My dear Readers,

From Long-term Policy to Short-term Policy

In light of Peter's prophecy of an impending Judgment of Fire in the last days (II Pet. 3:7), "seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved," let us reverse totally our plans we had hitherto made for the future. Let our long-term policy be changed to short-term policy.

What do we mean by this? By way of example, a Lifer who loves the Lord told us why he would not promote himself from a 3-room to a 5-room flat. He said. "This world is not my home." Consider the amount of money you have to lavish on your temporary tabernacle on earth which could be used more profitably for God's eternal Kingdom. Another brother who has loaned a sizeable sum for Beulah Land has decided that it be permanently banked up in heaven. To buy a new car he'd rather take a loan from the finance company. A young Lifer, seeing the shortness of life in these perilous times, offers to serve in the Lord's army than continue in his present career. God's Kingdom must have priority over man's kingdom.

In both the parable of the pounds (Luke 19) and the parable of the talents (Matt. 25), the word "trading" or "trade" is used to emphasise how we should serve the Lord. To trade, one cannot engage in losing business. One must make profit, which is the essence of trading.

> Your liberal giving and loaning towards the Beulah Land project has saved us tens of thousands, yea hundreds, in interest payments, presently running at 8%. Many have poured out their POSB savings into the Lord's Treasury foregoing that smaller amount of interest to earn the bigger interest for the Lord.

A more effective corporate trading for the Lord is to bring our tithes, every earner, into the storehouse. This will bring profit not only to the Lord but also dividends poured down from windows of heaven, more precious than dollars and cents. If we withhold the tithe, the sacred tenth, we rob God! (Mal. 3:8). But I am persuaded better things of you. The hilarious surge of offerings during the Christmas and New Year services have touched six figures, and this should encourage you who love the Lord. And the increasing support for our various missions should spark more giving for the extension of God's Kingdom. The Great Commission is the First Commandment to the Church!

Far Eastern Bible College reopened Jan 2 with Day of Prayer at Beulah House. We have admitted 6 new students with 2 Burmese from Rangoon awaiting exit clearance. Of the 6 who are here, 3 are from Singapore, 1 from Burma, 1 from Kenya and 1 from Korea. Please pray for the 2 Burmese students who are struggling through!

This academic year sees the College holding 4 evening classes! Apart from the Monday and Thursday classes taught by Rev Goh Seng Fong and Dr Wagner, there's a Hymnology class also taught by Dr Wagner, Wed, 7.30-9.30 pm. A Fri evening computer class, 7 - 9 pm, will be taught by Mrs Agnes Ong. There are only 2 or 3 vacancies left in this class, so if you want to join, hurry! This class is only \$15 per month or \$60 for 4 months. A course

on Library Science is offered by Mrs Lim Yew Cheng, Tuesday, 3.00 - 4.00 pm. If you are free at this hour, here is your chance to equip yourself for running a Church library!

Why Didn't We Think of Beulah House? The problem of noise disturbing worshippers in the porch, noise of running and playing children, I mean. To solve this problem it was observed the Korean Church had all their children shepherded to the green lawns of Beulah House. There, some adult is in charge

of their activities. Why didn't we who own Beulah Land think of this?

Let all the tiny tots be taken care of by the Nursery. And let all who are above the Nursery and who enjoy open-air activity also be shepherded to the green lawns of Beulah Land. For this healthy recreation we can install swings and seesaws, etc. Who would give to this newest project? If the children need to drink, there is installed in the big kitchen a water cooler for their timely use.



"The Lord's Business Required Haste" I received a Christmas Card from Haposan in which he reiterates his anxiety over the Medan "Beulah Land." When I woke up Fri 2 am the first thought that came to mind was, Go to Medan today. So I went in good time and should return Sat 11 am with good news,

In a letter dated Dec 13, 90, Haposan, FEBC 1987 (B.Th.) and now pastor of Medan B-P Church, writes Pastor as follows:

Last Wednesday at 8 pm (Singapore time), I did phone you, but I could not get you, for you were doing God's business in Tanjung Pinang. My reasons for phoning are these:



Mr Siagian (land-owner) of Medan B-P Church "Beulah Land" came 4 days ago. That is why my report about this land is late in coming. He told us that the price of that land is Rp60,000 per sq. metre. According to our estimation it is still expensive. Please pray that they may give us the best price; for the usual price in this area is Rp45,000 to Rp50,000.

I have seen the real need of a Fundamental Bible College here. As Rev Contento says, "Without a Bible college, the Church will die." The harvests are truly many, but labourers are few.

I've learnt something about the people of Medan during this Christmas season that makes me sad. They have heard the Good News preached, and they enjoy its message. But they refused to come to the Gospel light, for their deeds are evil. Shall we give up preaching? Not at all. For

this is a cross. As you have said, "When there is no cross, there is no crown." I studied from history that Medan means battlefield. Therefore Medan is our spiritual battle.

Let us pray for one another that God's Word might be broadcast in power especially during this season. I am still receiving many invitations to preach the Gospel, though I have to admit that God's flock entrusted to me must come first.

Ed. Note: The "Beulah Land" adjoining the Medan B-P Church property is 40 x 40 m. At about \$55 per m², the selling price of this valuable property is \$88,000. Medan BPC has about \$25,000. We have \$11,000 offered for Medan thus far. If the Lord should move Lifers to give now another \$52,000, we can clinch the deal, and that for a song! The Beulah Land Haposan is talking about has to be seen to be appreciated. It stands between two trunk roads and is served by bus lines on each side!

The Price of a Car!

With the pledge of \$5,200 coming in last week, a tenth of the \$52,000 needed to clinch the deal of Medan's Beulah Land, what Haposan needs is roughly \$\$47,000. That's

the price of a car! Of course there's the cost of construction of a school house with adequate classrooms for a Bible Institute and auditorium for worship as the next step of development. But, these are not within our purview just now! What our immediate objective is, is the land! Without acquiring this adjoining property with "marriage value," all our further extension for the Lord will be lost.



Beloved, here's a Beulah Land in Medan needing not \$7.2 million, but only \$47,000. Though it is a small sum, we need it most urgently if our purchase of the said property is to succeed. For there is a Chinese merchant offering to buy the same for expansion of his lumberyard business. If the Lord should move you to give to this Gospel outreach, then hurry to bring it in, marked "For Medan Beulah Land." The Lord bless your house as you devote a part of your substance to build His!

How the Work Grew in North Sumatra

It began with a visit in November 1972 by Rev K. C. Quek and me, in answer to a Batak Church's request for spiritual help from ICCC.

From this early contact Dohar found his way to study at FEBC, and Sahat the next year. Then came Glorya (who after graduation married Dohar), and subsequently Haposan and Agus. All our Batak students did well, each earning a B.Th., except Agus, a Diploma. Agus, who is finishing Law in a year or so, is returning to FEBC to take his degree. Both Haposan and Agus were instrumental in starting our Indonesian Service, 4.00 pm.

The Life Church pastor, with the help of three white FEBC students - Andrew Bo, Mark Heath, Peter Clements - on three occasions visited Benta Kersik and Kuta Baru, across a mountain several hours' bus out of Medan. As a result, a branch church was established at Kuta Baru with money provided by Life Church. As for the Church in the metropolis, ie, Medan, Mr Wesley Siregar, their father, offered his "HDB" house for the running of a Sunday school and holding of services. I was in Medan on two occasions to baptise and administer the Lord's Supper.

Seeing that we could not maintain this growing work, we committed the N. Sumatran field to Galilee Church. In course of time, Galilee expended 25 million rupiahs to buy a valuable property in the neighbourhood, 14 x 40 m, which had a bungalow house with a garage, plus a used van. With this new development, our Medan brethren established a Kindergarten. This began about 7 or 8 years ago. The Kindergarten met a long-felt need and was a means of bringing parents and young people to worship and fellowship on the Lord's Day and on Saturday. As Kindergarten pupils got promoted to Primary School, our Batak brethren took the initiative to build several more rather crude classrooms in the backyard. These extra classrooms, together with rooms in the old bungalow, are packed with 300 pupils everyday, like sardines. (The Primary School will soon open a Pri. VI class.)

As the biggest classroom can take in about 60 - 70 people, that is the number who worship on Sunday or fellowship on Saturday. When I visited Medan last week, Haposan was enlarging the garage, so it could be converted into another classroom. This is the end of the measuring line! There is absolutely no more space for expansion.

Should a Bible School be started, there will be a good crop of students. Already two young men, who have been individually trained under Haposan, are manning the station at Kuta Baru in the mountain. The spiritual hunger and thirst of Medan's millions cannot be felt until you visit with the young B-P Church there. (A round-trip ticket is \$300+.) Who will go for us? Who will help Medan BPC to their feet with your surplus dollars?—777.

THEOLOGICALLY SPEAKING

I heard on BBC at the 5 pm broadcast, Wed. Jan 9, 1991, how some European powers were wishing Saddam Hussein would withdraw partially from Kuwait. would put US on the spot, and delay the War. This was their fond hope for a peaceful settlement. doesn't want peace?

I heard on BBC at the 6 am broadcast Thu Jan 10 that the Geneva meeting between American Secretary of State Baker and Iraqi Foreign Minister Aziz had failed, and how oil prices shot up several dollars in 4 seconds!

I heard on BBC at the 10 am broadcast Thu Jan 10 that the General Secretary of the UN would make a final trip to Baghdad Sat Jan 12 in a last-ditch effort for Peace.

Will there be brighter news on the Lord's Day Jan 13? Writing this short article, Thu Jan 10, 11 am, I think not. And all this is due to President Saddam Hussein's intransigence. Why is he not deterred by the Allied force of 28 nations arrayed against him?

There is no explanation for this apart from the theological. We have a luminous precedent in the person of Pharaoh. For ten times, he who was supposed to yield to God, rejected Moses. The reason was given as his hardening his own heart (Exo. 8:15,32), but it is also given as God hardening his heart, too, after he had hardened his heart. Yes, when we keep on resisting God, God will let us become more obstinate. This principle is given in Rom. 1:26, "God gave them up unto vile affections . . . " and in verse 28, "God gave them over to a reprobate mind

Why did God harden Pharach's heart in the process? Rom. 9:17 says, "For the Scripture saith unto Pharaoh, Even for this same purpose have I raised thee up, that I might shew my power in thee, and that my Name might be declared throughout all the earth." If War comes, it is started neither by America or Iraq, but by the decree of God - if you can see it theologically.

Bible Prophecy on IRAQ Being Fulfilled

When Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait on August 2, 1990, Iraq suddenly leapt into prominence. Not only into the world of power politics, but also into the perspective of Bible Prophecy. Iraq came into focus of our "Prophescope." Assuredly it did as we turned to Rev. 9:13-16, "And the sixth angel sounded, and I heard a voice from the four horns



of the golden altar which is before God, saying to the sixiangel which had the trumpet, Loose the four angels which are bound in the great river Euphrates. And the four angels were loosed, which were prepared for an hour, and a day, and a month and a year, for to slay the third part of men. . . and I heard the number of them . . . "

The great river Euphrates is the river that flows through ancient Babylonia and modern Iraq. The loosing of the four angels which are bound in the great river Euphrates signifies God has given the go-ahead by His angels to release into action the armies on earth all poised for battle. War in the Euphrates' region (which includes Kuwait) breaks out, not in a hurry, but by God's appointed time, to the year, month, day and hour! Did this prophecy find its fulfilment after midnight, Jan 15, 1991 (S'pore time, 1.00 pm)?

We cannot say that the "Desert Storm" now raging over Iraq by Allied bombing under the UN banner is the exact fulfilment of Rev. 9:13-16. But if anyone will not admit there is a connection between today's escalating war in the Gulf region and the Revelation prediction, then he is spiritually blind and deaf. One year ago when everyone felt a new Peace Order was coming, no one could have foreseen all this.

Alas, this is not merely a war between an aggressor nation and the world community of nations. It is God's Judgment Day,

beginning to unfold. It is the beginning of the end-times, wherein a global conflagration will devour one-third of mankind and when the wrath of God is finally outpoured on Armageddon, leading to the destruction of Jerusalem, two-thirds of Israel will be killed (Zech. 13:8)! The Foreign Minister of Lithuania says, "This is the beginning of World War III while World War II is not yet finished." He is calling attention to the ominous turn of events in the Baltic States that will add fire to the Gulf situation.

Do not think we in Singapore will be spared! In the awful climax of this World War, while the Great City was divided into three parts, the cities of the nations fell (Rev. 16:9). No capital city, whether in the West or East, North or South, will be spared. At the equator, are we not right in the centre? Let Singapore say not to themselves, "We are not hurt like those in the Gulf States." Let us hear our Lord's admonition to the Jerusalemites: "I tell you, Nay: but except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5).

Dear Reader, it is nearer than you think! While we must still go about our business, the young daily to school, the executive to his office, the labourer to his factory, let us not plan any more that long-term policy for holding to this world. Let us adopt that short-term policy, of rather putting God's Kingdom and righteousness first, and let go our fond ambitions of worldly success. In this respect, may I once again challenge young men and women to serve in God's army.

More precious are the spiritual things, life itself, and not the paraphernalia of life. Jesus may come anytime now, but will you be caught up to be with Him to escape a burning earth? Or, are you still holding to your earthly pleasures and possessions? Do make good use of them before it is too late. What is your standing before the Judgment Seat of Christ when He comes to reward His servants (II Cor. 5:10,11)? Or will you be left in outer darkness where there is weeping and gnashing of teeth (Matt. 25:30)?

Last week I disclosed to you that Medan needed \$47,000, the price of a car, to clinch that Beulah Land adjoining their present property. This week I have good news for you: All we need is now reduced to \$10,000, the price of a scrap car! This dramatic reduction is due to 2 factors: 1) The Lord moved His children to bring in 2 x \$10,000 cheques last week, and 2 are a confirmation! 2) Haposan, in closing the deal with the vendor, brought the price down to R55,000 per m², ie, R5,000 less. Also it was discovered from the title deeds that the actual area is not 40 x 40 m² but 40 x 32.5 m². Hallelujah, praise the Lord! Who will catch up with the third \$10,000? No sum is too big, no sum too small, when your heart is prompted



by His Spirit. God bless your house as you give towards IAIB, the Bible School that is taking shape at last! Meanwhile, Dohar, elder brother of Haposan, has come to take a semester's refresher course, to better equip for the teaching ministry.

As to the construction of the Bible Institute of Western Indonesia, our view is for economy and utility, Sumatran timber and asbestos roofing. Neither should our members indulge in luxurious living, for the Lord's coming is at hand. Let us save every luxury spending to put that into missions! Let us keep on reducing our Beulah burden which now stands at \$2.43 million. One way of relieving that burden is to loan your money to the Church. Sounds paradoxical, but it is true! As I say this here comes a \$900 loan from a young Lifer, a National Servicemen! - T.T.

I'd rather accept my teacher Dr. Buswell's teaching that, as Paul reveals to us the mystery at the sounding of the last trump = the seventh trumpet in Rev. 10:7, it will occur in the midst of "great tribulation" (Rev. 7:14). Under the sounding of the seventh trumpet, the Rapture is seen from another angle to occur at Rev. 11:18. Marvin Rosenthal also identifies the Rapture to occur at the seventh Trumpet, and since after the Trumpet Tribulations Bowls that pour out the Wrath of God, he calls it Pre-wrath Rapture. call this Mid-Tribulation Rapture or Great Tribulation Rapture. MEDAN MISSION ACCOMPLISHED



I flew last Wednesday to Medan, and having accomplished the Mission acquiring the Beulah Land, I returned Thursday noon. The property that was selling at 100 million rupiah was finally knocked down to R64,625,000 (S\$1=R1098). Our contribution is \$43,000.

The vendor would have got a higher price from a Chinese timber merchant, but he had no peace. The Lord moved him to sell us apparently through his wife's sickness. Our brethren prayed for her and she has recovered. In view of this we paid him another visit. I had the joy of witnessing to him the Second Coming of our Lord. He is pleased

The teachers of the Kindergarten and Primary School gathered for morning devotions at 7 a.m. I spoke on the need of everyone contributing to the building of their Bibla School and classrooms, now that the land was theirs. I challenged them including the Siregar family to give half a tithe or 5% of their income monthly to the B.F. All agreed, including Ranto, another FEBC graduate, also in the Lord's Service. Medan is taking a lead in this most exciting enterprise, an example to other fields. When will their mission of building God's house be accomplished?

Our missions in S.E. Asia

Kebaktian Indonesia 9 Years Old

Our Indonesian Service was started on February 7, 1982 after much prayer with 6 FEBC students, viz., Haposan, Agus, Macarewa, Simon Tsai, Irene Lee and Peter Clements. No sooner had we launched out than Deacon Charles Chia and wife joined us. This Aquila-Priscilla couple have since been the mainstay of the Kebaktian. While the principal took an active part in the early years, owing to other commitments, he had to leave the preaching to his students - Haposan, Agus, Kiantoro and Arianto. We're glad Dohar who has returned for a semester can also help. Through these years, though small in numbers, we've never stopped assemblying every Lord's Day 4 p.m. This fact should be great cause for thanks-

giving. We extend a cordial invitation to Session members of the Mother Church especially to join us this afternoon, and to Indonesian speaking members of Life Church, including peranakans. Those who often express interest in a mission trip to Indonesia need not go very far. Little Indonesia is right in our Church campus to give you a foretaste of the great Archipelago of 13,000 islands.

The first commandment to the Church is to advance to the uttermost part of the earth, beginning from Jerusalem, then to Judea, and to Samaria. We count Malaysia and Indonesia our Samaria. Can you identify the dots on the sketch map that are clustered across Sumatra, Malaysia, Singapore and West Kalimantan? And which are the 3 dots, almost in a line on top?

Although our Indonesian Service is small, God has enabled us to do our bit for missions, wherever there is a need. Since Medan has of late been well taken care of, it is proposed that our thankoffering be channelled to the Philippines Hilltop, towards the building of a Bible College. (The Kebaktian has done their best in contributing to Beulah Land.)

Philippines the Neediest of All

Of the Asean countries, I am sure you'll agree that Philippines is the poorest. Not only economically, but also spiritually. For, 85 per cent of her population are Roman Catholics. In this land of blood, sweat and tears, God has raised Rev. Dan Ebert III to found a Bible College with the help of his two missionary sons and a lady missionary, and not the least, with the support of his wife. In view of the tight situation in Metro-Manila, they were obliged to look for space in the suburbs. Praise the Lord, they found what is now known as the Hilltop. They acquired a 5-acre hilltop a year ago with much help from Calvary. The price they paid was nothing compared with our Beulah. This is due to our strong dollar versus their weak peso.

I want to praise the Lord for instilling a keen interest in a number of Lifers, professional men not only in architecture and civil engineering, but in other walks of life. This committee is instrumental in drawing a master plan in no time and having it sent to the Eberts. Based on this Singapore masterplan, the Filipino brethren will build! (Not all at once, but in 4 stages, as the Lord provides.)

Now I have received a second letter inviting us to minister in Manila. Rev Dan Ebert III writes:-

"Our Council met the day after your call to plan for your stay with us. On Wednesday night we will have a combined meeting of the churches in the city so you can address them. Any message of challenge and encouragement in these difficult times will be a blessing.

"On Thursday, the men of the Center would like to have a special time of fellowship with you. These are the men whose lives have been affected by your ministry at Center for Biblical Studies through the years. These pastors are now the leaders of our church fellowship as well as the Metro-Manila School of the Bible. They also fellowship closely with us in the development of the Hilltop. The plan for the day is to gather at our home for a fellowship lunch, after this we will proceed to the Hilltop. The land has not yet been dedicated and we would like you to have a prayer of dedication there. It would be good if you could speak to the pastors both at the house and then again at the Hilltop.

"Friday, you will have two sessions at the Bible School, this will be a combined meeting of the two schools. Whatever topic the Lord lays on your heart will be a blessing.

We appreciate your giving us this time from your busy schedule and would not want to impose in any way. However, the men have requested me to ask if there is any possibility that the church could spare you for the coming Sunday, that is to say you would leave on Monday morning rather than Saturday morning. If this would be possible we could then schedule you to speak in two of the churches that Life Bible Presbyterian Church of Singapore has helped through the years. We would hold Saturday open so that Bill and I could have a time of fellowship with you. Once again we do not want to impose and if this is not possible we will understand.

"All of us here will be much in prayer as we look forward to your coming and know the Lord will bless your ministry as He has in days gone by. Please greet everyone there for us and thank them again for their prayers and interest in the Lord's work here."

In view of my pre-appointment with the Calvary Sunset Gospel Hour to speak on "Israel, Dispossessed and Dispersed", Feb.17, we cannot help but fly back Saturday night, Feb.16. Our Chinese New Year vacation at least affords us 4 days' ministry out of Singapore.

One message upon my heart is this: As I challenged Haposan and his kindergarten and Primary School teachers to give half a tithe or 5% of their income to build their Bible school, so I'll try to impress on our Filipino friends the need to do the same. We'll bring along as much good surplus clothing as possible as in previous visits. Pray for us, for souls to be won to the Lord!





"Prophescope" on the Gulf

It is our prayer that the Lord will spare us. We do not deserve this tranquility in a country highly favoured. While we pray for the alleviation of suffering of war victims, we must repent ourselves, for our Lord says, "Except ye repent, ye shall likewise perish" (Lk 13:5). It is good to hear President Bush call for a rational day of prayer. Without repentance there is no salvation.

We dare not say anything beyond what is revealed in His Word. No one can predict what will turn out in a day. But we are certain: "Jesus is coming again real soon" (C.T. Hsu). Did you ever ask, Why? Of course there are various reasons.

Solution of the Middle-East Problems, including the Palestinian Problem, cannot come by U.N. or U.S. and U.S.S.R., the super powers. It can be resolved only by Supernatural Power. In the words of Rev Jason Linn, "This mess cannot be cleaned up except Jesus comes."

WHO IS JESUS TO YOU?

(Scripture : Luke 7:36-39, 48-50)

Chinese New Year is round the corner. Many open their doors to guests. If you were living in the time of Jesus would you invite him to be your guest? It was common for the Jews to invite others to their home to eat, especially travellers. This passage tells us one Pharisee invited Jesus to dinner. His name is Simon. He did not know that he had the Son of God in his house. In v.39 we see there is a question in Simon's mind, Is Jesus a prophet? Was Simon's invitation to entrap Jesus, rather than to learn from him? Simon treated Jesus only as an ordinary guest. He did not give Him a special welcome.

Now, another person comes into the scene. In v.37, we read, "Behold". word calling us to attention: All eyes turned to stare at her. It was a great surprise to all who were in the room, except Jesus. Was it because she was an uninvited guest? No, it was the custom to allow needy people to visit such a party to receive some of the leftovers. What was so strange to them was this woman was an open sinner to everyone in the city. Don't mistake her with Mary Magdalene or the one who anointed Jesus at Bethany much later. She is unnamed here, nor is it stated what sin she had committed. What caused her to come? She must have heard Jesus that day, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." Jesus' word opened the kingdom of heaven to her. This woman believed the promise given by Jesus. The heavenly light shone into her heart! She was freed from the heavy load which she was carrying - that was her sin. Let us notice the action words used to describe her in vv.37,38: 1. She brought ointment. 2. She stood at Jesus' feet. 3. She was weeping. 4. She washed his feet with tears. 5. She wiped them with her hair. 6. She kissed his feet. 7. She anointed them with the ointment. There are altogether seven action words used to describe what she has done to Jesus. What caused this woman to do so many things? It is the power_ of the Gospel, just as Paul said in Romans 1:16 "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth." She was like the Samaritan woman at the well who left her waterpot and bravely went into the city after she found Christ.

Let us look into her heart: She has a(1) Contrite heart: She wept, not a few drops. It was so much as to wash Jesus' feet. She grieved for her sins. Her spritual eyes were opened. She was no more in ignorance of her sins.

There are two famous Psalms written by King David when he repented of his sin. They are Psalms 32 and 51. In Psalm 51:17 he says "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise." This woman has a contrite and repentant heart. How about us? Let us examine ourselves, have we ever grieved for our sin, and know what stage we are actually in as a sinner. Or do we only feel sorry for our sin, but there is no repentance? This woman knows the first point of Calvinism, the total depravity of man. And Jesus is a Saviour to her.

(2) God fearing and reverent heart: By observing what she has done we can see that now she is a God fearing person. She knows who Jesus is, she need not utter a word. She pays her full reverence to Christ. We need to learn from her. Do we go to worship service with a reverent heart? How about chapel here every morning? Does our reverence diminish day after day? year after year? I have to confess that sometimes I whisper to my friends who sit beside me when something prompts my mind. Let us remind ourselves. We are before a Holy God. In Ecclesiastes 5:1 we read, "Keep thy foot when thou goest to the house of God, and be more ready to hear, than to give the sacrifice of fools: for they consider not that they do evil."

Besides, she also has a (3) Grateful heart: She comes with ointment. Not only this perfume shows her gratefulness. Her actions show. Are we grateful to God for His grace and salvation? Or we think we are being very friendly to Him by accepting Jesus, and are doing a favour to God by entering to the full time ministry?

