEBC Hostel would be filled to the brim, with extra space for at most 2 or three. With this rising trend in enrolment, we can expect easily an increase of a dozen in a year or two. Then we would have no space to admit them!

To prepare for the influx, the College Directors have decided to take the initiative to renovate, incorporating the private verendahs of the dorms into the main units. By so doing eight more students can be accommodated in the rain-proof verendahs. Then there are those "upper regions", sitting in the cold all these years which we could make into more permanent shelters to house another 6 to 8 students. This is the least we can do to prepare for an increasing student body. This decision has met with enthusiastic response in the Directors who voted \$20,000 from FEBC, and in the students, as we begin to see offerings coming in from their loving hands. Yes, from their loving hands in the daily ministrations of keeping our Church grounds clean and green. Some who are electricians and know plumbing at the finger tips have saved the College and Church a good many bills for maintenance. The Church has provided for the College, and the College has served the Church.

The thought that blesses - that Life Church has been given a ministry by the Lord to take care of the Bible College by providing the quarters. We are the Widow and FEBC the Prophet. From this combined ministry there will come the Elishas and young prophets like Jonah, but we must pray, no Gehazis! - T.T. - L.

THE HARVEST AND THE HARVESTERS

Message by Rev. K.C. Quek at the 13th Graduation Service of Far Eastern Bible College in convocation at Calvary Pandan B-P Church, Friday, 24th July, 1981 Scripture Reading: John 4:31-37; 9:1-4; Matthew 9:35-38

"The Harvest truly is plenteous but the labourers are few"

This observation by our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ is ever so true. In fact, the harvest today is getting more and more plenteous and labourers, fewer and fewer. There are at least two reasons for this phenomenon.

Firstly, with the ever rising world population, the number of Christians as against the number of non-Christians becomes even fewer by ratio. Hence the total number of souls who need to be harvested and brought to Christ increases proportionately.

Secondly, with the fast spreading of liberalism and liberation theology, more and more churches have ceased to carry out the Great Commission of Jesus Christ and more and more Bible Colleges are turning out graduates who show no interest in soul-winning.

This trend can be easily seen, for instance, in the 1980 May Conference in Melbourne, South Australia, of the missionary arm of the World Council of Churches, the Commission on World Mission and Evangelism. Throughout that Conference, as I had personally observed, there was complete silence on evangelism and soul-winning according to the Scriptures. Repentance was repeatedly mentioned but that was to repent for sinning against the poor and the oppressed. To them, the all important command by our Lord: "Ye must be born again" in John Chapter 3 means "Turn your heart and mind around so that you can see what is in thappening right where you are"

Preaching of the Gospel is no longer welcome to the World Council's Commission on World Mission and Evangelism; an instance was quoted of the South Pacific where cannibalism gave place formerly to Christian civilisation through faithful preaching by faithful missionaries. Said a delegate representing that region in his address to the plenary session: "We are concerned that the Pacific region has been seen and used by many churches as a classroom for missions. We resent this strongly and wish to make it clear to the churches that we do not want to be exploited by the churches through their missionary programmes. The proliferation of missionary activities in the Pacific by the established churches and the independent missionary organisations is increasingly seen by the Pacific people as a threat to their cultures, their communities and their lives ... We solicit the support of this Conference ... to help us correct the attitude of churches regarding missionary expansion in the Pacific ..." And this verbal statement was later issued in writing and distributed at the Conference at the direction of the Chairman.

Such is the trend not only in the Pacific area but now throughout the world among churches and Bible institutions that have departed from Biblical Christianity. All indications from World Council publications are that this trend will go on increasing in intensity and extent.

The Role of the Far Eastern Bible College
It is here that the Far Eastern Bible College comes in, in the word of the Founder and F ncipal of the College, Dr Timothy Tow, "to meet the pressing need to train a new generation of evangelists, pastors and teachers for the Church of Jesus Christ in the Far East, and to confront certain institutions in Singapore that have apostatised from the Faith." In such perilous times as these, the mandate of the College, in the word of the President of the Board of Directors, Rev Dr Tow Siang Hwa, is, "not only to prepare labourers for the harvest fields, but also to train hardy soldiers to contend earnestly for the Faith."

By the grace of the Lord God Almighty, the College, now in its 20th year, has through its faithful Bible-centred programmes all these years, produced 66 graduates. Going through the list of these graduates in the 1980 to 1982 Prospectus of the College, we find that a great majority of them are still actively serving in the Lord's Vineyard. Some are already teaching others, according to II Timothy Chapter 2 Verse 2, both in the Alma Mater and in other Bible institutions. A good number have become Church Pastors and others are on the way.

We are so thankful to God for having given us an increasing number of students, 13 new ones for this academic year, making a total number of 49. The countries represented by the student body have increased to 14, not only from the Far East, but as the Principal and the Registrar have observed, from the north, from the south and from the west as well. Testimonies given at the College Day of Prayer this past Monday have shown us how marvellously the Lord has called these new dedicated young men and women to the College for training and how the College training in the past has helped the students in their ministry, either in their home churches or on the mission field. Some have even given up their well-paid secular employments in answer to the higher calling to come to the College. - to be continued.



OF WHAT HEAVENLY USE WILL BE YOUR

EARTHLY WEALTH AT JESUS' COMING?

The wisest thing to do, whi you may, is to send it up now! Jesus says, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through and steal: For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also " (Matt. 6:19-21).

But if He should tarry a little longer, we will have to meet Him, one by one, at His Judgment Seat. Will He say to you and to me, "well done, thou good and faithful servant"? All that we possess belongs to God, who has enabled us to earn, and to profit. We are ste-

wards, not towkays. We are trustees and not sole-proprietors.

How can we send our earthly wealth to heaven now? By putting it into the Lord's work, particularly where the need is, where God's servants are faithfully labouring. Women, wives with hard-earned savings, can also help! Luke 8 tells of their well-acceptance of our Saviour: "And certain women which had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary: called: Magdalene, out of whom went seven devils, And Joanna the wife of Chuza Herod's steward, and Susanna, and many others, which ministered unto Him of their substance."

Where can we invest our substance to the best profit? Insofar as Life Church is concerned you have been giving week after week to Woodlands! But we are still \$110,000 short of paying fully for the land - \$900,000 + \$26,000 (stamp duty). Woodlands, however, should not bog us down! We need to pay equal, if not more, attention to supporting Gospel outreaches under our care. There are 4 main fields needing our support:- 1) Kulai Besar (WF); 2) B-P Sumatra (AF); 3) West Kalimantan; 4) FEBC and Lifers under training here.

Rev K.C. Quek's message in reference to FEBC, Dohar's preaching last Sunday, Djunaidi's photo news at the Church foyer, Kulai Besar's Renovation depicted on the notice board, confirm my endorsement of these profit-making talents. These Gospel outreaches, winning souls by their direct involvement afar off are our bankers. If you cannot accomplish anything directly for the Lord, your money will, well-pleasing to the Master. If you have done nothing in these heavenly investments, then hear what our Lord said to the slothful servant, "Thou oughtest therefore to have put my money to the exchangers, and then at my coming I should have received my own with usury! (Matt. 25:27).

Qualifications the harvesters should possess.

From the Word of God we will note several qualifications that a harvester in the Lord's Vineyard should possess, be he an evangelist, a pastor or a teacher. May I point out three

of them here as an exhortation to our student body.

Firstly, be wholly consecrated unto the Lord. It must be assumed that any one seeking admission to a Bible College, in our case the Far Eastern Bible College, is prepared wholly to serve the Lord. Let him therefore heed St Paul's beseeching at Romans 12 to present his body a living sacrifice unto God (verse 1). Let him not be conformed to this world (vs. 2). Nothing should distract him from giving of his best, totally and willingly, to his Master our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly, be skilful. The Apostle Paul exhorted young Timothy at II Timothy 2:15, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." To "study" is to strive hard and learn with diligence. There must be skill in wielding the Sword of the Spirit, not only to effectively lead others to Christ, but also to protect the flock against the increasingly subtle attacks from the Evil One,

masquerading as an angel of light or as a ravening wolf in sheep's clothing.

. Thirdly, be zealous. Our Lord set us a supreme example of being zealous. After His first cleansing of the Holy Temple, as recorded in John 2, His disciples remembered that it was written: "The zeal of Thine house has eaten me up" (verse 17). At Jacob's well, in John 4

bus said to His disciples: "My meat is to do the will of Him that sent me and to finish his work. Say not ye, there are yet four months and then cometh harvest? Behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." And before He healed the man born blind, He said to His disciples who were more interested in studying theology concerning sin than to show mercy on the poor blind man: "I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh when no man can work." (verse 4).

Time and tide wait for no man. Four years in College will pass very quickly, and we have only one short life to live. We are to "redeem the time" because "the days are evil" (Eph. 5:16). Christ who died on the cross and shed His precious blood to redeem us, demands from us nothing short of wholehearted service. Our risen Saviour will spue out of His mouth any one who is lukewarm, neither cold nor hot in his service to the Lord (Rev. 3:16).

It is our prayer that every harvester in the making in the Far Eastern Bible College will fully possess these qualifications: Be wholly consecrated unto the Lord, be skilful, be zeal-Support for the harvesters

As for us who have not been called into full-time training to become full-time harvesters,

may I suggest we do at least three things.


Firstly, seriously heed the call of our Lord at Matthew 9:38 to pray that "The Lord of the harvest will send forth labourers into His harvest." Them match your prayers with actions. Encourage some dedicated member of our church to come to the College for full-time training d if necessary, support him financially. Let him take our place, as it were, as a fulltime harvester in the years to come.