This woman knows who Jesus is. She has a totally different heart from the Pharisee's. Earlier on we see Simon questioning who Jesus is. In v.39 we also can see that he despises the woman. He is a self-righteous man! How often we also have this thought "I am better than him." I also have this kind of struggle in me. Only two days ago when a brother whom I respected did something wrong to me, I was very angry. The idea of "I am better than him" came to my mind. It took me about a day to forgive him. May God help us to remember we are only sinners saved by grace. Let us realise the total depravity of ourselves and humble ourselves. Do you have the thought "I am better than him"? Jesus knows your thought as we see Him answering Simon's thought with an illustration: this illustration is according to the Jewish notion, "He would love most to whom most had been forgiven" which means, "Much benefit, much love, little benefit, little love." Does it mean Simon is less sinful than this woman? No. Dr Chia, teacher of Rev Tow in China said this, "The sin of the heart and mind is ten times worse than the sin of the flesh." Do we realise our many sins have been forgiven? If we do we will show much love to Christ. In v.48 Jesus says "Thy sins are forgiven." I believe her sins were forgiven at the point when she repented and acknowledged Jesus as her Saviour.

Now Jesus assures her by speaking to her personally. In v.50 Jesus tells her, "Your faith has saved you." Therefore she must have been forgiven and saved before she did anything to Jesus. Jesus did not say "Your tears have saved you." Neither did Jesus say "By washing and anointing my feet you are saved." Jesus only sa: ("Thy faith hath saved thee, go in peace." What a great blessing she had received. Jesus told her "Go In the Greek text the literal meaning should be "Go into reace." Yes, now she could go into peace of heart, into peace of rest, and into the eternal peace of the Kingdom of Heaven thereafter and forever. "For by grace are ye save! through faith" Eph 2:8. Jesus is a wonderful Saviour to her. Her repentant, grateful heart and love to Jesus was outwardly manifested in her action. On the other hand, Jesus was only a guest to the Pharisee, maybe less than a guest.

PASTORAL CHAT

My dear Readers,

Mission to Manila

Contrary to current report, our SIA flight SQ72 was filled to the last seat! Thank God for prospering our national carrier.

Rev Bill Ebert and mother were on hand to receive us in their minivan. As it was Ash Wednesday, when RCs sprinkle ashes on their heads and visit shrines, traffic was especially heavy. It took us 2 hrs to fight through our way home (a distance of 20 km).

The same evening we had to struggle through unrelenting heavy traffic to get to our destination in town. It was a rented hall seating 450, and 400 by count filled the auditorium. Pastors and members from 28 churches gathered at this first Combined Prayer Meeting, some "to hear the Chinese preacher preach in English," though a goodly number had heard me before.

The topic of my message was "Who will win the Gulf War?" and the text was taken from Dan 2:31-35. From the smashing down of Nebuchadnezzar's statue and the breaking of it into pieces so that it was blown away by the wind, while the Stone that struck it from heaven grew into a mountain that filled the earth, I said neither U.S. nor Iraq would win, but JESUS CHRIST our Lord. I urged young people to give their lives to serve the Lord as we await His soon coming and the older generation to serve God with their energy and substance. I challenged them to give 5 per cent of their income to the Hilltop Project of building a Bible College. This was agreed by the Chairman and congregation.

Thursday afternoon I was taken to Metro-Manila School of the Bible situated in another part of the City. It functions in a first floor flat consisting of several classrooms and a library. Male students commute from far and near to attend classes. Female students are accommodated in some nearby quarters and that limited to only half a dozen. It is for this reason that God has answered their prayer for better facilities by moving a Chinese tycoon to sell them 20,000 sq metres of hilltop land for a song. This hilltop is 15 km from the City in the township of Antipolo.

There were 70 students to hear me lecture on "The Clock of the Sevenfold Will of God". Or Chung my oldtime friend since primary school days and his wife kindly came to hear me and to wish us well. The application of the lesson taught should move every student to do God's will in all areas of their lives. The doctrine of predestination was clearly seen in the Decretive will of God, while Hyper-Calvanism was refuted by expounding the Desiderative will of God. John 3:16 is God's offer of salvation to the whole world (Greek cosmos), not merely to the so-called world of the Elect. Calvin's commentary confirms this. To say that John 3:16 is open only to the Elect is like holding a sale with its stipulation that only buyers can enter.

Visit to Hilltop

Friday morning saw the gathering of about 25 pastors with several of their wives at the Ebert home for a final meeting. I spoke on the Great Commission of Matt 28:18-20 as being the First Commandment to the church. It commands the church to Missions, Evangelism, Church organisation through Baptism and Indoctrination. The last point, Indoctrination of the church (through the running of a Bible College) concerned us in the Hilltop Project. Now that the land was acquired (at a give-away price), it behoved the Filipino thurches associated with Rev Ebert III to pool their resources to get on with the construction.

As there is no water supply to this hilltop situation, the solution is the drilling of a well at the lowest slope. Since this is still high ground it is estimated the drilling would reach 600 feet below and the cost between US\$20,000-\$25,000. In response to my message Pastor Bona proposed that an immediate collection be taken. This yielded 6,460.50 (US\$1.00 = \$29). Praise the Lord, that was not a bad beginning! The Pastors also pledged to give 5 per cent of their salary to the Hilltop Project.

"Seeing is believing." What a Beulah Land is this Hilltop! Though at the top of hill our land of over 5 acres occupies a gentle slope. When it reaches the top it rops suddenly and steeply into our neighbour's land which makes it a kind of no-man's and between us. O the breath-taking view of blue mountains and heavenly horizons above he clouds.

Moreover, the land is a good land of fruit trees and vegetable gardening. There is caretaker's hut overlooking 46 mature mange trees. When in season these trees will ield some precious pesos, as well as provide for the dinner table.

The immediate need is the well. So it was decided to call the contractor to view he land and start drilling forthwith! Water is life. Without water the land is lifeess, except for the trees. The help you have rendered, whether big or small is like stream of life-giving water, that nurtures forever more. Yours for the Gospel, T.T.



Why Israel?

The Christmas message is all comprehensive: "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, the Mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this (Isa 9:6,7).

Report on my eye-operation



Thinking that my eye operation would be a simple one, I applied to Session for 3 days medical leave. Elder Mahadevan commented, "At least one week."

When Elder Dr Ang Beng Chong operated on my left eye Monday morning Teb 25, neither did he realise it would be a major one which took 1½ hours. He said my eye was filled with blood, etc and might have to return for another operation on the cataract. He ordered a complete rest of one week, which relieves me of my pulpit, both it Life Church and at the Sunset Gospel Hour.

I agree heartily, for proper rest is a condition for wholesome recovery. And what metter retreat for my incised eye than 5-10 East Coast Chalet which sits in a shaded mood facing the blue Singapore Straits, beyond which are Batam and Bintan of the Riau slands.

I am deeply thankful to the Almighty Father for leading us here and to you who have rayed for me individually and corporately, for your many get well cards and phone inquiies - to Elder & Mrs Khoo especially who know the ins-and-outs of G.H. in accompanying to the various departments. Last but not least is the personal attention from my ife, and I must not forget FEBC students who helped us in logistics.

The chalet we rent here from Government is \$70 per night. It has two storeys. Downtairs is the living room, "kitchenette" and bath. There's a mini-porch which looks ut to sea. Upstairs is a bedroom for two. This gives privacy especially when chalets re fully occupied and the grounds are crowded at weekends. Since we are here only during eekdays, we are monarchs of all we survey, and that is what we want. Seclusion is rare commodity today. But you need not go to Fraser's Hill to find it. This East oast resort projected by our Government is yours - at your doorstep. The only deficiency n this chalet arrangement is a small fridge and stove. This would attract more patrons or with fridge and stove, half of the maken problem is solved.

There is a BBQ set up obliquely from our chalet by the sea. To let the whole College hare the beauties of nature, we declared Wednesday Feb 27 a half-holiday, so they could ome and swim and eat their own charcoaled chicken wings in the setting sun. Our students, ho hail from 12 countries, are being nurtured also in Christian community life, no man erving God can be a recluse. How can he serve God whom he cannot see, if he does not erve his fellowman whom he can see?

Gospel lesson from the change of clothes

This is the first time I ever went on the operation table. Let me share with you hat it is like to meet the surgeon's knife. First of all I had to strip all the clothes, nd put on the patient's wear. This consists of a light pale blue covering for the front f the body. There is also a plastic cap. At the theatre which is air-conditioned there s a woollen blanket that protects you from cold.

This reminds me of my clothings that they are as filthy rags, even my righteouness, sfore God (Isa 64:6). This reminds us also of the uninvited guest without the king's arment who was thrown out of the wedding feast (Matt 22:13). Reader, are you clinging your own show of dignity, wealth, power, position, edcuation? And you have not bowed the Lord Jesus Christ? As the patient has to strip himself before the surgeon, so ust we take away all our covering of outward good before Jesus the Great Physician.

Painless Recovery


The nurse injected something into my arm and soon I entered in a soothing sleep. hat a pleasant dreamland! Then I awoke as it were after some minutes (but it was one-nd-a-half hours). When I was pushed back to the sick bay from the operation theatre, realised my left eye was taped, but my right eye seemed sparklingly clearer than before. painful heaviness weighed over the incised eye and an intermittent twitch followed nat gnawed like an ant-bite. The nurse said this might become worse during the night, and I was advised to take panadol when (or if) this worsened. By God's grace, the heaviness on the eye and the twitches began to subside as we left hospital after being put bed for 4 hours. The next morning I felt 90 per cent normal. No panadol needed. he Lord does give you the desires of your heart (Ps 37:4). The nurse who cleaned my ye the next day was surprised to see such quick improvement.

Nevertheless as this is a major operation, I cannot see yet with my left eye. It ikes some time to recover. I am ordered one week's complete rest. But I can write his letter with my right eye while the left eye is shut out - so there is no strain t all.

Who wins the Gulf War?

This was the title of a message I preached in Manila. My answer to this question s: "Neither Bush nor Saddam but Jesus Christ!" We are happy that Righteousness has revailed over Aggression. But war brings suffering to all sides. Nor is U.N. able settle its many problems ahead in the Middle East. Neither U.S., nor U.S.S.R. This ast decade of the 2nd millennium is fraught with more wars, big and small, until the

final world war breaks out in the Euphrates region (Iraq again). This leads to the Battle of Armageddon (Rev 9 & 16).



There is the Greek mythology of the Hydra-This Hydra has nine heads. When one monster. head is cut off, it produces two. If all 9 heads are cut off, then it becomes 18 heads. From Bible prophecy we see no solution at all to the Arab-Israeli Problem. This Probem cannot settled except Jesus the Prince of Peace comes.

Israel will take a terrible battering But before long. Zechariah 13 says two-thirds of her population will be killed! PASTORAL CHAT

My dear Readers,

Far Eastern Bible College



One of the subjects of my thoughts during my enforced rest at the East Coast Chalets is FEBC. It's a long, long road since we took the first step the morning of Sept 17, 1962 when the principal sat on a kitchen stool to lecture to the first three students (Eddy Chan and Ng Sang Chiew of Batu Pahat, Ivy Tan of Singapore). Since that Day of days, the College has graduated nearly 200 from 15 countries, a fifth of whom have furthered their studies abroad. Many of these are now engaged also in the training

of others, pastoring churches, or holding executive posts. But we are not unmindful of those who are holding out in lonely stations, for example, Brutus Balan in the Aborigines country in West Australia (see Banner). And there is Miss Tiew Ah Tuan, for 2 decades principal of a 300 kindergarten in Kota Tinggi, Johore, Malaysia. Our first 3 African graduates are all pastoring churches and engaged in Bible College teaching. George Kutty of India, who married Kamala, our clerk, is pastor of Grace Bible Church in Providence, USA, ministering to Cambodian refugees, etc., etc.

Today, FEBC is at her highest tide in enrolment - 60 full-time students from 12 countries. The latest additions are 3 Burmese students. Two of these students have tertiary education. They are sent by Rev Robert Thawm Luai to train at FEBC so they might return to train others. With the acquisition of Beulah House, we are enabled to take in many more students. And many more are seeking entrance from other parts of the world.

Why should students come from as far as West Africa and from as north as Japan and Korea? I asked a Korean graduate student now pastoring a Korea Presbyterian Church in Singapore why he chose FEBC. He said, "For its strong theology and Calvinistic doctrine, and for Greek and Hebrew".

We have also the advice of a visiting professor, who after examining our curriculum, has encouraged us to work towards a graduate programme. As more of our graduates return, we will surely implement this. Our earnest prayer is that those who are joining the teaching staff remain loyal sons of the Faith. During all these years FEBC has stood bulwark for Sound Doctrine, for the infallible, inerrant, verbally inspired Word of God.

With a good endowment for the Library, we shall soon open up a fully equipped mezzenine floor of the Church Tower. Books, books, books are needed! If you have any which you little use but are of value to us, please send them in. As we receive, so we give. FEBC publications are sent to other parts of the world upon request, from time to time. The latest book to come from the principal's pen is "The Clock of the Sevenfold Will of God" (130 pages).



We returned from the East Coast Chalets Sat. morning Mar 2 to another hideout in the FEBC Block, and to an avalanche of good wishes from you in many kind expressions. With your constant prayers for me I am uplifted to face the surgeon a second time Fri. Mar 8. This operation will take place at 7.00 am at Mount Elizabeth Hospital. The Lord give grace and wisdom to the surgeon, and bless the work of his hands.

After this second operation I shall be under another enforced rest. As this Lord's Day is my turn to preach at the Chinese Service, I have to find a substitute. Mrs Lee has kindly found one in Rev Lim Jui Kai. Incidentally, Rev Lim and his wife will join us at the Family Camp up Fraser's Hill. He will minister in my stead to the Chinese-speaking section.

"Only one life 'twill soon be past Only what's done for Jesus will last."

This couplet spurs us on to serve the Lord wherever He leads, to the best of our ability, until life's end.

"Owe no man anything" (Rom 13:8)

By this law of Divine economics to which we have faithfully adhered, God has blessed our Church Funds the last 40 years. As we had cleared every debt in the building of Gilstead Road (1962) and of Woodlands (1983), so we are now paying promptly every sum on demand. Our debt-burden of \$3 million is reduced to \$2.3 million.

The Lord has caused His children to redouble their efforts towards EBF I during this Lunar New Year. We should aim at piercing the first million by Easter, which is only three weeks away. Meanwhile, we have not neglected the support of missions. By your extra efforts we have helped Medan acquire their Beulah Land with a mere \$43,000, and have accumulated for the Philippine Hilltop \$10,000.

With the rallying support of the Missionary Fellowship, we should be enabled to send the Charles Seets to Manila to teach at the Metro-Manila School of the Bible. Thank God for 2 sums that came in last week. When we spend on Missions, we are but paying our Gospel debt. "I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the

wise, and to the unwise" (Rom 1:14). Salvation is free, yet it is costly.

Speaking on missionary support, here comes a request from Rev Robert Thawm Luai, of the Far Eastern Fundamental School of Theology, Yangon (Rangoon) for a standard typewriter much needed for their office, and for a refrigerator for their College kitchen. (They have now 37 students, and soon a first batch of graduates will be despatched to the vast Burmese harvest fields). A standard typewriter will save much time over the portable one which has been given, and a refrigerator will save much food from deterioration and loss. Are these luxurious? A corollary to "Owe no man anything" is Prov 3:27, "Withhold not good from them to whom it is due, when it is in the power of thine hand to do it."

Incidentally, one of our African students, Geoffrey Lidodo, is sick up Beulah House L-Block. Who would give him some encouragement? "Do something good for Jesus everyday."



WHAT IS THE DESIDERATIVE WILL OF GOD?

(from "The Clock of the Sevenfold Will of God" by T.T.)

Another aspect of God's will is what we call the Desiderative. This word comes from the Latin implying desire or a longing for. The desiderative will of God is revealed in such Scripture verses as follows:

- 1. "For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savlour; who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (I Tim. 2:3,4).
- "Have I any pleasure at all that the wicked should die? saith the Lord God: and not that he should return from his ways, and live?" (Ezek. 18:23).
- "For I have no pleasure in the death of him that dieth, saith the Lord God: wherefore turn yourselves, and live ye" (Ezek. 18:32).
- "The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some men count slackness: but is longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (II Pet. 3:9).

Whether stated positively or negatively, these verses express the attribute of God in His "goodness" (Westminster Shorter Catechism Answer to Question 4). The word "goodness" here refers to the outgoing of God's grace and love and mercy toward the creature in his sin and need. "The goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance" (Rom. 2-4) — Buswell.

It is of God's character not to exult like Nero in the torture and death of his Christian subjects, nor like Hitler exterminating six million Jews with a stone-dead heart, but the very opposite. God is good, God is love. So it is in Himself to see sinners turn to Him in repentance, for He is not willing that any should perish.

Thus when we read John 3:16, the most famous verse in the whole Bible, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life," we take the plain, simple sense that salvation is offered to all mankind. John 3:16 expresses the Desideratve Will of a God of goodness, to both the good and the evil (Matt. 5:45). But there are the Hyper-Calvinists who see God's goodness only on the elect, that they cannot but conclude the world (cosmos in Greek) to be the world of the elect. And when II Pet. 3:9 is quoted that He is "not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance," these same Hyper-Calvinists must interpret it to refer again to the elect. John 3:16 is not a universal offer of the Gospel but a limited one only to the elect! This is like holding a sale for a departmental store with a restrictive sign under the word SALE — "only buyers can enter! Now, if these Hyper-Calvinists know there is an aspect of God's will known as the Desiderative, their blind spot on God's Abounding Grace would be removed. "I counsel thee to buy of Me anoint thine eyes with eyesalve. that thou mayest see." (Rev. 3:18).

What does Calvin himself say of John 3:16? In his commentary on this verse touching the word "whosoever," he says, "And he has used a general term, both to invite indiscriminately all to share in life and to cut off every excuse from unbelievers. Such is also the significance of the word 'world' which He had used before. For although there is nothing in the world deserving God's favour, He nevertheless shows He is favourable to the whole world when He calls all without exception to the faith of

Christ which is indeed an entry into life." If the Hyper-Calvinists should still insist on the Gospel in John 3:16 being offered only to the Elect, let them answer what the apostle John says in I John 2:2: "And He is the propitiation for our sins; and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world." By the desiderative will of God we will see clearly what is succinctly stated by Augustine on the effectualness of Christ's death — "Sufficient for all, efficient for the elect." — Calvin in his commentary on I John 2:2 above accepts this formula as correct (Buswell).

Another way to show that John 3:16 is a universal offer of salvation to the lost is the parable of the sower (Matt. 13:3-8). According to the Hyper-Calvinists the sower would be seen digging a hole in the good ground and pouring all the seeds into it. These are their precious elect. According to our Lord, however, the seeds are scattered to the uttermost part of the field. Hence, there are those that fall by the wayside, on stony ground and among thorns and thistles. The last three places where the good seeds landed yielded nothing. That cannot stop the good ground bring forth an hundredfold. Nor do we dispute the supralapsarian emphasis of Christ dying in fact for the elect, but to restrict John 3:16 to the elect is like pouring all the seeds into that hole.

As to II Peter 3:9, "... not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance," this is what Calvin has to say:

This is His wondrous love towards the human race, that He desires all men to be saved, and is prepared to bring even the perishing to safety. We must notice the order, that God is prepared to receive all men into repentance, so that none may perish. These words indicate the means of obtaining salvation, and whoever of us seeks salvation must learn to follow in this way.

It could be asked here, if God does not want any to perish, why do so many in fact perish? My reply is that no mention is made here of the secret decree of God by which the wicked are doomed to their own ruin, but only of His loving-kindness as it is made known to us in the Gospel. There God stretches out His hand to all alike, but He only grasps those (in such a way as to lead to Himself) whom He has chosen before the foundation of the world.

Now, when we see the desiderative will of God applies to all men, we will be the more zealous to spread the Word to as wide a field as possible. We will not like those Hyper-Calvinist Baptist ministers, when approached by William Carey to support his mission to India, be heard saying, "God has predestined whom He would save. He doesn't need you!" How like the Sale in that departmental store we have mentioned above that has a restriction beneath the big sale sign: "Only buyers can enter"!

But our God is not static. Our God is dynamic. Our God is not a computer. Our God is Controller of the universe and Comforter to the Church, yea, even to you and me, who says, "And him that cometh to Me, I will in no wise cast out" (John 6:37). God's grace is not bound, but abounding John 3:16 is God's universal offer of salvation to everyone who believes. When you believe, you will soon know from Scripture you are elect.

On the Desiderative Will of God

A picture is worth 1,000 words. To illustrate the relationship between the various aspects of the Will of God, we have produced a number of diagrams. Two of these are reproduced overleaf showing the connection between the world-at-large and the elect or chosen ones.

THE WALL OF JERUSALEM

"A New World Order is Coming"

These words uttered by President Bush in the wake of victory over Saddam Hussein with reference to his administration (which is short-lived), unwittingly, points to that Day when the Prince of Peace comes!

Let us not be deceived by the "PEACE" and conferences for peace that are being held under that New World Order. "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape" (I Thess 5:3). Until Jesus comes, any peace treaty made by men will be torn to bits. Until Jesus comes there can be no New World Order.

Today is Palm Sunday when we commemorate our Lord's Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. This is the beginning of Holy Week. "All this was

done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, Tell ye daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.". This ceremonial riding into Jerusalem heralds the day when He will come in great power and glory according to St John in Rev 19:11-16, "And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse: and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war. His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on his head were many crowns: and he had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself. And he was clothed with a vest re dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God. And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean. And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron; and he treadeth the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written, KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS." As Jesus comes into Jerusalem by the Mt. of Olives, in the Day of His Second Coming, it is prophesied by Zechariah he will do the same, as attested also by the two angels to the gazing Galileans.

But before Jesus comes to judge the world, He must conquer it by yielding his body to be crucified to break the power of sin and evil. This was the climax of His mission from heaven to earth. Praise the Lord, our Lord had stooped to conquer. He suffered and shed His precious blood to redeem us. He entered the jaws of death to snatch us out to life. His Resurrection was His Victory over His enemy. His Ascension was to His Kingly throne from which He is soon coming again to establish a New World Order that will last 1,000 years. Do you know that is what Palm Sunday means? As the children hail the King of Kings with loud hosannas (not "God save the king" but "God the King save"!) so must the whole world kowtow before Him that soon coming day. And where will you be? Are you among the saved or the lost?

And what preparation are you making for that glorious day to come? It is nearer than you think! Don't say 2000 AD! It can come next year or year after next, as suddenly as the Gulf Crisis erupted. Serve Him with your whole life now before it is too late. Maranatha.

"We have not so much as heard whether there be any Holy Ghost" (Acts 19:2)

This was the answer given by the Ephesians to Paul when he examined them in the Faith. When I was a boy I had heard of the Name of the Holy Spirit but without understanding. When I was soundly converted and born again by the Holy Spirit at the great revival meetings of Dr John Sung in 1935, I was filled with the joy and power of the Holy Spirit. Ever since, He has guided me each step of life's way.

At the Sunset Gospel Hour, Calvary-Pandan BPC, I shall be speaking during the month of April 4 messages on the Holy Spirit. These messages will be followed by others to be delivered by Dr S H Tow, Dr Whitcomb and Rev Stephen Khoo. As we are living in the Age of the Holy Spirit, all the more we need to be instructed in the Person and work of the Holy Spirit. O Lord, even now stir up the heart of every Reader to come and hear Your Word!





Easter Sunrise Service was The holding of started by Life Church 41 years ago at MacRitchie Reservoir. This glorious tradition is now being carried on by B-P Churches around the Island. New Life assembles at Woodlands Park and caters to several B-P Churches in Southern Johore, while Rev Koa Keng Woo of Muar is the scheduled speaker.

As for the Mother Church, we started a new tradition last year to congregate on the Church grounds at 7.00 am instead of 6.30 am. This more practical arrangement caters to Life Church's various services (English, Chinese, Indonesian, as well as to Sharon BPC), to 1,200 announced by the Deacon-in-charge last year.

The holding of Easter Sunrise Services by BPCs THE GARDEN TOMB, JERUSALEM around the Island is a powerful witness to non-Christians of the uniqueness of our Faith. We worship not dead idols made by human hands but the living and true God (I Thess 1:9). That Christ has risen from the dead shows He is GOD. He is the Son of God who has come down from heaven through the Virgin Mary, that He might die for our sins. By rising from the dead the third day He vanquishes death and hell for us. His Ascension to Heaven guarantees our Rapture in that soon coming Day, that we might live with Him forever more.

10 Appearances

Every Christian should know the 10 appearances of our Lord to the early disciples. Can you count them?

Five occurred on the first Sunday. They were to 1) Mary Magdalene; 2) the other women; 3) Cleopas and companion on way to Emmaus; 4) Peter; 5) All disciples except Thomas.

The other Five to 1) All disciples with Thomas the next Lord's Day; 2) Seven by the Sea of Galilee; 3) 500 on a mountain; 4) James in Jerusalem; 5) Disciples, the last time on Mt of Olives, before the Ascension.

No historical event is more attested than the Resurrection of our Lord, and this goes on and on as He appears to His special chosen ones, such as to Paul on the Damascus Road and several times more in his missionary journeys.

But it is not necessary for us to see a vision of Jesus as is emphasised by the Charismatics. Jesus said to Thomas, "Because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed" (Jn 20:29). So says Peter the Chief Apostle in his First Epistle, "Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing..." (I Pet 1:8). To see Jesus everyday the surest way is to read His Word. Read the 4 Gospels for a start. Does He not come to bless your heart as you meditate on His power and love? He speaks to you through the sacred pages! Resolve to read your Bible more this Easter Lord's Day! Are you using the RPG for help?



Thoughts on the Rescue of SQ 117



For a quarter century this little Island State of Singapore has never had it so good. This no doubt is due to a just and honest government but in our public prayers, we have always been careful to render due honour and glory to a merciful God. To the Almighty who has favoured our people according to His good pleasure and counsel of His own will. For He says, "I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion" (Rom 9:15). In private conversation we have often expressed thankfulness to our Father for keeping us from international terrorism and bomb scares that

have erupted, plaquing such a nearby country as Philippines during the Gulf War.

When the SIA flight SQ 117 from KL to Singapore Tuesday night Mar 26, '91 with 114 passengers and 11 crew was hijacked by 4 Pakistanis, my personal fears of such eventuality stared me in the face. It is only when it was all over in 30 secs. of commando operation by the S'pore Army that I was moved to offer thanks to God at the Invocation of our Good Friday Night Service. A European passenger commenting on the swift despatch of the terrorists said it was like Entebbe.

Among those who shook hands with the Pastor at the end of the Service was a smiling young man who told me he was one of the 114 passengers. After the Easter Sunrise Service the same person shook my hands again and mentioned that his wife would also come to Church. In my sermon that morning I contrasted the saving faith in this young man with the fears and faintings of those who most probably were outside Christ. It would be wonderful if this "Lifer hostage" would contact the AF or Men's Fellowship whereby we might hear from him firsthand his valuable experience through this ordeal, and better still, about his new resolve to follow the Lord.

We are thankful for a wise Government in handling such a nerve-wracking situation, and to our Armed Forces for such efficiency in tackling international terrorism. But we must not forget to thank God who governs every event of life, great or small, even the wing of a sparrow and the petal of a flower. God is great and God is merciful in preserving the lives of SQ 117. God is the Protector of our Island Nation. God save Singapore. Ugly Singaporeans need a transformation of that image by humbling ourselves and walking softly before God and man. Let our Church redouble her efforts to extend the message of salvation to the ends of the earth while the twilight of 'peace' lingers. Maranatha. Amen.

"...I must be about my Father's business" (Lk 2:40)

These words are taken from the 12-year old Jesus, whose parents having lost him for three days after the Passover Feast, found Him sitting among theological professors in the Temple. You who attend the 10.30 Service, please come half-hour before time. Just once a year! Can you be delinquent in your membership?

As the Church grows there are new commitments, especially the sending of missionaries abroad. Come and deliberate on what we all can do to advance God's Kingdom! Be about the Father's Business!



Report on Beulah Land, Medan

We are sorry to hear that you have an eye problem. Knowing of your sickness we prayed to God, that He may give you a speedy recovery. The words of the Psalmist is also our words to you (please read Psalm 20).

As a word of encouragement for the glory of God, I would like to report that your last coming here, especially your last speech before going back to Singapore, has caused a great result. First, teachers and workers who also join the Basic Theology for Everyone have become

more dedicated to God. Second, they are faithful in giving to God of what they have. Some give 5%, others 10%, while another gives 15% of their salary for the B.F. I heard that Rev Tan and sister Kimiko are coming. Praise the Lord for their zeal. Now is the time to start a Fundamental Bible College especially here at Medan. For not even one good Bible school is here. Let's start it in God's way. For God's work must be done in God's way as you have said so. If IAIB is recognized by the Government, we will have no problem welcoming lecturers from Singapore. The people of Medan long to see you. Because whenever you come it's only for one day, and tomorrow you disappear.



KOREAN FEBC GRADUATE HEADS BIBLE COLLEGE OF EAST AFRICA

Last week when Rev Mark Kim Kyung Soo knocked on my door, I was almost floored by what I thought to be an apparition! He and his wife and two daughters had left FEBC a year ago to head the Bible College of East Africa. To my knowledge it was a long



arduous journey flying up to Karachi and down the horn of Africa past Somalia and Ethiopia to Nairobi, Kenya. How did I know there's a shorter route by Mauritius and Madagascar, and the roundtrip fare is only US\$900. This has facilitated his coming. [Rev Kim has a BSc and BTh from Korea and DipTh(FEBC).]

Why did Rev Kim make this sudden trip to see me? He had come to enlist the help of another FEBCer. So, there will be 3 FEBCers serving at the Bible College of East Africa. The third one is also one of the three Kenyans who obtained their degrees from FEBC. He has returned to serve in his alma mater besides pastoring a church and teaching at the African Church Reformed Bible Institute started by Masila.

In a letter received by hand through Rev Kim, Rev Richard Kivai says, "Greetings from Kenya. I have not regretted for having studied in FEBC. I just want to assure you of my sincere prayers for you and the ministry there.

"Thank you for the book "Chronicles of Conquest" you sent to me. I very much thank 30d for the training I received from you. Here in Kenya, God is using me as He wills. I teach in our Bible College and also in our Bible Institute named Africa Church Reformed 3ible Institute. I am also Pastor of a church at Mitaboni. Please, sir, pray for me for the work here. Remember me to the FEBC students and the teachers and also to Mrs Pow.

"There is a teacher who works with me here and I am recommending him to your school. I hope he can do well. His name is Alex. Rev Kim will explain to you all the details.

"Sir, I would like to have more of your books for the work here. It's my prayer that God will enable me to visit Singapore sometimes. Why don't you think of visiting Kenya at least for two days? I would like to have you. Sir, may God bless you. NB: In Kenya, the fruit of FEBC is evident. We have a very good principal, Rev Kim. I am happy that he was a student of FEBC. We do pray for FEBC. God bless FEBC."

I have personally visited BCEA. That was in 1975. At present they have 23 students. The need of sustaining this fundamental school of theology is great. BCEA is the product of the Independent Board for Foreign Missions, which had sent Rev & Mrs John Grauley to FEBC in the sixties. But American missionaries seem to have run their part in the neeley. It is high time for men and women of other races to carry on the baton. Especially those who are qualified to teach.

But here's a note of warning! Visits by church members to the mission fields, self-paying are good. But those who say they are called to be missionaries must first be qualified and be prepared to rough it out on a long-term basis. Are you willing to stay on the job for a term of 3 or 4 years? Any work for God must be cost effective. Of course there are arrangements for special stop-gap ministries, and a valid case in point is the valuable service by Elder & Mrs Khoo to the Australian Churches, particularly Bethel BPC, Melbourne.

Coming back to Rev Kim's unexpected visit to Singapore, there is another reason why se contacted us. It is for our help in the supply of theological books. The books we save published through CLBC and sent to Kenya through Rev Kim's container a year ago 500 at least) have been exhausted. They are used in several other schools and churches. So we have promised another 500 to be sent in time. We have also donated 100 copies used Trinity Hymnals to the African Church.

By the willingness of a Korean FEBCer to give his life to Africa, "a great door and effectual is opened" (I Cor 16:9) to our members and readers! If you cannot go, you can pray and pay! Incidentally there are 3 more Kenyans, 1 Ghanan and 2 Liberians training at FEBC, and soon one of them will graduate and return to teach in his homeland this July. Pray for FEBC that we may be enabled to train more workers for the farflung harvest fields of another hemisphere.

FEBC is the fountain head of a Bible College movement that has flowed to Burma (Thawm Juai), Philippines (Charles Seet), Indonesia (Haposan) and now Kenya (East Africa) - Mark Kim Kyung Soo. Do remember us in our day-to-day ministry in prayer. Amen.



From Profit to Profit



In both the parables of the talents and the pounds Jesus used the word "trade" to teach us the importance of profit in our endeavours for God's Kingdom. Your hilarious giving to the Beulah Land Enterprise saved us taking a million-dollar loan from the bank. It brought the Lord good profit for by your effort we are saved from tens of thousands in interest-paying. This has enabled us to support missions in various fields, so that God's work

is not hindered. This will help us, in part, to send two missionary couples - Charles Seet & Frieda to Philippines and Deeram & Jess to Thailand.

Is every Lifer "trading" wisely for the Lord?

As the Church is made up of individual members, it is of paramount importance that every Lifer "trade" wisely for the Lord. Are you one who brings home 100% profit like the five-talent and two-talent servants or are you the third one who buried his talent in the earth? Are you profitable or unprofitable to the Lord?

Since we are bought with a price (I Cor 7:23), even by the precious blood of Jesus Christ (I Pet 1:19), we are no more our own. We belong to Him. Let us live a wholesome, vibrant Christian life to glorify Him, and not be one in name only. Can he say to you, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant"?

Practical Considerations

Coming to Church once a week as a matter of duty is not enough. How about joining the S.S. with your children to added profit? Coming to Tuesday night prayer meeting is a step in the right direction. To be more profitable, may I suggest you join one of our Fellowships. There are at least 10 of them to cater to every age group. There is no limitation of age or sex in the Missionary Fellowship. To further your Biblical knowledge there are the Monday and Thursday Evening Classes provided by FEBC. The various projects of our Church need material support. If every earner will keep up to the Lord's tithe, we will not be hampered in the advancement of God's Kingdom. (God doesn't require what you have not.)

If you are a father or mother with young children, now is the time to train them up in the way of the Lord. Holding a nightly family worship and telling them the wonders of God's work from the Bible will lay foundations for their early salvation. Disciplining them in study and recreation (the TV set must be strictly regulated), is part of your wise "trading" for spiritual profit for your whole family. Do you read a portion of God's Word everyday, underlining "golden texts"? Do you underline the texts preached every Lord's Day? This will enhance your understanding of the Truth. Do you pray to the Lord in sweet communion with Him? Do you bring all your problems to Him? Do you give thanks when He answers? All these questions I put to you are to start you on the right track to "trading" for the Lord. How much profit will you bring to Him?

Cost-effective Missions



According to the Livine mandate of "profitable trading", so has our Church's involvement in Missions been cost-effective from the beginning. A few examples will suffice: 1) Kulai Besar Corner Terrace House, now home for Kulai Besar BPC and Kindergarten. Acquired in 1972 for M\$14,700, its value is easily 5 times that today. Here is a flourishing self-supporting Church of 30 under Rev David W.T. Wong with a Kindergarten of 40. 2) Selayang Segar (KL). By extending a loan to Rev Liew Hon Seng, this "A-1" flat at the corner of the

2nd floor, dedicated by Dr Arthur Steele, is now a busy centre of worship, etc. Rev Liew has also a work at Taman Sri Melati, 2 miles away. The Peace BPC, for that is their name, will be fully self-supporting 1992. 3) A 21-acre Church-Kindergarten, School-Orphanage complex with several pieces of land therein bought by Life Church for Rev Djunaidi, this Christian Village became self-supporting since April 1988. Rev Djunaidi has expanded the gospel work on his own and built two churches at Kumpai and Biong (15 adults were baptised, Christmas 1990).

With support withdrawn from the above-mentioned three enterprises, we are enabled to go to the aid of new missions. The first is B-P Mission on Batam Island under Sis. Roska. With the prospect of acquiring a house in the National Development Estate near Sekupang costing S\$10,000, our Batam Mission costs \$18,160 (1991-92). 2) Burma. Under Rev Robert Thawn Luai's leadership, the Far Eastern Fundamental School of Theology receives S\$25,000 every year. This sum has helped to rent 2 houses, pay the staff and offer a number of scholarships. 3) Philippines. In association with Rev Dan Ebert's Metro-Manila School of the Bible, Mr & Mrs Charles Seet will be sent. Their support is estimated to cost S\$36,650 a year. 4) Thailand. Deeram and Jess with two children will return to Chiang Mai where they will start a Kindergarten and Church. Their expenses will total \$\$21,975. The grand total for Missions to Batam, Burma, Philippines and Thailand is \$\$101,785 for one year. Since offerings for their support are far from adequate, gifts designated to the persons concerned shall be channelled to their public account and not directed to the individuals. This is a universal missions policy.

In pursuance of our policy of self-support and cost-effectiveness, with the view of nurturing a strong national church, it is hoped our various constituencies in the field will follow the example of Kulai Besar and Rev Djunaidi in Kalimantan. With this procedure, new mission fields will be opened. In view of the fact that our Beulah Debt-burden is still over \$2 million we will concentrate on lightening its load. It is hoped we can be freed of this debt by June 1993. Yours faithfully, T.T.

PASTORAL CHAI

My dear Readers,

"Owe no man anything" (Rom 13:8)



At last week's Congregational Meeting it was disclosed by the Treasurer that since we acquired the Beulah property Apr 30, 90 to this day we have cleared \$790,447.40 from our \$3 million debt. So, we are now owing \$2.2 million. Reflecting on this healthy situation, I wrote the same day we should aim at wiping the remaining sum by June 1993.

To accomplish this we need to stretch our sinews again! We need to mobilise every department and fellowship of the Church. Meanwhile, the Men's Fellowship had led the way with a gift and loan. Maranatha followed suit with a goodly loan. In order that each department and fellowship might exert an equal effort, it is proposed that 50% of your respective incomes be channelled to the EBF II. Or should "many sons starve a father," according to a Chinese proverb I had quoted? Rather, "Bear ye one another's burden and so fulfil the law of Christ" (Gal 6:2).

"Every work for Jesus will be blest, But He asks from every one his best Our talents may be few these may be small, But unto Him is due our best our all,"

What happened to those who beautify their own houses

to the neglect of God's House?

After the Jews' Return from 70 years exile in Babylon they were told to rebuild Solomon's Temple that was destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar. They had built first the altar and laid the foundations when they were suddenly stopped by the higher authorities. That stop lasted 15 years.

Meanwhile the people built their own houses and lavished them with decorative ceilings, with never a thought for God. Listen to the prophet Haggai's message that might well apply to ugly Singaporeans, "Now therefore thus saith the Lord of hosts; Consider your ways. Ye have sown much, and bring in little; ye eat, but ye have not enough; ye drink, but ye are not filled with drink; ye clothe you, but there is none warm; and he that earneth wages earneth wages to put it into a bag with holes...Go up to the mountain, and bring wood, and build the house; and I will take pleasure in it, and I will be glorified, saith the Lord" (Haggai 1:5-8).



Nor can we withhold the tithe, the sacred tenth without His rebuke, "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation. Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. And

I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the Lord of hosts" (Mal 3:8-11).

Powerhouse for Missions



There is a reason why God has sent us students from a dozen countries. He wants FEBC to be a powerhouse for Missions. This is shown e.g. by Rev Mark Kim of Korea being sent to head the Bible College in Kenya; by the first three African graduates Masila, Kivai, Koech returning to pastor and teach in their own churches, in town or country. Of the two couples to be sent to the fields, Charles Seet and wife Frieda are both B.Th. holders from FEBC. Charles, a pure Lifer, has also taught at FEBC for

the last one year. The other couple are Jess, another Lifer and Deeram. Deeram her husband is Thai, so they will return to their original field in Chiang Mai. Another FEBCer, member of a local Presbyterian Church, is being sought by Rev Kim to go to Kenya. And so the line up of those going out keeps lengthening.

To keep up the tempo of training our present body of 60 students, we are enlisting three new lecturers in the next academic year 1991-92, which is our 30th Anniversary: 1. Rev Dan Ebert III, Director of the Metro-Manila School of the Bible and of the Centre of Biblical Studies for Graduate Students. He is the creator of the written script of the Palawano language (Southern Philippines) and translator of the New Testament. 2. Rev Albert Ong, FEBCer B.Th., M. Div., Th.M., is a lover of the alma mater, whose wife Agnes, M.A., M.A. has taught a computer class this semester. 3. Mr Das Koshy, a graduand, who having studied 3 years Greek is taking an intensive course under Dr Paul Wagner. His teaching of Greek Reading next year is part of FEBC's launching of her master's programme. Mr Das Koshy holds a B.Sc. in Chemistry. He comes from India. 4. The principal himself is taking a 5-week refresher course in Modern Hebrew over the 5-month Ulpan course he had graduated from the American Institute of Holy Land Studies, Jerusalem 1969-70. This time he'll be away in June-July, '91. 5. Rev Goh Seng Fong, old-timer FEBCer, Cert.R.K., M.A., M.Div. is leaving for States to take his doctorate in Ministry this August. He is sponsored by the alma mater. 6. Dr Whitcomb who is speaker at Calvary's Combined Family Camp will teach one week's Vacation Bible College



at Calvary and FEBC in June '91. FEBC students who attend the one week's intensive course, both morning and evening and write a paper will earn one credit, N.B.! 7) A Third Holy Land Study Tour under the auspices of FEBC is being considered for March 1992. FEBC students who join this Study Tour and write a paper will be granted 2 credits, as in the last two study tours. (As a result of this link-up between Singapore and the West Bank, Israel, we have through Life Church bought a piece of land at Beit Sahour, 3 miles from Bethlehem, for the Arab Church.)

The highlight of your visit, I'm sure, will be Tanjung Uban. On Easter Sunday the sign-board of the Church was erected with official approval. Our workers there are Mr & Mrs Chia Jung Kong, No. 35 Jalan Hang Tuah. This newest station, our 40th, needs an electronic organ (portable). Perhaps the Lord might send one through the MF, so that your visit will bring enhanced joy to the new worshippers. This is missions!



TESTIMONY BY THOMAS KHOR BOI HUAT



The Lord has been extremely kind and merciful to my family in protecting me during the 8-hour long SQ 117 hijack on 26 March 1991.

At 9.48 pm flight SQ 117 took off from Kuala Lumpur to Singapore. I was seated on the fourth row Economy Class. Refreshment was served at 10.00 pm and I was the last to be served. Suddenly a big commotion came from the rear of the plane. A tall, slim Pakistani rushed forward and shouted to all the passengers, was a hijack!" All Economy Class passengers seated on the first 3 rows were commanded to move to the rear. There were 4 hijackers. They carried 2 detonators each. They told us that the purpose of the hijack was to release the jailed political leaders of the

Pakistan People's Party in Pakistan.

The most notorious hijacker, Mohammed Khan, was guarding the centre exit. The chief Mr Shahid commanded the plane to be flown to Sydney. Fortunately, Cpt Lim managed to convince them to refuel in Singapore. The plane landed at Changi airport at 10.24 pm.

Negotiations were proceeding, but at midnight the hijackers had not received the fuel on the first deadline. Two stewards were pushed out of the plane. The notorious Mohammed Khan threatened to kill one passenger every five minutes. I kept this passage of God's word in my heart, "Come unto me all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." I prayed to the Lord to move me several rows backwards. I requested permission to go to the toilet. I returned to a new seat on Row 6.

Demands were made with deadlines imposed. The hijackers got upset at 2.45 am. They poured alcohol all over the plane and almost ignited it.

At 6.45 am the hijackers refused to wait any longer. Mr Shahid ordered the captain to start the engine within 5 minutes or else he would kill all the passengers. He counted four, three ... when I heard the Commando's command "LIE LOW!" All the passengers dived low. The passenger sitting next to me was shivering and petrifying with fear. Praise the Lord, I was slightly frightened. Shots were heard. In less than 30 seconds Operation LIGHTNING STORM was over. The four hijackers were killed. We were ordered to sit up and keep our hands on our heads. I praise the Lord for protecting me throughout the 8 hours trial. The Lord has brought my family closer to Him as a result of this hijack -------

"Seek ye the Lord while He may be found..."

... "Call ye upon Him while He is near!" (Isa 55:6). But we must cleanse ourselves before He would hear us. So the prophet continues, "Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and He will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon" (Isa 55:7).

You have read Bro Thomas Khor's testimony above. The difference between him and the one sitting next is the Lord's presence with one and not with the other. May the word from Isaiah remind us to draw nigh to God always.

Conversely, hear the words of King Solomon, "Because I have called, and ye refused; I have stretched out my hand, and no man regarded; But ye have set at nought all my counsel, and would none of my reproof: I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when your fear cometh; When your fear cometh as desolation, and your destruction cometh as a whirlwind; when distress and anguish cometh upon you. Then shall they call upon me, but I will not answer; they shall seek me early, but they shall not find me: For that they hated knowledge, and did not choose the fear of the Lord" (Prov 1:24-29).

Many have been inquiring after my left eye. Praise the Lord, though recovery is slow, it is sure. I'm heading towards 40% as announced by Eld Seow to the Chinese Service. We're deeply thankful to God for His gentle mercies, so we will hold a Thanksgiving Service Fri. May 10, 8.00 pm at the FEBC Hall. Not only to thank the Lord, but the whole Church, you who have specially shown me kindness, not the least Eld Ang Beng Chong the eye-surgeon.



We have been granted 2 months sabbatical and study leave by Session. The main purpose is to attend to Jemima's wedding to Jeffrey Khoo. They will be married at Suncoast B-P Church, Florida by the hands of Dr Howard Carlson and Dr Arthur Steele. The date is May 22, 10.00 am. We leave May 11 TG414 2040 hrs via We arrive in N. York Sun May 12, 1445 hrs. As usual our stalwart Lifer abroad, Rev Hsu and wife will be at hand to "deliver" us. Usually my son John would drive us to Philadelphia, but as he is now fulltime in the

Air Force, he seems not able to make it.

We'd visit relatives and friends in Baltimore and the Philey area, then the Turners at Harrisburg and from there to Akron, Ohio to see daughter Lily. From Akron by Greyhound still to a little town Morton in Illinois to visit with William Teo. May 20 we fly down to Florida. We leave the States May 29 for Israel, where we'd spend 40 days on a refresher course in Modern Hebrew, returning S'pore July 10.

HOW THE LORD LED ME TO THAILAND By Jess Tamee

It was in 1981 when I first went to a youth camp in Pattaya, Central Thailand; playing

the role of counsellor to English-speaking varsity students. Never before in my life did I see so many temples (practically found on every street). Also, families that have two fathers, or three or four mothers. Yes, idolatry and adultery are a way of life in Thailand! And so, a burden for this heathen country started to burn in my heart.

Then in 1984, I went on a mission trip to Chiangmai, Thailand; playing the roles of preacher, medic and general helper to the various hill tribes. Never before in my life did I see so many animal bones (practically found on every doorpost). Also, drug-trafficking, murder and a real-life war. Yes, animism and barbarism are a way of life in the Golden Triangle! And so, that same burden burned even more in my heart.

After that, I took up Thai lessons with Tuanjai, wife of Prachan, an FEBC student then. I also shared this burden with Rev Tow. But he reckoned that it was not time to send me to Thailand as yet for I was still very young and single. Besides, Life Church did not have any station in Thailand.

In late. 1984, I was to go on a survey trip and to a family camp in Yala, Thailand. Before that trip was made, Rev Tow received a letter from the director of the Frontier Labourers for Christ asking for a missionary to help. Rev Tow asked if I minded working in the North. Of course, no. A door had opened for me to enter Thailand. A commissioning service was held Oct 14.

In that same year, the Thai government had a new ruling not to issue new missionary In-coming missionaries only could replace outgoing or deceased missionaries. Many were affected and had to leave Thailand for Penang every 3 months to renew their risas. But thank God, I got my quota through a foreign mission for a fee of US\$100 per

In 1987, that foreign mission raised the fee to US\$500! But thank God again, I got married to a Thai national, Deeram Tamee. And in 1990, a new government directive ruled that only Thai citizens could spread religion among the Tribals. The latest 1991 directive makes it compulsory for foreign missionaries to pass grade 6 Thai to qualify...

The door is closing little by little. Come May 15, Deeramand Jess will 30 back to Chiangmai to start a Bible-Presbyterian Church and a Christian kindergarten. May the Lord go before us and be with us always.

Chittagong Experience



It was about 1.30 pm Mon 29/4/91 at the factory in the Chittagong EPZ when the local M.D. told me a cyclone was heading N.N.E. in the direction of Chittagong. "Not in 20 years has a cyclone of such magnitude been reported." He said the core speed of the cyclone would be 185 kmh to 210 kmh.

At 1.30 pm, the M.D. decided we (there were 3 of us from S'pore) should return to the hotel. The sky was getting darker and the air was chilly.

Back at the hotel, the rain started to fall with strong wind. I went to bed around 10.30 pm. I was awakened by the sound of crashing glass. The howling wind was something I've never heard before. The pounding rain continued incessantly. I looked at my watch. It was 2.30 am. I prayed to the Lord to spare the city.

The next morning, the cyclone had moved on. We made our way to the factory. My colleagues and I witnessed the devastation along the way. When we arrived at the EPZ, many factories were damaged, our factory was also damaged. We spent the next few days helping to restore the factory.

As the communications were disrupted, we could not contact anyone outside of Chittagong. I sensed that loved ones in S'pore would be anxious for some news but it was impossible to tell them I was safe.

Many of the locals had become sick with diarrhoea. I prayed for guidance and good health. It was decided on Mon 6/5/91 that I should return to S'pore.

As I landed safely Tue pm, I gave thanks to the Lord. On my journey back by the night train from Chittagong to Dhaka, I shared a 4-berth compartment with 3 Bengalis. 2 of them could speak perfect English and volunteered much helpful information. As it was a requirement to confirm 72 hrs before take-off, I decided to call at the SIA Office. I was fortunate to fly back to S'pore the same day. I would like to thank everybody for all your prayers and kind words to my family in their anxiety.





REPORT ON FAR EASTERN FUNDAMENTAL SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY, BURMA By Rev Robert Thawm Luai, Principal

As I have already reported to you vide my letter of February 16, 1991, we now have 37 full-time students studying in the first, second and third-year classes. They belong to the following nine different denominations - Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian Church of Burma, Christian Reformed Church, Church of Christ, Evangelical Free Church, Fundamental Baptist, Evangelistic Prayer Group, Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Burma (our church).