Secondly, support the Bible College or get your church or group to support the College. There is at present a need for \$20,000 to renovate the College premises and increase the capacity for resident students by another 16, making a total of 66 bed spaces. This is an investment that will definitely multiply manyfold in the years to come. (See Renovation Note).

Thirdly, take up part-time study in the evening classes of the Bible College, and if this is not possible, make a real effort to study the Word of God diligently and daily by ourselves. Consult the Bible College or our pastor on what systematic part-time courses we can pursue in order to better equip ourselves as part-time harvesters. Sunday School teachers, Bible Class teachers, lay preachers and lay evangelists, all should consistently enrich themselves spiritually in order to be able to give out to thers richly.

A Matter of greatest importance and urgency Today, with an ever increasing and ripening harvest to be reaped and an ever diminishing supply of faithful harvesters, it is a matter of the greatest importance and urgency for us all to put our shoulders to the wheel and help train more and more consecrated, skilful and zealous harvesters to reap the fast ripening harvest. Lost souls need to be saved, and saved without delay. The Churches of Jesus Christ need to be kept pure in faith and practice, and be saved from being engulfed in the overwhelming, soul-destroying tide of the Ecumenical Movement. Then will all of us as sowers or reapers rejoice together, gathering fruit unto life eternal (John 4:36).

That heavenly citizens while on earth are citizens also of the realm wherein they live is taught by our Lord in this famous saying "Render therefore unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's and unto God the things that are God's" (Matt. 27:21). Hence our young people should serve with a willing and cheerful heart in the armed forces. A notable example of Christian patriotism is that of Lt. Col. Dr Yung, a gynaecologist. A busy man - yet he finds time and pleasure to serve his nation under uniform like an old scout who cannot relinquish his scouting.

Therefore, next to serving fulltime in the Lord's Army, I would that our young men consider taking up soldiering as a career. In this double respect we have our own Dr Patrick Tan for a nobler example. He has joined the armed forces in order that God's Kingdom might find a place in the hearts of our soldiers. A patriotic Christian and a Christian patriot. GOD HAS DOUBLY, YEA TREBLY, CONFIRMED

Last week, when I had the architects' drawings of the recently completed Siantan Church-Kindergarten reproduced with a 2-storey extension housing Parsonage (upstairs) and Fellowship Hall downstairs, I was constrained to add, "We need to press on in the work of the Lord because Jesus' coming is near. Even at the door! For this reason I make no apology to hasten with the development of our Church-Kindergarten complex at Siantan Slum Village, Pontianak." The same Lord's Day I reported 4 sums earlier received for Djunaidi, totalling \$880.

Since that communication from my trembling pen, the Lord has doubly confirmed this decision. First, the Chinese Service has reacted with gladness. Mrs Lee Choon Ngee our Treasurer responded to do her best to exhort the Chinese-speaking Lifers. Second, an envelope of \$500 came in, marked "Gospel Boat", which is earmarked for Djunaidi. Third, the B-P Banner pledged a hearty \$10,000. We have one-quarter of our financial needs met in a week! I also said, "Let not this urgent and essential new development hamper our New Church at Woodlands project. But let not God's Kingdom be bogged down by Woodlands either." We shall not channel sums intended for Woodlands to Siantan, Pontianak. But please forget not Siantan in your prayers. To Djunaidi and co-workers in Pontianak may you enlist young people to contribute their labour to construction work, so as to cut down expenses. If every member will do his best, God will take care of the rest!"

PASTOR RICHARD WURMBRAND COMING! FOURTH VISIT

And he will preach at Life Church, Aug. 30, 10 a.m. and at Calvary Pandan Sunset Gospel Hour, 6 p.m. the same day. How God is vindicating the B-P Church again! He had served a 14-year jail sentence under the Russian Communists. The scars of torture on his body are matched only by the vivid description our brother has made in a book called "Tortured for Christ". Read this book for a blessing!

Pastor Wurmbrand has a ministry to suffering Christians behind the Iron Curtain. He has written a good number of books, most inspiring, deep and erudite. Any book by him is first class reading.

As next Sunday, Aug. 30 10 a.m. will see the Church packed to standing capacity, let me exhort you to come early. Bring a friend who will surely thank you for the spiritual treat. Then there is the Sunset Gospel Hour at Calvary Pandan B-P Church at which Pastor Wurm-

_rand will also speak. We might have to use the downstairs Quadrangle!

Pastor Wurmbrand, an independent Christian Minister, takes a strong stand against Communism, Romanism, Modernism and Ecumenism: He is not afraid to speak out against Pharisees in the Church today.

PASTOR WURMBRAND WRITES

"Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites!" appears seven times in Matthew 23. During my years in solitary confinement in a Communist prison in Romania, where we were allowed neither books nor paper, I created in my mind different films that I often "viewed" inwardly.

One of the films concerned all that I could remember of my past life. Eventually I made several versions of the film: (a) what really happened, and (b) what would have occurred if at certain turning points I had made the right decision instead of the wrong one.

Even today I practice this spiritual exercise, which is very helpful for discerning and overcoming any hypocrisy that has crept into one's life. I heartily recommend it.

Jesus wrote no fund-raising letters, nor did He make fund-raising appeals. On the contrary, He antagonized the most influential segment of Jewish society. Had he not pronounced seven woes against the Pharisees (see Matthew 23), He might have received much support for His incipient church. Today's professional fund-raisers would certainly have advised Him not to irritate the moneyed classes.

We too will expose hypocrisy in high places, not that you should despise others, but rather that we might see in their potrait a magnification of our own hypocrisy and might repent of our sins.

I do not intend to deal with all manifestations of hypocrisy but will confine myself to the hypocritical alliances of clergy with Communism.

In the USA, Maryknoll priests and religious have repeatedly shown their sympathy with the revolutionists in Latin America. The Protestant leaders organized under the banners of the World and National Councils of Churches give financial support to guerrillas who murder missionaries.

In France a Catholic Committee Against Hunger was created. Read the following list of the items on which they spent money collected in churches and you will realize how they fight hunger: "organization of trade unions and political cadres in Latin America, organization of 100 individuals responsible for guerrilla warfare, rebellion against the dictatorship in Chile, etc."

In addition, the French Protestant Relief Organization states clearly, "It is no longer a question of whether or not to make revolution, but only to decide who will make it ... The problem is not to make a theology of revolution, but to know how Christians can parti-

cipate in a responsible way in the revolutionary process." ("CICES," 4/81)

These are hypocritical priests and pastors. They call themselves disciples of Jesus, Love Incarnate, but instead of teaching the poor and the rich how to repent of their sins

and abandon their wicked ways, they foment and promote bloody revolutions.

Can they feign ignorance of the fact that the Russian revolution cost the lives of 66 million people, the Chinese of 60 million, the Cambodian of two million? Death and destruct-

ion are what revolution gave to the poor.

Eichmann, the German mass murderer of Jews, is said to have remarked before being hanged, "I descend to the grave happy, knowing that six million Jews preceded me there." The Communists can boast of having slaughtered well over 100 million victims.

And what of those who have survived the purges and bloodbaths? Do the leftist clergy not know that in Russia, Romania, and Poland, among other Communist nations, people stand in line for food? In Russia they tell a wry joke: "God should have established Socialism in paradise. Then there would have been no apples, and the first couple would not have sinned." Is it worth fomenting revolution only to increase famine? "Voice of the Martyrs", July '81

GEMS FROM WURMBRAND'S SERMONS

Gleaned from his first visit to Singapore in October 1972.

1. From "Unprofitable Servants" to Profitable Ones. In the parable of the "unprofitable servants" (Luke 17:7-10), we observe that we belong to this category if we serve the Lord merely from a sense of duty. If we do work for the Lord with the mentality of a servant, doing no more than is required, we remain "unprofitable". We should rise above this level of one with a passionate love. Then our service becomes profitable indeed!

From Moses to David, God had chosen to dwell with His people in a tabernacle. It was David of all His saints who felt a holy desire to build a better building for the Lord, to make it out of gold and precious stones and the finest cedar wood. He desired to do this because he passionately loved His God. For this holy desire to build God a House, David was rewarded with an established throne and a high commendation from the Lord. Let us serve the Lord not as servants but with a passionate love that makes us delight in His service.

- 2. "366 Fear Nots". One injunction to Joshua that recurs again and again is "Fear not". When I made a count of the number of "fear nots" in the Bible, I found that there are 366 of them, i.e., one for each day of the year, plus one for the leap year. How good it is to know that our God is with us every day and every fraction of a day. He tells us not to be afraid anytime, for He cares for us.
- 3. SAVED, while the Sermon is preached! How often evangelists who call for decisions of the end of a sermon give the impression that it is by their call that a sinner comes to repentance. This is not true. As the message is being preached and a soul, hearing the glad news of Christ's saving grace believes through the working of the Holy Spirit, then he is saved there and then. As you hear the Word being preached now and you believe, you are already saved! You are saved now as I speak!
- 4. Members one of another. How is it that when someone hits you with a truncheon on the ankle you groan with your tongue? Because ankle and tongue are members one of another, members of the same body. When Christians are tortured by the Communists, we who are outside the Iron and Bamboo Curtains cannot help but cry out! We are members one of another of the same body of Christ.
- 5. Prayer, as defined by a sacret believer in Red China hearing our braodcast is: After you have said everything throughout the day and you can conclude with "Amen", then it is prayer. Such a definition could not have been made by one going through ten seminaries!
- 6. Another insight into the deep truths of Christianity is observed by the underground Church in China don't try to be "better" Christians, rather become Christ-like Christians!
- 7. Prayer is a dialogue not a monologue. When I was a little boy I once pranked on the door bells of my neighbourhood. After ringing the door bells, one by one, I ran away from the inmates. Often we are like that in our prayers made to God. We repeat some outworn phrases perfunctorily and we rush away from Him into our own world of business or pleasure. don't give him a chance to reply, to speak back to us. Prayer is a dialogue. Let us reverently wait for His answers.
- 8. Be a "jubilated" Christian. In the Catholic Church Calendar a name is given to every Sunday. One is called "Jubilate" i.e. "Be jubilant" or "make a joyful noise". On such a Sunday I observed no sign of jubilation in the priest as he mumbled a prayer. Even so, at dinner time we thank God for our food with neither jest nor expression. But upon tasting the sweetness of the soup we husbands would thank our wives most profusely. But we don't thank God for the good wives He gives us! Let us thank God not perfunctorily, but profusely. Let us start a new kind of Christianity that is not afraid to shout "Hallelujah, Praise the Lord!" Let us become "jubilated" Christians!