We have received a request from one Seventh Day Baptist who is interested to enrol at our College for the new semester and hope he will soon submit application for admission. If he is admitted there will be ten different denominations among our students, or in other words, our Bible College will represent ten denominations from Myanmar(Burma).

Out of the 37 students, 22 are granted full scholarship by FEFST. The recipients of stipend awards comprise 15 students from EPCB; 3 students from Christian Reformed Church (ie Rev Chan Thleng's Church), one from Church of Christ (from Kachin State), one from Evangelistic Prayer Group (from Rangoon), one from Free Evangelical Church and one from Presbyterian Church of Burma.

We have a total of ten staff comprising eight faculty members and two office staff. Six members of the faculty are for theological teaching while two are for teaching English. Two work as office staff. All of the eight faculty members, two office staff and the 22 stipend holders are fully sponsored by the Life Bible-Presbyterian Church of Singapore.

We now have three premises including Calvin's Building which was leased lately. These three buildings are situated close to each other and it is almost as if they were in one big compound. The first building accommodates residential quarters for me and my family; Principal's office, and one room is used concurrently as classroom for 3rd year students as well as library. The second building is Ebenezer which houses two faculty members and their families and also boys' dormitory. The third building, "Calvin's Building" is used as Girls' dormitory; resident for Dean of FEFST, residence for one office staff and his family and classroom for first year students. We are planning to arrange one more room in this house for use as classroom for the new semester. This building is named "Calvin's Building" in your honour because you told me that you helped me for being a Calvinist.



You may be surprised to learn that FEFST students will evangelize during the summer holidays in the whole of Myanmar. Just before our college was closed for summer vacation, we requested each and every student to dedicate his/her holidays in the service of the Lord by evangelizing faithfully in his/her respective area. At this, the students voluntarily vowed before the Lord to give their time to the Lord each ranging from one to three months. With the exception of the third year students, they are now on their way

to their respective areas where they will be preaching faithfully. This will cover six provincial areas viz - (1) Shan State (2) Kachin State (3) Chin State (4) Sagaing Division (5) Irrawaddy Division and (6) Yangon (Rangoon) Division. The period of evangelizing is from one to three months depending on each student the time being May, June and July. Most of the students will concentrate their preaching and evangelizing in the remote rural areas. The third year students and I will look after EPCB local churches in the Chin State. They will accompany me to the Chin State where they will be engaged in preaching and evangelizing while I will administer the Church business. I believe this will be a great challenge for all of us as we are now in the last days of the Last Days. Please pray for us.

By the grace of God, we have been able to send two of our faculty members namely Mrs Thankipvel Zahau and Mr Fung Dun to Singapore in January 1991 for Theological training at the Far Eastern Bible College.

Budget Estimate for FEFST and EPCB. Our budget estimate for the fiscal year 1991-92 is K400,000 for FEFST and K100,000 for EPCB totalling K500,000 in all. This is roughly the equivalent of S\$25,000.

The lease agreements for the two houses will expire on April 30 and May 31 respectively. The third building called Calvn's Building has been rented till the end of October. Presently, we are in need of K200,000 by the end of this month.

We are trying to send the translation of The Shorter Catechism by book post or by hand. As far as my knowledge is concerned, it may not be possible to despatch so many copies by book-post. If that is so, we will send by hand. Please pray for us.

Ed. note. For cost-effectiveness it is quite obvious that the \$25,000 we give to Burma per annum goes the longest way. It is not support for a family but for a whole College including a 20% diversion for the Church. At end of this year a first class of students will graduate. Make your dollar a missionary dollar! Make it count for eternity. Don't forget Burma when you give to Missions.



My dear Readers,

We want to thank each one of you who came to the Fri. Night Thanksgiving Service, and who came to the airport to see us off. We felt we were borne on wings of your prayers.



At Bangkok Airport we were amazed at the improvement they have put into the new one. No wonder the Thais are called the fifth dragon! Is the church as enterprising? We landed at Heathrow early Sun. morning. After a break of 4 hours we transferred to TW 703 which ferried us into Kennedy Airport, N.Y. 1445 hrs, May 12.

What a relief to be warmly received by Rev C.T. Hsu and his wife.

Being the Lord's Day he did not drive his taxi. They came by bus,
but had a hired taxi to take us to the City (costing US\$35). He put us safely on
a Greyhound to Baltimore. Before he left he gave us a love gift and US\$200 to help us
reduce the \$2.2 million debt! We arrived Baltimore 11.30 pm and sure enough my cousin
Keng Eng and her husband came in their station wagon to transport us to their home.
Keng Eng's husband is a professor of physics at Towson U. They both love the Lord and,
like Aquila and Priscilla, are in charge of a Chinese congregation of 50-60 and worshipping at a rented Baptist Church. As we had no time, we phoned Lawrence and Lee Lin at
Huntingdon Valley, Pa. We left Baltimore May 14.

From Baltimore we took Greyhound to Philadelphia where we were met by Rev Carl Martin. He drove us to see his Church at Spring City before taking us to Dr and Mrs Murray's at Hatfield, Pa. where we lodged for the night. That evening we were warmly received at a reception made up of old friends and new thru "John Sung My Teacher." I had a good visit with Dr Allan A. MacRae the next day in conjunction with a book on Daniel he is printing thru Paul Wong. He is delighted with the format I showed him. We had telecommunication with Miss Trato and also with Dr Carl McIntire.

May 15 afternoon Rev & Mrs Jim Turner kindly drove up from Harrisburg to take us to their new place of work. Having served with Child Evangelism for 30 years in the Far East and South Pacific, they returned to USA about 8 years back. They have served the Lord not only intensively but also extensively, from Pakistan and India in the West to Fiji and nany Pacific Islands in the East. They spent a good part of the time in S'pore, having taught at FEBC. Lifers all know them and love them. Today they have a new ministry called TAP = Teachers' Assistance Programme. Their job is to gather Bibles and good thristian literature, pack and ship them to national pastors and evangelists, most of which go to the Philippines.

They become timely rations when you hasten long. You never can tell. When we had no time to stop for a bite, four biscuits on he bus became a delightful meal!

My dear Readers.



We planned our stay with the Teos so we could attend the Church they have chosen - Grace Evang. Mennonite Church. Who are the Mennonites? They are a branch of the Protestant Movement dating from 1525. As followers of Luther (1517) are called Lutherans and we Bible-Presbyterians trace our spiritual ancestry to Calvin, so the Mennonites are descended from Menno Simons. Because the followers of Menno Simons were against infant baptism, requiring the immersion of adults, they are called Anabaptists, which means "Baptise Again." These Anabaptists were persecuted by both RC's and mainline Protestants, but they thrive to this day. are Mennonites in 40 countries, and there is a Mennonite School

near Bethlehem where I preached the Gospel when we were there 1969-70. As the Mennonite Church at which the Teos worship require their son Samuel, who was baptised at infancy and reaffirmed his faith when he grew up to be re-baptised by immersion, they do not join as members. Nevertheless, they are cordially received into the fellowship of the Church.

We took leave of the Teos Mon. 20th by USAir Fokker 21-seater to Indianapolis for a Boeing 737 which landed us safely in Tampa. Dr Steele, the Khoos and Suan Yew were on hand to "deliver" us. A 15-minute drive via Clearwater Christian College brought us to the Steele home. This was our "field headquarters" all given to our use. Dr & Mrs Steele very kindly retreated to stay with their son Dr Jonathan across the street. We have a home away from home in the Lord Jesus Christ.

The night before Jemima's wedding, John my eldest son phoned from some Airforce base to offer his good wishes. The reason why we did not "find" him was his frequent service out in the field. During the Gulf War he was sent overseas. His job is servicing aircraft computers.

The wedding between Jemima and Jeff Khoo was officiated by Dr Howard Carlson and Dr Steele at Suncoast BPC, 975 County Rd., Palm Harbor, Florida, May 22 10am. It was conducted open-air on the 2-acre Church grounds under an oak tree. Dr Steele gave the Word according to a Bible passage chosen by the bride: Joshua 24:14,15. Dr Steele noted that this message of Joshua was given at Shechem (24:1). This Shechem was the first stop in Canaan after Abram had left the old county to enter the Promised Land. There God appeared to him. The couple and congregation were exhorted to review their faith, to return to the faith of their fathers. If you are a 2nd or 3rd generation Christian all the more are you required to examine your faith (II Cor 13:5). Then we are to fear the Lord with a holy fear, not just reverence or respect, because of such an Almighty and Holy God we worship. We are to serve Him in sincerity, honestly, and in truth, right doctrine. And Joshua's service of the Lord was one from his youth, since his days in Egypt. Were not Joshua and Caleb the only two who did well when they entered Canaan to survey the Land? Who followed the Lord wholly? The message Dr Steele preached was to start the married couple right as they embarked into life and to remind old-timers of the need of a steadfast faith. Despite an overcast sky the service went through with only a slight drizzle at the end. Mrs Carlson sang the Lord's Prayer and a Holy Land Song most appropriately.

Americans do not celebrate a wedding with a 10-course dinner like some of us in a big hotel. The custom is a buffet dinner in the Church compound, sparkling home-cooked food brought by friends and relatives. The same evening the next-of-kin of the married couple and friends involved with the ceremony and the pastor eat another buffet dinner at some restaurant "where you eat all you can!"

Visitors to Florida make sure they do not miss seeing Disney World and Epcot, the Sea World and Space Centre. These places are located on the East Coast, and Orlando in the Motel Capital. For greater economy we rented a minibus which ferried the eight of us to Fairfield Inn, which charged us $\frac{1}{2}$ price, US\$31 per night. The special discount accorded by the Motel was due to the kind offices of a former Yamaha student of Rev Khoo's. She's on the staff of the Motel. The first place we visited was the Sea World. We saw how dolphins, seals and whales all acted in precision at the behest of their trainers. I wondered if we who are in the Lord's Service are as sensitive to His will? Perhaps God is calling you, young man, young woman, as He called Samuel, though not with audible voice. He is speaking to you, "Come, leave your petty ambitions. Come and serve me." And he is signalling you through some failure in your life. There's a saying, "Failure is the Mother of Success." Had not the Lord struck me down with failure, yea, even the death of loved ones. I would not have left the world to give my life to Him.

The Sunday before we said good-bye to our American friends we drove 70 miles south of Orlando to worship at Grace BPC, Cape Canaveral, pastor: Dr James L Blizzard. Dr Blizzard is another good friend of mine at Faith Seminary,

Six years ago he started the Grace BPC, with seating for 100, as illustrated by this artist impression. We had informed him in advance of our coming, and I promised to "speak a word." When we got there, however, he "ordered" me to give the sermon. A pleasant surprise I had to comply with, I preached from II Cor 4:16-5:11. My theme: The Christian's world view: Short term policy for this life, long term policy for next life." To augment the message, I sang "When Daylight's Fading."

As our hearts were touched saying farewell to our friends, especially those at Clearwater, the Lord gave these lines to the tune of "Good Night Ladies":

The time came for us to say bye-bye to one another. First the Toh couple, Rev Khoo's sister and her husband. They came on a free SIA ticket by virtue of Mrs Toh's job. They stay at the Loyang SIA Estate, a stone's throw from Maranatha. We introduced them to our branch, N.B. Dn Pong Sen! We sent the Khoos to Orlando Airport, May 28. In turn, iwan Yew, Jeff and Jemima sent us off May 29, whereupon they drove back to Clearwater to return the minibus before they themselves flew back to Indiana. After completing tummer school, they'd enter Biblical Seminary at Hatfield, Pa towards the Th.M. and Mima the M.R.E.

Meanwhile, we've invited Dr & Mrs Steele to FEBC Jan 1992. This time Dr Steele will affer Daniel, Thurs. evening, and Proverbs. A textbook prescribed for the Daniel class of Dr Allan A MacRae's new publication by CLBC in which he has asked me to write the oreword. This book is good specially for students of prophecy. Dr MacRae takes the remillennial position to which we also subscribe. I had learnt David under him, as well as Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel.

Alas, the golden age of Faith Seminary, which produced stalwarts like Francis Shaeffer nd Jack Murray, is gone! Out of Faith has sprung, nevertheless, Covenant, Biblical, nd Western Reformed Seminaries. FEBC is an offshoot in the Faith tradition. By God's elp, we in the Far East shall endeavour to make her a centre of Biblical learning in he spirit of Paul's Mandate to Timothy (II Tim 2:2). Though we are launching the Masters rogramme, we desire to produce not dry as dust pedantics but humble yet effective serants of the Lord. And only those who are called and selected can come with us, not hose who will pass out as professionals and "paper tigers" who boast of their Greek, reek, Greek!

At Kennedy Airport, N.Y. when we showed our tickets at the El Al counter (Israeli irline), we had first to pass the security test. When the security officer heard the urpose of our entering Israel was to study Hebrew he was surprised. He wanted us to srify. And he wanted us to identify all our friends and relatives. When I gave our onnection in Bethlehem, Miss Davenport of the Independent Board for Foreign Missions, was suspicious. Then I gave the name of Mrs Ben Asher our Jewish friend and her phone imber. Immediately he rang her in Haifa. That settled it! He was all smiles and coursely. We were put on a straight flight to Tel Aviv instead of our original plan schedule of fly via London. Rom 8:28!

"Economy is the mother of prosperity." This is a virtue shared between Chinese and sws. We noticed how El Al economises on time and materials. They do not pass out earnones to passengers. They are all in the pockets. They do not lavish on meals. They are the exact amount so there is no leftover as in other airlines. The green part their airport is not grass, but vegetables. Beneath the orange trees they keep bees. In Church has practised strict economy all these years. One way is openness of facilities to all departments. When you begin to make one area exclusive unnecessarily, economy see, so prosperity. When so-called organisation turns to red tape, economy suffers.

Your hilarious giving and free loans have helped missions in no small measure. That's economy! And prosperity.

We are warmly received by the missionary and pastor of Baraka Bible-Presbyterian Church We are comfortably settled in the missionary quarters we had stayed 1969-70. To leave it empty for years is dead loss. To let it be used, which is productivity, is sound economy and prosperity.

Our schedule here is to spend 2 or 3 weeks to learn Hebrew from Mrs Ben Asher in Haifa. Because of the Lord's Day we must shuttle back to Baraka to give the pastor who has to earn his living as a nurse a break, I promised to preach for him 5 Sundays, June 2-30. My 1st sermon today is taken from Ps 133 "The Wonderfulness of Christian Fellowship." This is the more precious to the Christian traveller. No matter where you go, the Name of Christ, by which you are surnamed, is a tower of refuge and a house of rest to the travel-weary. For example, our next connection after Israel is Athens. There is no other way of returning home than via Athens, and we have to wait 2 days to catch a Thai plane to Bangkok-S'pore. Now, we know no one in Athens. Through the pastor here, however, we are given 2 contacts, one a Korean Travel Agency whose boss is a Christian. The other a Reformed Greek pastor at whose Church we will worship. We will not be adrift. We will be encouraged by Christian Fellowship. Obediently, T.T.

Throughout my three years of study at the NUS the Lord has been my portion of wisdom and strength. In His merciful kindness He has spared me the tribulation of a "Re." In other words the Lord has helped me pass each year without letting me sit for a single supplementary paper although I was an average student. In my first year of study I had to come to terms with my grief and it was a difficult year because my studies were mingled with tears and sorrow. After my second year at NUS, I decided to try for a baby and in my third year I had to grapple with nausea and studies. It was my most difficult year at NUS for when I conceived in October last year, my nausea was so bad that it didn't go off till Jan, a month before my Final Exam. "Lord, please help me to study the salient things, answer the required number of questions with the salient points and give me passable grades." I cried upon my knees. Praise the Lord for He heard my ardent prayers and when I opened my detailed result slip I was delighted that He has blessed me with better than passable grades. In fact I did better than my second year.

Yes, the Lord has been gracious to me throughout my three years of study at NUS. My salary which had been disrupted for three years because I was on no-pay study-leave, was now been reinstated. My first thought when I received my pay last Friday was "I must give the firstfruits of my increase to the Lord." Although I know that I'll soon be on no-pay maternity leave in July when my baby is due, I thought of the example of the widow who gave her "last mite" to the Lord. Like the widow, I believe that the Lord will provide for my needs when I go on no-pay leave again. Initially I thought of waiting until I get my end-of-the-year bonus, but I believe the Lord does not want our surplus.

Yes, the Lord has been particularly good to me during the past three years. He has plessed me with a B.A. degree and a baby on the way. What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits? To show my love and gratitude to Him, I enclose my first pay cheque for EBF II. May all glory be to the Lord Jesus Christ for all His benefits. Amen.

My dear Readers,

In keeping with the American tradition, the Baraka Church holds an evening service, 5 pm. As most of the parishioners live at Beit Sahour, 3 km from the Baraka Church on Hebron Rd., this evening service is crowded into the pastor's house, and there were 18 of us. I promised also to speak at the p.m. service. To enliven the service, I taught them "Father, I'm Coming Home." The sermon on the Prodigal Son Parable, however, had 3 pts. under the theme: "What is Greater than a Father's Love?" The 3rd point touches the Big Son, the Greater Prodigal! While working with the Father, neither was his heart with him. The test came in the Return of the younger son. His attitude towards his brother reflects his attitude to his Father. How true the saying, "For the Lord seeth not as man seeth: for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart" (I Sam 16:7). A loyal heart, where can you find it?

We took off Mon. June 3 morning. Rev George Awad helped carry our baggage to the Bus stop, 200 yds from the Church. Miss Davenport accompanied us to the Central Bus Station in Jerusalem where we transferred onto the Haifa Express. The cost per ticket is 15 Shekels = S\$11. The time, exactly 2 hours. This is much faster than in earlier years when we had to take the coastal road via Tel Aviv. Now there is developed a shorter route through the low-lying Plain of Sharon. Like US the roads are straight and smooth with double lanes. The Bus we travelled in is well-cushioned and airconditioned.

As it was 12.30 pm when we got down at Haifa Station, we ate lunch at the Cafeteria. We ordered one plate of yellow rice with 2 slabs of fish and another with leg of chicken, one soup, one coffee. This cost 19 Shekels = S\$13. Very filling! In this hubbub of Jewish life, we saw Jews of all shades of Young girls are also drafted into military service. Many old couples, weighed down with age and the burden of WWII apparently, also moved in the stream, transferring into local buses. As for us the quickest and safest way was by taxi. This cost 17+ Shekels to the address above.

When we rang the doorbell Mrs Ben Asher (Project) was on the dot to welcome us. In 1964 when the Israeli Govt. sent her husband to help Singapore solve her traffic problems, she naturally accompanied him. They served 6 years. Mr Ben Asher, a Civil Engineer, was the first to build overhead bridges. He also built the Raffles Place underground carpark. Mrs Ben Asher built a greater bridge by teaching Hebrew at FEBC. (She was introduced by my sister.) She taught me and Rev Grauley a special Hebrew Class in her home. The textbook she used was "Elef Million" = "1,000 word book". She taught us half that book. Meanwhile I've gone on further and my purpose of coming here is to finish the book with her. Why Modern Hebrew? Why should FEBC teach Modern Hebrew, when the Bible is in ancient Hebrew? The astounding discovery about Modern Hebrew is it stands out quite different from Modern Greek in relation to their ancient language. While a student of Modern Greek cannot be at home reading Bible Greek, a student of Modern Hebrew merely "changes gear" into Biblical Hebrew. The fact is that the Hebrew language died in the course of the Jewish diaspora to the four corners of the earth. It was not until 100 years ago that the national language was resurrected. This came about by the efforts of Eliezer Ben Yehudi (1857-1922). And it was through the Bible primarily that Modern Hebrew was born and now has become a powerful language. (Jews are second only to USA in the publishing of books.) By teaching Modern Hebrew, our Hebrew students' hard cracking of ancient Hebrew is relieved! Moreover when ancient Hebrew is pronounced, the modern way, it also comes alive to the ear. Abraham, were he living today, can understand his descendants except for such terms of Coca Cola and Cornflakes. Such modern names are easily transliterated in Hebrew letters.

Mrs Ben Asher has written how she appreciates the BP Weekly and has shared it with her friends. She mentions the things common between our teaching and O.T. teaching, such as our emphasis on the Tithe. She has learned to pray as a result of reading the To further enlighten her I sang the Prodigal Son Song, "When Daylights Fading" and this new composition:

Finding a roof for shelter and an inexpensive meal when on travel is a basic, day-to-day problem to settle. Hence this recommendation. Who knows? When in Israel you can always find a warm welcome in Bethlehem.

Bethlehem, June 9, '91 Our Haifa friend confirmed how she was woken up in the dead of night to answer Qs about our identity before we could leave N.Y. Out of this situation I was moved to write these lines in an important theme, after "Cheep, cheep, cheep."

Learning any subject from a lively teacher, mouth to mouth, face to face, is far more effective than by correspondence or video. For, if any part or particle of the lesson is not clear to you, by asking your teacher on the spot you can get the answer immediately. Hence our Lord taught His disciples, face to face. He lived,

He ate, He slept with His pupils 3½ years. Paul taught his pupils in the same way. He gave the same method of teaching to his successor Timothy (II Tim 2:2). It has been a delightful week spent with Mrs Ben Asher. All the Qs I had in my text book I got an immediate solution by direct contact. No tedium of looking up a dictionary, etc.

Before leaving our hostess we prepared these parting words which might bless some fellow-readers:

- 1. When you are alone, and there is no one to talk to, When fears fill your eyes, and life seems an empty dream. Remember your God, your loving Father! He who feeds the birds, will He not your soul redeem?
- 2. Jesus says to you: I am the Way, the Truth, the Life: No man can go to the Father but by Me. The Son of God has come to save us from sin. If you look to Him, He will surely set you free.
- 3. Yes Lord, I can hear your gentle voice to me calling. I now believe You are the coming Messiah. Help me to trust in you each step of the way. Lead me gently on till I see You face to face.

Since the Sea of Galilee is only an hour's drive from Haifa, we returned to our Bethlehem base by way of Tiberias. As before we stayed at the Church of Scotland Hospice. What massive stone mansions, is this erstwhile flourishing Mission Hospital. Through the devotion of Dr David Torrance this huge complex was built. He laboured here 1893-1923, was succeeded by his son till 1948. As times have changed the hospital is now turned into a hospice (like Baraka Hospital south of Bethlehem also now used as a Conference Centre).

From Tiberias we took bus along a road that avoids the troublous Samaria district. We came by way of Jericho to the Central Station in Jerusalem. From Jerusalem we caught a No. 160 Hebron Bus, which dropped us at the Bethlehem Check Point, a little walk from Baraka Church.

One regret during this Sabbatical abroad is our missing Dr John Whitcomb's lectures at the Vacation Bible College. To make up, and to encourage him I'm faxing this new song on Christ's Second Coming which the Lord gave in Galilee, sung to the tune of "Santa Lucia." As Dr Whitcomb is a stalwart on Premillennialism which BPC also teaches, but is now being subtly undermined, may I dedicate it to him. Please forward this song to Dr Tow my brother, and if he sees fit, may it be sung through some choir at the end of the VBC to the sweet memory of Dr Whitcomb's Far Eastern Ministry.

Baraka BPC, Bethlehem

Stones and Living Stones

June 15, '91

Last week I mentioned the name of Dr Torrance who built a great hospital on the shores of Galilee and how it was used by the Lord for over half a century. As times have changed the hospital is turned into a hospice. The same may be said of Dr Thomas Lambie, world famous missionary of the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions. A greater than Dr Torrance, he was used by God to found seven hospitals in Africa and the M -East. He was personal physician to Emperor Haile Selasse of Ethiopia. After WWII he built his seventh hospital in the Valley of Berachah (II Chron 20:26), a T.B. hospital of 100 beds that served the Kingdom of Jordan.

When the ICCC visited Dr Lambie in 1950 and I had the windfall of a tumpang with Rev K C Quek to visit the Holy Land, we were personally led by the Doctor to go round the near-finished Hospital up to the roof top. The Berachah Valley gave name to the Hospital now known as BARAKA (Conference Centre). A more lasting stone edifice is the Church and Mission Qrs Dr Lambie built at Bethlehem. Bethlehem is 4 miles from "sea".

But the greatest stones of all are the living stones of an Arab Church that has risen over these mansions, and the chief among them is Rev George Awad elected minister by the national congregation, ordained by Dr Tow and Dr Tan when they toured the Holy Land 1985 with 40 others from Singapore. A bond of Christian love and fellowship was being forged by the Unseen Hand, which was further strengthened by Life Church-FEBC 1987 Pilgri-Out of our visit was that hilarious response to help the young Arab Church buy a piece of land to build a Church of their own at Beit Sahour, overlooking Boaz' Barley Field. Not only the plot of land of 1,100 sq m but also a wall surrounding it, as reported by Leong Kit Hoong of Tabernacle BPC. Now our eyes have seen all these and how we praise the Lord that S'pore has a part in Missions back to the Land of our Saviour's Birth, to the very field the Angels sang the first Christmas Night!

But the story of the chief living stone of the Arab congregation is even more enlight-When I asked George Awad how he a nurse by profession is now also overseeing pastor, he told me of his conversion under one Rev Hamilton (I know him). As a boy he would come to the Gospel Meetings and S.S. of the Baraka Church. There he believed and jot out of a ritualistic Christianity. He went to Abu Dhabi to earn a living and was instrumental in starting a Protestant Church there. His missionary zeal has now flowered into this leadership of a Baraka Church at Beit Sahour. BS is 3 km from the Bethlehem Thurch where we were lodged.

The process of leading him into Christ's Kingdom is repeated at the Sat YF meeting, ill run by young Arab leaders. The YF has an attendance of 30-50. A young graduate from Bob Jones whom we met at a BPC in US 1988 is now taking the lead. Rev Awad himself vas present at one of the meetings we attended. Living stones beget living stones. is American missionaries seem to fade, we have a duty to help nurture this national Leadership.

Before leaving S'pore Chan Ngiap Koon twice said to me "Let's visit Egypt in our next Holy Land Tour." As if to confirm this our travel experts, "The Guiding Star," Gabriel

Khano and son Mark whom we consult suggest the same! Then comes a letter from Daniel Indrawan and wife to book a place in advance! To have a preview of the southern route, we took a two-day trip to Eilat, Israel's southern port on the Red Sea, an important halt in Israel's onward march to the Promised Land skirting Edom. There's a side trip to Sinai, to Mt Moses where the X Commandments were given, but we did not venture. Nevertheless, this trip to Eilat gives us light to negotiate for a Tour to our advantage. We're now in the process of formulating a 12-day Holy Land tour that will incorporate the whole school vacation Mar 14-22. From previous experience, 12 days is an ideal schedule. To


beyond this would be counter-productive. Most of the party will be dead tired, nodding umen to a guide who lectures only to the wind.

PROGRESS REPORT - THE LIFE CHURCH EVANGELISTIC BAND

The Life Church Evangelistic Band Committee hereby presents a brief report of its work beginning from the year of inception September 1987 to February 1991. Truly, the formation of the E-Band initiated by our beloved pastor, Rev Timothy Tow and formalised by Rev Colin Wong had experienced much grace and working power of the Holy Spirit.

Every Lord's Day, except the second week of the month where the E-Band spent its time n prayer, the Gospellers were shadowed by the Almighty. The experience of being rejected, idiculed, threatened, and shouted at, were part and parcel of the Gospel ministry. Despite all these, the E-Band counted it a great joy to suffer shame for His name.

The initial objective set was to cover Toa Payoh estate. The time given was five The E-Band is glad to report that as of today, about 95% of the Estate had been systematically covered, with the remaining 5% uncovered. It was due to the on-going demolition. There are close to 300 blocks in Toa Payoh. Majority of these are 3-room flats, followed by 2-room flats and 4-room flats. The E-Band also managed to evangelise (im Keat Area.

The average number of Gospellers who came faithfully and stedfastly was 20. vas a very small number compared to the membership of the Church. Further, the response from the Fellowship Groups had not been very encouraging. However, despite the poor ittendance, the Lord's work must go on.

The Church's van was often used to fetch Gospellers to the field. The rest of them would take a train.

Before the E-Band went out for evangelism, the Gospellers met for a time of prayer and exhortation at 12.45 pm, Beulah House. Evangelism began at 2 pm and finished by

A Bible Correspondence Course was offered to those who were interested in the Christian faith. New converts were also introduced to this course. A total of 183 persons had enrolled. Presently, there are 25 still doing it. The average duration to complete the course is 3 to 6 months, depending on the age groups, and how soon they send in the reply. Gospel tracts were obtained from the Reformed Tract Distributor and Bible Society. They were in English, Chinese and Tamil.

Besides evangelising Toa Payoh, the E-Band also visited Old Folks Home and friends and relatives who were hospitalised.

The estimated contacts who attended Life Church were as follows: English Service-20, Chinese Service-15, and Sunday School-10.

The E-Band Committee would like the Church to remember this ministry in prayer. Satan ates it and will do anything to hinder it.

May God raise up many more labourers to do the work of evangelism (Matt 9:37,38).

Bethlehem, Israel

The intifada has resulted in the containment of Arabs within their own villages and townships. Except for Arabs who have working passes to Jerusalem, others who wish to travel to Israel territory must apply for "passport." This means the distance that an Arab can travel is greatly reduced. This applies to those residing in Bethlehem and Beit Sahour, 3 km from Bethlehem Church. As the young people have nowhere to go, a good group would come to play mini-basketball and mini-football on Baraka Church grounds. Now that the Arab Church of Baraka has bought land at Beit Sahour and plan to build and develop it also into a Youth Centre, it will attract the young people encircled in Beit Sahour to come together. This will be a wonderful opportunity to win young Arabs to Christ. The ground is not as hard as you would imagine. Most of those that would come, 40-50 of them, are from a ritualistic Christian background. And we have glorious conversion by the power of the Gospel (Rom 1:16). Your giving to Baraka at Beit Sahour has come "for such a time as this" (Esther 4:14)!

Is This Our Land, Our Promised Land?

Like the spies who were commissioned to go through Canaan 40 days, the days spent here have taught us many lessons. From these lessons we're all the more burdened for our Beulah Land across Gilstead Rd. Hence these verses, sung to the tune of Annie Laurie. These I present to our Church Choir to rehearse, to sing, if possible, the Lord's Day of July 21.

- . Caleb says, the Land of Promise God gave to our Fathers Is a land of milk and honey, Brooks, streams, springing waters. If God delight in us, He'll bring us by His Hand, To this Land flowing milk and honey, To this our land, our Beulah Land. . There's a Promised Land to Christians, To them who hope in their Lord. Not to those who serve half-hearted, Who ne'er cast in their lot. Will God delight in them, And bring them by His Hand? To this land flowing milk and honey, To this their land, their Beulah Land?
- 3. There's more good land to be conquered, But Israel call it a day. Lifers we have long crossed Jordan, Shall now we end the fray? 'Tis a question to answer: Our battle's far from won! O this land flowing milk and honey! Is this our land, our Beulah Land?

As your pastor I am heavily burdened for our Beulah House as well as the newly added ission outreaches. The consolation however, is we have no bank interest on the \$2.2 illion debt to pay. For this reason we should willingly support every outreach in the pirit of St Paul: "I am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the ise, and to the unwise. So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to ou that are at Rome also" (Rom 1:14,15). What is missions? It is the Greatest Cause a the world - to extend God's Kingdom to Earth's end till Jesus comes.

Before the Return of the Messiah...

here must be the completion of the ingathering of the Jews back to their Homeland. here are at least 25 prophecies on this ingathering which is called ALIYAH by the Jews nemselves. Here is one prophecy from Zechariah: "Thus saith the Lord of hosts; There hall yet old men and old women dwell in the streets of Jerusalem...and the streets of ne city shall be full of boys and girls playing in the streets thereof...Behold, I will we my people from the east country, and from the west country; And I will bring them, nd they shall dwell in the midst of Jerusalem; and they shall be my people, and I will their God, in truth and in righteousness" (Zech 8:4-8).

Not only our 1992 March and June tours are in the offing! If there is a real need, there is no reason why a third one in September might not be considered. "I want to walk where Jesus walked."


Athens, July 9, '91

We retrieved our steps to Haifa again to be tutored by Mrs Ben Asher. For parting we ate at a Chinese Restaurant called "Sea Waves" sitting right over Haifa Harbour. Interestingly the Chinese Restaurant is operated by a Jewish towkay. The cook, waiters and waitresses are recruited from Hong Kong.

He knows this Mr Ahn to be a Christian tourist expert. So we faxed him and in no time came the welcome reply. Mr Ahn would receive us at the airport. "As cold waters to a thirsty soul, so is good news from a far country" (Prov 25:25).

At Athens Airport, Mr Ahn received us very promptly and drove us to a good hotel in the heart of the city. As it was Sunday 8.00 am when we arrived we sought him to take us to worship at the Greek Evangelical Church we had been introduced to by George Awad. "No problem" he said. "This Church is only 10 min. walk from your hotel. You have plenty of time before 11.00 am worship time. Besides, I am a deacon of the Korean United Church of Athens borrowing the premises of the Greek Church at 50 Amalias, a main street of the city."



Is Circumcision Devoid of Faith?

Our church baptises infants because we not only follow the Apostle in its being part of household baptism (read Acts 16:15, Lydia; v.33 Philippian jailor; I Coi 1:16 Stephenas) but also in its close analogy to circumcision. Colossians 2:11,12 plainly equates baptism with circumcision, calling it "the circumcision of Christ made without hands." So as male children are circumcised in the O.T. we baptise infants in the N.T. Now I often hear this argument, "Show me a command in the N.T. on baptising infants, and I will submit to it." This seems a good argument, but if anything we practise in the church must be so directed, then let Calvin in his Institutes answer, "Women were not present at the Lord's Supper to receive Christ's commandment, but they are admitted to the Lord's Table all the same." How's that?

Coming back to our main topic on circumcision, being taught recently by a visiting professor that it does not involve faith but baptism does, we have the Apostle Paul to arbitrate. (Now one chief characteristic of a Jew outwardly is his circumcision. In this respect no male Jew could escape Hitler's Gestapo.) St Paul says rather, "For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly, neither is that circumcision, which is outward in the flesh: But he is a Jew, which is one inwardly, is that of the heart = faith = in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise is not of men, but of God" (Rom 2:28.29).

In other words, the Jews that were circumcised in the O.T. were not to go through the rite as a matter of tradition, but as an affirmation of their faith in God, separated from the pagan world. Paul says it again in Romans 4:11 of Abraham's circumcision, that "he received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of faith which he had yet being uncircumcised..." That is to say, before a Jew receives the sign of circumcision on his outward flesh, he must first be circumcised in his heart, ie. he must have faith in God his Saviour first before the knife is applied. Similarly, we see that a candidate for baptism must first show evidence of faith before water is applied.

Now, the argument that circumcision is devoid of faith is given to challenge infant baptism. Since we have proven that the sacrament of circumcision is bound up in faith, infant baptism, the N.T. counterpart of O.T.

infant circumcision, holds.

Here's another argument: being an infant the babe cannot exercise faith as in an adult. So we should not practise infant baptism.

Our answer is, the covenant made by God to the father covers the son, inasmuch as the goodness of the father, yea, even the mother extends to the child. A mother will give the best to her child, breast milk, vitamins, orange juice, etc. She does not require the child to express its faith in mother's milk etc. Why should an expression of faith be required from an infant when baptism, the best of all gifts, is given? The covenant made by God to the father covers the son.

PASTORAL CHAT

My dear Readers,

Wang Ming Tao, 1900-1991

Members of Life Church are conversant with the name of John Sung and his Revival Meetings (1935) through



several books published by CLBC
-"John Sung My Teacher," "Asian
Awakening" etc. The name of
Wang Ming Tao is beginning to be
known through my later book
"Wang Ming Tao and
Charismatism" and through "A
Stone Made Smooth," a translation of Wang Ming Tao's autobiography in Chinese, "These Fifty
Years" by Arthur Reynolds.

If John Sung was great, Wang Ming Tao was no less. The two servants of God, both living in Peking, were friends. When John Sung died in 1944, Wang conducted his funeral service.

While John Sung had only a brief 15 years' ministry, dying at age 43, Wang outlived him by almost half a century. Wang lived long to witness to our Lord against the Japanese in their occupation of Peking during WWII. The Japanese could not bend him. The Lord's Name was upheld.

When Mao took over China in 1949, persecution of Christians began with kangaroo courts and anti-Christian rallies. All Christian Churches must join what is called the "Three-Self Patriotic Movement." Wang Ming Tao, seeing that to be a puppet Church Council, refused to join. He was imprisoned for life and his wife 15 years. Without compromise he served for 23 years, when suddenly in Jan 1980 he was released. He found a new place of abode in Shanghai from where his "Iron Witness" continues to shine like a lighthouse to the Chinese Church, yea, even all the way to Southeast Asia. His stature is so great that Billy Graham in his "crusade" to China 1988 could not feel complete without calling on him in his hideout flat. But Wang had no truck with Billy, because he was the guest of the Three-Self Patriotic Movement, the puppet show of the Chinese Communists.

Wang Ming Tao not only has a bright witness against the Ecumenical Movement, the TSPM, the modernists and liberals but also against Charismatism. Soon after his conversion as a young man, he got entangled with Pentecostalism which "worked" on him to speak in tongues. After many days of trying he babbled off some strange syllables for which he was declared "graduated." But he was not convinced. After a year or two of deep searching of the Scriptures, he repudiated tongues and the bogus faith healings accompanying it. From that time on to the days before his death, he maintained this stand. This is confirmed by two FEBC students who visited him in his Shanghai flat in Dec 1988. The Wangs declared they stood by what they repudiated in the 1930's.

If you wish to know more about this man of God, visit the CLBC for his books. Arthur Reynolds his translator, whom I met at Spurgeon's Tabernacle, London, 1986, says of him, "Wang Ming Tao to me is not only a remarkable leader. He is one of the outstanding preachers of the century, and in saying that I am thinking of three vital elements in preaching - man, message and method (presentation). This

is not to suggest that he has no shortcomings. In fact he frankly speaks of them in his testimony. Nevertheless, he is a warrior, with singleness of purpose, takes little account of possible wounds; he is demonstrably prepared and willing to lay down his life for his Master." Amen.

"For the administration of this service...

"not only supplieth the want of the saints, but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God" (II Cor 9:12). I'm sure the hearts of many Readers are stirred as they read the report of last week's offerings exceeding \$50,000, a good part of which was designated for our missions to ASEAN countries, plus Burma, the Holy Land and FEBC (with students from 13 nations).

This offering declared for Missions was accentuated by our making National Day an International Missions Day. A new tradition has been inaugurated. These offerings so hilariously given were beyond anybody's expectation, so all the more must glory and thanksgiving be ascribed to the Father Almighty and to our Lord Jesus Christ.

The offering declared for missions truly "supplieth the want of saints." It boosted the week after week of meagre offerings for the missionaries and the mission projects. While Burma is a major field with 38 students at the Bible College, it has been practically forgotten. No offering was designated for Burma.

To keep up the logistics of our various missionary projects, we should have your support of \$2,000 per week. The MsF should be happy to give from its own ranks.

Trading with every talent to profit

Every available talent must be traded to bring profit to the Lord. So, every inch of our two properties is used to accommodate the needs of God's people.

One little used former ward of the Eye Clinic is now being renovated to house an FEBC student who has a sizeable family. As the room adjoining this "ward" is occupied by the Women's Fellowship, it would be most profitable if they could spare it. Praise the Lord and thank the WF, this room is offered back to the Lord, for which we are deeply thankful. Here's another example of brotherly and sisterly love that works among members of the ever-growing Church.

Both FEBC and Beulah House are fully occupied by a student body that has reached 65, our highest enrolment. Furthermore, we are receiving applications from Australia and USA!

Though occupied to the last room, it is our policy to take in strangers, Christian friends and missionaries passing through our metropolis, by every possible stretching of our "rubber" house. (Remember, Singapore is a land of rubber!) Hospitality is our watchword.

Remember to pray for our national leaders and contribute to the advancement of missions. "I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; For kings, and for all that are in authority: that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth" (I Tim 2:1-4).

'My husband's face beamed with joy then I told him the good news that I'd be paid for my naternity leave.

I have found that the more I return unto the Lord the iore blessings He has showered upon me. I intend to give ie Lord 10% of my gross salary because the Lord has been iving me "gross" blessings. Indeed the Lord has proven that e is true to His promises. He has "opened the windows of eaven" and "poured out a blessing" that my heart has "not nough room to receive it" (Malachi 3:10).



On behalf of the Chinese Service, Elder Sng is gone to Tanjung Pinang to purchase a motor cycle for mission use at Tanjung Uban.



My dear Readers,

The Growth of Life Church Missions



From the very beginning our church has been involved in Missions. So the Lord has blessed us with 41 branches in 41 years! The latest ones are Maranatha 39th, Tanjung Uban 40th, and Chiangmai, Thailand 41st.

Of foreign missions that have become self-supporting and self-governing, the earliest is Kelapa Sawit in Johore; the greatest is Djunaidi's 2.5 acres complex of schools, Bible night school, orphanage, church, at Siantan, Pontianak, West Kalimantan. Djunaidi has extended upstream to build one Church at Kumpai and another at Biong on their own. He also oversees the Sharon Rose church and kindergarten at Kuching across the Sarawak border. In KL, Malaysia, Rev Liew Hon Seng whom we helped from 1983 will become self-supporting 1992.

For Burma we have Rev Robert Thawm Luai, founderprincipal of the Far East Fundamental School of Theology at Yangon, Myanmar, also moderator of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church.

For Medan, North Sumatra, we have the three Siregar brothers and father, Haposan taking the lead. (We've bought them valuable land for building a Bible School and Church complex).

In the Holy Land, there is Rev George Awad whom two of our B-P ministers had ordained in 1985. When it was reported in 1988 that the Arab Church was making an effort to buy a piece of land at Beit Sahour, 3 km from the Bethlehem Church, Lifers who had visited the Holy Land rallied to make that a success. We helped them also to build a wall around the property. To further assist them put up a house of worship will raise a much-needed Protestant Witness in a town dominated by the RC and Greek Orthodox churches. Beit Sahour abuts the Shepherd's Field.

Two couples of our Church have been commissioned. One to Northern Thailand and the other to Manila. It is

hoped a strong church will be established in Thailand and many Filipino pastors trained through these two missionary couples. As expatriates their expenses are necessarily high.

The 8-month sapling of a mission station planted by our Chinese Service at Tanjung Uban with the cooperation of the Tanjung Pinang Church is an example of economy in missions expenditure. Being totally managed by national hands, we were able to procure a bungalow house standing exclusively on a beautiful plot of ground on a 3-year lease for a song. It costs only S\$2,500! As there was a surplus of Church pews in Tg Pinang, Evangelist Joseph Liew gladly gave them to us. He had them transported to the new station at Uban as seen in this week's photo. (Tanjung Pinang is 90) km south of Tg Uban on Bintan Island). The latest is that Elder Sng has gone to Tg Pinang to buy a new motor cycle for our worker at Tg Uban that he might be enabled to ferry members in who live beyond the environs of the town. Besides Uban, our Chinese Church also contributes to Air Bemban, a branch of Kelapa Sawit Church.

Whether near or far (our farthest field is the Holy Land and nearest Batam and Bintan, Indonesia), the work of the Lord must go on till He comes.

A missions project we almost forgot to mention is Far Eastern Bible College. Here we have 65 students from 12 nations, training daily for the harvest fields. It is heartening to note that Rev Mark Kim of Korea, a recent graduate of FEBC who has a degree in Agriculture, is heading the Bible College of East Africa, Nairobi, Kenya. Following in his train is Miss Jenny Ong, B.Th. of Pilgrim Presbyterian Church, S'pore. She leaves September to USA for orientation by the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions before being sent to the field. (The Bible College of East Africa is a long-established work of the Independent Board. Rev Richard Kivai, another FEBCer is teaching there). Indeed, FEBC is the centre of a Bible College movement. Other fields where FEBC graduates are taking a lead in theological education are Burma, Medan and Manila.

Dear Reader, when the Lord gave the marching orders to the early church, He was speaking also to the church today. As a member of Life Church, what have you done for the extension of the Gospel to the ends of the earth? Are you not moved by the motto "Do something good for Jesus everyday"? If you cannot go, you can give - to keep Life Church Missions going and growing. Amen. T.T.

My dear Readers,

"Earnestly contend for the faith" (Jude 3)

It was Life Church, the Mother of all B-P Churches, that introduced the International Council of Christian Churches to Singapore and Malaysia. Though we are not officially in the ICCC as a result of the dissolution of the B-P Synod, we have not diminished in spirit to "earnestly contend for the faith." And there are many other Bible-believing churches and Christians who take a similar stand. "I have reserved to myself seven thousand men who have not bowed their knees to Baal" (Rom 11:4).

One of the good old fundamentalist testimonies is TAP (Teachers Assistance Programme) at Harrisburg, Pa. USA under the helm of Rev and Mrs Jim Turner. The Turners mail to pastors in the Far East every kind of good Christian literature, and KJV Bibles where there is a need. The Turners have periodically mailed us "News & Views, Notes & Quotes, To Warn & Inform" published by the Calvary Contender which we are reproducing on the back page. These reports serve a crucial purpose. They beam the red light signal on Christian organisations and leaders in the West who at one time were reputable in faith and doctrine but are carried away by the flood of apostacy and unbelief. So read them carefully. Be informed. The Chinese military proverb says, "To know your enemy and to know yourself is crucial to achieving victory in every battle." So, let us contend not only earnestly, but intelligently, for the faith once delivered unto the saints.

"Many sons starve a father"

This is a Chinese proverb that says to this effect: "The more sons a father has, the less does he receive filial support." Is it so?

Seeing the plight of the Church to be insofar as paying the Beulah Debt is concerned (we're still owing over \$2 million), our Chinese congregation has voted to cancel \$5,000 loaned to the Mother Church by the Chinese Sunday School, and to give a further \$15,000 towards EBF II.

There is an individual responsibility to the Church's financial burden, and there is a corporate responsibility as well. May our many departments and fellowships consider not only their own interests, but also the Church's Beulah Debt. If we don't double up, this situation will drag on till 1995! Who will be the next loving son to declare your filial piety? (We are not mindful of the individuals who have given most sacrificially all these days.)

"Prophescope" on Soviet Russia and Israel

From Bible prophecy on Cyrus, the King of Persia who should fulfil God's rebuilding plan of Jerusalem (Isa 44:28), we interpret Gorbachev's return to power to be the Lord's sovereign purpose in upholding him, "for Jacob my servant's sake, and Israel mine elect ... though thou hast not known Me" (Isa 45:4). For it is under Gorbachev's perestroika that hundreds of thousands of Soviet Jews have found freedom to return to their homeland. And a million more are still queueing up. Now that Gorbachev is at the helm again, we shall see a greater influx of olim (returnees), like homing pigeons. This going back to Israel is variously foretold in Isaiah and other prophets. "And I will make all my mountains a way, and my highways shall be exalted. Behold, these shall come from far: and, lo, these from the north and from the west; and those from the land of Sinim" (Isa 49:11,12).

Meanwhile there is much talk of a peace conference between Israel and Arabs, and the return of occupied land is the bone of contention. Our prophescope sees no way out! We are heading for Armageddon.



NEW EVANGELICAL SCHOLARS EXPLAIN AWAY HELL Cults such as Seventh-day Adventists, Jehovah's Witnesses, and Armstrongites teach a doctrine of annihilationism concerning Hell. They, along with some liberal and "evangelical" seminary profs, try to explain away the "eternal punishment" aspect of Hell. Today we see an alarming drift by conservatives away from the orthodox teaching in an extensive article in the 3/25 U.S.News. Kenneth Kantzer of Trinity Evangelical Div.School says: "But when Jesus spoke of flames...these are most likely figurative warnings." Clark Pinnock asks: "How can Christians possibly project a deity of such cruelty and vindictiveness" as to inflict "everlasting torture upon his creatures, however sinful they may have been?" He went on to say in a recent Criswell Theol. Review that a God who would do such a thing is "more nearly like Satan, than like God." John Stott and others such as F.F. Bruce & Philip Hughes contend that rather than suffering endlessly, those who ultimately rejec God will be put out of existence in the "consuming fire" of hell. But what these scholars think about Hell is not what matters most. The Bible is clear that Christ-rejecting sinners will suffer eternally in a place called Hell.

PRAIRIE BIBLE INSTITUTE CHANGES WITH TIMES Prairie Bible Institute of Alberta, Canada was founded in 1922 and has trained and sent over 2,100 missionaries. In response to a drop in enrollment from around 800 in the 1980s to the current level of 454, many "relevant changes" are being made in areas of administration, salary structure, seeking AABC accreditation, etc. (3/11 Chr.News). A woman, Charlotte Bates, is vice-pres.of theological education and administers the master of divinity graduate program. This may "smack of liberalism", but she says PBI historically "has had women in significant positions." And: "If we are preparing women for ministry, it is important for them to see women role models." A book by Dr. L.E. Haxwell, PBI co-founder and head for over 50 years, was "a gung-ho endorsement of women preachers"(4/1/88 Bib.Ev.). PBI has had new-evangelical mission board speakers, and SBC's Stephen Olford, etc.

We note with sorrow the tragedy that overtook the M.V. Doulos, Aug 10 at Zamboanga, Southern Philippines. Two ladies lost their lives and 32 others were injured by a grenade attack by opponents of the Gospel. Let's pray for the injured and bereaved.

ROMAN CATHOLICISM IS A CULT -- Dave Hunt in his "To deny that Roman 6/91 CIB Bulletin says: Catholicism is a cult is to repudiate the Reformation and mock the more than 1 million martyrs who died at Rome's hands...." He says: "The 'Christ' of Roman Catholicism is just as false as its 'Mary' -- as much 'another Jesus' as that of Mormonism or any other cult." Romanism rejects salvation by faith and preaches a false gospel of works that cannot save. Yet charismatic and new-evangelical cult experts omit RC from their list of cults and often explicitly approve it! J.Oswald Sanders' 1973 book Cults and Isms placed Catholicism at the head of the list of "heresies", but the RC chapter was dropped in his 1981 edition(9/1/89 CC). Campus Crusader Josh McDowell's Understanding the Cults lists | 11 characteristics of cults and RC has all of them, yet is not listed as a cult. J.I. Packer, Kenneth Kantzer, and MBI's C. Donald Cole have praised, or said they accept RC's as "brothers in Christ," etc. Billy Graham, Jerry Falwell and charismatics, praise the Catholic Pope, who prays with Buddhists and Hindus. Graham uses RCs as counsellors in his Crusades, and sends converts to their churches. Hunt begs readers to "write to Bill Bright, Billy Graham, Chuck Colson, CRI, YWAM, Moody and Nelson publishers, and the many others who cooperate with Roman Catholicism and deny that it is a cult."