 9. God gives us a better name, but do we live up to it? God changed Abram's name to Abraham, which means "father of many nations" and Sarai's to Sarah which means "princess" and she was "mother of many nations". Do you live up to your name who are called Mary, John or Magdalene? Do you live a life of holiness like Mary, mother of our Lord, a life of passionate love for our Lord like John the Apostle, and a life of dedication from one previously degraded by sin like Mary Madgalene? When the Lord asked me in the prison cell one day, "What is your name?" I dared not answer a word because I could not measure myself to Richard the English martyr who died for Jesus centuries ago in England.
- 10. God our Father. Jesus teaches us in the Lord's Prayer to say, "Our Father." It is He who has shown us this most endearing name of God!

Once a boy was standing on an island. As a big ship sailed by he waved the ship to stop. Some men who were around made fun of him. But the ship suddenly swung round and a little boat was let down which soon ferried the boy up the big ship. Said the boy to the mockers, "Did you know that the captain of the ship is my father?" How good it is to know that God is our father. He will do His utmost for us, who are become his children through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Luther was reputed to look into the sky from his bedroom window before he retired. He would say, "Good night, God. I commit your church and everything to your care as I rest my body for the night." He knew God as his Father. Do you know God as your loving Father?

11. Your name is linked to God's. Once my wife witnessed to a woman warder while in prison and she believed. She wanted to know more about God, particularly His name. My wife had not studied theology, but the Holy Spirit gave her an answer. She said, I have heard that God is called God of Abraham, God of Isaac and God of Jacob. So God condescends to link His Name to a person's name. Your name is Nina. So He is God of Nina.

Now in Hebrew the word "of" does not appear separately like the English so that it reads "God-of" Abraham, "God-of" Isaac, "God-of" Jacob. God's name and your name are the only two words together linked. How privileged you are to so received of God that you are verily his .. and He yours, as Paul says, "For me to live is Christ!" Can you put God's Name before your name?

Smile! The love of Christ can put a smile on our lips in the darkest moments of our 12. life.

Once the Communists made a cunning plan to shatter the faith of a young Christian girl. They arrested her on the very day of her wedding, yes, even at the sacred ceremony that was being performed in the Church. This Christian girl, instead of being shocked to death or fainting fits, smiled upon her captors. Giving herself up to be handcuffed she said goodbye to her husband. She looked forward now to seeing her Heavenly Bridegroom in the prison cell, and sang a song of praise as she was led away.

The smile that Christ gives us is an arch with strength to straighten out every crooked line of our life.

DR LAIRD HARRIS, MY TEACHER AND FRIEND

I first came to know of Dr Laird Harris when I was a student under Dr Chia Yu Ming in Nanking, 1946. It was through a catalogue of Faith Theological Seminary, then located at Wilmington, Delaware that had found its way to China. Rev Harris (he was a minister of the Bible Presbyterian Church, USA) was then Registrar and Instructor in Old Testament.

From Nanking I wrote Rev Laird Harris of my intention to transfer to Faith Seminary. Somehow, he did not reply (or was I too impatient?). So, I wrote again, but somehow I addressed it to a Board member instead, the Rev Harold Laird. I got mixed up between Laird Harris and Harold Laird, but I gained an extra friend! Then came the reply from Laird Harris admitting me to Faith Seminary with a small foreign scholarship.

No sooner had I arrived in USA, Jan. 1948 than Rev Laird Harris was conferred the Ph.D.

by Dropsie College of Hebrew Learning in Philadelphia.

Faith Seminary was in her heyday then. Stalwarts of Faith, devout teachers of Holy Scripture, made up the illustrious team that Faith's faculty was - Allan MacRae, J.O. Buswell, R.L. Harris, Douglas Young, John Sanderson, Harold Mare, Jack Murray. Dr Carl McIntire was and still is Faith's President. How I treasure the knowledge of God's Word faithfully imparted from each of these professors.

Laird Harris, however, became my closest friend. He taught me Theology, Hebrew, both the old and New Testament! What perhaps drew me closer to him was the class in Syriac, held at home to a small class, bolstered sometimes with coffee and cakes (to keep us awake?). As Registrar, Dr Harris was in close contact with students. This was another reason.


I specially treasure the analytical study of Barthianism or Neo-orthodoxy which Harris taught, but the greatest theology I learnt from him is the Doctrine of the Inerrancy and Infallibility of the Word of God. That Harris is the author of "Canonicity and Inerrancy of Holy Scripture" which won the Zondervan prize proves my point. Dr Harris was also involved in the 20th Century Reformation Movement and was present at the 2nd Plenary Congress of the International Council of Christian Churches in Geneva, Switzerland, 1950. He had a part also in my ordination in Geneva, with Dr Buswell as moderator.

After Faith, Dr Harris went to teach at Covenant Theological Seminary. In July 1979 when Mrs Tow and children and I were returning to Singapore after our ministry at the Alma Mater, we visited with the Harrises in St. Louis, staying for the night. Mrs Harris kindly served us breakfast. Alas, sometime last year I heard Mrs Harris had gone to glory. This was a

great blow to the doctor, for they were a loving couple.

With the passage of time, however, the Lord has found another help meet for him. Dr Harris married the former Miss Anne Krauss, Faith alumna and missionary to Japan, on Aug. 1, 1981. Dr Harris and the new Mrs Harris are able to come to Singapore as they have a ministry in India and Hongkong, and Singapore is in between. What a windfall of blessing to Singaporeans!

Dr Harris has also taught Rev Tan Wai Choon and Mr Bob Phee. He is one of the translators of the NIV (New International Version of the Bible) and author of a Hebrew Grammar, widely used throughout the world. In these days of widespread denial of the Word of God, with increasing attacks on its Inerrancy, it will be well for you, my Reader, to hear such a devout scholar. Dr Laird Harris is erudite and brilliant but the greater than these is his love for his Saviour. And, "the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom" (Job. 28:28). - T.T.


the funds through Mr Liau that payment be made accordingly.



But if we have a real revival,

then, things would surely be different.

You put up the Expressgram that 2 checks for Dyak preachers from C.T. Hsu have reached you safely. But it is better to say the amount of the two checks so that readers may know how much we have supported the Dyak preachers. Readers have so many things in their minds and except you tell them clearly every time, they do not know the real situation and be moved and be encouraged. (2x (3x50) = US\$300)

This is more for real edification of our people, as some Christians may think that pastors always ask for money, but they don't give much themselves. Well, it's not always so, like C.T. Hsu, he gives so much for the Lord too.

I am now 64. I work 10-11 hours every day on the street. I work at home, reading many letters, reports, books, and prepare articles to be published, about 3 hours every evening. Even Sunday I am very very busy indeed, including preparing new Gospel garbage cans to replace destroyed ones frequently, and giving out tracts and booklets in Chinatown.

So little time to write anything to you, I hope you understand.

The Lord may be back real soon. Russia may start a new war to defeat U.S., not giving time for U.S. to catch up in military strength. Russia may drive Vietnam to start invasions in South East Asia too. So plan your program accordingly. - Hsu

C.T. HSU, MY BROTHER IN THE LORD

I have known C.T. Hsu since 1935, soon after the John Sung Revival. He has remained to this day my bosom friend and brother in the Lord. Whenever I visit America, he is the one friend I must see, face to face. I cannot help mentioning him in my sermons as an example of a loving disciple of Christ.

C.T. Hsu is another of those gloriously saved under John Sung. He joined the J.S. Evange-listic Band. Since then he has devoted all his life to every evangelistic outreach. He is one of those who live for the Day when he will stand with confidence before the Judgment Seat of Christ.

When our Church was inaugurated in Oct. 1950, he was one of the founding fathers. He was elected Deacon. He heartily joined me and Rev. K.C. Quek in our stand for separation from the Ecumenical Movement. He was present at the founding of the Far Eastern Council of Christian Churches in Manila, 1951 (paying his own way). He joined me in many evangelistic trips up the Peninsula. He helped to get Miss Char's Jemaluang Church started by offering self-driven car. In 1956, at the 3rd Assembly of the FECCC in Singapore, he was ordained together with Rev. K.C. Quek.

1960 saw Rev Hsu and family migrate to New York. He had a small Chinese Church in the beginning. God has blessed his six children. One of them is an ordained minister.

For a number of years now Rev Hsu has served the Lord as a taxi-pastor. While earning an honest living, he ceases not to preach Christ to his passengers. To start a conversation with his clients, he wears on his back an "Only Jesus Saves" label. This brings him into many a contact with R.Cs. This gives him an opportunity of witnessing to them that Christ is the Mediator, not Mary. (I Tim. 2:5).

I have seen half a dozen of his Gospel Garbage Cans that he installs at street corners in Chinatown. A strange way of witnessing? St Paul would be delighted with any means you could use to preach Christ. Surely it is more effective than Balloons carrying Gospels to Communist countries that American Christians once employed. I say the Gospel Cans are more effective because a good number of the hundreds of Chinese who pass by would want to see what the Chinese Characters painted thereon out of curiosity. But you say, "Jesus' Name on the Garbage Can?" That's a picture of what we are, full of filth and sin but Christ has condescended to come to us.


C.T. Hsu has a point in telling me to make public the amount he is contributing to our Lord's Cause. This time he sends US\$200 for FEBC renovations. He is also my spokesman to urge Christians to consider more support for God's work. I'm glad he puts in a word for Woodlands too - if only the hearts of Christians are revived. A NEW PRESBYTERY IS BORN

Saturday Sept. 19, 1981, 3.00 p.m.! The Bell of Rawang Church clanged the announcement of a special meeting: An epochal meeting. The projected formation of the Chinese Presbytery of the B-P Church of Singapore and Malaysia had now become a reality. "A new presbytery is born!"

Rev T Tow, moderator of the B-P CSM called the congregation to worship in the words of Ps. 133. Rev Lin Tah Mon of Grace Chinese Service offered the invocation. Rev Peter Tong of Jurong BPC (Chinese) and Mr Koh Kian Mia of Toa Payoh read the Scriptures. The Young

People's Choir of Rawang Church sang.

Then the moderator gave a historic survey of the development of the BPC since it began as the English Service of Life Church, Prinsep St., Oct. 20, 1950. He noted that Rawang Church which become an independent Church 1922 and joined the BPC Movement Sept. 1972, after the completion of the new Church, issued from the same fountain of Faith. We are originated from the labours of William Chalmers Burns of Scotland, first missionary under the English Presbyterian Mission to South China, by whom our ancestors were converted. He noted this to be a precious heritage that goes right back to the 16th Century Reformation to John Knox and John Calvin.

Rev Quek Kiok Chiang, coordinator of the Chinese Presbytery, gave the Word according to Phil. 1:27 "Striving together for the faith of the Gospel." Greetings were brought by the following: Elders Teo Teck Heng and Lau Hock Ann of Rawang Church; Elder John Ling of Kelapa it; Elders Teo See Yak, Chuang Shih I representing Faith Church, the biggest contingent; Mr Tsao See of Life Chinese Service; Rev Peter Tong of Calvary Jurong, Mr Koh Kian Mia of Toa Payoh BP Church, Mr David Wong of Grace Chinese Service and Kulai Besar, Rev Chan Lay Seng of Calvary Pandan.

The service closed with the singing of "Blest Be the Tie that Binds" with the benediction pronounced by Rev Teng Sih Shan, visiting pastor from Indonesia.

After service the local congregation regaled the Singapore and Kelapa Sawit delegates with "high tea" (Chinese style). Thereafter the Chinese Presbytery decided to be represented in force at the formation of the Synod, Oct. 25, 1981. Rev Quek Kiok Chiang was elected moderator, Elder Chang Oon Soo of Faith Church Stated Clerk, and Elder John Ling, Treasurer.

Rev Tow, I would like to know when would you be able to conduct the Holy Communion for us and also to conduct baptismal service for the eleven persons who have decision to get baptism in the B-P Sumatra?

Why all these Renovations?

There was a spate of renovations before the FECCC Gen. Assembly in June. After the Conference we have resumed with a Phase II to this moment, and it will take a fortnight yet to finish, just in time for the great influx of campers, Nov-Dec!



The coldblooded precision of technology may seem to be at odds with the mysteries of religion. But in a computer study of the Bible called the Genesis Project, the twain have met - and surprisingly, the Good Book has won a vote of confidence from the soulless machine.

At issue is the authorship of the Pentateuch, the first five books of the Old Test.

ment. Traditionally, Jews and Christians alike considered the Pentateuch to be the work of Moses. But for the past hundred years, liberal theologians have generally agreed that the books of Moses are the work of a variety of writers. The conclusion was based on rigorous exegeses of the contradictions, duplications and varying vocabularies in the holy text. One notable example: the first two chapters of Genesis contain two overlapping versions of the creation of man and woman.

Distinct: Enter the Genesis Project: two computer experts and a Biblical scholar working at Israel's prestigious Technion Institute. They fed the 20,000 words of the book of Genesis into a computer programed to conduct an exhaustive linguistic analysis of words, phrases and passages in the original Hebrew. The results, to be officially released next month, were striking. Two narrative strains that scholars have long considered distinct because they employ different words for God turned out to be linguistically indistinguishable when methodically compared by the computer. A third strain-designated "Priestly" because of its preoccupation with ritual and genealogy-did stand apart, but project coordi-*

FIRST PRESBYTERIAL RETREAT AT PORT DICKSON

The journey from Singapore to Golden Sands, along the winding coastal road from Malacca, took 6½ hours, a distance of 324 km.

Golden Sands is second-to-none for a Christian Conference such as this. At the low price we paid, for the accommodation we got, and for the on the spot cheerful Christian service. Three cheers for the Baptists!

Four messages were given. The first by Rev Tow was from Ps. 133 on the need of reviving waning brotherly love and oneness in our B-P Movement. The second by Rev Quek challenged the audience to suffering for Christ in these last days. The third by Dr Tow Siang Hwa listed 10 "precious points to pastors" from II Timothy. Rev Peter Chua gave the closing message on Christ's Authority.

After each message time was given for questions and answers. A special brain-storming session was held on the second morning in the "amphitheatre" overlooking the sea under giant trees that served as umbrellas. There was no pleasanter setting under a clear blue sky with the murmuring waves below. In all these question-and-answer sessions every conceivable subject was brought out for discussion - from how to preach a good sermon to Chic publications and Dalai Lama burning incense in Westminster Abbey.

There's the sudden arrival of visitors from S'pore and Muar - Paul Wong, Agus and Kivai behind the wheel of Elder and Mrs Kwa's Alfa Romeo! These added to the spirit of the second night's session. Our visitors, incidentally, were on their way to K.L. with their "hotel" booked at the Chinese Presbyterians' new retreat centre, a mile or two out of Port Dickson.

All conferees agreed such a good start of a B-P Retreat should be followed up annually, and even enlarged to take in the whole church. And the place? Golden Sands again! The need to speak to one another, to seek one another in our growing B-P Movement was never greater. Let all B-Pers reading this report prepare to come to Port Dickson, 1982! The date cannot be decided but by the mutual adjustments between us and the Baptist Administration. Praise God for a wonderful first retreat now become history.



"FACES CHANGE COLOUR AT THE MENTION OF THE SIGER"!

This is a Chinese saying about Money. Don't you ever bring the mighty Subject into conversation, for the mention of it would scare your friend. This should not be in Christian circles. In the words of St Paul who exhorted the Philippians to give, "Not because I desire a gift; but I desire fruit that may abound to your account" (Phil 4:17). Let not the mention of Tigerish Majesty scare you!



SOME THOUGHTS ON SADAT

It was just after eleven Tuesday night last when the phone rang. Rev K.C. Quek relayed, "Do you know that Sadat is dead?" To say that his death shocked me, as it must have shocked you, is to put it very mildly. Sadat's death has come upon the world like the explosion of an atom bomb! Sadat, the brave son of peace is dead. So dies the hope of a workable peace in the Middle East? is one of my sad thoughts on Sadat. Alas, for Sadat!

Sadat was he who made a pilgrimage for world peace, to Jerusalem. He made peace with Israel. As God has promised, according to David's Psalm 122, prosperity to those who love Jerusalem, I said in my recent sermon at Calvary Pandan concerning haters and lovers of the Jews in these words: "Israel is bound to be a great nation again, because God has set this seal upon her in Abraham: 'And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee' (Gen. 12:3). Thus those who have persecuted Abraham's descendants the Jews have lost out. Yea, they have been thoroughly extinguished. The macabre ending of Hitler, the Jewbaitor and arch anti-Semitic, is notorious. Then there arose Nasser, who wanted to throw every Jew into the sea before the Six-Day War. He soon died of a grave disease in the War's aftermath ..."

Now this is what I said immediately about Sadat: "How we thank God for Sadat, his successor, who has bravely stood alone to make peace with Israel. I can predict such a man will not end up like Hitler or Nasser. Inasmuch as he has made peace with Israel, God will be his shield."

I was speaking from a projection of Ps. 122 in which God has put His blessing on every er of Jerusalem. I was right in the light of what has happened to Sadat. He has not died an ignominious death like Hitler nor of a debilitating disease like Nasser. He has died a martyr for the cause of peace. But I am totally shocked by his sudden assasination which I could never have foreseen. God is the Omniscient One. Let me be humbled to the dust. Let all preachers on prophecy be humbled as well. This is a salutary thought from Sadat.

Now the sombre thought on Sadat. By the atomic-blast of his death on the whole world, Armageddon is sooner than we thought! To say with Deng Xiao-ping that the world's peace would be most endangered in the late eighties can fool oneself into a false complacency. Whatever the pronouncements of great men, let us stick to our Lord's warning to be prepared for the worst right now. Paul says in I Thess. 5:3, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety then sudden destruction cometh upon them as travail upon a woman with child, and they shall not escape" This is the world's plight, not the Christian's plight.

How then can we be prepared? We are prepared when we have received Christ as our Saviour. When our sins are washed away by the Blood of the Lamb. When we are walking in holiness with Him. Are we?