BURGEONING PENTECOSTALISM--Pentecostal and charismatic churches gain 19 million members per year, and worldwide now claim 382 million members, or one of every five Christians (5/27 Chr. Today). The movement includes over 11,000 Pentecostal and 3,000 independent charismatic denominations. Two of every three Pentecostals live in the Third World. Mainstream evangellcalism in Britain has embraced the charismatic movement in a greater way than in the U.S. The recent Spring Harvest conference of about 80,-000 evangelicals was co-sponsored by British Youth for Christ, and featured charismatic-style worship--raised hands, dancing, hand-clapping, prophecies, words of knowledge, and speaking in tongues (6/91 Charisma). The modern charismatic movement unites evangelicals and Roman Catholics, and is an ecumenical catalyst the coming one-world church of Antichrist.

TRINITY CONFERENCE HAS CATHOLICS & J.I. PACKER Christianity Today senior editor & Regent College prof J.I.Packer is the keynote speaker at a May 29-June 1 conference at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. Other speakers include Catholic charismatics Michael Scanlan and Ann The theme is "Repentance, Holiness, and Power."(BJU's What In The World!). Popular author Packer is an ecumenical evangelical who often speaks with Catholics, and allows for women's ordination. He says the charismatic movement "must be adjudged a work of God."(7/15/89 CC). He mays "Catholics are among the most loyal and (spiritually) virile brothers evangelicals can find these days." (5/17/85 CT).

our Government, but may I remind you of a higher citizenship. As Christians we belong to the "Kingdom of God Party." Man's Kingdom may come and go, but God's Kingdom goes on forever. "Of the increase of His Government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon His Kingdom, to order it, and establish it with judgment and with

justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this?" (Isa 9:7).

The extent of God's Kingdom on earth is global, wherever the Gospel goes. Invisibly it rules in the hearts of men. "The kingdom of God cometh not with observation: Neither shall they say, Lo here! or, lo there! for, behold, the kingdom of God is within you" (Lk 17:20, 21). Visibly, it is the people who make up the Church, with buildings of worship, of education where the Bible is taught, of healing (mission hospitals) in the Name of Jesus Christ, etc, etc.

Had I not become a Christian, I would have joined some political party, with all the glitters of power and fame. Having heard the call of God, I have devoted the last 45 years to His Kingdom, by love constrained. Serving in God's Kingdom is totally different from serving in Man's Kingdom. Our Party symbol is not Hammer and Sickle or a lightning flash, or simply a hammer. Ours is the Cross of Jesus Christ planted on top of the world. The Way of the Cross is spelt out in these terms, "If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it, and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it." A life of self-denial, of no worldly possessions, power or position, but of single-hearted service through His Church to the loneliest of places He might send on the face of the globe. This runs counter to the worldly spirit. Those who are not totally dead to self and the world will leave when the cross becomes a heavy burden. Those who go the whole way with Christ will find the yoke easy and the burden light.

Every Church member is a member of the Kingdom of God Party. Every Lifer is loyal not only to his Saviour, but also to the Church, that has, like a mother, says Calvin, nurtured him. Every department, every fellowship, is zealous in the service of God sectionally, but it also supports the mother church which is governed by the Session elected by the people.

In answer to our appeal last week to every department and fellowship of Life Church after the example of the Chinese Service, the forwardness of the YAF and the Evangelistic Band is heartening. A brother converted a \$2000 loan into a thanksoffering.

While we minister to members of the Church, our thrust into all the world through evangelism and missions is crucial to the extending of God's Kingdom. In this regard we are surely encouraged by the zeal of an outgoing Evangelistic Band, a Missionary Fellowship and not the least the visitations of the Men's Fellowship.

Now, our Church had caught the vision of worldwide missions since her founding 41 years ago. So God has honoured us with 41 branches, yea, even to the ends of the earth. We welcome the formation of the MsF as your

purpose is to help the Mother Church in her heavy task of sending the Gospel out far and wide. As you become self-supporting and more prosperous, you will be of greater help to our mission fields, our outposts for God's Kingdom.

A spiritual SAFTI closely linked to our Church is FEBC now training 65 soldiers from 12 nations. These are our most powerful forces for extension of God's Kingdom. As more and more applications for training at FEBC are being received, the day is coming when enrolment will reach three figures. This will mean more of your support, if indeed you are a member of the Kingdom of God Party.

By God's grace our Church has established a witness in every ASEAN country (Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines) except Brunei. With the campaign

Bring a friend to Sunset Gospel Hour, Calvary Pandan

For almost four months I have been absent from the Sunset Gospel Hour Pulpit. When I returned last Lord's Day evening, I found a goodly number of Lifers missing. Nevertheless, the attendance was being kept up between 250-300.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord' (Isa 55:1-3, 6-8).



The Beauty of Beulah House



In this connection, let us thank the Lord again for the good buy we've made of Beulah House. While other churches have tendered \$4 million to get some empty plot of Government land for 60 years' lease, we have ours freehold with the castle of a house (European style) connected to an annexe that once was the old Bye Clinic's hospital wards.

Today Beulah House provides living quarters for Rev Colin Wong and family, as well as to 8 student families of FEBC, with one room to spare for guests. Downstairs are 5 rooms occupied by the Ev. Band Fellowship, YAF, YF, AF and Lively Teens. Then there is one room taken by the SS, an airconditioned room used by the Choir and Thai Service, etc., the Chinese Service room used for Catechism Class, etc... speakup and it has been echoed by other MPs. It is now our time, and the Round House Hall, the biggest of all sused for Church functions etc. The big lawn is used by young people for football or games.

Presently, we are bricking up the Outhouse (150 sq ft) and a former shed facing the Lawn (100 sq ft) to provide shelter for more students, and more rooms are to be created in the Round House itself. These are capital investments "trading" most productively for the Lord. 12.17.12

In the light of all these renovations we are sheepishly asking for \$5,000. So far \$1,100 have come in, which shows the Lord's Spirit is working! In contrast, we have noted that the HUDC flats behind our Church at Chancery Court are Jesus everyday." asking for \$1/2 million per unit! The beauty of Beulah House is that with all the family rooms and meeting halls, we

have nearly 30,000 sq ft of golden land. All we paid for was \$7.2 million. (Our Beulah Debt is now reduced to \$1.95 million. And there is no interest to pay.)

"Prepare to Meet Thy God"

Thursday morning, Sept 5, I received a phone call from Preacher Joseph Liu of Tg Pinang Church. He said, "Deacon Teck Hock was taken home sud-



denly, a couple of hours ago!" He had high blood pressure, that I knew. To depart this life so unexpectedly at 55 shocked me, and all who are his friends.

Does the death of this dear brother in the Lord speak to your heart? The message came to me, "Prepare to meet thy God" (Amos 4:12). But death is no respecter of persons. Beware, those who are in the fifties, too!

As Tanjung Pinang is one with us, I was duty bound to minister to the bereaved family. My wife and I could spare Friday night to conduct the vigil service. so we left the same morning, arriving at noon. We returned Saturday early afternoon. Rev Bob Phee. who has been standing in for me of late, would be here Sunday afternoon, and officiate the funeral Monday 1.00 pm. Incidentally, Dr Patrick Tan and a learn of FEBC students evangelising at Tanjung Uban, 30 km north of Pinang, would come to the funeral.

"He had served his own generation"

This sentence is taken from Acts 13:36 about King David's faithfulness in His service of God. It can be said of Deacon Teck Hock also, to God's glory. 3od has His own witness in every land, even to the ast island on the horizon. The story how God has ised Deacon Teck Hock, insofar as Tanjung Pinang s concerned, must be told.

It all began with his father-in-law Rev Tan eng Koon who came to this Island emporium to start Chinese Presbyterian Church in 1967. Rev Tan had wo daughters, one married to preacher Joseph Liu and the other to Deacon Teck Hock. As the young hurch needed help, both daughters and their husands were "summoned" to leave Palembang and liantan, respectively, to come to Tanjung Pinang.

Soon Rev Tan found a piece of "haunted" land n high ground, a quarter-mile from the City. He ought it for a song, but since no one in the family had adonesian citizenship except Teck Hock, the proprty was registered in his name. As Teck Hock was a ratchmaker with a good income, there is no doubt he ontributed to the purchase of the land.

From a small beginning the Church has grown its present strength of holding two Sunday services n both Chinese and Indonesian) with a membership f 200. It has a handsome three-storey building for ie sanctuary and a two-storey school-house that nrols 500. The latest project on Deacon Teck Hock's

mind was to pull down the old wooden parsonage and build a new one with quest rooms to take care of frequent visitors and invited speakers. Deacon Teck Hock had started to order the materials when suddenly the Lord took him.

Since my ministry with Tg Pinang began in 1973 to this day I've found my brother in Christ a man of deep respect for God's servants and of generous hospitality. He never failed to come to the jetty to receive us or to send us off. He was well respected by the officials at the seaport. We jokingly called him "Vicepresident."

Today Tanjung Pinang Presbyterian Church has expanded to Kijang, a bauxite town 17 miles on the eastern part of the Island, and to To Uban (in conjunction with our Chinese Service). Kiantoro, a recent FEBC graduate now serving there, is a convert of the Church. Mr Tan Nam Siang, another member of Tg Pinang, is the lay leader of a mission church established by Calvary BPC at Batam, with Roska's help.

God's servant is no more, but God's work goes on. There is plenty to do in this Island mission field, and Life Church is looked up to for succour. (All offerings for Missions are to be directed to the Church Treasurer, Deacon Charlie Chia. The Church has a mission budget of 6 figures and it is the Church's responsibility to send out the funds.)

Attendances at cinemas are up. Letters have been sent to the Forum page. Pro-R groups praise the restraint of the censor's scissors. Anti-R groups equate this new visual freedom with immorality.

Was the Government right or wrong to allow this flood of R-rated movies? Right or

allow this flood of R-rated movies? Right or wrong, whoever made that decision must have been brave; it must have been a tough balancing act.

Although "the relaxed policy on movie censorship will be partly reversed in the wake of the General Election" (St. Times, Sept 5, '91), there are those who openly campaign to retain the R-rated movies. Here's a letter to the Straits Times, dated Sept 9, '91, who would "let people decide." Since the writer. John Sung and Charismatism

One of the things you'd read about Wang Ming Tao in the latest issue of the Banner is his repudiation of charismatism into which he was misled in the early years after conversion. Now, Wang Ming Tao and John Sung are two of "Five Stars of the Chinese Church." What, we are interested to know, is John Sung's stand on Charismatism? Read p.121 and p.161 of "John Sung My Teacher" as follows:

I. p121: "The fullness of the Holy Spirit is not tongue-speaking or any other phenomena that the charismatics stressed, but rather the living water springing up like a fountain from within every born-again believer. Tongues and other so-called spiritual gifts are not God's blessings. Once a person's sins are cast out from his heart through the saving grace of the Lord Jesus, immediately there spring the living water of the Holy Spirit from within him, which flow on and on without quenching (John 7:38, 39). Every Christian must become an empty, clean channel through which the living waters of the Holy Spirit might flow to many a parched and dried up heart. This was the answer he later passed on to the Tsingtao charismatics."

II. p161: "At Shihkiachwang in Hopeh (Province) the (Evangelistic) Band stepped on charismatic territory again, for the meetings were held at the AOG Church (Assemblies of God). John pointed out to them an anomaly. Those who stressed on tongue-speaking as a sign of the Holy Spirit nevertheless had never repented of their sins. Those so-called Holy Spirit filled ones were exhorted to come forward to confess their sins. Therefore Dr Sung stressed again, 'What a sinner needs is not the gift of tongues, but the gift of salvation. Too many who claimed to have the Holy Spirit ended up having an unholy spirit! Instead of being filled by the Spirit, they were felled by the Spirit.' Some twenty missionaries who came from the surrounding cities were greatly blessed."

My dear Readers,

The Church Militant

This is a theological term on the function of the Church as an army. Isn't the Church reminded of St Paul to



"fight the good fight of faith" (I Tim 6:12), and Timothy his successor of his role as a soldier (II Tim 2:3)? As of himself, when he had come to the end of his earthly life he testified, "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith." But our weapons are not carnal, "for we wrestle not again flesh and blood, but against

principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God..." (Eph 6:12, 13). Now, any armour that a soldier wears consists of both defensive and offensive components. As to the offensive components in God's armour, there are the shoes for the gospel propagation and the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God. Hence our Church's stress on missions from the day of her founding, and the preaching and publicising of God's Word, as attested by our emphasis on the Bible and the publication of books and magazines, not the least this little Weekly. Our offensive action cannot go on, however, without "praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit" (Eph 6:18), so our constant reminder to corporate prayer every Tuesday night.

At present Life Church is engaged in total war against the R-rated films. Now, in any war, we need the help of allies, friends, and supporters wherever we can find them. We count not only on our members, but also on those defined by this comprehensive term: "adherents". Under "adherents," we have a wide area to cover in this signatures campaign. This wide area is described by Webster's New Twentieth Century Dictionary Unabridged, Second Edition, as follows: "Adherent: n. a person who adheres; one who follows a leader, party, etc: a follower, or partisan, a believer in a particular faith or cause. Syn. - follower, partisan, supporter, friend, aid, ally, companion, backer."

Let me appeal first of all to you, my Reader, to commit your signature to the Forms out there on the table at the Church entrance. Secondly, may I appeal to the Sunday School to have all the signatures of our scholars. Thirdly, let me urge all presidents of our 10 fellowships to gather the signatures of your groups, even the names of your Christian friends who are against the R-rated films.

This is a time to test our zeal. In Paul's Epistle to Titus, the apostle mentions the need of zealous good works: "Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works." We have a watchword, "Do something good for Jesus everyday." Here's a great challenge to love of the Saviour. God bless!

I AM an American who has been working in Singapore for the past nine months.

Since I have been here, I have heard a barrage of aspersions cast at "Western decadence". If local morals are falling, blame it on the West. If a local woman is caught jogging naked, it must be the West's fault.

I have found this attitude perplexing since close to my work place are several rows of thriving brothels — something that would not be found in my hometown in the United States.

When it was first proposed that Rrated movies be allowed in Singapore, I thought this was harmless enough even if I did not go to see one.

However, it seems that what in Singapore is R-rated would be labelled X-rated in the US and only shown in some sleazy "adult" theatre in the seedy part of town.

Here, though, pornography was

screened in the same theatre in which I had earlier seen Home Alone.

Even the church I attend meets in a theatre that would be showing pornography not long after the service was over. My American modesty was outraged.

Nevertheless, I have appreciated the fact that society at large in Singapore recognises the need for high moral standards.

I applaud the courage your Government shows in trying to lead the people in preserving those standards.

But I would like to warn Singaporeans that when morals slip, do not blame "Western influence" or Government laxity.

Instead, fault human depravity and the reasoning reflected by Christopher Ee in his letter (ST, Sept 9) when he wrote "there is no right or wrong, only opinions".

That is the heart of the philosophy of relativism which will, if taken to its logical conclusion, destroy every standard of decency and make a viable society impossible.

I hope Singaporeans find the absolute foundation upon which to build a value system to grow and prosper.

An Urgent Call from Saipan

"Please ... please go and see for yourself, the several thousand mainland Chinese who need your help!" exclaimed Dn Lee, an FEBC Korean student. He had recently made a trip to Saipan with the gospel ship, MV Hannah. My heart was stirred by his testimony of the urgent call from Saipan.

The King's business requires haste! On 14th August, I was sent with the blessings of our Church and Pastor Tow to assess the actual situation in Saipan. Having no direct flight from Singapore to Saipan, I had to stop one night at Manila and then transit to Saipan. With much excitement and eagerness I arrived at Saipan the next evening.


Saipan island is located in the western Pacific. It lies about 3300km southeast of Hong Kong, 2400 km east of Manila. Saipan is the capital of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. The local people of Saipan are divided into two major

ethnic groups - Chamorro and Carolinian - each with their own language and culture. During the past few years, large numbers of Filipinos, Taiwanese and Koreans have emigrated to Saipan and current estimates put the population at 30,000. Saipan is smaller than Singapore, about one third its size.

A Korean missionary and two deacons of the Korean Presbyterian Church of Saipan received me at the airport...

Early last year, 20 garment and textile factories started to employ mainland Chinese workers for cheap labour. In Dec 1990, some of these workers visited the Korean Church out of curiosity, there being no Chinese Church in Saipan. The Korean Church pastors offered them the gospel despite having no knowledge of the Chinese language. Many workers were gloriously saved after hearing the truth being preached and interpreted into Mandarin.

The number of Chinese worshippers grew by leaps and bounds every Sunday. The Korean Church supplied each of them



with a Chinese Bible and a hymn book in Chinese. Today, about 300 of the 3000 Chinese workers attend the Sunday Service faithfully.

On Saturday night, I visited a meeting held in a factory's dining hall. When the group of 40 believers saw me, a Chinese preacher, they all stood up and clapped hands to welcome me.

My heart was overjoyed to see the 300 odd Chinese come to Church the next morning. Half of them are Chinese Koreans

attending the Korean service. The other half attend a separate Chinese worship service. I was invited to preach at this service. I was simply overwhelmed by their enthusiasm. The same Holy Spirit who moved me in China moved me also in Saipan. I challenged them to surrender their lives to Jesus. When I asked a Chinese Korean sister to close in prayer, she wept in tears with thanksgiving for the Lord had shown great mercy on them. Most of them wept with her as the message touched them deeply. They acknowledged that the gracious Lord had sent them out of China not only to be saved but also to be trained and return to mainland China to preach the Gospel.

In the next ten days, almost every night I conducted training sessions for them. They voiced their desire to have a Chinese pastor. They begged me to stay or return again because they are contracted to work in Saipan for only two years. None of them was a believer and some even did not know who Jesus is! Yet the Lord brought them out here to be trained for the sake of the Gospel!

There are 8000 more Chinese workers coming to Saipan by the end of this year. There are 3000 local Chinese and 2000 mainland Chinese in Guam, another island 75 km south of Saipan, which is also without a Chinese Church and pastor. As the apostle Paul responded promptly to the Macedonian call, it is high time for us to respond to this Saipanian call. Will we?

From SINGAPORE: IMPACT OF A REMNANT By R.E. McMaster, Jr. in Chalcedon Report, Aug. 1991

"Bible Presbyterians in Singapore have a significant impact. There, with the church firmly planted on prime downtown Singapore real estate, the thunderous Calvinistic doctrine of Reverend Timothy Tow has sown its seeds in culture. The fruit is readily manifest. The sovereignty of God, as opposed to the exclusively humanistic gospel of freewill salvation, is aptly and clearly presented. Reverend Tow blasts the lawlessness of this day and age, too, in one of his six books, The Law of Moses and of Jesus. One of Tow's other works is entitled, Calvin's Institutes Abridged. Small wonder, with such a solid foundation, that The Asian Awakening, the title of a third book by Tow, is underway.

A big, powerful, dedicated Christian church in an island city-state of 2.7 million people can and does have quite an anfluence. The university/seminary which Life Bible Presbyte-ian Church has established for the purpose of training theology students from all Asia in the Calvinistic perspective of the Gospel's highly regarded. At the associated South Korean service which visited following our Sunday morning worship service, once again I rejoiced, particularly at the beautiful harmony of the inging of hymns by South Koreans. Their entire essence was soured into their study, praise and worship.

In the Sunday morning message, I heard Reverend Tow hit hard the excessive emphasis in Singapore upon secular materialism, which is the negative side of the excellent work ethic so prominent among Singaporeans. (Singaporeans have been rated for ten years straight as the best workers in the world, according to BERI, a widely respected international business rating service.) Reverend Tow also talked about the importance of humility in giving thanks for material prosperity and blessings. All in all. it reminded me of readings I had done regarding worship services which occurred in early America, when America was great, before we entered today's post-Christian era. The perspective on debt, which had recently been used to obtain additional church property, was warned against. The thrust was that the church should pay off its debt as soon as possible. The heading of the weekly pastoral chat was, "Owe No Man Anything" (Romans 13:8). In one year Tow's church had paid off \$800,000 of its \$3 million debt. Tithing and giving by these Calvinists in Singapore is taken seriously as an indication of their maturity and covenantal faithfulness. I can truly say, "It was good to have been there."

Christian reconstruction also has a voice as newspaper editor, Christian book distributor and Chalcedon subscriber Peter Ong works amidst the church, the Christian, and secular communities-at-large.

"Only one life 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last."

"For what shall it profit a man if he should gain the whole world and lose his own soul?" (Mk 8:36). This was the verse that became the turning point in John Sung's life. Here's the account of the upheaval in his soul, taken from "John Sung My Teacher."



March 1926 saw Sung Shang Chieh obtain his PhD 'with all the rights and privileges pertaining thereunto'. Offers of jobs and high positions came from his alma mater, from China his own country and from Germany. He was now carried to the dizzy heights of his own achievements, floating on golden clouds of glamour more than even before.

Waking up the morning after the glamorous night of his self-exaltations, there came a still small voice, however, from his innermost being. For what is a man profited if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?' (Matt 16:26). Again the words came, now loud and clear. For what is a man profited if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?' From the pinnacle of inflated egoism he was plunged suddenly into a swelling tide of emptiness. Musing over this famous saying not from Confucius, nor from Laotse, he heard a knock-knock, so sudden, on the door. Of all people, Rev Wilbur Fowler, the Wesley Foundation man at Ohio State, had come to visit: 'Why, you don't look a bit the scientist that you are. You are more of a preacher,' remarked the unexpected visitor.

In the ensuing conversation Dr Sung revealed his original purpose of coming to America and the conflict ever more raging in his soul! 'Why not study at Union Theological Seminary in New York then?' suggested Rev Fowler.

The attractions of seeing America's No. 1 City where is located the world-famous Columbia University were in his consideration, but the yes he said to Rev Fowler at the end of this fateful visit had been prompted from Above. 'The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the Lord' (Prov 16:1). Pastor Sung having dedicated his son from birth to the Lord, and the same having yielded to the vow of his father, would not the Lord accept the twice-uttered offering in the fulness of His time? The die was cast for Union Seminary.

On his way to New York City, God showed Sung a greater sight than the skyscrapers of New York, the mute work of puny man, which seemed to beckon him. The thunderous waters of Niagara Falls, booming the awesome majesty of the Creator like a thousand-thousand voice choir humbled him to the dust. Rising up, he prayed, 'O Lord, let me be a Niagara for Thee.'



Last Tues. Sept 24 Elder Sng and I were called to Tg Pinang to officiate the funeral of Mr Teo Keng Nguan, 76. Mr Teo is known to our members, having taken shelter at Beulah House while in Singapore for medical check-ups. We readily answered this call, for Mr Teo had a bright testimony.

Before migrating to Riau he had heard Dr John Sung in Swatow, China in the thirties. This kept him from idol worship, but he was still far away from God. He finally settled on Singkep Island, a mining town with vestiges of Dutch rule, 5 hours by motor boat south of Tg Pinang.

When an FEBC student was sent to Singkep Island in the early eighties Mr Teo's knowledge of Christ was renewed, short of receiving Him as Saviour. When a big fire swept Singkep town and burnt down rows of shophouses, Teo cried to the Lord. The fire had reached almost his doorstep when it stopped. This so convinced him of God's power that he received the Lord that very hour. Immediately, he telephoned me to baptise him at the Tg Pinang Church.

Since his baptism he has witnessed to all his relatives, both in Singapore and back in Swatow China. He told me they had all believed. What is greater joy to him is all his children have also believed.

FOUNDATIONS OF A HAPPY HOME

The "Art of Parenting" Seminar held Sat. Sept 28, '91 under the auspices of FEK and YAF, was attended by



about 250. The speakers were myself, Mrs Siow Soon Chin of New Life and Dr Lim Teck Chye.

For the sake of Readers who were not present, here's a brief summary of my message on Foundations of a Happy Home:

Introduction

That so many of you are here (a good many are parents of FEK, Including a Sikh couple) shows there is a great need on how to bring up children. I sympathise with you, seeing that these are topsy-turvy times when the Fifth Commandment becomes "Parents obey your children" instead! A recent Japanese news item from the S.T. reports, "Children think the world belongs to them," a 24-year-old office worker said. "Everyone needs a little peace on the train at 9 o'clock in the evening, but they joke around and scream as if it were a school ground." What affects affluent Japan has also affected affluent S'pore. Are our children any better? I've seen children who misbehave against their parents at a dinner table. Before prayer is offered these would snatch the food they like and gobble it under the eyes of guests. Calvin says, They who eat without prayer are like animals. (Someone heard what I quoted from the great theologian and rolled her eyes!)

The first foundation of a Happy Home is GOD. Choose God! God appeared to Abram in Ur of the Chaldees. He was told to go to a Land God would show him. Lot went with Uncle Abram, for he chose to worship Abram's God (Gen 12:4). Are you a Christian? If not why not come to Life Church to find out the Truth? Come and see and hear for yourself, and when you come to see the Truth, choose God!

The second foundation is also God. Love God! When Abram and Lot's cattle grew so numerous that they could not thrive together in peace, the uncle let his nephew choose his territory first. Lot moved to the Jordan valley to Sodom and Gomorrah, but these though rich cities were filled with wicked people. "Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him" (I jn 2:15). Lot was saved (il Pet 2:7), but he lost his family because of his love of the world. Conversely, Abram put God first. He didn't mind

hilly Hebron, a barren rocky place. Though living still in a tent, "he built there an altar unto the Lord" (Gen 13:18). When we come to Church, is it because we love God? Now, this is Paul's philosophy for a happy life with a warning for the get-rich-quick. "But godiness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows" (I Tim 6:6-10).

The third foundation of a happy family is still God! When we love we obey. While Lot lost his family because he let the love of the world corrupt them, Abram was commended, "For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the Lord ..." (Gen 18:19). While Abram is known for obeying God in the matter of the sacrifice of isaac, did you see how he had trained his son to lovingly obey him, so that he was willing to let his father sacrifice him? How well have you trained your child to obey God?

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 prescribes how we should train our children. We are commanded to teach our children at home through family worship. Do you teach your children to say grace at meals and pray with them before bed and rising the next morning? Do you scold, but never praise the Lord before your children? What things do you hang on the walls of your house? Pin-ups? Semi-naked women as displayed on calendars? Do you hang up the Ten Commandments instead? A picture of kneeling Samuel, and Bible verse plaques, even jESUS SAVES clocks? Is your child's playroom piled up only with toys and toys ceiling high? Is the TV your child's foster mother? And you have no control over your child?

Conclusion

The three foundations of a happy home are God, God, God! Choose, love and obey Him. Let me conclude with a personal testimony. Three persons have influenced my life greatly. First is Mother, a loving, understanding, praying Mother. Second is Father, a strict disciplinarian but he always led us willingly to family worship. Third is Grandpa, a praying minister. When he prayed we were ushered into the presence of God! They set me firmly on the Rock foundation who has upheld me to this day and my brothers and sisters too. Amen.

MISSIONARY OUTREACH IN WEST KALIMANTAN CONTINUES


Rev Djunaidi writes:

"When I received Life B-P Weekly No. 51 and read about our work here at Pontianak being one of Life Church's 41 branches, I praised the Name of the Lord!

Here's my report for July '91. At the invitation of an inland church of WEC (Worldwide Evangelisation Crusade) to hold 7 days meetings on "Christ's Second Coming" I ventured into Nanga Lebang on the upper reaches of the Kapuas River. The name of this Church is Gereja Persekutuan Sidang Kristus. The Lord blessed these meet-

ings, so they have requested me to minister again.

As the distance is great and travel is difficult, the MAF (Missionary Aviation Fellowship) came to my rescue through their auxilliary Team Penginjilan "Sayap Kasih." So I shall be flying Sat. Sept 7 to Ketungau to preach to the Dyaks. The Gospel Team abovementioned of late has been making one sortie every week into the interior. By means of Gospel films they are able to draw several thousand natives to the meetings. What economy of time and energy this method of evangelism! Please pray for us.



God has blessed our Church, school, orphanage and Evening Bible School here at Siantan, Pontianak. Recently the Ministry of Health borrowed these premises to spread the knowledge of healthy living to the community around us. There was a contingent of doctors, nurses, military police that joined this Health Campaign. The response of the village folks was overwhelming. This recognition by the authorities of our Christian Complex is another evidence of the Lord's mercies. May God bless your work in Singapore." (dated Sept 1, '91)

SOLEMNISING ANOTHER WEDDING DOWN TANJUNG PINANG

With newer and faster "Jet Raiders" and "Super Cats" plying between Finger Pier and Tg Pinang, it is possible to accomplish the Lord's business there within a day. (A return ticket costs \$71.) We took the "Island Jade" out 9.20 am Wed Oct 2, and arrived Tg Pinang in 2 hours 15 mins.

Ev. Joseph Liu chaired the Wedding Service by announcing a hymn. Then an Indonesian pastor, at whose church the bridegroom has been a long-time worshipper, prayed. Kiantoro read the Scripture in Indonesian, after which I was asked to deliver the sermon. As the parents on both sides were non-Christians, the message was directed to them. From Gen 2:18-25 it was described to them how holy matrimony began. This adumbrates the love of Christ, the Heavenly Bridegroom to those who believe in Him, even the Church. After the message, the choir sang.

The Chinese Liturgy is patterned after the Common Prayer Book. It is interesting to note that the Preamble quotes from ancient classics that emphasise the sacredness and permanency of the marriage bond. But the final Word is Christ's: "What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder" (Matt 19:6).

As the wedding ceremony took place during the Church school hours, a big crowd of students gathered. To those outside the Church, the Christian Marriage is a holy mystery.

In lieu of the reception, a box of Indonesian cakes was distributed to each guest, including a package drink of crysanthemum tea! The bride and groom then drove off to their ancestral homes where special guests, mostly relatives, would eat a meal together.

In view of our need to return to Singapore in the early afternoon, Ev. Joseph Liu was entrusted to take care of us. The Indonesian pastor, Kiantoro, Ivy and myself were driven to a seaside Chinese restaurant, where fishes and prawns, kept swimming in enclosures in the sea below the restaurant were hauled up alive and cooked on the spot and served sizzling hot. As it was high tide and the wind began to drift in with the flow, who would want to leave such a Shangri-la if not for the siren blast from the returning "Cat"? We arrived back at the Parsonage before 7 pm, mission accomplished.

"Be Thankful unto Him, and Bless His Name" (Ps 100:4)



May I repeat to you the giving of "The Clock of the Sevenfold Will of God" Oct 20 to add to our 41st Anniversary joy. This book sells \$5 at the bookshop.

As pastor I must remind you to come with thankful hearts and praising lips for His bringing us "safely through another year." Ps 103 reminds us of His goodness in forgiving us our sins, healing our sicknesses, saving us from death (eg accident, calamity) and restoring us to youthful energy with a good appetite. As Singaporeans we have been favoured with good Government, with a continuing prosperity, and protection from natural disasters, Pinatubo! We don't deserve all this. Therefore, we should not "forget all His benefits" (Ps 103:2).

Nevertheless, as I pen these words, here comes the S.T. of Oct 10 reporting on "Yesterday's Haze the worst as visibility drops to 1 km." Wed Oct 9 was the worst day because all this while the average visibility was 4 km. This haze comes from forest fires raging in South Sumatra and S.E. Kalimantan, from hundreds of miles away! Are these forest fires that have consumed 50,000 ha of Indonesian forests lesser in terror than Pinatubo? Hasn't this HAZE spoken a warning from the Creator and Governor of the Universe? When will you and I, awake to futility of a materialistic life S'poreans are chasing after? In one night all that we have may be consumed by another kind of fire. Read II Pet 3:10.

3rd Pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Mar 2-16, '92



After months of prayerful inquiry and personal negotiations with our travel experts in Jerusalem, we believe it is the Lord's will for Life Church and FEBC to lead a 3rd Pilgrimage to the Holy Land. The first and second were 1983 and 1987. The travel schedule has been finalised and the date is headlined as above. (You come to airport 10 pm and you fly just past midnight.)

While others call theirs Study Tours, ours are Pilgrimages in the real sense. When we visit Sinai where the X Commandments were given, let us "take off our shoes for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground" (Ex 3:5).

As our headquarters in Israel will be Beit El Baraka Conference Centre, 10 miles south of Bethlehem, there we will have full freedom of worship before going out and after coming in. Moreover, we will have Sunday worship at Baraka B-P Church, Bethlehem with the Arab Christians and with Miss Joan Davenport, missionary from the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions. We shall drive to Beit Sahour (Shepherds Field) 3 km from Bethlehem to stand on the land we had bought for the Arab Church in 1988.

The route we take this time is entirely different from the previous two trips. We fly into Amman where we have a half-day city tour before transplaning to Cairo. After two nights in Cairo we cross the Suez Canal by coach to Sinai. From Sinai we head northward via Eilat to Baraka. With a full week criss-crossing the Land, we fly out of Tel Aviv to Istanbul (Turkey), the original Constantinople, so full of Church History. Two nights in Istanbul and we head wearily homewards, arriving Singapore Mar 16, 1400 hrs. Only the healthy and strong can come along. Take no chances! (This tour will be repeated in June '92 by Calvary BPC under Dr Tow Siang Hwa.)

For the big sum of \$7.2 million expended? If it is bought by a towkay to stay with his family and servants, it will be a liability. Put into God's hands, where hundreds are using it every week to promote His Kingdom, it is a priceless asset.

When you come to the 41st Anniversary Thanksgiving Dinner next Saturday and sit with the Church family



under one bright big tent stretching the whole length of Beulah Lawn you will agree with me. And it is not this annual event only that uses this big lawn. You should see how the field is utilised for healthful exercises and games by young Lifers and FEBC students, and their children during the week.

Moreover, there are the rooms that house 9 1/2 families comprising church staff and the married students, totalling 33 souls. If an EBF member has declared Beulah House her second home, it is even more for the 9 1/2 families mentioned above.

Moreover, the House provides a "den" for the following: EBF, YAF, YF, AF, Young Teens. Three meeting halls are used by SS, Catechism Class, Junior Worship, Thai Service, Choir, LBC, NBC, Women's Fellowship, SS functions etc. Yet, there are several more rooms to spare to take care of a constant flow of visitors and passing through missionaries, not the least friends from the Riau Islands. And the car park?

Is Beulah House a liability? The spiritual exercises our members went through 6 1/2 months of giving to Beulah have made us more liberal in the financial support of other Church projects, eg the sending of two couples to Thailand and Philippines.

Our Beulah debt is now down to \$1.85 million. Who would give a piano for meetings at the Round House? Anymore surplus potted plants? Any spare beds? We thank God for every item that furnishes the 30-room House. Amen.



Thank God for caring sisters-in-the-Lord like Mrs Helen Eio who did the marketing for me and Mrs Siriwan Lim who brought me livefish to eat. Dr Lim has never failed to encourage me along with words of Scripture each time I see him. When I told him that I had conceived in October last year, he told me that the chances for conception in "reanastomosised" cases are 60% but it was 90% when he did the operation.

Like Hannah and Mary my heart "rejoiceth in the Lord" today because He has heard my prayers and blessed me with another son. Today as Amos is baptized I thank the Lord for my little baby who is "Hand Made by God." I have been vacillating about writing this rather personal testimony for the past three months. The Lord sent me a reminder in the form of a gift from Rev and Mrs Edward Paanwe. The words on my Amos' T-shirt "HAND MADE BY GOD" prompted me to pen this testimony. Yes, my baby is a "miracle baby" as a lady Lifer never fails to remind me each Sunday when she sees him.

Each day I thank the Lord for blessing me with a cherubic baby. My daughter is the happiest of all because the Lord has blessed her with a little sibling. May the Lord grant my husband and me the wisdom to bring up my little Amos so that he can grow up to love and serve the Lord. Amen.

When we give thanks and praise His Name, He reciprocates by pouring down His Spirit on every sincere heart. Every Thanksgiving is always attended with joy and metriment.

Last week's Thanksgiving took on a new spirit with the decoration of the sanctuary with many potted plants and flowers. The Hall was spring-cleaned by many groups under the direction of Deacon Sng. The management committee erected for the Dinner a bigger tent than last year's and added more fans. With cool breezes sent by the Lord we had a perfect evening. The menu with plenty to spare, was second to none. Praise God from whom all blessings flow. The thankofferings totalled some \$57,000, including almost \$2,000 from the Chinese Service. (With this intake the Beulah Debt is reduced to \$1.8 million.)

Two thankofferings were wrapped in gracious words as follows:

- 1. "When pastor sent this thanks giving offering envelope, I realised how much God had blessed me, and I hadn't even begun to thank Him. I humbly offer this tiny sum to show my deep gratitude and praise to the Lord for saving a special friend. He will be baptised this Anniversary. Praise colony -di the Lord."
- 2. "My heart was filled with praise and thanksgiving to our Lord Jesus for His mercy and grace that is upon my father. I want to thank the Lord how He had sent you to bring the good news to him at the right time. He was very glad that you could identify with him.

"As the Lord had blessed us, I would like to present a love offering for the Church Extension Building Fund II (\$1,050). 'The Lord is full of compassion, slow to anger and of great mercy' (Ps 145:8). "



- 1. Brunel, Nov. 7-14, '91. This is a double campaign in two churches, 80 km from each other. It is a teaching session on the Person and Work of the Holy Spirit in the face of inroads made by the Charismatics. The Brunei Church has also invited the pastor's wife to come along.
- Saipan and Guam. Dec 6-12, in company with Pr Pang Kok Hiong and Dr Cheng Wei Nien of Calvary BPC. - 3. Yangon, Myanmar (Burma) Dec 16-23. This is in answer to Rev Thawn Luai's request to speak to a Leadership Conference for the Ev. Presbyterian Church and Far Eastern Fundamental School of Theology. The pastor's wife is invited to minister to the women.

THE REFORMATION EMANATED FROM THE BOOK OF ROMANS by Dr Ray Martin

That eve of All Saints Day, 1517, is known as the pivotal beginning of the Protestant Reformation. But actually, it was not the beginning. In November, two years earlier, or five years after joining the faculty of the University of Wittenburg as professor of Sacred Theology, Dr. Luther began lectures on the Book of Romans (These began on November 3, 1515 and continued until September 7,41516). As he painstakingly prepared these classroom sessions, the deliberating, meditating, praying a professor gradually came to the realization of what constituted the central teaching of all Holy Scripture.

It was during his careful preparation for these lectures on Romans that Luther came to the eternal truth that "The just shall live by faith" (Rom 1:17). He found it again in the Old Testament book of Habakkuk (2:4), making it universal, for the Jew and for the Gentile. Thus, this five-word phrase from the Bible became the hallmark of the Reformation that followed. It is faith, not works, not indulgences, not obedience to the Pope, the apostate priests or the orders of the Church of Rome, or anything else, that brings down to man the righteousness of God. That righteousness, and any reformation that follows, comes to us through the real and perfect life, death and bodily resurrection of our Lord Jesus

True Reformation is Bible-based and Bible-built. We in the International Council of Christian Churches still hold to this grand principle of Reformation.

From all this Bible study and Luther's teaching in the University and at the Wittenburg Church there emerged a trilogy of spiritual truth in a motto that beautifully declares the faith and doctrine of the Reformation in seven simple words: "THE WORD ALONE; GRACE ALONE; FAITH 18 TUB 8.00 pm Prayer Meeting THU 7.30 pm Law of Moses (Rev Tow) ALONE"

True Biblical Reformation is the natural result of salvation in the many hearts of those who make up the Body of Christ on earth and their adherence to all of Holy Scripture. This all emanates from the Word of God alone and excludes none of it; it was sent from Heaven by God's Grace alone, we having no part in it but to receive it and dispense it to others; it becomes ours by Faith alone, not by works nor human effort, that man might not boast of his own achievement in attaining it.

Those who believed and spread those three basic articles of the faith brought down on themselves the wrath of Rome. The whole system of lucrative indulgences was in jeopardy. With these simple truths, Luther pierced the windbags of the philosophers, attacked the Pope and the bellies of the monks. He and a handful of fearless witnesses were excommunicated. Others, which made up the greater numbers that came into the Reformation movement, like Katherine von Bora, the former nun who became Luther's faithful wife, walked out of the Roman Church. These two groups, the bold prophets who were excommunicated and the dissenters who walked off the premises, or turned their whole churches into evangelical centers of Bible Christianity - these formed a fresh center of Ecclesia that preserved and propagated the faith in purity. They all heard the command of their Saviour Jesus Christ, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues (Rev 18:4).

WIEIEIKILY

DELIVERED OUT OF THE MOUTH OF THE CHINESE DRAGON

It was a Sat. morning, a week ago; there came a phone call from Conrad See, an FEBC student: "Pastor, can you help my father? He has an urgent request. Shall we come and see you Sunday afternoon?"



"What's the matter?" I asked.

"My father is greatly worried. The temple medium with whom he is involved pronounces he would die by a certain day!"

"Then bring him here at once!"

At 3.45 pm, after I had spoken at the Inauguration of Chinese YF, I found both father and son sitting in the Palm garden waiting. I brought them upstairs to my flat.

Mr See Pee Guan, 57, sat a frightened, perspiring man. A Baba in upbringing he is more conversant in Malay and English than in Chinese. He spoke a mixture of English and Hokkien. "For the last four years I have been involved with a Chinese temple. As a devotee I have to attend temple ceremonies every Mon., Wed, and Fri, night. Lately I was promoted to do higher service, burning joss sticks and joss papers, and going through complicated motions. As I have made mistakes I was chided on occasions. Last night, I was punished to kneel two hours on conch shells. The young medium pressed me down several times to increase the pain to my bruised knees. My friends chided me, a well-to-do towkay, for being bullied by good-for-nothing upstarts. My wife, who has lately believed in Jesus nursed me, but I bluffed her I had fallen down.

"To add insult to injury the young medium said to me, You are 57. But you will die before you're 59. (I've been relieved of \$100,000 during the years.)"

At that, I turned to Eccles 8:8 "There is no man that hath power over the spirit to retain the spirit; neither hath he power in the day of death..." Verse 7 says, "For he knoweth not that which shall be: for who can tell him when it shall be?" (NIV says: "Since no man knows the future, who can tion was far from complete. So would our Lord urge us today to tell him what is to come?") Incidentally these verses were quoted by an old FEBC student who was also pronounced by a medium to die before a certain date. This fear drove him to Christ. He had a shrine-room filled with idols costing \$10,000 but he had them all smashed and burnt up.

I told this story to Mr See. In Jesus' Name I guaranteed him safe from the medium's curse. In Jesus' Name I' exhorted him to give up his idol worship. Then I offered to visit his office to survey the situation, to which Mr See consented. Together with Conrad his son we drove off in a Weekly a list of 44 churches and mission stations established brand new Mitsubishi sedan.

We climbed up three storeys to a stuffy office room dominated by a wall to wall idol shrine almost ceiling high. The icon of Kuan Yin goddess of mercy presides over 8 Chinese gods and a sea goddess, Mah Cho (Great grand-

mother). The other gods, such as god of war, Kuan Kong, the monkey god, the god of heaven, etc, red-faced, blackfaced, brown-faced, sat on two tiers covered with crimson velvet in order of rank. Incense was burning simultaneously from 6 or 7 positions. Bananas, oranges, apples and Chinese shortbread were placed before these idols. Then there was a brown Buddha with bulging belly, 2 1/2 ft tall standing guard by the door. There were numerous smaller gods occupying two lower shrines, cartons of joss papers, etc. etc. Half of the office was taken up with all these evil objects. It took us three men 1 1/2 hours to dismantle and pack them into 16 sacks. The last deed we performed was to hang a JESUS SAVES clock on the wall.

This infernal cargo was packed into the sedan car, and consigned to the rubbish trolley in our Church compound. But that was not all. Mr See would have to hire a lorry to transport that rosewood shrine with the huge Kuan Yin icon. All these must be brought to Church to be chopped up for the rubbish heap.

On the way back to Church, Mr See asked to be baptised. Early Sunday afternoon before 4 pm, he and his wife, with two sons, were all seated in the Indonesian Service waiting for me. We arrived on the scene 5 mins. before time. I preached from Luke 15:8-10 on the lost coin and the joy in heaven over one sinner that repented. Mr See gave a short testimony in Malay, whereupon he knelt down before the Lord - to be baptised, Hallelujah!

Never had the Indonesian Service an attendance of 32 as on this Lord's Day. The worship service ended with a high note of praise, and with a get together. As we sat over the refreshments a smiling Mrs See chuckled, "Now my husband, who has not eaten beef the last thirty years as a devotee, can eat satay lembu! (barbequed beef)..."

MESSAGE TO MARANATHA BPC AT HER 1ST ANNIVERSARY THANKSGIVING SERVICE

(Text: Matt 28:18-20)

Last year at the inauguration of Maranatha BPC, I spoke on this text under the theme, "The Great Commission." Why do I speak on it again? Because "The Great Commission" is also "The Unfinished Commission."

When Sun Yat Sen, Father of the Chinese Republic was proclaimed President upon the fall of the Manchu regime, he urged his comrades to struggle on because, he emphasised, the Revolupress on without let up, for there are many areas in Singapore still untouched by the Gospel!

The story is told of an angel asking Jesus this question when He ascended to heaven, "You have given your disciples the Great Commission to go into the world to preach the Gospel. What if they do not go?" Answered our Lord, "They are my hands and feet. If they do not go, I have no other way."

It is so easy to become complacent. On the occasion of the Mother Church's 41st Anniversary last week, you read in the during the 41 years (of course there were some casualties). Some might have felt satisfied for going so far. To sit down awhile, to relax a little, would be fine. Once we take that attitude, we will slide back. God's work is like sailing upstream. If we relax a little we'll go downstream.

Now, the Great Commission has four points like the compass. First is "Go" and that is missions. Second is "make disciples" and that is evangelism. Third is "baptise" which is Church organisation, and fourth is "indoctrination," teaching them to observe all that our Lord has commanded.

The spearhead of this Commission is "Go." Hence the paramount importance of missions. We thank God for sending Charles Seet to the Philippines and Jess Tamee back to North Thailand. As to evangelism, the Church can lose zeal in soul-winning and thus become a social gathering. Thank God for the E. Band in Life Church and for the evangelistic committees in the various Fellowships.

In the "Go" of the Gospel, I see the importance of decentralising. Not centralising but decentralising! There's a church in Singapore that had four stations on our Island. When they had built a beautiful church, these four stations closed down one by one to enjoy worshipping at the new sanctuary. Instead of increasing membership, the reverse is the result. In light of this situation, I want to commend Grace Church for decentralisation. As a result she has given birth to Shalom BPC which has built a big church at Pasir Ris. Now I hear Grace is negotiating to buy a 10,000 sq ft property with a bungalow at Simei for \$1.2 million. I heartily support such a programme.

The Unfinished Commission must not be advanced with our own prowess. No dollar power, not favour from the Government, not some rich uncle, not some big organisational programme like the city wide campaign of Billy Graham, Cho Yonggi, Reinhardt Bonke, Luis Palau. The Kingdom of God is not a mushroom that balloons overnight and peters out the next day. The Kingdom of God is a mustard seed that grows steadily and sturdily. Let us not be discouraged by our smallness. But if all BP Churches and their adherents overseas were to come together we can fill the National Stadium too. Let us not look at numbers! I say this merely to encourage your hearts. As the Chinese saying goes, "Every beginning enterprise is fraught with difficulties."

The Unfinished Commission must be advanced by the power of the Lord Jesus Christ, which is the preamble of the Great Commission, often deleted! "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth." It is His Holy Spirit, the Unseen Power that energises the Church from the very beginning. Paul had no missionary society and regular supply of money to sustain him in his missionary journeys. It was by the Unseen Holy Spirit Power that he went, and he could so reach the major cities in the Roman Empire that he could say he had "no more place in these parts" to

preach (Rom 15:23). I'm glad to say that Life Church did not depend on money power or organisational power but on Him alone to acquire Beulah House. It was entirely by the moving of the Holy Spirit in the hearts of members and friends that we were enabled to buy it.

This Unseen Power, however, has been equated by Charismatics with the Visible - the manifestation of tongues, visions, voices, healing. There is much showpiece to attract the credulous. But what I see as the great power by His Spirit is Love. Love is the greatest according to I Cor 13 over tongues and even preaching. By loving service shall His Kingdom be built.

The Unfinished Commission, advanced by the Unseen Power, cannot work without you as our Lord had reportedly said to that angel on the Day of His Ascension. So, He comforted the disciples, and you and me, "I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen."

As to home missions, we praise God for the support of lay people like the MF and WF and other groups like LBC. We thank God for the elders and deacons who advance into South Johore, to Kelapa Sawit and Air Bemban.

For foreign missions, we must appeal to young people to yield your life to fulltime service. And we have the FEBC to train you up.

Let me tell you a story about Ting Li Mei, the Moody of China. He had a "One Thousand Student Volunteers for Christ" movement to get young people into the fulltime ministry. When I asked Rev Heng Teck Im the Teochew pastor of Life Church Prinsep St how he had decided to be pastor, he said, "I heard Rev Ting's appeal and I answered the call." Rev Ting had succeeded in getting 1,000 young people for Christ. Now, I had a wish to enlist at least 200 by training them for the ministry, and FEBC is fast attaining this goal. Perhaps I should have asked for more!

For you who are middle aged and above, God also has a role for you to play. You can pray and pay! We need resources to pay the way of young people going into the Lord's service. With your accumulated wealth you can also go for the Lord by your love gifts.

And we have to double up in these last days before Jesus comes, for He says, "And the gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations and then shall the end come" (Matt 24:14). Maranatha! I like the name of your Church. What is Maranatha? The Lord comes! (I Cor 16:22). Even so come Lord Jesus: Amen.



We have new applicants from Kenya, Thailand, Philippines, Korea, Taiwan and several from S'pore. Our student body should reach an all-time high of 70 in Jan 1992.

Modern Hebrew which was taught in the evenings will now be offered to those who have Biblical Hebrew in the day classes only. As for the evening courses in Basic Theology for Everyone, we shall offer "Prophescope" on Israel and Five Stars of the Chinese Church Mon. evening. The Five Stars in chronological order are William Chalmers Burns (1815-1868), Jonathan Goforth (1858-1936), Ting Li Mei (1871-1936), John Sung (1901-1944), Wang Ming Tao (1900-1991). On Thurs. evening, another two courses, viz. Charismatism False and True and How to Discover God's Will for My Life.

Elder Heng Yow Tong is our faithful Treasurer all these years. His phone no. is 337-7421 for your convenience. As for financial support we want to thank Maranatha BPC especially for \$3,368.30 they are sending in from their 1st Anniversary Thanksgiving collection.