But preparedness is not merely in regard to the salvation of one's soul. Preparedness includes loving service and devotion to God in our earthly life. Are you engrossed only in your ambitions and plans? Or are you giving equal if not greater part of your thoughts and endeavours to God's Kingdom? "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all use things shall be added unto you" (Matt. 6:33). Do you miss Church for your own profit and pleasure? Do you take the tithe that belongs to God to invest for your own enrichment? Do you ever take extra time to lead a soul to Christ, or say you, I can't bother? Do you spend time with God or spend time with the T.V.?

Indeed, if we are wise children waiting daily for Christ's return, we will be going all out with our energy, time and money to labour for Him till He comes! Saving thoughts from Sadat's death!

Alma mater, a Latin word which means "benign mother" or "fostering mother" is a term lovingly used by old students to their university. Hence, by old boys to their schools. This is very evident with Chinese schools whose sons and daughters are more forward to express their filial piety.

Calvin says the Church is also like a mother. In Book IV Ch. 1 Calvin says of the Church, "in whose bosom it is God's will that all His children should be collected, not only to be nourished by her assistance and ministry during their infancy and childhood, but also to be governed by her maternal care till they attain, and at length reach the end of their faith ... that the Church is the mother of all who have him for

their Father ... according to the testimony of the apostle who declares the new and heavenly Jerusalem to be "the mother of us all" (Gal. 4:26).

Ps. 103 reminds us not to forget all His benefits - sins forgiven, sicknesses healed, preservation from death in accidents, e.g., provision of good things even to our mouth each day ...

Beware of Tongue-Twisters

It is the prophet Isaiah who says, "Woe unto them that call evil good and good evil, that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitterness for sweet, and sweet bitter!" (Isa. 5:20).

Now the communists are master tongue-twisters in the deceitful use of words: To inject into a good word a bad meaning, to palm off a word to cover up an ugly truth For example, "peaceful coexistence" to these pundits of deceit is that of the mouse in the stomach of the cat. Democracy is the mouse and communism the cat. Catch that?

Equally deceitful are other coiners of new terminology these evil days. I don't know who invented "life style", but it has come into vogue only during the last decade. Any old immorality you can read about today has a new name. "Homosexuality" is called "gay", a "life-style" that's all. "Lesbianism" is another "lifestyle", and so forth. Not only the twisting tongue is in play, but also the wriggling tail of the snake.

Then they have used the good word "fundamentalist" to mean "extremist". By now we are so used to hearing about Muslim "fundamentalists" of Ayatollah Khomeiny. Now I have heard expositors on Islam that one fundamental of Mohamedanism is peace. Therefore to call a blood-busting Iranian Muslim under Khomeiny a fundamentalist casts grave aspersion on the Bible-believing fundamentalist. The substitute of "fundamentalist" for "extremist" has been subtly made, but not for long when truth is out! Now they return to "extremist" when the Muslims of Asyut attack the Egyptian police alongside Sadat's assasination. Yes, it is more truthful to call them all "extremists". Fundamentalist simply means those who keep to the fundaments on basics of doctrine. So there are fundamentalists among the Jews too. We are Bible-believing fundamentalists but by no means extremists. Beware of tongue-twisters. Every new word introduced in the English language these days has to be scrutinised. "Woe unto them that call evil good and good evil..." - T.T.

1981 - THE YEAR OF YEARS IN OUR B-PC MOVEMENT

May they carry on the torch of their fathers' faith, without compromise, to the end.

This year of years will witness the redoubling extension of God's Kingdom in the physical realm. The ground should be broken before long for the construction of Ling Kwang Home for Se or Citizens and of the New Life Church at Woodlands. (Beulah is our youthful, advance party). Galilee is also catching up with the plans to build their Second Phase. Sembawang has succeeded in purchasing Salem Chapel in the Teachers Estate. Last but not least is the raising of a two-storey Djunaidi Parsonage cum Church Hall at Siantan, Pontianak, West Kalimantan. These are avenues of service whereby Readers who have no talent or time to preach can serve - with your funds. (God bless every cheerful giver). Then there is the soon completion of a seven-classroom school building at Tanjung Pinang which will contribute significantly to the Church and Sunday School now being held on the same premises. 



WHAT FUN TO CAMP

HOUSE?

Church camps today are just as popular as Tourism! With the rat race on - accelerated production and pressurised study - both old and young need relaxation. For, "all work and no play makes Jack a dull boy." Christians go out to some distant resort, such as Port Dickson or Fraser's Hill, for recreational fellowship. They come home infused with new vigour to do their daily chores. Even our Lord needed this, for He would take the disciples aside

to some mountain or desert country to rest. Hence comes the word "retreat" into our Christian vocabulary.

The young people of our Church, especially, are ahead in this ministry of Christian recreation. Then there has been opened a children's camp for the last two years in our own Church to great success. Why not then take in the oldsters, and any one who would come? There's a great reservoir to be tapped outside of our youth groups. There's the neglected Chinese Section, particularly the mothers and grandmas. Though Session has voted to go to Port Dickson Dec. 1982, for this year we can have our Church Camp right here at Gilstead Road! But what fun? you ask.

While it is admitted that the ideal is outside Singapore, there are advantages camping __ our own house:

1. It affords those who cannot take leave the opportunity to camp in part-time! After work, return to the camp grounds to relax the rest of the day and night and not to more work at home.

2. It costs but a fraction of what you'd have to pay travelling abroad.

- 3. Our garden of fragrant pine and palm, standing next to a greenwood I've called the "Forest of Lebanon" is a window into Creation. Apart from the greenery that surrounds us, there's that constant soothing note of chirping birds, if you'd stop to listen, that adds melody to the colours. Every morning, at the first streak of dawn, a tree-top chorus from a hundred twittering voices would sing you a "It is time to wake up!" - nature's computerised music clock, without fail, to the second. As darkness deepens into night, then comes the echo from more throaty voices below, the frogs making merry on the Sea of Galilee. And now, not only Galilee Sea, but the Forest of Lebanon Fish Pond and the Little Fish Pond (where is it?). Who'd donate a fountain for that long, oblong "waterhouse" at the back to brighten it up?
- 4. And have you not noticed the renovations, still going on, that have added these attractions to the young Bird House, Squirrel House, Rabbit Hole, Upper Room, Jerusalem Court Chapel, Girls' Roof Garden. How many sleeping capsules can you count? Where is the --Workshop of the "Breakthrough" Book-binders? Where will two new pondoks, with built-in Leats, be located?
- 5. Example from Israel: When we were in Israel, we saw how the Jews kept the Feast of Tabernacles or Booths. This was a weeklong affair. If they had a garden they would build a temporary pondok with branches and palm leaves, whatever that came fresh from the forest. If they lived in a flat with a verendah, they would make do by bringing in the green branches and putting up some sort of natural covering over their heads. Thus surrounded by "nature" they would rejoice in a festal air. That's their camp! Surely, we have much more than that! And we need not stick to a set calendar. We can camp anytime we like. Thus, these beautiful grounds at our Church are made more beautiful for the enjoyment of every Lifer anytime throughout the year.

That young Lifers have camped in frequently should be sufficient testimony to the whole Church why it is just as fun to camp in your own house.

One great spiritual truth that I learnt after becoming a Christian was that "...while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). Yes, Christ did it for us all and He had increasingly revealed Himself to me even while I was still in the dark; a lost sinner groping for the truth.

In the first place, God made us such that without Him, we would feel a void in our lives. This I felt in my early childhood (even though I was a rather staunch Buddhist then) and I could not find an answer to the many perplexing problems in life and also as to my destination after death. Night after night, I would ponder over such issues in my mind and having

not been able to find all the answers, I would fall into an uneasy rest. Finally, I came to the conclusion that Buddhism is perhaps not the way to God. I then decided in my heart to seek out the truth for myself.

My experiences with Christianity were not altogether satisfying. I had been brought to Church as a small child. Even now, I realized that my heeds were not met there for the gospel was not presented to me at all. And every Sunday morning saw me surrounded with toys and sometimes with lambs made of cotton-wool and toothracks. I felt miserable, the only joy I found was dropping a ten-cent coin into the offering bag everytime it was passed around. Even on the day of Christmas, I found that presents given were based on a system of merit. Active children were given wonderful gifts whereas the more passive ones; (if seemed that I was the only one then) were given not-so-satisfying presents for Christmas. Hence I received only two handkerchiefs as a present and this had some kind of an impact on my life. I discovered that Christianity was not so ideal after all. It was shortly after that I left the Church.

The next incident happened when I was in primary six. My cousin was telling my sisters and I about Hell. She made it sound so terrifying that I agreed to go to church with her the following Sunday. However, my father got to hear about it and he gave her a sound scolding. I was spared but the fear of my father was to prove an important element in my future dealings with Christian friends who tried to witness to me.

Two such friends spoke to me in early 1977. I was quite convinced by the things they told me but a fear of what laid ahead (if I were to become a Christian) prevented me from committing myself further. Likewise, many attempts followed but I always held back. And my friends almost gave up on me.

At the same time, I kept telling myself that I was still searching for the truth. Indeed the truth was revealed to me but I was blind to it. The death of my mother brought this issue to the fore once more. I had fought with God for long enough: finally I admitted that He might just be the One who could rescue me from all the uncertainties of life. My friend's words served to encourage me further. She said that if only I would take the faithful step of accepting Christ into my life, I would be released from all doubts and fears. I took her advice and in my three years with the Lord, I can say that I have never regretted that one step of faith - "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God" (Eph 2:8,9).

It is vain for us to talk of going to Timbuctoo when our younger brothers next street in Sumatra and next door in Johore are calling to us. The Mahjong Drive for Missions was an effort by the women of the Church to support the Lord's work. Not only Mahjong, but Bingo! "Next Wednesday Night, Bingo"! This ad appeared in an R.C. Church in Philadelphia, which we saw in 1978.