FEBC in the procurement of books for students is greatly facilitated by Christian Life Book Centre under the management of Mrs Annie Wong. As for the Library, we will be happy to receive donation of good theological books from Readers. Why keep them without ever reading them

By June we will see the return of Quek Suan Yew, Jeff and Jemima Khoo to augment the faculty. Pray for them that they will imbibe the right doctrines, that they may discern between God's teaching and man's teaching.

There was a time when they wanted to make FEBC the school of academic excellence. Modernist teachings crept in which we stoutly repudiated, and if we did not continue to keep vigilance other damnable doctrines would have infiltrated.

What is academic excellence without the fear of the Lord (Prov 1:7)? What is academic excellence that never declared the Bible is the infallible, inerrant, verbally-inspired Word of God? What is high learning of reading "90 theological books" but with little impartation of Bible knowledge? While we declare without apology we are sons of the Reformed Faith we will strive to make FEBC a truly Bible College, where the Bible is the centre of all learning. Dr William Phelps of Columbia University once declared, "A high school student with knowledge of the Bible is more educated than a College graduate without any knowledge of the Bible." No Bible, no theology.

By God's grace, more and more from the Third World are pressing to enter FEBC because they are assured they will be taught sound doctrine. But we cannot take them who have no financial support. Nevertheless we will strive our level best to give every genuine applicant a chance to learn God's Word that they may be able to teach others also. Maranatha! The Lord's coming is at hand! 

My dear Readers,

When we flew into Brunei's International Airport our spirits soared to meet the challenge of two Gospel campaigns before us. Ivy first went through the Immigration, so she got ahead and hauled our two suitcases to the Customs. She received a warm welcome from the officer, "Have a nice stay," after opening only one bag for examination. At the exit point she was welcomed by the host pastor as well as by Bro Khoo Wah Ann and wife Sai Chu, Lifers in Brunei.

But I, who came after her, was asked politely to stand aside. A lady officer took my passport to one of the rooms inside to be processed by the Chief, since I declared in the white card I was a pastor. How did I know that as a pastor I was persona non grata? This condition applied also to Buddhist monks, said a sympathetic officer on the side.

My passport un-stamped, we were told we might have to wait till 6 pm to be flown back. Fortunately, SQ 182 that made the round turn was delayed by some sick person arriving late. This delay afforded us just enough time to catch up at the last minute! We gratefully arrived back at the Parsonage 3.30 pm the same day. There's no place like home.

Can you see God's Higher Hand in this drama? "The steps of a (good) man are ordered by the Lord: and He delighteth in his way. Though he fall he shall not be utterly cast down: for the Lord upholdeth him with His hand" (Ps 37:23,24). Though we were naturally disappointed, we yielded to His Higher Will.

Reflection: How true are the words of our Lord Jesus, "I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work" (Jn 9:4). Pray for Saipan, and all the more for Burma, the remaining two doors to be entered.

"OUT OF THE STRONG CAME FORTH SWEETNESS'

Can you find this riddle in the Bible? And what is the answer? Perhaps I can apply this cryptic saying to this week's sermon to be preached at the 10.30 am service. Like the four points of the compass, I'd like to share the lessons I've learned from adversity as follows:

- 1. No one can tell what one's future is.
- 2. A Christian knows nothing happens by chance.
- 3. Whatever happens to him works for good.
- 4. One good is wisdom gained over the world.

The Bible proof texts are: 1) Jas 4:13-17; 2) Matt 10:28-33; 3) Rom 8:28; 4) Matt 10:16-20,

The Theme of this sermon can be worded thus: "In life's many struggles we are more than conquerors through Him that loved us."

Application: If you are losing out in your plans, if you are not a Christian, isn't it high time to come to Jesus, choba, choba? (Have a try). If you are a Christian and you wilfully stray from Him, come back, come back, no matter how great the loss. There's no other way out!

To make the best of the time we should have spent in Brunei, we decided to divert to Tanjung Pinang. We have found a hideout there at little Sadaap Hotel which is second to none for location. Sitting on a promontory "where two seas meet," we are lost in the merging watery expanses below and above. Moreover this is the season of the N.E. Monsoon that brings in cool breezes across the South China

Sea. The convenience of faster and faster speedboats adds to the inducement, for what took 4-5 hours in 1973 to chugchug through the 48 miles of inland seas is now reduced to 1 1/2! We thought it profitable to spend a working holiday there writing up Psalms for RPG.

Hearing we were making the trip, our friends in T.P. immediately fixed me up to speak at a memorial service for the late Mr Teo of Singkep Island, whose funeral I officiated 50 days before. As Sat. night was the YF's I was naturally lined up as well. For Sunday, they had three services, 2 at T.P. and the final at Kijang, a branch church 17 miles east on the seacoast.

According to schedule we took off for T.P. the day after we returned from Brunei, ie on a Fri morning. I spoke both Fri and Sat nights. All this while I was nursing a cold I had caught on the plane flying to Brunei. It became so unbearable Sat night after preaching that I had to cancel the latter two services on Sunday. I had to take antibiotics prescribed by an Indonesia doctor. Nevertheless, the Lord gave me strength enough for Sunday morning at which I was asked to baptise the younger son of the late Mr Teo of Singkep Island. We hurried home after service by the afternoon speedboat. Then did it dawn on us why God had refused us entry by the Brunei Immigration. Had we been in Brunei, by Sunday afternoon I should have to speak 9 times. At T.P. I could not go on after 3 sermons. Rom 8:28!



This is the New Light Church of the Blind, 859-39 Pangbae-1 Dong, Seocho-Ku, Seoul, 137-061 Korea. Tel. 533-9863-4. It is built over the site of the old premises, and dedicated Oct. 14, 1991. It has a Braille printing press that sends out a Gospel magazine to blind Koreans. It houses two dormitories, one for boys and the other for girls, the once discarded and doomed to darkness, but now have received the Light.

It is pastored by the world-renowned An Yohan, Blind Korean Pastor, whose film we've shown 43 times, in Singapore, Malaysia, Philippines and Australia. "O Come Back to the Lord" is one of three Gospel songs haunting you from his film. Roska has sung them in English, the other two being "Jesus came and touched my soul" and "The Prodigal Son." Tape and book available from CLBC.

Ed. note: The Biblical strategy of missions is as worldwide as the saving grace of the Lord of Missions. Some people ask, "Why should Life Church take such an interest in the Blind Korean Pastor? Our answer: Because he is one whom God has called, who in his limited way has brought blessings to thousands around the world. "For unto everyone that hath shall be given..."



This is also timely and convenient since you are going to buy gifts for Christmas such as Christmas cards. Why go outside to get them when there's a full supply from our own store? Patronising your own Book Centre is helping yourself because it will help keep it from going under. Life is a two way street. Let us be grateful for a ready service the Book Centre is maintaining for our members.

CLBC was the pastor's vision from the very beginning at Prinsep Street. It was formally launched in 1976 and run by a committee. After 3 years it was privatised and has since been under the management of Deacon and Mrs Paul Wong. (Our Book Centre is commended by Dr Keith Hinton in his book Church Growth - Singapore Style).

GOSPEL OUTREACH ON THE BURMESE FRONTIERS

As promised in my letter of November 2, I am very happy to write and give you an account of my last trip to the Chin State.



I flew out from Yangon on October 16 and was met and received by six elders and pastors at Kalemyo airfield. I spent two nights at Kalemyo and went to Minhla, about 18 miles north-west of Kalemyo with the six pastors and elders on bicycles on October 18. On Sunday morning, October 20, we performed dedication serv-

The Presbytery leaders requested me to give the especially reformed Theology and Polity for ten days but as I was just recuperating from recent illness, I could oblige them only for two days. It was somewhat like a Leadership Course attended by about 90 and I believe that every one of them enjoyed it and was quite satisfied. During the course many questions were asked which I answered as best I could. We also prayed for your coming visit to Myanmar in December during the Bible Seminar. The Lord blessed me richly in that so many people showed interest in our reformed doctrine and also in many other ways.

On October 25, I proceeded to Falam by car. We had EPCM Standing Committee at our Assembly Headquarters Office where we discussed matters related to your coming visit to Yangon and the Pastoral Conference and Leadership Course, December 10-23, 1991. We earnestly prayed for you. We all are really very happy at the prospect of meeting you and Mrs Tow in person in Yangon soon. May God help us. - Rev Robert Thawm Lual

BEULAH DEBT LATEST

I'm sure everyone of you have your personal copy of Chronicles of Conquest. It is a testimony of God's mighty working today through Lifers in the acquisition of Beulah Land. Under date of Apr 30, 1990 is the record of our paying the vendor of 10 Gilstead Rdnearly \$7.2 million. To be exact \$7,155,820.91, but that excludes lawyer's fee which was waived by one who loves the Lord, giving her free services.

To pay this huge sum we were enabled by \$3 million free loans, a great half from Christian friends and Churches and institutions outside Life Church. To date our Beulah Debt is reduced to \$1.75 million, praise the Lord! At the rate we are paying it will take us to mid-1994.

This is wonderful good news, for if we had to take a bank loan, like some smaller B-P Churches, we would have to pay thousands in interest every month. Then, it would drag on and on till?


MISSIONS UNCURTAILED

Another heartening report is that despite the Beulah Debt we are able to carry on our Mission Outreaches without curtailment. Our expenditures for Batam, Medan, Burma, Thailand, Philippines, Malaysia involve 6 figures per annum. There are lovers of God who not long give cheerfully to this, but also encourage our hearts with words of faith. By God's grace we will persevere on, and wherever there is a legitimate need we will attend. Your rallying to supply books to Africa and sustain the Saipan Expedition is exemplary.

Our Lord's Return is just round the corner. And He predicted that as His Return loomed nearer, the faster must the Gospel be preached as a witness to all nations before the end comes.

There was a time we thought missions was the responsibility of the West, but now we are experiencing God's power to send the Gospel to the uttermost part of the earth. I'd like to mention here the needs of Rev George Kutty labouring among Laotian refugees at Rhode Island, USA. The plight of the Arab Church in the Holy Land and the cost-effectiveness of the 47-student Bible College in Rangoon (Yangon) through the dynamic leadership of Rev Robert Thawm Luai. In this connection I must commend the MsF for undertaking to print the Shorter Catechism translated into the Chin language (a dialect of Burma). The MsF is a timely auxiliary to the Church's Missions Programme.

SAIPAN EXPEDITION



launch out in spiritual warfare. We have good ammunition in hundreds of copies of the Shorter Catechism in Chinese we're carrying along, but we need the prayers of every Reader on the Home Front. Pray that the Lord will give utterance also to Dr Cheng Wei Nien and Preacher Pang Kok Hiong that make up our Gospel Squad. Jehovah Nissi!

MORE THAN A STUDY TOUR

Our 18-day Pilgrimage to the Holy land, Mar 2-20, '92, will include two nights in Cairo, two nights in Istanbul and two nights in Amman. Every trip to the Holy Land is a study tour to the Christian. But there's a deeper significance to ours, it is rather a sacred tour - a pilgrimage. What is a pilgrimage? Websters defines it as "a journey undertaken by a pilgrim, especially a journey to some distant place sacred and venerable for some reason, undertaken for devotional purposes."



Visiting the Holy Land to see, eg, Golgotha and the Garden Tomb, to walk along Via Dolorosa, the way our Saviour trod to His death, will not be devotional enough without daily worship. For this reason we have made the Baraka Conference Centre of the Independent Board for Presbyterian Foreign Missions our base of operations. At this Christian Hospice we have full liberty to worship every morning before going out and every evening after coming in to thank and praise the Lord and meditate on what we see during the day. (This you cannot do freely in a hotel.)

Then we have another feature rarely enjoyed by other Christian groups. We have the Baraka Bible-Presbyterian Church at Bethlehem where we can worship on the Lord's Day and fellowship with Arab believers, members of this Church. We see not only the hoary stones for archaeological study, but the lively ones in souls saved from the Arab race.

We contributed to the buying of land for building a church at the Shepherd's field through the 1987 our, and we can have the joy of seeing the construction of the Lord's House there through this 3rd Pilgrimage! We shall worship at Baraka on two Sundays, so as to enjoy double blessings with them. This is the high point of our Holy Land Pilgrimage, higher than climbing proud Masada.

At any rate we shall be drawn closer to the Lord as we stand with Moses on Mt Nebo to view the Promised Land, or on Mt Moses where he received the X Commandments. To stand with Elijah on Mt Carmel and to sail the Sea of Galilee, in quiet and serenity as of vore, are experiences not to be forgotten. Another place, I'm sine, you if find blessing unspeakable is to stand on the Mt of Transfiguration where Moses and Ehiah descended to meet with our Lord and Saviour. We shall sing all the songs that are composed in the Holy Land for the Holy Land!

Ours is a Pilgrimage, while no less a study tour. So FEBC students have the added opportunity of writing a paper on all they have seen and heard, and earn two credits towards their academic attainment. A study tour, indeed, and more than a study tour. Ours is a pilgrimage. - T.T.

According to instructions, we applied through Mr George Ee our long time friend and travel agent to three big Tourist operators to visit Burma under their package tours. The first one said, "If you have a company of five, we'll work on it." We were only two. The next one would charge well over \$2,000 per person, ticket and hotel. That left us cold. The third one could help by "sending us an invitation letter from Burma for business" so we could go under the category of "business"?

With no peace of heart or mind, we took it to be the Lord's hindering. as He did to Paul in his Second Missionary Journey, the second time (Acts 16:7). Instead of our going to Burma, I've offered my wife's ticket to Rev Thawm Luai to come to S'pore! Man proposes, God disposes.

As we conclude this paragraph here comes a happy rescheduling of our Holy Land Pilgrimage. After consultation with my brother Dr Tow Siang Hwa, we are agreed the 18-day Tour is too long and would end with an anticlimax. So we are both agreed this package must shed off the last leg to Istanbul. We will climax with a final worship at Baraka Bethlehem, then drive down to Jericho and cross the Allenby Bridge to Amman, just in time to head straight back home sweet home! The other good news is for your pocket - a several hundred dollars reduction! Shalom!



As you begin to read this page this week, Dr Cheng Wei Nien, Preacher Pang Kok Hiong and I would be preaching to the Chinese garment factory workers on Saipan Island. After our mission to Saipan is accomplished we will go south to Guam to answer another call before returning to Singapore. The duration of this expedition is one week, Dec 6-12, '91.

HISTORICAL SKETCH OF SAIPAN AND GUAM



Discovered by Portuguese Ferdinand Magellan the first man to circumnavigate the world in 1521, they were named the Ladronnes (Thieves Islands). These Islands were settled by Spanish Jesuits in the 17th century and renamed Marianas

In 1899 the Marianas were purchased by Germany (with the exception of Guam which became a possession of the United States). They passed under Japanese mandate after World War I (1914-1918) by the Treaty of Versailles.

Saipan was an important Japanese airbase in World War II (1939-1945). It was captured by U.S. in 1944 and has since passed into American hands under U.N. trusteeship.

The inhabitants of Saipan are divided into two major ethnic groups - Chamorro and Carolinian - each with their own language and culture. During the past few years, large numbers of Filipinos, Taiwanese and Koreans have emigrated to Saipan. Current estimates put the population at 30,000. Saipan Island is about one third the size of Singapore.

During the long vacation (May to July) of FEBC this year, one Korean student Lee Hyo Chun sailed with the Korean Gospel Ship Hannah to Saipan. There he discovered within the Korean Church a hundred and fifty Chinese women married to Korean Christians. They could half-understand the Korean messages when they attend the Sunday services. Another hundred and fifty however were pure Chinese. They also have believed, but cannot understand the Word preached in Korean. When Lee Hyo Chun returned to Singapore he lost no time to contact Preacher Pang Kok Hiong, an FEBC alumnus serving at Calvary BPC. Hearing of the great door opened by the Lord in Saipan, Preacher Kok Hiong immediately entered the field. The following is his report:

Early last year, 20 garment and textile factories started to employ mainland Chinese workers for cheap labour. In Dec 1990, some of these workers visited the Korean Church out of curiosity, there being no Chinese Church in Saipan. The Korean Church pastors offered them the gospel despite having no knowledge of the Chinese language. Many workers were gloriously saved after hearing the truth being preached and interpreted into Mandarin

The number of Chinese worshippers grew by leaps and bounds every Sunday. The Korean

church supplied each of them with a Chinese Bible and a hymn book in Chinese. Today, about 300 of the 3000 Chinese workers attend the Sunday Service faithfully.

On Saturday night, I visited a meeting held in a factory's dining hall. When the group of 40 believers saw me, a Chinese preacher, they all stood up and clapped hands to welcome me. My heart was overjoyed to see the 300 odd Chinese come to Church the next morning. Half of them are Chinese Koreans attending the Korean service. The other half attend a separate Chinese worship service. I was invited to preach at this service. I was simply overwhelmed by their enthusiasm. The same Holy Spirit who moved me in China moved me also in Saipan. I challenged them to surrender their lives to Jesus. When I asked a Chinese Korean sister to close in prayer, she wept in tears with thanksgiving for the Lord had shown great mercy on them. Most of them wept with her as the message touched them deeply...

In the next ten days, almost every night I conducted training sessions for them. They voiced their desire to have a Chinese pastor. They begged me to stay or return again because they are contracted to work in Saipan for only two years...

There are 3000 local Chinese and 2000 mainland Chinese in Guam, another island 75 km south of Saipan, which is also without a Chinese Church and pastor. As the apostle Paul responded promptly to the Macedonian call, it is high time for us to respond to this Saipanian call. Will we?

Yes, we will. So now we are three. SAIPAN SURVEY REPORT

Friday Dec 6, '91 6.45 am Eld Khoo arrived promptly to ferry me to Terminal Two to rendezvous with Dr Cheng and Pr Pang for our flight to Manila. Lee Hyo Chun, FEBC Korean student who was our bridgehead to Saipan, was on hand to help with the luggage. By early afternoon we were booked into Hyatt Regency Hotel, nearest to Manila airport, to await our flight the next day to Saipan. We tried to phone Charles Seet, but it did not get through.



Our flight the next day to Saipan by Continental Airlines was delayed for 2 hours, so when we touched down on this US territory farthest from the Mainland, it was 8.30 pm. Now there was a meeting arranged for us by Pastor Kang, Korean missionary to the Chinese garment workers. To make good I asked a kind soul first in queue before me to let me go ahead of him, because customs examination at Saipan Airport was slow and tedious. It left no stone unturned - they were justifiably fearful of drugs. While the Customs gave me no trouble, the Immigration officer looked me over: "Are you Chinese, not Filipino? Show me your other identity papers." I produced my S'pore IC. "What's your occupation?" Not satisfied with my claim to be pastor (pastors are respected here) I showed him a copy of the Weekly with my name. By this he let me in.

Leaving behind my comrades who were still standing in a long line, I was whisked away by Deacon Jang to the dining hall of one of the garment factories. Here were con-

gregated 40 women workers all with Bible, Chinese Hymn Book and notebook. By then it was 9.30 pm. I spoke for almost an hour to a most attentive audience. As the meeting closed with two John Sung choruses ... "All my sins are washed away, In the Blood of Jesus," Dr Cheng and Pr Pang arrived. We then booked into the Koresco, a sparkling, new Korean Hotel.

Sunday morning I was introduced by Pastor Kang to speak to a congregation of about 100. "The wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Rom 6:23). After service Pr Pang continued with a Bible Class in Thessalonians. While he spoke the leader of the group asked me many theological questions. Then we were transported with some twenty of the Chinese women workers to the hilltop resort of YWAM where a Korean lunch was served by Mrs Kang. Incidentally, Pastor Kang had visited Singapore in July this year to attend the Korean

World Missionary Conference. This has led him to join FEBC to take more lessons in theology, as well as to deepen his Chinese language. I gave him a warm welcome in advance. (Meanwhile another Bible Class was being conducted by Pr Pang for the young women. You'll be surprised how much they have learnt from their well-marked Bibles.

At a Monday breakfast at Koresco Hotel the Senior Pastor of the Korean Presbyterian Church, Rev Kim, discussed with us the future of our outreach to the mainland Chinese workers. We assured him we've come to help, not to supplant.

The same afternoon we flew south to Guam, an Island smaller than S'pore with 130,000 population. On hand to welcome us were Dr Chen Wen Yen and his wife, the Aquila and Priscilla of Chinese Christians, mostly from Taiwan. A hotel reception was arranged for us at which a dozen others swelled the party. One of them, the proprietor of a big furniture store, was converted and baptised as recent as a week before. It is at his villa that we were accommodated. Here we held an evening service.

The following morning two of the ladies came to show us scenic spots around after which we drove up a hill to a mammoth Korean Presbyterian Church and Bible College under construction. This is the domain of Rev Dr David Hwan Jo who got an honorary doctorate from Dr McIntire. A past president of the Korean World Missionary Conference, his vision for God's Kingdom is as wide as the ocean seen from his hilltop Church.

An evening get-together of the Chinese Church was held at the Faith Presbyterian Reformed Church where I was speaker. From 11 pm to 1.30 am after returning to the furniture proprietor's villa, we answered our host's many questions on the faith. A new convert he was enticed by the heretical teachings of a JW couple. By the Spirit's enlightenment his many doubts were cleared. Grateful for the breakthrough he brought US\$300 in thanksgiving to the Lord. We never expected this, but our host pressed us to receive the gift. This episode reminded me of Zacchaeus' gratitude.

We returned to Saipan Wednesday evening to a Revival Meeting at the Korean PC. Lo and behold, there were two of the women workers who brought four young men, all Hokkiens. Immediately Pr Pang "worked" on them, while we joined the main service. After over an hour the four young men received the Lord! They were given Bibles in abbreviated Script brought in by the Korean Church from S'pore! Bubbling with joy Deacon Jang and Eld Han, chief supporters for Pr Pang to come to Saipan, got us together to "celebrate" at the Koresco Coffee House. We have no doubt the bridgehead made by Lee Hyo Chun at Saipan will soon be consolidated. Hallelujah. Amen.

Ed. note: The garment workers imported from Mainland China have increased to 8,000! They are on contract for 2 years. So there is a constant rotation of returnees and new arrivals. By getting them saved and indoctrinated their return to China will bring salvation blessings to their own families. These Mainland Chinese hail from Manchuria in the north to Hokkiens from the south. God has opened a door of evangelising China from an island in the Pacific, beyond our imagination.

BASIC THEOLOGY FOR EVERYONE (JAN - MAY 1992) Lecturer: Rev Timothy Tow, M.Div., S.T.M., D.D.

FIVE STARS OF THE CHINESE CHURCH (Mon, 6 Jan, 7.30-8.20 pm)

A highlight study of Chinese Church History from the lives of two missionaries, William Chalmers Burns (1815-1868), Jonathan Goforth (1858-1936) and three Chinese evangelists: Ting Li Mei (1871-1936), the Moody of China and "winner of 1,000 souls a month"; John Sung (1901-1944) who needs no introduction and Wang Ming Tao (1900-1991), the greatest of the five. Hear the gruesome stories of the beheading of 185 missionaries during the Boxer Rebellion, 1900. May the study of great lives of the Chinese Church inspire you to action for Jesus Christ before He returns! Amen.

"PROPHESCOPE" ON ISRAEL (Mon, 6 Jan, 8.30-9.20 pm)

Based on 5 lectures delivered at Sunset Gospel Hour, Calvary Pandan, it is an enlarged study of the prophetic history of Israel from Abraham to Christ's Second Coming. Study the prophecies on Israel that are being fulfilled in our lifetime! This should awaken us to action for our Lord Jesus Christ. One Holy Land Song with music notation will be sung and given away after each lecture. Learn 15 new songs and introduce them to your Church for inspirational singing.

CHARISMATISM FALSE AND TRUE (Thu, 9 Jan, 7.30-8.20 pm)

And on which side are you?

This course is an examination of the special characteristics of Charismatism today - the phenomena of tongues (including inside stories), visions, voices, "Thus saith the Lord," healing, "slaying of the Spirit," "fasting," etc., etc. What does the Bible say to each one of these signs?

And what does contemporary History of Revivalism reveal about tongues? The lecturer's personal experience in a Pentecost that swept Singapore in the thirties under the ministry of Dr John Sung, in which tongues were absent, was sought by Spurgeon's School of Theology (Dr Peter Masters) in 1986. His further research into other revivals that swept China, such as the ministries of Jonathan Goforth, Ting Li Mei (Moody of China) and Dora Yu (under whose revival Watchman Nee was saved) revealed no tongues either. And what is true Charismatism?

HOW TO DISCOVER GOD'S WILL FOR MY LIFE (Thu, 9 Jan, 8.30-9.20pm) Some Cultic leaders use bibliomancy to find out what is God's will for your Chambers Dictionary defines "bibliomancy" as follows: "divination by selecting passages of the Bible at hazard, and drawing from them indications concerning future events."

The story is told of one seeking God's will by opening the Bible at random and blindly putting one's finger on a Bible verse. It hit on Matthew 27:5 about Judas hanging himself. Not happy with such a verse, the same person turned to John 13:27 which ends with saying, "That thou doest, do quickly." What luck?!

By a detailed discussion of my recent book "The Clock of the Sevenfold Will of God" it can be ascertained from Bible principles what is truly God's Will for our lives. Not haphazardly, but assuredly. No confusion, but confirmation. "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart ... and He shall direct thy paths" (Proverbs 3:5, 6).


BLESSED WITH A WHITE CHRISTMAS?




FROM SAIPAN TO HONGKONG