One result of such watered-down ethics in the Church is the encouragement to untaught Christians to indulge in games of chance and every sort of gambling. OUR KOREAN COMMISSION

What is known as the Great Commission - the Lord's Command to His disciples to "go and teach all nations" is often repeated in the Church today. So often is it heard that familiarity to the repeated sounds has brought contempt. Fortunately, it is not so with our Church. At the 31st Anniversary Dinner Testimonies, I was encouraged by Deacon Sng Teck Leong's remarks in which he expressed the joy of seeing our Church reach out to Sumatra and West Kalimantan. Yes, the Church is for Sumatra and Kalimantan. This is reflected in the gifts earmarked for these two fields. The latest is an envelope of \$300 for "Church-Kindergarten Kalimantan".

Now, to further encourage the hands and hearts who are minded in the Gospel outreach, God has honoured us with a Korean Commission. This has

been our mandate since over a year ago when we offered our Church premises to the Korean Church in Singapore - through our brotherly ties with Mr Stephen Hyun (now with Gideons International, Guam). The Koreans in Singapore are a fast growing community. There are over 1,000 residents and 2,000 imported workers (in the building projects). By offering our Church to the Koreans, we become an instrument in the saving of souls from the Korean nation. We are in no lesser role than receiving a Commission from the Lord to evangelise Korea itself.

Our relation with the Korean Church leads us to contact with the whole community. This is through the Korean Sat. School 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Children of Primary School age use our dergarten premises for instruction in the mother tongue. Most of these children are naturally non-Christian. By attending their own school on our Kindergarten grounds they are drawn closer to the Church. They are also influenced by the Bibles and Christian literature they are attracted to buy from our Book Centre.

If you should ask what results thus far have come about our association with the Koreans, I can give only those that are visible and known to us. First, Mr Stephen Hyun's own sonin-law, Mr Han Joong Sik. He studied four years at FEBC and graduated with a B.Th. With further degrees from the West, he is now teaching at a Theological Seminary in Pusan. Mrs Han who also studied at FEBC teaches in a Christian Day School. Presently a Miss Rhee, daughter of a Deacon of the Korean Church, is studying at FEBC. Through our Korean connection, two young men from Korea are applying to FEBC. The Lord be praised for the Korean outreaches. And all these have come about not by our zeal or prowess, but by the Lord's providence.

Auspiciously, this Lord's Day is the Thanksgiving Day of the Korean people. The Korean Church will celebrate with a special Lunch at the FEBC Hall 12.30 p.m. We have an Invitation from the Church to our Seven Elders with their wives to attend. May the following elders take note to join our Korean brethren this Lord's Day: Elders Khoo Peng Kiat, Lau King Hong, Lim Teck Chye, Eric Mahadevan, Seow Chong Pin, Edmund Tay and Peter Wang, Rev Patrick Tan N.B.!

"WAIT UPON THE LORD"

(Sermon by Catherine Ng to FEBC. Students)

My topic today is "Wait upon the Lord". The ability to wait upon the Lord is not easily acquired. We are restless and want to be on the move. We do not like to wait in line, or wait in the doctor's office — in fact, most of us just do not like to wait. It is much easier to act than to wait. Someone has said, "Waiting on God is not one of the marks of the average space—age Christian." Waiting on God is seeking His face for guidance and direction in our lives. It is becoming quiet enough before Him to hear His voice. If we do not take time to wait on Him we may go forth in the energy of the flesh or we may force open a door before His time. Wait! God's clock and His Calendar are not always the same as ours, but they are always right on time. Therefore, let us consider seriously the results of patient waiting upon the Lord.

1. Waiting upon the Lord is waiting according to His time schedule. "And therefore will the Lord wait, that he may be gracious unto you ... blessed are all they that wait for Him" Isa. 30:18). Perhaps today you may be waiting for God to do something for you. Are you puzzled by the delay? Do you think that perhaps God has forgotten you because no one has recognised your gifts and talents? God does not always answer us when we think He should. Sometimes He waits because He knows it is not the right time for the answer. He may be waiting that He may enlarge our capacity to receive and thus give us an even greater answer to our prayers. He may be waiting because we must learn needful lessons before He can answer our prayers. He waits that He may do His best for us. Isa. 30:18 "And therefore will the Lord wait, that he may be gracious unto you ... blessed are all they that wait for him." Our Lord is looking and longing to be gracious to us. Blessed are we if we wait earnestly for Him, for His victory, His favour, His love, His peace, His joy and His matchless, unbroken companionship.

The Bible speaks of many who had this ability to wait on the Lord. Joseph, for example, endured a long period of waiting, for he did not become a ruler in Egypt until many years

after he had been sold by his brothers. Yet he continued to wait upon God, and he could say to his brothers, "But God meant it unto good" (Gen. 50:20).

It had been well said, "His delays are not denials". The Lord is waiting that He may be gracious unto us.

One illustration for those who might be waiting upon the Lord. For those who are single, marriage perhaps may seem extremely important, but don't panic. God wants more for your life than a wife or husband. God's choice is the best choice. Leave things in God's hand and wait for His time. If you are single, marriage is not now God's complete will for you. What He wants now is to develop you into a fulfilled person, one who is maturing in character and ability, one who consistently experiences God's blessings.

If you are married, God will use many events from everyday life to mould you into a Christ-like person. He may choose the times when your children are sick to teach you to rely on HIm. He may use the death of a loved one to teach you that He is the Divine Comforter. He may allow you to experience personal failure in order to help you develop humility. Let us have patience with God to wait upon Him according to His time. Though patience is not a "once for all" spiritual experience. It is a spiritual quality that grows as we put God first in every circumstance. It is an attitude that says, "God, I thank you that you control circumstances. I want your will fulfilled in my life. You know the beginning from the end, so I am willing to wait for you to complete your program in your time."

Waiting upon the Lord is seeking His face for guidance and direction in our lives. "I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye" (Ps. 32:8). This is the promised for the believer's pathway. We could depend completely on Him for guidance. It is God-planned and God-directed that we are here at FEBC. God, has enrolled us in His Great University as His pupils. He has promised to instruct and teach us in the way we should go. He imparts to us the knowledge we need if we are to walk in the light of His will. Our Heavenly Teacher says, "I will instruct you and train you." He trains us to apply His instruction to our daily lives. Perhaps we are all still waiting upon the Lord for guidance and direction in the area of service after our study or our training at FEBC. Do we find the waiting hard to bear? Waiting upon the Lord is not easy but it is rewarding for He always gives us the best. When we serve the Lord, we want to be successful. There are times when we are very impatient while waiting upon the Lord. Just like our instant mee, instant coffee, instant breakfast, instant potatoes and so forth. We attend Church and hope to hear an instant sermon and like some young people who are searching for the instant will of God. We may also try to attend the school promising instant graduation. Six month and one year Bible Courses are becoming popular. The fact is we should not worry and hurry over things. We should learn to conquer our impatience to wait. Take for example, if we are waiting for someone, let us use the waiting time constructively. We can replace frustration with reading, planning or creative thinking.

Some of you may know where you are going to serve the Lord after your study but yet there are some who may not know. As we wait upon the Lord, let us use our time constructively. Involve yourselves in Church and College activities. Learn to discover our spiritual gifts and talents and use it for His glory, while we are still in school, and there will come the time when God will reveal to us where He wants us to be. God's concept of the proper time is, when He sees in us the capability of handling the responsibility. This means not only that we have the ability, but also the maturity.

Someone said, "Jesus is coming very soon." I'm not going to waste my time in Bible Coll. I have got to save the world. There is no time for that kind of education. What is this? Study! Study! Assignment! Assignment! Assignment! There is so much to work outside, witnessing to the lost, counselling and so on!! Look! this person does not consider that he could be an effective witness while attending school. At the same time he can become better equipped so as to serve the Lord effectively. When the Lord does return for His people, he is not going to count the number of people we have led to Christ. He wants us to do exactly what he has purposed in us. If Jesus finds us in school when He returns, He'll say, "Well done, good and faithful servant. You were doing exactly what I asked you to do." Let us learn to wait upon the Lord and yield ourselves to Him. Ps. 25:4,5: "Shew me thy ways, O Lord; teach me thy paths. Lead me in thy truth, and teach me for thou art the God of my salvation, on thee do I wait all the day."

Do not let your life be filled with troubles and discouragements when our friends and relatives laugh at us, while studying at Bible College. Pray! Work and keep waiting for God to do something significant in our life. The Lord's promise to us is, "You will be successful as you continue to serve in My power and for My glory."

3. Waiting on the Lord today, will renew our strength. "But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall walk, and not faint" (Isa. 40:31).

The condition for renewing our strength is waiting. We are to be waiting pilgrims, not weary ones. The Hebrew word for "wait" means "looking unto and expecting from": "looking unto God means praying and expecting from Him means trusting.

Ps. 62:5 "My soul wait thou only upon God, for my expectation is from Him." Wait prayerfully and expect trustingly. As we wait on God, our strength is renewed. We have exchanged our finite weakness for His infinite strength. This is illustrated by the eagles who have power to rise high above the storm. We, too, as we face the storms of life, can mount up with wings as eagles. God has "wing power" for us, but these wings are only for those who wait on the Lord. WHAT PROFIT?

Synopsis of last week's Sermon on Jesus' famous question: "For what is a man be profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul?" (Matt. 16:26)).

While it is the Bible's teaching that we are not to be ensuared by riches, "for the love of money is the root of all evil" (I Tim. 6:10), neither is the profit motive in life discounted. In fact it is essential for the well-being of society, for the prosperity of the Church.

In the parables of the talents (Mat. 25) and the Pounds (Luke 19) does not our Lord commend those servants who made profit from the capital money He had delivered them? Those who made more profit were given greater reward, those who made no effort to earn were harshly reprimanded. This teaching has been well imbibed by our Church from the beginning. Therefore Life Church and her daughter churches are thriving because it is required of us all to make profit for the Lord. Not only must the Church be run on a self-supporting and self-propagating basis. It must also win souls for hire. Profit must be made both in the physical and the spiritual. Yes, the profit motive is an essential part of life, but not profiteering. Not the making of excessive profits. "Insofar as the management of our Church's finance is concerned, all the Lord's people's offerings are kept in fixed deposit to earn at the present rate of 11-12%. To put the money in speculative business for high but risky profit is wrong. To just let it lie unproductive in current account is also wrong. But to make legitimate profit is according to our Lord's teaching.

How do we know whether any business is making profit or loss? The yearly balance sheet. But there is a greater and more important balance sheet we must look into and that is the balance sheet of life. To the more elderly members of this Church, I say this, "Should you come to the end of your life on earth and you have accumulated \$10 million and all the houses of Orchard Road, yea, even all the houses in Singapore, but your soul will land down in hell, of what use to you are the accumulated earthly riches? Remember the fate of the Rich Man in hell? But neither is there profit to you if you, having the same amount of wealth, should reach heaven, but have done nothing for God on earth. Of what profit is the \$10 million to a man departed out of earth? Of what value is it to him who gave but a few dollars from the mountainous abundance God had bestowed him? In His presence he will receive but the Lord's rebuke. What shame, what guilt, what remorse!!! So there will be many rich Christians on earth who when they get to heaven will become very poor. Of such is the Rich Fool. This man, possibly a Christian too, planned and schemed to increase his wealth everyday. He wanted to build bigger and higher houses to store his goods. But he didn't know the very night of the day he had discussed with his contractor to build his warehouses, his soul was required of him. This man was not profitable to God nor to himself.

The true profit to a man's life is not more money but more life. Jesus comesto give us life and life more abundantly, yea even life everlasting. Thus Jesus teaches us in the ordered to two brothers quarrelling over inherited property. Jesus retorted, "Who made me a judge or a divider over you?" And he continued, "Beware of covetousness, for a man's life consisteth not of the things which he possesseth" (Luke 12:15). The true profit to man's life is life and not money, even as a Chinese proverb says, "Have life have money, have not life have not money." Life is greater than the things of life, life that is in the salvation of the soul through our Lord Jesus Christ and together with that the exuberent life of the body, even health when a man's soul is saved. When a man is made anew by the Spirit of God e.g. a converted Drug addict, his bodily health is also restored. Because he refrains from his old sinful ways that sapped his health.

In Jesus' definition of what profit in life is, we must conclude He was the richest Man on earth. Surely He could not be, you said, since he was born in a manger and he worked as a carpenter. But we say He was because all in heaven and on earth was His. He was tired of the physical riches you and I would desire to possess, but also to our sorrow. He needed not to keep a stable of asses so He could ride them. When He needed one he told His disciples to get it from another disciple. He owned everything. But Peter not understanding this truth asked about himself. Jesus replied, "And everyone that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father or mother, or wife or children, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit life everlasting. What profit! When we find life everlasting to be the true profit of life, we gain also 100 times in the material. Has not the Lord blessed you after you are saved with increasing abundance of earthly riches? Has not the Lord filled Life Church grounds with members' cars? And the good things in your homes? Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you" (Matt. 6:33).

Jesus Christ not only taught us the profit motive in life, He also set us the example. But dying on the Cross against all the temptations of Satan in order that He might deliver us from sin and Hell, he made the greatest profit in His life. He suffered pain to its

uttermost but for a duration, but by paying that price He's able to save us, the whole world, as many as would believe in Him, to the uttermost.

In order to obtain this profit in the life abundant, there is however a price to pay. That is we must forsake our own life (not committing suicide to your own loss) - for His sake. Peter when detracting our Lord from going to Jerusalem to be crucified exposed his own cowardice, his fear of death, of sacrifice in the service of God. If we are to be profited in the life God promises us, we must also be prepared to die for His Name. Every Bible College student here especially must heed this condition of service. An OMF Newsletter recently revealed how one of its missionaries, a Mr Coos, a Dutchman, was gunned down

point blank by a Thai assassin as he was preaching in a village. He knew such danger lurked in his paths before he went to Thailand. But he was prepared to pay the to gain the profit of life everlasting. If we serve him with only a servant's attitude we are unprofitable servants, says Wurmbrand. If we serve Him lovingly as sons we are profitable servants.

While Jesus rebukes the profiteering spirit He nevertheless teaches the profit motive and the profit of life is more life; even life everlasting and not the riches of this

THE MYSTERY OF SUCCESS IN GOD'S WORK (Synopsis of a Sermon delivered at Mt Carmel B-P Church, November 29, 1981)

Text: Luke 5:4-7 "Now when he had left speaking, he said unto Simon, Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon answering said unto him, Master, we have toiled all the night, and have taken nothing: nevertheless at thy word I will let down the net. And when they had this done, they inclosed a great multitude of fishes: and their net brake. And they beckoned unto their partners, which were in the other ship,

that they should come and help them. And they came, and filled both the ships, so that they began to sink."

I have been requested to speak on "Building God's House". As both Carmel and Life are seeking to build a House of Worship, we are over-concerned for the material. Our worry is money! Building God's House is not on the material level! It is on the spiritual!

Building God's House cannot be undertaken on purely economic values such as in the starting of a factory. An American businessman now attending Life Church tells why his company has chosen to invest in Singapore and not Taiwan. After considering all the pros and cons, his company has confidence of making a good profit here than in Taiwan. Building God's House, and for that matter any other aspect of God's work, cannot be "computerised". Ince our Lord does not use the figure of a factory, but of fishing, in reference to God's work. Inasmuch as He has called Peter, James and John to be fishers of men, He implied that God's work is like fishing.

Now, in fishing, there is involved an unknown factor. A mysterious factor about fishing! A fisherman cannot rely on his prowess and industry alone to catch fish as a manufacturer can by putting in more hours. Peter cannot boast of a good catch simply because he is a Ph.D. in "Fishiology". That mysterious factor of the unknown in fishing is revealed in his two empty catches as recorded in Luke 5 and in John 21. What is that unknown factor, that mystery of success that is so needed in fishing? What is the mystery of success in God's work? That mystery of success in God's work is God Himself!

Therefore, when Jesus Christ comes into the picture, both in Luke 5 and John 21, there is told a different story from what goes in vain before. Jesus brought the defeated disciples success. Whereas, before the Lord came upon the scene the disciples had caught nothing. Now, at His Word, they caught two shiploads! In John 21, 153 great fishes! We must seek God at all costs in any attempt at doing God's work.

The mystery of success in God's work, first of all, involves God. Then comes man's participation.

What is it that involves God? First, the work must originate from Him. Unless God has malled us to do His work, our efforts no matter how sincere will fail. For it is Jesus who daid unto Simon." He said to Simon; He gave him an appointment. Why are you in fulltime service? Are you there by your own zeal, or because you were called? Why do you want to build God's House? Unless God has called you, you will not succeed!

Upon the death of the principal of a certain Bible School, the alumnae proposed to take advantage of the emotional situation to launch the School's Extension Building Plan. This was proposed on human considerations. There was no mandate from the Lord. It fizzled! By God's grace, we have successfully tendered for Woodlands. God was the mystery of success in the deal. We succeeded because we were sure the Lord had called us to the project.

Next, we must follow God's directive. Jesus said, "Launch out into the deep." In John 21, He said, "Cast the net on the right side." Be sure we follow God's directive! That we launch into the deep, not into the shallows. That we cast the net on the right side, not on the wrong side! Be sure the course of action taken fits into God's plan, not into your plan, however bright it might appear! (The Bible is our guide and direction).

Having been assured of God's call, and having received His directive, we must respond gladly, spontaneously. Peter, though tired after a hard night's fruitless labours, nevertheless, launched out "at Thy Word." Are you helping to push the boat out of the sand into the water, or are you sitting in it, a dead weight? How do you respond to building God's House (you've no argument against it, you are convinced it is from Him)? Those who spontaneously, cheerfully do His bidding in the sacred task of building God's House, either at Woodlands or on the West Coast, are the sooner rewarded, as we shall see - two shiploads. How much a shipload? \$10,000? \$20,000? There is no Lifer who has given, according to my knowledge, but has been trebly rewarded:

Not only cheerful, spontaneous response. There must be explicit obedience. Jesus says, "Use your nets." Had Peter not used the nets, but some fishing lines, he would have caught some ikan bilis by comparison, and not ikan parang by the boatloads. Our Building Fund must be built solely with the people's tithes and love offerings and not on income induced by

human methods. Walkathons, concerts and funfares, jumble sales, T-shirts and chewing gum, "mahjong drives" and games of chance are man's methods. Lines and rods versus God's nets. your giving way beyond the tithe. If the Lord wants you And God's nets might involve to give all, you must not withhold.

Finally, brotherly cooperation. As Peter found himself hard pressed with the catch, he called on his partners, James and John to help. And the brothers came heartily, instantaneously. Are you rendering this brotherly service for God's sake? When an emergency develops where will you be? Standing on the sides with folded arms, as the Chinese saying goes? It is an honour to be called on to help, but if you turn aside you miss the blessing!

The mystery of success in God's work involves man's part where there is no mystery! God requires of us all spontaneous, loving service, which when rendered glorifies the Father in heaven. "If every member will do his best, God will take care of the rest."



CAN WE BREAK THROUGH THE \$1 MILLION MARK BY DEC. 31, 1981?

This loving question we asked in last week's column was prompted by a new surge of cheerful giving lately. This loving Question for Jesus' sake was asked because we are looking forward to building God's House at Woodlands in the new year. The mountain facing us is great! To scale this mountain, like motoring up a steep road, we must press on the accelerator without let up! This Question reflects the driving spirit of our congregation!

Notice that I said "we". There is no capital I in this Building project. Let not anyone, young or old, dare claim credit for Woodlands. We are all unprofit-

able servants, even after having completed the building of His House.

That giving to the New Life Church at Woodlands has proved such a blessing to every worshipper is seen in the continuous gifts brought in. And in the widening circle of givers. In the increase of giving to meet the tithe, and beyond it, with "love offerings". As a man's health is improved through exercise, so is God's blessing in our lives vibrantly felt while we all struggle to give. Some, indeed, have given way above the tithe. Praise God for this comradeship and devotion in giving. If a multimillionaire should offer Life Church \$1 Million outright, the blessing goes back to him, to the spiritual poverty of us all! We'd rather labour and struggle together, experiencing the blessing together, than look to some rich Uncle.

It is profitable to you that I should have challenged you to give towards the Million rk. I did this in the spirit of St Paul to the Philippians: "Not because I desire a gift: but I desire fruit that may abound to your account" (Phil. 4:17). This fruit that is to the Philippians' account is declared "an odour of sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, well-pleasing to God" (Phil. 4:18). The \$58,500 needed by our Lord to make up \$1 million (last week's latest was \$941,581.26) is deemed doubly precious in the estimation of the Apostle.

"Can we break through the \$1 Million mark?" This depends on our reaction to the Question.
If we take this to be the Lord's prompting, if we love Him and resolve to go over the top

with Him, we shall conquer!

This Question comes to you as a blessing if it will divert you from meaningless, thought-less, uneconomic spending. Somehow there's a magical power in the barrage of advertisements now daily bombarding you from Mr Santa Claus (thought by some Chinese merchants to be the progenitor of Departmental stores). Purse strings become magically loose at this festive season (not the Birth of the Saviour). Hundreds and thousands are thrown away in adding this item or that to your household, or personal gear, to become lumber in a matter of months. If you won't believe me, look at the number of unused articles in your house. To save that unconscionable waste, I must step in to ask you save that sum for the Lord. That sum will remain unto eternity, bearing interest, now at 9%, and sometimes up to 13%, eternally. Not a cent of that sum given to the Lord ever runs into the drain.

I say: we wage-earners alone will easily clear the hurdle. I challenge you to give that the month bonus to the Lord, as I did last year. Why not, if those who have done so have

proven this suggestion right in the events that follow.

"God loveth a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound toward you, that ye always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work" (II Cor. 9:7, 8). No one who has given Him much has become the lesser. Nor has any who hoards much for himself become the richer.

Epilogue: "For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich" (II Cor. 8:9).

YOU AND YOUR GOD

The fact of God should be obvious. Astronomer Peter Stoner says, "You cannot study the heavens and see the greatness of God and the tremendous order there without believing in a Designer of infinite power." No matter how wise some atheist may be in some fields, they are ignorant about God. The Bible says, "The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God" Psalm 14:1.

The <u>need</u> for God is also apparent. The great mathematician Pascal referred to this as "the God-shaped vacuum" within every man. St Augustine confessed, "Thou hast made us for Thyself and our heart is restless till it rests in Thee." Psychiatrist Dr Victor Franke believes that pleasure seeking Americans "are existential vacuums. They become doubtful that life has any meaning. Man's need for meaning is as basic a drive as hunger."

The specifics for finding God are in the Bible. In contrast to man's elaborate theories of how the universe came to be, the Bible simply says, "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth ... So God created man in his own image." Gen. 1:1,27. The Bible then relates how the first couple Adam and Eve sinned by disobeying God's command.

The rest of the Scriptures is largely taken up with two great themes - ruin and redemption. Sin infects the human race. Even God's chosen people, the Jews, fails to return to Him.

God foretells through His prophets the coming of a redeemer, Jesus Christ. The saviour is also God's own Son, who came at the appointed time to dwell in human flesh, lived a perfect life, died on a cross as a sacrifice for man's sin and finally rose from the grave after three days. Then after promising to return, He ascended back to heaven.

God offers to forgive your sins and to live in your life in the person of the Holy Spirit. But you must want this relationship and receive Christ to salvation. It is this simple. "And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life" I John 5:11,12.

A WORLD LEADER

DEDICATION OF PARSONAGE IN KALIMANTAN Another more meaningful way of celebrating Christmas and ushering in the New Year is to go down to West Kalimantan to dedicate the Djunaidi Parsonage and Church Hall. Woodlands notwithstanding, building the Parsonage and Church Hall was given the go-ahead during our last visit in June Praise the Lord, He has vindicated this "high" decision, for since then, without diverting from the Woodlands Fund, the Lord's people have given \$34,000. What is needed to "fill the gap" is but a mere \$9,000.

SOON A DIRECT SERVICE The way to Kalimantan will soon be cut short by half when Garuda inaugurates a direct service between Singapore and Pontianak. With more frequent flights and with the Djunaidi parsonage sitting on a plank upper floor, half a dozen of us can be comfortably accommodated. Christmas is more meaningfully celebrated when we can see with our eyes and put our shoulders to the Cause of Christ beyond our City. POINTED WORDS TO MERRY-MAKERS

"JESUS IS COMING"

In the last Weekly we said "it is meaningless to celebrate His First Coming without reference to His Second." As we approach another New Year, it is more essential that we tell one another "Jesus is Coming." This sign we carry on our mini-bus is a daily reminder, but "familiarity breeds contempt."

What is your attitude towards the Lord's Return? It must be guided by Holy Scripture . We can tell how near Christ's Coming is by certain signs of the times. Jehovah Witnesses say Christ has already come, but He is reigning just above the clouds. This is a stumbling block to untaught, young Christians. St Paul says, "That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by word, nor by letter as from us, as that the day of Christ is at hand. Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition ... " (II Thess. 2:2,3). There is a falling away of the faith of the Christian Church when we see Protestants today joining with Rome and carried away by the Charismatics. But that man of sin does not seem to be revealed yet, so it is proper to say Christ is not likely to come this week. But since our understanding of the mystery of future things is limited, we must not fall into the sin of presumption. As dutiful servants we must make ourselves ready to receive the Lord at a second's notice. We know, yet we do not know." Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man! (Luke 21:36).

Our knowledge of future events is, may I coin the word, "antithetical". We know, yet we I't know. We don't know, yet we know." To illustrate this tension of knowledge, Paul uses the figure of childbirth. We know that the period between conception and labour is 280 days. But the expectant mother, even, is often overtaken by the stork so that embarassing situations in taxis and even airplanes are reported. She does not know the exact day and hour. Neither can we. If not, we should be on the alert even when it seems the man of sin has not appeared. To relax, to become worldly-minded, so as not to look out for His coming will lead us to an embarassing situation. We may be left behind when He comes! Our duty is to watch and pray all the time!

Learn a lesson of Christ's Second Coming from the outbreak of the Pacific War. As Great Britain began to send troops to Singapore in the early forties we sensed War was near. But while preparations were going on for a year or two, we're so used to them that our tension eased. At the unexpected moment on Dec. 8, 1941 Singapore was rudely awakened by Japanese bombs dropped all over the Island. In fact we were soundly asleep when at about 4.30 a.m. the invasion started. So will many be caught unawares by Christ's sudden Return. Therefore it is my pastoral duty to warn you, "Are you ready to stand before the Son of Man at His

When WWII came, every country got on a war-footing. The Home Front was mobilised. Every one had to work overtime, particularly in the leading countries involved, Gt. Britain and America. They had to contribute to the war effort by making ammunitions, and growing more od. This time, I wonder, there would be given this "lease of life" to catch up? Christians who are in the light and not in the night, should do the catch-up work now! Paul says, "The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly as in the day; not in rioting (orgies) and drunkenness, not in chambering (sexual immorality) and wantonness (debauchery); not in strife and envying. But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof." (Rom. 13:12-14).

I must thank God for many Readers of this "mosquito" paper who are Godly-minded. This is expressed by the cheerfulness you've shown towards Woodlands, Kalimantan, Sumatra, Kulai Besar, to the needs of the Church (which are of the barest minimum). This is expressed in the big adult S.S. class who follow diligently the lessons in Revelation. This is shown by your regular attendance at the Tues. night Prayer Meeting, etc. Those who are not so minded, may I plead with you to begin anew with the Lord in 1982. Let us cast all our failures with the old year aside so long as we will resolve, by God's grace, to run the race in the New Year.

To my Readers overseas, come the same exhortations. To my Jewish friends in Israel and elsewhere: we often remember you and the salvation of Israel. May the Prince of Peace come ON "THE RAVAGES OF TIME" soon to give you peace.

Dr Fred Schwarz, of Christian Anti-Communism Crusade in his Christmas letter says, "I remember a statement that impressed me when I was a student of philosophy: "Pure time flows in the universal flux of inevitable becoming." Translated into English, this means that the passage of time produces inescapable changes. As far as physical strength is concerned, these changes produce deterioration, and this demands some modification of increased knowledge, experience and, yes, wisdom, compensate for the lessening of physical endurance." May these words encourage those who are feeling a little slow

with the weight of years piling up on their shoulders.
